REPORT: TEN-MAN ROYALS HIT BACK TO TAKE THREE POINTS

AFC Portchester produced a superb battling performance to come from behind to beat Metropolitan Police 2-1.

Momentum in football matches can change in a matter of minutes and the outcome of this league encounter centred on two three minute spells - the one in the first half seeing the Royals reduced to ten men and go behind, and the one at the start of the second half bringing their equaliser and what proved to be the winning goal.

The home side had their first chance on three minutes when a ball lofted forward into the right hand side of the penalty area dropped in behind the defence and Zack Willett tried to flick the ball past keeper Liam Beach but he pushed the shot away.

Four minutes later Charlie Williamson's cross from the right ran through to Alfie Stanley at the far post but the forward put his shot straight at Beach.

On 19 minutes the Royals tried to get past the visiting defence inside their penalty area a couple of times before a clearance fell to Tommy Scutt 25 yards out but he put his shot well over the target.

Five minutes later James Cowan had the chance to shoot from a free kick on the left hand edge of the box but his effort curled on to the roof of the net.

The game suddenly turned in the visitors' favour on 29 minutes. Erick Kenko Djoudie went down under Jack Lee's challenge some 40 yards from goal but despite the distance and other Portchester players in close vicinity of the ball, the referee somewhat harshly deemed this to be a straight red card offence.

Matters then went from bad to worse for the home side when they went behind two minutes later.

The visitors found space down the right and the ball was fired in low across the six yard box by Frankie Morton, missed by a number of home defenders and keeper Steven Mowthorpe and Ekow Owusu-Boakye bundled the ball over the line from close range at the far post.

The Royals tried to hit back quickly and on 33 minutes a long ball down the middle of

the pitch found its way to Lee Wort and his shot from the edge of the box had to be beaten away by Beach.

Portchester needed to make a fast, strong start to the second half and they did this by creating a number of half chances.

In the opening minute of the half Willett fired off a shot from just inside the penalty area and Beach had to beat it away from his goal.

The home side were inches away from equalising on 50 minutes when a free kick from the right was fired towards Wort at the far post.

He headed it back across goal but despite two Royals players stealing in at the far post to try and knock the ball into the net neither was able to apply the finishing touch from close range.

A minute later Portchester had another good chance when a ball into the penalty area was picked up by Stanley and his low shot had to be blocked by Beach's legs.

The Royals eventually got their equaliser on 53 minutes. Willett was brought down as he made his way into the left hand side of the box and Stanley drilled his spot kick low past Beach's dive and into the net.

Portchester's fast start to the second period culminated in them taking the lead on 55 minutes.

A free kick from the right was initially cleared by the visitors but after being worked back out to the right hand side the ball was crossed into the box by Willett and Scutt directed his glancing header towards goal and it beat Beach on its way into the far corner of the net.

The home side almost snatched a third goal just after the hour mark when a cross from the right picked out Archie Willcox around ten yards out but he wasn't quite able to direct his header towards goal.

The final third of the game passed without any real goalmouth incidents to speak of. Portchester were happy to soak up any attempts by the visitors to try and get back on level terms.

Met Police had plenty of possession in front of the home defence but they were unable to work themselves any openings against resolute defending from the whole of the Portchester team.

Radcliffe joint-boss Anthony Johnson's (pictured right) recent social media post caught the eye.

He highlighted their three goalscorers - Jordan Hulme, Rio Clegg and Mikey Afuye Johnson - and pointed out their upbringing through local amateur football to the positions where they were used to putting up the nets and paying subs.

His message to youngsters is to not turn their noses up at lower levels, but get out and play competitive men's football.

Those three are now spearheading Radcliffe's National League North campaign that has got off to a flyer.

It's interesting as a reminder to young aspiring footballers there are many ways to make a career in football. Playing – and being paid – to play part time at such a good level doesn't happen by accident. It takes hard work and dedication to achieve.

It's true there are some youngsters who may sneer at non-league. Stories of some turning down the chance to go on loan to help with their development do float around.

Perhaps it's the social media culture where it's easier to have 'professional footballer' written in the X or Instagram bio.

But for those who do play, there are more opportunities than ever to make an impact and get spotted.

In recent seasons we've written about so many stories of players getting their chance in the Football League who are not drawn just from the top of non-league, but right the way through all steps of the pyramid.

"Let's use those (Hulme, Clegg and Afuye) as an example," Johnsons told us.

"Rio Clegg has never been hurt by the system. Because he's never come through an academy, he's never been released by a Liverpool, United, Blackburn and landed at, say, an Oldham and had



to start again.

"That leaves a lot of scar tissue, it does. I see it with young players we coach now - eight, nine, ten year olds who have been told they're not good enough - and people wonder why there's a pandemic of young lads with mental health.

"We've got Rio Clegg, Mikey Afuye and a whole group of that age around the club where we can go: 'They're starving hungry'.

"Then when you've got a Jordan Hulme, who has come from the exact same playground as them, put nets up and, it sounds awful, cleared dog mess off the local park pitch, paid subs to then getting to paid to play semi-professional football, shows how far they've come.

"Yes, you've got young hungry lads coming through but you've also got lads at the top end who have been there and done it themselves. That helps keep their feet on the ground.

"We've got a group here – Matt Sargent, Danny Greenfield, Michael Afuye and Rio Clegg – who are all 23, 24, being watched by EFL clubs and they're an incredibly talented bunch.

"Then we've got the group above them who are coming into their prime. Then we've got our experienced group. It's almost three categories so we've got a really good blend."

EFL - and even Premier League - teamsheets this weekend will show there are plenty of routes to the same destination.

