If you want to see some goals, it looks like Whitley Bay and Retford United are the places to be.

That was certainly the case in July and August. This season we're teaming up with the guys at Non-League HQ - find them on X - to bring monthly stats from across the non-league pyramid system.

It promises to show a snapshot into how teams and players are performing each calendar month.

Perhaps the table shows they're struggling but a deeper look may show a team is in fact one of the most in-form sides around.

Our first instalment shows Whitley Bay scored 27 times in the opening period of the season as did Retford at Step 6 - although Cranfield are just a goal behind.

Of course Steps 1 to 4 started a little after Steps 5 and 6 but it will be fascinating to see how things unfold throughout the campaign.

We'll also be highlighting the players. At the end of August, the top scorer across non-league football was Zak Khan.

The Route One Rovers man hit 13 goals, including three hat-tricks, for the Northern Counties East League Division 1 side.

He was a closely followed by Alnwick's Euan Potts and Step 5's leading scorer from Penrith, Luke Hunter, who both ended August on 12.

Potts has also grabbed two trebles, while Hunter led the way when it comes to consecutive games he scored in with nine.

The closest player to that sequence is Oxhey Jets' James Barnett with six games on the spin.

At Steps 1 to 4 - having not played as many games - National League North duo Michael Gyasi, the King's Lynn Town striker, and Scarborough Athletic's Stephen Walker were the most profitable in the opening month with seven goals each.

The stats will focus on different areas throughout the season but we can't wait to see how the Golden Boot races unfold.

And who knows where these goal getters might end up. In last week's Non League Paper, Tony Incenzo spoke to QPR's new signing Richard Kone.

It seems incredible the striker (pictured below), who the Hoops signed from Wycombe Wanderers, was playing for Athletic Newham in the Essex Senior League a couple of years ago.

The 22-year-old scored 125 goals for the non-leaguers while visa issues were sorted to allow him to move into the full time game.

"I was playing against tough men week in, week out," he said. "It helped me discover how to overcome physical defenders."

His rapid rise will be a real inspiration to so many. After all, goals pay the bills. And they also help draw in the crowds!

Whitley Bay and Retford are certainly on our ones to watch list in September!

MINUTE'S APPLAUSE HELD TO REMEMBER MIDFIELDER

AFC Portchester paid tribute to their former midfielder Ryan Woodford with a minute's applause at The OnSite Group Stadium.

The former Royals player was fondly remembered by those in attendance at the Flackwell Heath game shortly before kick-off of the FA Trophy tie earlier this month.

Woodford played for Portchester during the 2017-18 season and he also had spells at Petersfield Town, Moneyfields and Brockenhurst in the Wessex League.

The midfielder brought plenty of experience with him to The OnSite Group Stadium as his previous clubs included the likes of Horsham, Worthing, Andover Town and Eastleigh.

A fair few of Portchester's players and coaching staff who took part in the minute's applause played or worked with him at some point and all remembered him as a strong player and fun character to be around.

He certainly brought plenty of life to the dressing rooms he was involved in. I had the pleasure of seeing him in action at Petersfield while the club were playing in the Southern League for two seasons.

In season one he was part of a highly successful squad which had just won back to back

promotions, and the second season at Step 4 proved to be the complete opposite of that as Petersfield battled all season against

relegation.

In both situations Ryan was given the captain's armband and he certainly proved his leadership qualities in both campaigns.

He wasn't everyone's cup of tea but he used that to his advantage and if you had Ryan on your side you got the benefits of that.

At times his passion got the better of him and he would pick up a red card but Ryan could also play and he produced a number of standout performances while helping his team to victory.

His display against Weymouth in the FA Cup immediately springs to mind - a crucial performance on a day which brought a major giantkilling victory for Petersfield at Love Lane.

When I look back over my time in non league football a large number of the funny stories I tell people involved Ryan in some way.

He brought the dressing rooms he was in to life and there was always something going on when he was around. The pre-season trip to Cowes Sports is legendary – a day of madness and mayhem but also one of great laughs and ultimately it brought a squad just starting out in Step 4 football together.

A player who will be fondly remembered by all those who played with him and saw him in action.

His funeral is being held at St John's Church in Locks Heath on September 30 at 11.30am.

Adhoc football, a cross between rugby union and football – and perhaps a few other games to boot – took place between Plymouth and Tavistock sides from the mid 1870s, but it took a letter in the Tavistock Gazette from scribes under the pseudonym of 'Wei/wisher' and 'Halfback' to attract the attentions of two local businessmen

The club was founded on September 8, 1888, the foundation year of the Devon County FA, when sportsman and businessman Herbert Spencer summoned interested persons to assemble at the Guildhall, where a committee was elected under the chairmanship of his brother, Wilfred, with Herbert as his deputy and another brother, Kingsley, on the committee, with Tom Owen as secretary.

