# REPORT: TROPHY VICTORY WILL GO DOWN IN ROYALS FOLKLORE

AFC Portchester have had some memorable days in the national cup competitions down the years and the 2-1 win over Taunton Town will be joining that list.

This victory in the Third Qualifying Round of the Isuzu FA Trophy will also be mentioned in Portchester folklore in years to come – this win was that good.

Collectively as a team Gav Spurway's side were excellent – you'd be hard pushed to single out any individual player for man of the match as everyone involved had to be at their best to get this result against a strong Step 3 Taunton outfit.

Resolute defending and a high work rate were the orders of the day and every player performed that excellently and they soaked up a lot of pressure created by the visitors in the final quarter of the match.

There was still a stiff breeze blowing across The OnSite Group Stadium - the tail end of Storm Amy after much windier conditions overnight - and that contributed to Portchester's first chance of the game on seven minutes.

Taunton could not fully clear their lines and after the ball had looped up in the air several times it eventually found its way to Alfie Stanley and his shot flew wide of the target.

At the other end a deep cross into the box found its way to Kane Simpson, who tried to flick his header past Steven Mowthorpe but the keeper was able to comfortably gather the ball.

Portchester took the lead on 12 minutes when the ball was played into the penalty area from the right and it was held up in the wind. When it dropped Connor Duffin controlled it excellently before hitting a low shot past keeper Frankie Phillips and into the net.

Both sides traded chances as the first half went by. On 23 minutes Taunton played a one-two with a free kick just outside the penalty area but Alfie Moulden put his shot straight at Mowthorpe.

Stanley went close to scoring at the other end a minute later when the ball was played up to him on the edge of the penalty area and although his shot beat Phillips it flew narrowly wide.

On the half hour mark good play by the visitors on the left saw the ball worked inside to Jack Rice on the edge of the box and his effort

was deflected but that saw the ball drop straight to Mowthorpe.

Taunton's best chance of the first half came on 37 minutes when a long clearance was allowed to bounce a couple of times by the home defence and it fell to Owen Brain, who hit a low shot which Mowthorpe had to get down quickly to save.

The visitors only had to wait until five minutes into the second half before they got back on level terms. Matt Carson picked up the ball on the left hand side of the penalty area and when he hit a shot towards goal it took a deflection off a defender and that took the ball past Mowthorpe's dive and into the net.

However, the Royals were back in front two minutes later. They won possession of the ball off of the visiting defence and Duffin then played it through into the path of Stanley, who guided his low shot under Phillips and into the net.

Portchester had some good chances to extend their lead further after this. On 61 minutes Tommy Scutt broke clear of the defence and played the ball to Stanley in front of goal but as he looked to fire the ball into the net an excellent last ditch tackle from a defender prevented what looked a certain goal.

Two minutes later Calvin Davies tried to curl his free kick from 25 yards out into the net but he put his shot straight into the keeper's hands and Duffin then latched on to a long ball into the penalty area but his header dropped wide.

Taunton were getting plenty of balls into the box to try and force their way back on to level terms and on 71 minutes Joe Hatch went past two defenders on the left hand side of the box but Mowthorpe comfortably smothered his shot.

Portchester went so close to getting the third goal on 85 minutes which would have allowed them to see out the remainder of the game comfortably. Charlie Williamson played the ball to Scutt, who let fly with a shot from 35 yards out and Phillips managed to get his finger tips to the ball to divert it on to the top of the crossbar.

Taunton had the chance to send this tie into a penalty shoot-out in the third minute of injury time when a cross from the right found its way to Jake Hodgson when it held up in the wind but he smashed his shot wide.

Perhaps it's the oversized top and gloves, mixed with the emergency stopper's shorts and socks. May be it's that every cross into the box seems to be laced with added jeopardy.

In my case, it's happening to be at a game when the volunteer even saves a penalty as Niall Quinn once did for Manchester City!

Whether it's clearing routine low shots with a cultured hoof rather than a comfortable two hands - surely anyone who does it comes out with an appreciation of what it's like to actually be a goalkeeper.

As we all know, it's a position where any mistake is in the full glare of everyone watching and tends to end up in the net.

It came to mind after a story we carried in last Sunday's Non League Paper about Clevedon Town striker Sam Beresford – he played in goal for two different teams, only three weeks apart!

Beresford was called upon for what proved to be his final game for Bridgwater United when goalkeeper Ben John was forced off injured at half time in a match against Helston Athletic.

With no keeper on the bench, Beresford (pictured below), a summer signing from Clevedon, took the gloves and did enough to earn Bridgwater a 3-2 win.

Front man Beresford then left United to re-join Clevedon in September and returned to the day job, adding two goals in ten games to his previous Clevedon tally of 46 in 85.

