HISTORY BEING MADE AS ROYALS MAKE THE STEP UP

The Royals will be making history today when they finally play their first ever league game at Step 4 level of the non-league football pyramid system.

It has been a long time in the making – ever since the club won promotion from Wessex League Division 1 in 2012 they have harboured ambitions of joining the upper levels of non league football.

They went close a number of times – a third place finish in the Premier Division in 2014-15 under then manager Graham Rix and they endured final day heartbreak at the end of the 2022-23 season when after leading the division for most of the season, they went into their final game of the campaign in second place but lost to Bemerton Heath Harlequins and finished the night in fourth place.

The 2023-24 season saw them knocked out of the promotion play-offs at the semi final stage when Brett Pitman's goal against his old side put Shaftesbury through and set them on course for their eventual promotion.

However, 13 proved to be lucky for Portchester – 13 years after first gaining promotion to the Wessex Premier Division they secured automatic promotion thanks to winning the league title, and going on to add three further trophies to The OnSite Group Stadium's trophy cabinet to complete an unprecedented quadruple.

Over what felt like 13 very long years waiting for the next step up in the pyramid, plenty of investment was made on and off the pitch to ensure the club was in the right position to seize the opportunity of Step 4 football with both hands.

And that doesn't stop with that achievement – the improvements and upgrades keep on coming, with plenty of exciting plans in the pipeline for the future of the club.

Exciting times indeed and the club starts its journey into the unknown looking forward to the new challenges and adventures that lie ahead of it.

Today brings an exciting start to that journey with the visit of Bognor Regis Town to kick-off the new Pitching In Isthmian League South Central Division campaign.



It's the first time the two clubs have met in a competitive fixture. There have been pre-season friendly meetings in the past but the clubs have been on different trajectories until now – Bognor enjoying plenty of Step 2 and 3 football while the Royals were stuck at Step 5.

But as is often the way in football and how the fortunes of clubs swing in different directions over time, the two sides are now brought together in the same division and at the same step level for the first time.

It promises to be an historic and fascinating afternoon. History made as the club makes its debut at Step 4 level and fascinating to see how the afternoon pans out for both sides as they start new chapters in their own histories.

Both sides are well supported so a big crowd will no doubt be inside The OnSite Group Stadium to witness this new beginning for AFC Portchester.

It promises to be an exciting afternoon – one that has been long awaited but eagerly anticipated by those backing the Royals.

THE ROCKS

Bognor Regis Town's co-manager Michael Birmingham says his side will have a game plan for their match at Portchester.

Speaking to Bognor's official website after their 2-0 pre-season victory at Chichester City, Birmingham said he got the reaction he wanted following a 4-1 defeat at Wimborne, and the players would be working hard in training ahead of today's game.

Speaking after the win at Chichester, Birmingham said: "The boys did okay tonight, there is no point going, 'ah yeah, what a result, what a performance', because as we know six days in football is a long time.

"We had a good training session and the boys really took on board what we were asking of them and I thought they did that to a tee against Chichester, every single one of them. They bought into it, they understood their roles and responsibilities but we still have a few things to iron out.

"Portchy is going to be a very different side. They haven't lost at home since October 4 last year. They have won four trophies and it is a fortress there.

"It's a very tough place to go but we will have a game plan and we will work on it Tuesday and Thursday at training."

Bognor were founded in 1883 and the club became founding members of the West Sussex Football League in 1896, joining the Senior Division.

They won the championship of this league for five successive years in the early 1920s, after which they joined the Brighton and Hove District League in 1926.

Just one year later they joined the Sussex County League where they were to remain until 1972. The club became Bognor Regis FC in 1929 after King George V added the suffix 'Regis' to the seaside resort.

The club won the Sussex County Division 1 championship in the 1948-49 season. At the end of that season, they added 'Town' to their name so as not to be confused with the local rugby club.

At the end of the 1969-70 season they were relegated, but won Division 2 at the first attempt. The club won the Division 1 championship title the following season and were promoted to Division 1 South of the Southern League.

In 1972-73 they reached the First Round of the FA Cup for the first time, losing 6-0 at Colchester United. In 1976 Jack Pearce became manager at the age of just 26, and went on to hold the position until 2007.

In 1981 the club were transferred to Division 1 of the Isthmian League, and were promoted at the end of the 1981-82 season after finishing second.

In 1984-85 they reached the First Round of the FA Cup again, beating Swansea City 3-1 in a replay after a 1-1 draw at the Vetch Field. In the Second Round they lost 6-2 at Reading.

