We are forever grateful for the ultimate sacrifice they made for our country.

REPORT: WORT AT THE DOUBLE AS ROYALS RACE PAST ASCOT

Lee Wort continued to close in on AFC Portchester's all-time goalscoring record when his double netted three points against Ascot United.

He moved on to 92 goals for the club – now just five behind current highest scorer Simon Woods – and he looks to be on course to go past that number sometime in the coming weeks.

It was an afternoon of positives for the Royals with this 2-0 win - something badly needed at the end of a torrid week which had brought league defeats against Raynes Park Vale and Westfield.

This result put three points on the board, brought a clean sheet and produced a much improved performance. Defensively Portchester were rock solid and the visitors barely put their goal under any threat.

The Royals had the first chance of the game on two minutes when Tommy Scutt won possession of the ball in midfield and hit a shot from 25 yards out but it went straight at keeper Kie Plumley.

Two minutes later Spencer Spurway threaded his pass through the Ascot defence to find Wort but he couldn't quite get his shot away before the ball was cleared.

The home side took the lead on six minutes after a back pass from a defender fell well short of reaching Plumley.

Alfie Stanley latched on to the ball before rolling a pass inside to Wort, and he dispatched his shot low into the net.

Portchester doubled their lead on 13 minutes thanks to a long ball forward when it was cleared from midfield

As it dropped into the penalty area Wort got underneath it, held off his marker and then struck his shot home inside the near post.

The worldie goals file almost had to be reopened on 34 minutes when Stanley won control of the ball in midfield.

He spotted Plumley off his line and from inside the centre circle he tried to lob the ball over him into the net but the keeper just about recovered in time to make the save.

A series of corners in the final five minutes of the first half almost brought a third goal for the home side.



From the first one Archie Willcox's header had to be cleared off the line and when the ball was played back into the box Plumley had to tip the ball over after one of his defenders knocked it on towards his own goal.

From the second corner Plumley had to tip Willcox's goal-bound header over and from the next corner the Portchester defender's header dropped just wide.

The home side stood firm defensively in the second half to snuff out any attempt by Ascot to try and find a way back into this game.

The visitors struggled to muster any meaningful attempts on the Portchester goal throughout the afternoon and keeper Steven Mowthorpe was not put to any serious test during the 90 minutes.

On 72 minutes a corner from the right found Jack Lee but he put his header just over the top.

In injury time quick passing across the pitch saw the ball moved on to substitute Zack Willett on the left edge of the penalty area but his shot flew over.

In a funny way, Kevin Horlock's quote after Maldon and Tiptree's defeat to Port Vale encapsulated what the FA Cup is all about.

"We had them on the ropes for five minutes - we probably scored 85 minutes too soon," the Jammers boss said of Anisius Lewis' very early strike that put the Step 4 side ahead, "but what a magical moment."

Less than 20 minutes later and Horlock's side were 4-1 down to the League 1 Valiants, the lowest-ranked team in the First Round of the FA Cup was seeing their adventure coming to an end.

But it's those moments that make the FA Cup. For a few minutes, nine to be more precise, their travelling fans would have been wondering 'what if'.

We all know about the financial rewards that comes with the FA Cup - the TV cash to boost the coffers, the benefit of prize money, extra sponsorship and ticket sales. But, also, it gives unforgettable moments.

Think of Havant and Waterlooville all those years ago

when they led the mighty Liverpool not once but twice at Anfield. Think of Kidderminster Harriers taking West Ham to the final moments before Declan Rice bailed the Premier League side out.

Think of Tamworth last season as they took Tottenham into extra time but almost won it in the dying stages of the 90 minutes.

Chelmsford City caused the first upset of round one when they beat Braintree Town during the Saturday lunchtime of the FA Cup First Round weekend – a feat repeated by fellow Step 2 sides Weston-super-Mare, who knocked out Aldershot Town, and Slough Town as they piled the woe on Altrincham.

There were some all non-league ties that brought Sutton United, Wealdstone and Buxton success and a place in the Second Round.

We also saw Gateshead upset League 1 AFC Wimbledon, Brackley Town beat Notts County on penalties and Boreham Wood take, what feels like, their annual EFL scalp in Crawley Town.

Carlisle United looked to be on their way out at Reading before Regan Linney scored two stoppage time goals to force extra time - where he then scored the winner to complete his hat-trick.

"It was a good three points," he accidentally said live on Match of the Day the next day. "I've crumbled here!"

Thankfully the striker doesn't crumble when he's in the box!

"Where's the matchball?" presenter Jason Mohammad asked. "It's still in my car," Linney responded with a smile. That's the magic of the FA Cup!

NEW ARRIVALS AT KINGSTONIAN

Kingstonian gave debuts to two new arrivals as they defeated Three Bridges in the Velocity Cup.

Midfielder Martin Youngah signed from Phoenix Sports. He spent time in the South Central Division with Raynes Park Vale last season, playing nine times.