But the striker was soon back in unfamiliar(ish) territory recently when the Western League leaders took on Wellington.

Goalkeeper Jacob Glover was forced to leave the field after only 18 minutes of his Seasiders debut when he injured his shoulder trying to prevent Wellington scoring.

Beresford took the gloves and pulled off a string of fine saves to keep the visitors at bay earning him man of the match honours.

Beresford's heroics went on to

help secure the Seasiders a 3-1 win, but managers Nic Steadman and Jamie Smith will be banking on him to score the goals, rather than keep them out!

#### LEWES PART COMPANY WITH BOSS

Lewes have announced the departure of manager Bradley Pritchard.

At the time of the announcement, the Rooks had gone ten matches without a win and lost the last six of those.

In a statement, the club explained: "Lewes FC and Bradley Pritchard have mutually agreed that he will step down from his role as first team manager, with a shared intention of ensuring the club continues to move forward in the best possible way.

"This decision comes after considerable and careful reflection and open conversations between Bradley and the club's leadership, with a understanding that this is the right moment for change in the best interests of the team's continued progress.

"Bradley is someone we hold in the highest regard — as a person, a former player, and as a manager. His dedication, professionalism and passion for Lewes FC have been evident throughout his time here.

"He has always put the club first, and we will always respect and cherish him for this."

Bradley took over as Lewes boss in May after he spent most of last season as player/coach at Phoenix Sports.

Peter joined Canvey in May but the Gulls have struggled during his tenure, and he departs with them at the bottom of the Isthmian Premier Division, with one win from 11 matches.

Earlier in his career Peter managed Leicester City, Crystal Palace, Brighton and Hove Albion, Hull City, Southend United, Wycombe Wanderers, Bradford City, Dagenham and Redbridge, Stevenage, Welling United and the Bahrain national team.

As a player, he was a full England international, and played club football for the likes of Tottenham Hotspur, Crystal Palace, Leyton Orient and Southend United.

He also had a spell in charge of the England team, a one game caretaker stint, and he has also managed the under-21 and under-20 sides.

#### WELLING DEBUT FOR THOMAS

Welling United gave a debut to Jack Thomas in their midweek County Cup tie.

He Jack came through the Bishop's Stortford academy before making his first team debut at 18 years of age. The midfielder played 237 times for the Blues, winning the Premier Division title and playing at National League North level.

## MIXED RESULTS FOR SARNIES

It has been a season of mixed results so far for Egham Town in the Pitching In Isthmian League South Central Division.

Like Portchester, they won promotion to Step 4 last season and in their 12 league games so far they have the record of four wins, four draws and four defeats.

Their wins have come against fourth placed Moneyfields, fifth placed Hanworth Villa, seventh placed South Park Reigate and bottom side Fareham Town.

Harrow Borough, Hayes and Yeading, Raynes Park Vale and Hartley Wintney are the sides who have beaten Egham, while the Sarnies have picked up draws against Raynes Park Vale, Metropolitan Police, Southall and Bedfont Sports.

All of those results mean Egham are currently in 13<sup>th</sup> place in the South Central Division table – one place above Portchester.

Margate beat them in the Preliminary Round of the Isuzu FA Trophy and they reached the Second Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup before being knocked out by Deal Town.

The club was initially established as Runnymede Rovers in 1877 and later re-constituted as Egham in 1905.

They secured the West Surrey League title in the 1921-22 season, subsequently becoming founding members of the Surrey Senior League in 1922 and winning the league in its inaugural season.

The club were runners-up in 1927–28, after which they joined Division 1 West of the Spartan League. A sixth place finish in 1928–29 resulted in their placement in the Premier Division for the 1929–30 campaign.

Following a bottom of the table finish in 1931–32, Egham were relegated to Division 1.

Egham exited the Spartan League at the conclusion of the 1932–33 season and returned to the Surrey Senior League.

The club ceased operations during the Second World War and was not immediately revived after the war.

However, a public meeting held on December 9, 1963, led to the club's re-formation as Egham Town.

They participated in the Parthenon League for the 1964–65 season, before re-joining the Surrey Senior League. After two seasons, Egham moved to the Spartan League in 1967.

The club won the Spartan League in 1971-72 and joined Division 2 of the Athenian League in 1974. Triumph in Division 2 at their first attempt granted promotion to Division 1, where they later finished as runners-up.

In 1977, Egham entered Division 2 of the Isthmian League. League restructuring relocated them to Division 1 South in 1984, with Division 2 being re-instated in 1991.

Relegation to Division 3 followed the 1997–98 season, and the club remained at that level until the next restructuring placed them in Division 1 South in 2002.