They reached the Second Round again the following season, beating Enfield in the First Round, before losing 6-1 at Gillingham.

They went on to reach the First Round again in 1986-87 (losing 1-0 in a replay to Slough Town) and 1987-88 (losing 3-0 at home to Torquay United). In 1988-89 they beat Football League opposition again, defeating Exeter City 2-1, before losing to Cambridge United.

In 1991-92 Bognor finished in the relegation zone, but were reprieved after Dagenham and Redbridge Forest merged. However, the following season they finished bottom of the Premier Division, and were relegated to Division 1.



In 1995-96 they reached the Second Round of the FA Cup for a fourth time, before losing 4-0 at Peterborough United.

In 2002-03 they finished second in Division 1 South, and were promoted back to the Premier Division. After finishing tenth the following year, the club were placed in the newly established Conference South.

They were relegated back to the Isthmian League Premier Division at the end of the 2008-09 season, and were relegated again the following season.

Season 2010-11 saw the club compete in the Isthmian League Division 1 South and they missed out on promotion by the tightest of margins. Having finished with a club record total of 96 points, they lost out in the title race to Metropolitan Police on goal difference by just one goal, having led the table by two points going into the last fixture.

As a result, they found themselves in the end-of-season play-offs, where they lost at home to Dulwich Hamlet who had finished 31 points behind. Revenge was sweet, however, in 2011-12 when they again finished second in Division 1 South. They won the end-of-season play-offs, defeating Godalming Town in a thrilling semi final, before beating Dulwich Hamlet 1-0 in the final, gaining promotion to the Premier Division.

The 2012-13 season saw them finish in 14th place in the Ryman Premier. The 2013-14 season saw Bognor finish in third place but they lost in the play-off semi final at home to Lowestoft Town.

Season 2015-16 saw them miss out on the Ryman Premier title by one point and they then lost in the play-offs to Dulwich Hamlet.

They did however, also enjoy their best ever run in the FA Trophy by reaching the semi finals. They beat Bath City, Maidstone United, Altrincham, Sutton United and Torquay United along the way but they were defeated in the semi final by Grimsby Town – losing 1-0 in the first leg at Nyewood Lane and losing the second leg 2-1 at Blundell Park – 3-1 on aggregate.

Season 2016-17 saw them finish in second place for the second season running, but this time they triumphed in the play-offs, beating Wingate and Finchley in the semi final, before victory over Dulwich Hamlet in the final, to win promotion to the Vanarama National League South for season 2017-18.

Season 2017-18 unfortunately saw the club relegated back to the Isthmian League but 2018-19 did at least bring the excitement of winning the Sussex Senior Cup for the first time in 32 years at Brighton's Amex Stadium, with a 2-1 win after extra time against Burgess Hill Town.

Robbie Blake, the former Premier League striker, was handed the manager's job in March 2022 and in 2022-23 he steered his side to the Sussex Senior Cup final only to lose on penalties to Worthing. The Rocks finished 14th in the league standings that season.

Bognor finished tenth in the Premier Division in 2023-24 but last season saw them finish in 21st position in the final league table and the Rocks were relegated to Step 4 football.

BOGNOR PEN PICS

MAC CHISHOLM – Goalkeeper (Age 22)

Mac Joined the Rocks in July from Littlehampton Town. He also featured in the Baller League on Sky Sports and was in the under-18s set-up at Fulham before joining West Bromwich Albion.

ALFIE BARNES – Goalkeeper (16)

Alfie is a promising talent from Bognor's own youth system and is with the under-18s side.

HARVEY REW – Defender (22)

Harvey joined the Rocks in January and he plays either left centre back or at left back. Rew progressed through Pompey's youth ranks from under-13s and featured for Portsmouth in League 1 seasons 2019-20 and 2020-21. Formerly with Gosport Borough and Horndean.

RYAN THOMAS – Defender (20)

Full-back Ryan was recruited to the Rocks' ranks this summer. He plays predominantly in the right back berth where he is known for his dogged defending and darting runs forward. Formerly of Littlehampton Town, Ryan has also spent time at Horsham.

CHAD FIELD – Defender (28)

Chad re-joined Bognor in December 2024. A central defender, Field first arrived on loan at the Rocks in 2015 from Portsmouth before joining the club permanently a year later. But he tore his anterior cruciate ligament in 2020 and left the club as he focused on his recovery. He was a mainstay at the back for Horndean for several seasons.