Martin was mainly Kent-based prior to his move to South West London. Last season he played for Rusthall, making five appearances.

During the 2023-24 season he made 20 appearances for Corinthian, and he has also played in the same league for K Sports and Punjab United.

Lorenzo Strachan had a fine debut, scoring the K's fourth goal. A former QPR academy prospect, the winger signed on at Loftus Road aged only six, and played for the under-18s side until leaving the club in the summer.

More recently he has played under-23 football for Harrow Borough.

HAYES BRING IN DEFENDER

Hayes and Yeading United have added a defender to their squad as Aziz Sankoh made the move from Pitching In Isthmian Premier side Carshalton Athletic.

Aziz played 13 times for the Robins this season, and that followed a staggering 54 games last season, with two goals.

That was his second Carshalton spell - he played 26 times for the club during 2021-22, and then followed manager Peter Adeniyi to Merstham, playing 44 times during 2022-23 before following Peter back to Colston Avenue.

He was originally signed by Adeniyi for Athletic from Cray Valley PM, where he played both under-23 and a little senior football.

LEADERS BRING IN MIDFIELDER

Pitching In Isthmian South Central leaders Leatherhead have moved to strengthen their squad with Logan Coles coming in from Binfield.

The midfielder came through the ranks at Chelsea and then Swindon Town, leaving the latter in 2024.

He also had a loan spell at Bracknell Town and another at Sandhurst Town.

After leaving the County Ground he guickly signed for Holyport in the Combined Counties Premier, where he played 33 times

and scored four goals before a step up to Binfield.

He managed six appearances for the Moles before last season came to an end, and this season has played 18 times and scored four goals.

Tanners fans might remember him from their 3-2 win at Binfield at the end of September.

HEATH RETURN FOR DOUGHTY

Broadbridge Heath have announced a return to the club for forward Mason Doughty.

Mason has already played more than 100 times for the Bears, including 33 appearances with eight goals last season and 38 games with eight goals during 2022-23.

He moved back to Broadbridge Heath from Sevenoaks Town, where he has made 16 appearances this season and scored twice.

He previously played for Three Bridges in two spells, and also spent time in the Isthmian League's top flight with Worthing and Burgess Hill Town

HOLLANDS JOINS THE ROCKS

Bognor Regis Town gave a debut to veteran midfielder Danny Hollands as they defeated Hayes and Yeading United last week.

Danny was a Chelsea youth player before becoming a big part of the AFC Bournemouth midfield for five years.

After departing the seaside he played for Charlton Athletic, and while at The Valley had Ioan spells at Swindon Town, Gillingham and Portsmouth, eventually making a permanent move to Fratton Park.

After a couple of years with Pompey he had a season with Crewe Alexandra before returning south and signing for Eastleigh.

He spent four years with the Spitfires before moving to Gosport Borough, where he has spent the last few years, including a brief spell as jointmanager, before departing last month.

TOWNSEND LEAVES BECKENHAM

Beckenham Town have announced that midfielder Steve Townsend has left the club to join Herne Bay. He made 40 appearances and scored 13 goals last season as Town battled hard but just came up short of the play-offs.

Worthing arrive with pedigree and ambition, but Portchester will be buoyed by recent performances and the backing of their home crowd.



WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS FAREHAM TOWN



TOUGH START AT NEW LEVEL

Fareham Town had a decent enough start to life at Step 4 but they have found themselves rooted to the bottom of the Isthmian League's South Central Division in recent weeks.

They opened the season with back to back defeats against Raynes Park Vale and Portchester before winning back to back games against Littlehampton Town and Ascot United before the month of August was over.

Due to their commitments in the FA Cup and FA Trophy, Fareham had only one league fixture during September – a 1-1 home draw against Horndean.

Seven league games in October brought only two points in thanks to draws against Moneyfields and Southall. Fareham lost against Hartley Wintney, Westfield, Binfield, Horndean and Egham.

That run of poor form has continued into November with 2-1 defeats against both Leatherhead and Harrow Borough.

This wretched run of form has sent Fareham to the bottom of the South Central Division table, seven points adrift of fifth from bottom side Southall.

Fareham Town were formed in 1947 following the amalgamation of three local sides – Fareham FC, Fareham Brotherhood FC and Fareham Youth Centre FC.

The idea to create a town football club was proposed at a public meeting in 1946. The club initially joined the Portsmouth League, playing at Beaconsfield Meadow before moving to Bath Lane

In 1949 the club earned promotion to Division 3 East of the Hampshire League and, as champions, they then quickly advanced to Division 2

By 1952–53, they were runners-up in Division 2, securing promotion to Division 1. The club debuted in the FA Cup three seasons later, reaching the Fourth Qualifying Round before losing to Wycombe Wanderers.

In 1959–60, Fareham Town won Division 1 for the first time, followed by five consecutive titles starting in the 1962–63 season.

They added two more league titles in the 1970s and moved to their current home, Cams Alders. in 1975.

After finishing runners-up in 1978-79, the club joined the Southern Football League, starting in the Southern Division.