The old Tavistock Grammar School playing field in Russell Street hosted the newly formed club and the first match, against the Duke of Cornwall Light Infantry, resulted in a 1-0 victory.

The first annual general meeting held at the old Temperance Hotel, now the Ordulph Arms, proudly recorded a first season playing record of won 13 matches, lost three and drawn one.

By 1890 the club adopted a strip of blue and old gold and formed a second team, moving two years later to Green Lane, Torlands, courtesy of the proprietor of the Bedford Hotel.

Tavistock won the league and were cup runners-up in 1900-01. On one day in 1903 at Torlands, on the edge of Dartmoor, a game had to be abandoned due to a sudden blizzard.

In the same year, wild ducks invaded a flooded penalty area and set up home for a week in a makeshift pond, resulting in a postponed fixture.

No wonder that, over the next few years, venues changed – from a return to the old grammar school pitch, to Green Hill and Sandy Park. It is believed that in 1913 the entire Tavistock team was selected to represent the county.

Eventually there were at least three other clubs in the town – Tavistock Comrades, Bannawell Blues United and Tavistock West End. Amalgamation in 1939 produced the familiar colours of red and black – a welcome change to the salmon pink shirts with chocolate

collars and cuffs of 1919.

The years 1920 to 1930 were successful times with excellent results in the league, Bedford Cup and Senior Devon Cup. Sadly, the next decade saw a decline in both results and attendances.

Play ceased at the end of the 1931-32 season due to debt. Jumble sales and whist drives were held to ease the financial situation and football resumed once more in 1937.

In 1945 The Lambs joined the Plymouth Combination League's Division 1. In 1947, club president Herbert Thomas Langsford purchased Langsford Park, giving it under trust to the club in 1949

In 1952, Tavistock joined the South Western League but were forced to withdraw in 1961 due to financial issues. They re-joined in 1968.

The club has been the birthplace of many players going on to enjoy professional pay-days in the Football League, including Harold Redmond and Danny Sullivan to Crystal Palace for a fee of £100; Neil and Peter Langman to Plymouth Argyle and Mike Trebilcock – perhaps the most famous footballer to have played for Tayistock.

Robbie Pethick, Tavistock-born and ex-player of the club, signed professional forms for Portsmouth in October 1993, where he had five successful seasons before moving to Bristol Rovers.

The club won the Devon Premier Cup in 2001-02 and repeated this success in 2006-07 by beating Upton Athletic 6-0, creating a record winning margin in the final of this competition.

In 2005-06, the club reached the last 32 in the FA Vase, going out to Pickering Town. The club also entered the FA Cup that season for the first time since 1953-54.

On February 3, 2011, a fire all but saw the complete destruction of the changing rooms and the Red and Black clubhouse. Since then, a re-

building programme under the guidance of manager Stuart Henderson, has seen the club rise from the ashes and achieve great things by becoming the South Western Peninsula League (SWPL) East Divisions champions in 2014-15 and then SWPL Premier Division champions in 2016-17.

Tavistock AFC made SWPL history the following year by becoming the first club to win both the SWPL Charity Vase and Bowl.

After being runners-up to Plymouth Parkway in the SWPL Premier Division in 2017-18, the Lambs won the league on the last day of the 2018-19 season, beating Plymouth Argyle reserves to gain promotion to the Toolstation Western League.

The club's first two seasons in the Western League saw them top of the table in 2019-20 when the season was curtailed due to the Covid-19 pandemic and then second when the 2020-21 season was also curtailed, missing out on promotion on a points-per-game basis over those two seasons.

However, despite having a smaller budget compared to many of their rivals, the Lambs were crowned champions of the Western League in 2022 with a final day win over Ashton and Backwell to secure the title.

Tavistock's first season at Southern League level - the 2022-23 campaign - saw the club finish a very credible sixth place in Division 1 South, missing out on the play-offs on the last day of the season. Striker Liam Prynn's 28 league goals won him the league's top goalscorer award.

With a strong foundation laid, the hope is the club can continue to develop and thrive at the heart of its community on the edge of Dartmoor.

Seasons 2023-24 and 2024-25 saw Tavistock AFC continue their progression with a place for another season within the Southern League with mid-table finishes.



MAJESTIC ROYALS ROMP TO VICTORY OVER MONEYFIELDS

AFC Portchester were back to their majestic best as they romped to a 4-0 victory over Moneyfields on Bank Holiday Monday.

Four goals in 33 first half minutes secured the three points by half time for the Royals, who were able to comfortably see out the second half and ensure the visitors were unable to stage any form of comeback.

There was another spectacular goal to add to the August worldie goals file too, as Alfie Stanley scored from close to the half way line – his second of the game and his fifth goal of the season.

Moneyfields had the first chance to break the deadlock after two minutes when the ball was played up to Rudi Blankson on the edge of the box but his low shot was easily gathered by keeper Steven Mowthorpe.