TOMMY BLOCK – Defender/Midfield (24)

Signed for Bognor aged 18 and impressed to the point where he earned a big money move to Hibernian. Went on to play many times for Queens Park before returning south to Hampton and Richmond and then Dartford. Has returned to Bognor this summer.

CALLUM BECK – Defender (16)

Callum joined the Rocks in July from Worthing United.



RIO LONG – Defender (16)

After a few seasons away from one of Bognor's youth teams, Rio has impressed since re-joining the under-18s in the Isthmian Youth League, with some calm and composed defensive performances.

MATT JONES – Defender (29)

Matt (pictured above) was previously with Swindon, Chippenham, Farnborough, Hungerford and Weston Super Mare. Joined Bognor in July.

HARVEY WHYTE – Defender /Midfield (33)

Played for the club during two loan spells before signing permanently seven years ago from Havant and Waterlooville. Great ball control and blistering pace makes him very popular with the Rocks faithful. Son of 1980s Rocks favourite Dallas Whyte, Harvey began as a winger but is now an accomplished attacking midfielder. Harvey is the club's captain and lifted the Sussex Senior Cup in 2019.

SAMUEL HOOKEY – Midfield (28)

Sam signed for the club in July and was previously with Horndean and Gosport Borough.



BILLY ALLCOCK – Midfield (18)

ROYALS ROMP INTO THE NEXT ROUND OF THE FA CUP

AFC Portchester stormed into the next round of the FA Cup with a resounding 3-1 replay victory over Melksham Town.

The Royals raced into a 2-0 lead after only 22 minutes and Lee Wort's wonder goal on the stroke of half time ensured his side could see out the game in the second half in relative comfort.

Portchester made a fast start to the game and dominated the early exchanges and took the lead on 12 minutes.

Lee Wort picked the ball up in midfield and raced into the left hand side of the penalty area. He knocked the ball on to Ryan Pennery, who pulled it back into the path of Alfie Stanley and he fired home his first goal for Portchester.

Stanley went close to grabbing a second goal four minutes later when he picked up the ball on the right, cut into the penalty area but put his shot into the side netting.

It was 2-0 on 22 minutes when a corner from the right was knocked back across his own goal by a defender and Wort reacted quickest to turn the loose ball into the net.

The visitors had a couple of half chances to score from just outside the box around the half hour mark but on both occasions their shots sailed well over the goal.

The home side went close to getting their third goal on 36 minutes when a ball in from the right was heading straight to Pennery just outside the six yard box.

He would have had a simple tap in if it wasn't for keeper Adam Forster spotting the danger and he just about got across in time to cut the ball out.

A minute later the Royals went even closer when Zack Willett was sent clear thanks to a through ball from midfield and although his shot beat Forster it went narrowly wide of the far post.

There was no stopping Portchester in first half stoppage time though when they netted a goal which has been seen by millions of people on social media.

Some described it as the best goal they had ever seen – it's hard to disagree with them.

Charlie Williamson played the ball up from inside his own half into the right hand side of the penalty area. With his first touch Wort

brought the ball under control and cut inside two defenders and with Forster looking like he was in a good position to deal with any shots fired off, the odds were in the keeper's favour.

However, a touch of genius by Wort saw him try a rabona shot and the ball flew past the keeper's shoulder and into the net. If you haven't seen the video yet search for it on social media – it is a must watch.

The second half proved to be a more even affair with the home side comfortably in front, but they almost got a fourth goal on 54 minutes.

Willett was put in behind the Melksham defence and he tried to dink the ball past the keeper but Forster was able to push the shot away.

Jamal Lawrence had been the danger man up front for Melksham in the first game and he almost got on the scoresheet again three minutes later.

The ball was played into him from the left and he unleashed a vicious dipping shot which only just cleared the crossbar.

On 70 minutes Willett played the ball down the right to Williamson and his cross picked out Wort at the far post but the striker was denied his hat-trick when Forster managed to beat away his effort.

The visitors got themselves on the scoresheet on 76 minutes when keeper Steven Mowthorpe managed to block an initial shot after the ball was played into the box but Lawrence reacted quickest to turn the re-bound home from close range.

Portchester were still creating good chances and they almost restored their three goal advantage when Connor Duffin latched on to a high ball played towards the penalty area.

He turned past his marker and fired off a shot which was heading into the net before a defender's outstretched leg knocked the ball away.

The reward for Portchester's excellent performance is a trip to Moneyfields in the Preliminary Round stage of the Emirates FA Cup. The tie will be played at Moneyfields' John Jenkins Stadium on Saturday, August 16 – kick off is at 3pm.