In 1982-83, they were placed in the Premier Division following a league restructure, and then spent seven seasons there.

During this period, they reached the FA Trophy semi finals, losing to eventual winners Kidderminster Harriers.

Relegated to the Southern Division in 1989, they spent nine seasons at that level, and also won the Hampshire Senior Cup for the fourth time by defeating Farnborough Town 4-1 in the final.

In 1998, the club opted to move down to the Wessex League due to financial constraints at the time.

They remained in the league's top division for the next 27 years until the 2024-25 season, when they were promoted to the Isthmian League South Central Division.

This came after they defeated Andover New Street 2-1 in the Wessex League play-off final on April 26, 2025.



WE WILL ALWAYS REMEMBER OUR 193 FALLEN HEROES

Portchester has been a place which has always had strong connections to the armed forces.

As you gaze across the harbour from the castle and shoreline the home of the Royal Navy can be clearly seen.

The threat of war was very real during the dark days of the Second World War, with bombing raids from the Luftwaffe destroying large parts of Portsmouth – an obvious target for enemy air forces with many high profile naval targets and supply lines to hit.

Portchester's war memorial in St Mary's Church at the castle includes the names of residents who were killed in their homes when German bombs fell on the village.

The records of our 193 fallen heroes show that the community not only provided personnel for the Senior Service during the two world wars.

Many fell on the battlefields of France and Belgium during the First World War and during the 1939-45 conflict there were many serving in the Army and Royal Air Force too.

After the horrors of those two conflicts few probably expected just under 40 years after the end of the Second World War that our forces would again be involved in a conflict.

This time it was the Falklands War in 1982, a conflict which effected so many families across Portchester who sat nervously at home hoping their relatives and friends were safe in the South Atlantic

Unfortunately, as the records of our fallen heroes show, two Portchester men sadly did not make it home again.

Before this evening's match against Fareham Town we once again take a moment to reflect on the ultimate sacrifices these 193 heroes made for our community and our country.

AFC Portchester is proud to permanently display these names by the entrance to the stadium and they are all listed on the following two pages.

REPORT: BACK-TO-BACK WINS AT STEP 4 A FIRST FOR ROYALS

AFC Portchester recorded their first back-toback wins in the league at Step 4 level after coming from behind to beat Hendon.

After some disappointing results, Gav Spurway's side showed their battling qualities once again to back up the three points they got against Ascot United in their previous game.

In truth Portchester should have been out of sight before the visitors took the lead against the run of play midway through the first half - the home side spurned a hatful of good chances in the opening 20 minutes of the game.

They could have gone in front in the opening minute when a cross from the right found Zack Willett at the far post but he missed the target from close range.

Willett's pace was a constant threat to the visiting defence and on 11 minutes a ball from midfield sent him racing clear on the right. He took the ball into the box and keeper Joshua Strizovic had to get down quickly to save his shot.

Willett fired off the same shot five minutes later after the defence had given the ball away to him but again Strizovic saved his low shot. On 18 minutes Lee Wort excellently brought a high ball under control and this gave him the chance to shoot but he dragged his effort wide.

In the next attack Wort had another opportunity, which this time was blocked by a defender and several follow up efforts were also blocked before Hendon could clear the ball away.

The visitors stunned the Royals when they took the lead following a break down the right. The ball was pulled back into the path of Niko Muir and he dispatched his low shot past keeper Steven Mowthorpe and into the net.

Portchester recovered though and drew level on 34 minutes. A defender missed the chance to clear a cross at the near post and the ball ran to Willett, who tapped it home from close range.

Hendon rallied again in the closing minutes of the first half and went close to re-taking the lead on two occasions.

Rohdell Gordon's free kick from 20 yards out was saved by Mowthorpe and the re-bound dropped to Muir but he blasted his shot over.

Kyron Richards then broke clear down the right and after taking the ball into the



penalty area he unleashed a shot which a defender got back in time to block for a corner.

The visiting keeper was in inspired form in the second half as he denied the home side what looked like certain goals on several occasions.

On 54 minutes Strizovic managed to push Willett's shot away and two minutes later when Alfie Stanley flicked a free kick towards goal the keeper somehow managed to adjust his body in time to make the save

Jack Lee then headed a corner over before Wort almost put the Royals in front on 68 minutes. A cross from the left found him on the right side of the box and his first time shot was flying into the top corner at the near post before Strizovic threw himself upwards to acrobatically push the ball around the post.

Both sides looked certain to score in the space of 20 seconds on 72 minutes. Hendon's Keegan Cole hit a shot from eight yards out that was going in until a defender blocked it.

The ball was then cleared long down the pitch for Stanley to chase and after winning possession he hit a shot goalwards but Strizovic again somehow managed to block the ball.

The winner came on 77 minutes in a move which started on the right. Wort played the ball across the pitch to the left and an inswinging cross was glanced towards goal by Stanley and this time Strizovic was unable to prevent the ball from bouncing into the net.