The Royals got their noses in front a minute later following a defensive error by the visitors. A defender lost control of the ball on the edge of his own six yard box and Stanley pounced to win possession and then roll his shot into the net.

Portchester were 2-0 up on ten minutes when Calvin Davies' ball in behind the Moneys defence sent Zack Willett racing clear down the right. He cut inside a defender before firing his shot into the far corner of the net.

Blankson went close with a free kick from 25 yards out which just cleared the crossbar and at the other end after an attack down the right, the ball dropped on the edge of the box to Archie Willcox but he put his shot well over the target.

Blankson again had a chance for the visitors when he tried to slide in on a low ball put across the six yard box but he just failed to connect with the cross.

The Royals then went 3-0 up in spectacular fashion on 21 minutes. Moneyfields were caught in possession in midfield and a quick pass fed the ball to Stanley, who after taking a couple of strides into the Moneyfields half of the pitch, sent his shot from over 50 yards out sailing over stranded keeper Ellis Grant's head and it dropped into the net.

The scoring was completed on 36 minutes when more pressing from the home side in midfield saw them win the ball back and it

was played to Ryan Wilkins.



He took it up to the edge of the box, cut inside his marker and then curled his shot into the far corner of the net.

The second half was a lot quieter with the home side comfortably in front and the visitors struggling to make any real inroads past the strong home defence.

On 56 minutes Conor Bailey received the ball on the left hand edge of the penalty area and his low shot had to be diverted around the post by Grant.

Two minutes later a free kick was floated into the box and after Willcox's header bounced away off the keeper's face, Jack Lee fizzed his first time shot over the target.

Substitute Max Smith almost got his first goal for the club with five minutes remaining when his free kick from 25 yards out was heading in until Grant managed to flick the ball over the crossbar.

ROYALS DESERVEDLY TAKE GLOUCESTER TO A REPLAY

The Royals recorded an excellent 1-1 draw at Gloucester City in the First Qualifying Round of the FA Cup, meaning the two teams would meet again in a replay at The OnSite Group Stadium.

Portchester put in a battling and spirited performance against their Step 3 hosts – Gloucester play in the Southern League's Premier South Division – and fought back from going a goal down to send the tie to a replay.

Both teams deserve credit for the good standard of football produced in this encounter as driving rain and a stiff breeze swept across The TigerTurf Stadium throughout the 90 minutes.

The home side had most of the opportunities to score in a first half which lacked many chances.

On three minutes Sion Spence put his free kick from the left edge of the box over the crossbar and 12 minutes later he was sent clear of the Portchester defence but keeper Steven Mowthorpe got down quickly to his right to keep out the shot on goal.

The visitors had their only half chance of the first half on 37 minutes when James Cowan's free kick from the left was knocked down by Archie Willcox to Calvin Davies but the Royals' skipper screwed his shot well wide.

Four minutes later Elis Watts picked up a long ball forward in the left hand side of the penalty area but his attempted chipped shot went over the target.

The home side rattled the woodwork three minutes into the second half when Ed Williams set up the chance for Kieran Phillips to shoot but his effort came back off the post.

Some last ditch defending by Portchester kept the scores level as the home side looked to finish off a couple of good moves forward from close range but Gloucester finally broke the deadlock when they won a free kick just outside the box on 62 minutes.

Harry Pinchard curled his free kick from 20 yards out past the defensive wall and straight into the top corner of the net, leaving Mowthorpe rooted to the spot.

The visitors didn't let the game get away from them and continued to work hard as the

match went into the final quarter and they started to create some dangerous-looking

chances.

On 71 minutes keeper Jared Thompson had to dive to his left to keep out Conor Bailey's shot from 25 yards but three minutes later at the other end Spence cut inside and unleashed a low shot which Mowthorpe had to push around the post for a corner.

Lee Wort almost got his fifth FA Cup goal in the current campaign on 76 minutes when Charlie Williamson's long ball dropped in behind the home defence.

Wort got to the ball first around ten yards out but it wouldn't drop down quickly enough for him and he blasted his shot over the target.

However, the Royals weren't to be denied and they got their equaliser with nine minutes remaining.

Williamson played the ball inside from the right towards Connor Duffin, who initially saw it run away from himself but he got to it first and back heeled it straight into the path of Marley Ridge.

The midfielder took the ball to just inside the penalty area before firing his low shot past Thompson and into the net.

Both sides had chances to win the tie in the closing stages. With a minute to go a home player cut into the box from the right wing and went past three visiting players before unleashing a shot which Mowthorpe had to beat away at his near post.

The last chance of the game went to Portchester after five minutes of injury time had been played when they won a free kick just outside the box.

Davies' free kick beat the defensive wall but Thompson got down to his left to push the ball away from goal and the full time whistle was blown straight after this.