Egham then transferred to Division 1 West of the Southern League for the 2004–05 season, but returned to Division 2 of the Isthmian League the subsequent year.

In 2006, Egham left the Isthmian League to join the Premier Division of the Combined Counties League.

They became Premier Division champions in 2012-13, earning promotion to Division 1 Central of the Southern League.

A third place finish in 2015–16 brought qualification for the promotion play-offs, where they were defeated 4–2 on penalties by St Ives Town after a 2–2 draw.

The following season, Egham finished fifth and again qualified for the play-offs, losing 4-0 to Farnborough in the semi finals.

At the close of the 2017–18 season, Egham transferred to the South Central Division of the Isthmian League.

They finished at the bottom of the division in 2018-19 and were relegated to the Premier Division of the Combined Counties League.

Subsequent league restructuring placed the club in the Premier Division North. Egham were runners-up in the Premier Division North in 2022–23, qualifying for a promotion/relegation play-off against Merstham of the Isthmian League, which they lost 3–1.

The 2024-25 season, which witnessed Egham's promotion back to Step 4, was masterminded by Jordan Berry, who had left for Harrow Borough for one season but came home to Runnymede Stadium for a title win in the Combined Counties Premier North.

A nine point gap between the Sarnies and runners-up Bedfont Sports was just one achievement, another being a club record 11-0 win at home against Hilltop.

# REPORT: ANOTHER FIVE STAR SHOWING FROM PORTCHESTER

AFC Portchester produced another five-star performance to record a resounding 5-0 victory over Hartley Wintney under the lights at The OnSite Group Stadium.

Hot on the heels of their brilliant display when they knocked Step 3 high-flyers Taunton Town out of FA Trophy, it was a return to the bread and butter of the league for this midweek encounter and Gav Spurway's side were nothing short of excellent once again.

It was another towering display defensively and the visitors struggled to live with the high quality passing and movement of the Portchester front line, which saw all four strikers getting amongst the goals on the night.

The visitors almost snatched the lead though after two minutes of the game.

A quick break forward saw the ball played to Kanye Moyo down the right hand side of the penalty area.

He hit a low shot which keeper Steven Mowthorpe managed to block and then the Hartley player quickly fired the re-bound back towards goal from close range but the Royals' keeper managed to recover in time from the first shot to block that effort as well.

Portchester then took the lead five minutes later in a move which started with a deep cross from the right to the far post.

Brett Pitman managed to hook the ball back across goal at full stretch towards Lee Wort, who had anticipated the ball coming across the six yard box towards him and he ran on to it before guiding his low shot past keeper Nick Jupp and into the net.

Pitman went close to getting on the scoresheet on 20 minutes when he jumped highest to meet a cross into the box but his header dropped on to the roof of the net.

Three minutes later at the other end George Wallace got forward down the left hand side before cutting inside and firing a low shot towards goal.

Mowthorpe blocked the shot but spilled the ball before gathering it safely at the second attempt.

Marley Ridge prevented an almost certain goal at one end before nearly doubling

Portchester's lead at the other in the space of two minutes around the half hour mark.

Connor Holland got clear of the home defence and then looked to finish off the move by firing the ball home into the net but just as he was about to pull the trigger, Ridge produced a perfectly timed tackle to slide in and take the ball off his foot.

In the next attack at the opposite end of the pitch Ridge latched on to a cross that came in from the right but he put his shot over the top of the goal.

The home side did double their lead two minutes before half time when they were awarded a penalty after a defender was judged to have handled the ball inside the box.

Jupp got a strong hand to Pitman's penalty but the spot kick had enough power on it to find its way into the corner of the net.

Portchester's third goal arrived on 63 minutes after Wort had received the ball on the right hand side of the penalty area and played the ball out to Charlie Williamson on the right.

He lofted his cross to the far post where Pitman outjumped his marker to head the ball back across the six yard box and Wort ran on to it and smashed his shot into the net.

Mowthorpe had to be alert to block a free kick from 25 yards out on 74 minutes before the home side made it 4-0 a minute later.

Williamson received the ball in midfield and spun past his marker before crossing the ball into the box from the right.

It eventually found it's way to substitute Alfie Stanley and he dispatched a swerving shot from 15 yards out into the net for his seventh goal of the season.

The scoring was completed on 79 minutes when a long clearance out of defence went in behind a Hartley defender and after he fell over, Connor Duffin raced past him to get to the ball and he then dinked his shot past Jupp and into the net.

Hartley Wintney's miserable night was completed on 84 minutes when Alex Body's shot on goal beat everyone in a Portchester shirt only to come back off the post and the ball was then cleared to safety.
