I personally had to work so hard and never gave up, while my teammates at youth level were getting contracts in England I was overlooked until I was 21 when eventually after not giving up and working harder than everyone around me I achieved my dream and signed a professional contract with Bristol Rovers, and having played football for a long long time I can say that players who work the hardest with the best attitude and never give up go on to have great careers.

You've moved a lot as a young person, how much has this helped you develop as a player and a person? (James Graham to George Robesten)

I'd say it's helped me develop a lot as a person as it forced me to figure out how to fit in with different people and find new friends in different places. As a player it taught me to be comfortable in discomfort and never stop moving forward, no matter how little you can see in front of you.

We've missed you this season. How is the injury and when might we see you playing again? (from Gareth Hunter to Jordan Bastin and James Dodd)

Bastin - Well, I had a second MRI scan which the surgeon told me my ACL had healed partially and that ultimately it was up to me whether I wanted surgery or to return back to football with the risk of a weak ACL. Having waited so long for the surgery I decided to go ahead. After coming out of surgery the surgeon told me it was a good job I had the surgery as it hadn't healed and the MRI was a misread.

The surgery went well and I am four weeks post op with a good range of movement in my knee, the rehab has already started and I'm hoping to be back in contact football towards the end of the year.

I can't thank the fans, the players, management and most importantly the club for the continued support during this difficult period for me, and I can't wait to be back out on the pitch doing what I love the most.

Let's get in them play-offs!

Dodd - It's been really tough to miss most of the season and especially hard watching the games! Football is such a huge part of my life but I think going through long term injury before has enabled me to understand the process.

It was a unique injury where I had to see if I could get away without surgery, but I have an operation on the 30th aiming to be back for the start of the league season.

THE BIG INTERVIEW- WITH JASON POPE



Jason Pope chatted to Rob Hammett about his season so far, looking back at the most memorable games and discussing the many challenges and changes that the club has experienced during the campaign.

Hi Popey, how do you feel the season is going so far, for the team and yourself personally?

I feel it's been a brilliant season for the club. Reaching the Third Round of the FA Cup for the first time and hopefully going one better than last season and finishing in the play-offs would be a fantastic achievement for the club. Personally I've had to fill in a few positions due to injuries and feel I've contributed where I've been asked to play for the team. I've had a couple of suspensions this season for the first time and I'll put that down to having a newborn and not getting any sleep around that time...

What would you say have been the most memorable games so far during this campaign?

The FA Cup run was fantastic, the First Round winning in extra-time and coming on up front was good fun. I missed the Chelmsford game due to suspension but the boys were brilliant. The assist from Dom and finish on the volley from Britts was special. We were obviously gutted to not get a bigger team in the Third Round but we gave a good account of ourselves and came away disappointed with not winning on the day.

We play Dorking in our final home game of the season today. What sort of occasion are you expecting at the Optima for this game?

I'd expect a big crowd and for them to create a decent atmosphere like they have on so many occasions this season, particularly away from home the fans have been a massive boost for the lads.

There have been so many games to squeeze in lately. As a player with a career outside of the game and a young family, how demanding has the schedule been?

It's challenging. To be honest we play the most demanding level of football in that sense. There's a lot of full-time clubs at our level now where you can obviously have more time to relax and spend time with friends and family. As a part-time player at this level it's relentless, you work every day, train 1-2 times per week and have 1-2 games per week. Then away games on Tuesdays throw a spanner in the works in terms of your sleeping pattern. Personally I find the distribution of sleep the most challenging aspect not just for recovery but for feeling alert and switched on for work outside of football.

THE BIG INTERVIEW- WITH JASON POPE

The defence have been outstanding again this season. What's it like playing with the likes of Emlyn, Avo, Dan Martin, Dom and Smudger?

Yes, our defensive record speaks for itself. We've got really good squad depth at the back and a lot of quality. There's been rotation but the lads have all performed when called upon, there's no sulking, we all want the best for each other and the team. I should also mention Dan Ellison who was solid for us on loan from Yeovil.

There has been a managerial change this season with Scotty Rogers taking over. What's he like as a gaffer, and what are Gary and Adie like alongside him?

The management have been brilliant. They all complement each other very well. They get on well with the lads and the lads respond by giving their best for them every week. We've had suspensions, injuries, players leaving for other clubs, loans coming in and out at crucial times so there's so much more to it. I know Adie has a big role in guiding Scotty and Gaz and he helps with the bits away from matchdays and training, so having him around the club is a massive benefit and it's helps that the lads get on with him really well and respect him.



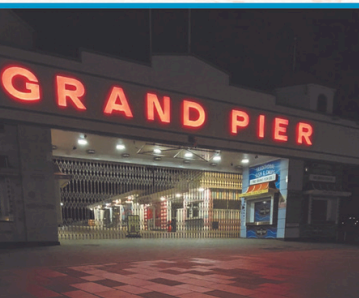
After a spell with Crawley Town, Tony eventually joined Dorking Wanderers, where his cult-hero status has continued.

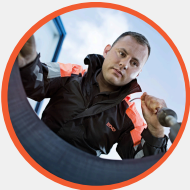

7. FIREWORKS, FLARES, SMOKE CANISTERS, LASER DEVICES, AIR HORNS, KNIVES, BOTTLES, GLASS VESSELS, CANS, POLES, AND ANY ARTICLES THAT MIGHT BE USED AS A WEAPON AND/OR COMPROMISE PUBLIC SAFETY ARE NOT PERMITTED WITHIN THE GROUND. THESE ARE CRIMINAL OFFENCES AND STRONG ACTION WILL BE TAKEN AGAINST ANYONE COMMITTING SUCH AN OFFENCE.
8. NO PERSONAL FOOTBALLS, TENNIS BALLS, INFLATABLE BALLS OR ANY OTHER SUCH THROWABLE BALL, HAND-HELD MEGAPHONES OR THE LIKE, SHOULD BE BROUGHT INTO THE GROUND. Anyone found with such will have the item confiscated until the conclusion of the match.