HALL OF FAME STAR LOOKING TO MAKE HISTORY FOR ROYALS

She has already made it into one hall of fame but Gemma Hillier could write herself into the AFC Portchester history books as well if she leads her side into the Third Round of the Adobe Women's FA Cup.

Hillier became the first female player to be inducted into Pompey's Hall of Fame in 2018, joining the likes of Portsmouth greats Jimmy Dickinson, Paul Merson, Alan Knight and Mark Hateley to be given the honour.

Hillier made 282 appearances for Portsmouth's ladies team, scoring 92 goals and she spent 17 years at the club.

She went on to play for AFC Bournemouth and captained the side when the Cherries reached the Third Round of the Women's FA Cup for the first time in their history.

Now the Royals' captain is aiming to create another piece of history in the women's game by helping to guide the Royals into the Third Round for the very first time.


"We're really proud to have reached the second round proper for the second season running, equalling our best ever achievement," said Gemma.

WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS KINGSTONIAN



EARLY YEARS IN CLUB'S HISTORY

The Kingstonian club came into being in 1919 as a result of the merger between Kingston Town FC and Old Kingstonians FC.

However, the club can trace its origins even further back and celebrated its centenary in 1985.

The reason for this is that one of its forerunners, Kingston and Surbiton YMCA FC played its first match on a ground in Bushy Park in November 1885.

In 1887 the YMCA changed its name to Saxons FC. Then in 1890 it changed to Kingston Wanderers FC and once again to Kingston-on-Thames Association Football Club (KAFC) in 1893.

In 1908 the club split in two, with Kingston Town playing at Norbiton Sports Ground and Old Kingstonians on what became known as the back pitch at Richmond Road.

The new Kingstonian set-up started life in the Athenian League, a competition that it won in both 1923-24 and 1925-26, playing home matches at a brand new ground in Richmond Road that remained its home

until 1988.

K's, accepted an invitation to join the Isthmian League as a replacement for the Civil Service FC, and they remained in that league until 1998. The K's achieved in April 1933 its then greatest

In 1929 the Kingstonians, widely known as the

The K's achieved in April 1933 its then greatest accolade by winning the FA Amateur Cup. Wins over Portland United after a replay, Leyton, South Bank, Dulwich Hamlet and Whitehall Printeries took them through to the final against Stockton, which resulted in a 1-1 draw.

For the replay Kingstonian had to travel north to Darlington, but despite going one goal behind after only four minutes of the game they came back to win 4-1.

In the following season they went on to win the Isthmian League, a feat they repeated in 1936-37 and 1997-98.

The Kingstonian teams of the early 1960s were arguably as good as those of the 1930s and many trophies were won.

After winning the Surrey Senior Cup for the ninth time in 1967, the club's successes dried up, and despite the endeavours of many managers and countless players, the team went into decline.

In 1979 relegation to Division 1 was suffered, but in 1985 the club bounced back as runnersup to Farnborough Town.

Kingstonian remained as members of the Premier Division until the end of the 1997-98 season when they were promoted to the Nationwide Conference.

The famous Richmond Road ground became increasingly dilapidated and subject to vandalism, so a decision was made to relocate and develop the site for housing - a move that also assisted the club's finances.

The last game played there was in January 1988 against Bromley.

After one and a half seasons of ground sharing at Hampton's Beveree ground, K's opened their brand new Kingsmeadow Stadium in August 1989, when Slough Town were the visitors.

After achieving a draw with Peterborough United in 1992, the club recorded a fine FA Cup win at Kingsmeadow by beating Brighton in 1994

In front of 3,495 supporters the K's held

Leyton Orient to a 0-0 draw, only to go on and lose 2-1 in the FA Cup Second Round Replay in 1998.

At the beginning of the 1997-98 season, the club appointed Geoff Chapple as manager.

In his first season, he took the club to the Isthmian League Premier Division championship. In the following season, their first in the Football Conference, the club finished a creditable eighth, but they capped it all off by winning the FA Trophy at Wembley in May 1999 with a 1-0 victory over Forest Green Rovers.

The following season, in the last FA Trophy final played under Wembley's famous Twin Towers, the K's retained their title with a 3-2 win over Kettering Town, giving Chapple his fifth FA Trophy final win in seven seasons - the other three were with Woking.

The club also reached their highest position of fifth place in the Conference.

In 2000-01 the K's made the headlines again with a tremendous run in the FA Cup. A home win against Devizes Town was the start of an incredible run that saw the K's defeat Brentford, Southport and Southend United - all away from home.

In the Fourth Round, K's were thwarted by the last kick of the game at Ashton Gate against Bristol City, who went on to win the replay at Kingsmeadow.

Unfortunately, the club's league form proved to be exactly the opposite, and they finished next to bottom and were relegated back to the Ryman League.

Following a poor start to 2004-05, Scott Steele was promoted to manager but he was unable to prevent what became an inevitable relegation to Division 1.

The 2005-06 season saw K's win some silverware following a 1-0 win over AFC Wimbledon in the Surrey Senior Cup final.

The club was then jointly bought by Mark Anderson and Malcolm Winwright – the board would be completed by the presence of John Fenwick as chairman from May 2011 to June 2014, and then co-chairman with Anderson and Winwright until January 2018, when he became sole chairman again.

Mid-way through the 2006-07 season Alan Dowson became manager and he immediately transformed the club, and achieved a semblance of stability.

The 2008-09 season was successful from start to finish. A run to the Third Qualifying Round of the FA Cup was highlighted by a 4-0 home win over Conference South side Braintree Town.

But it was in the Ryman League Division 1

South that the biggest success came, as Kingstonian won the division by seven points ahead of Cray Wanderers.

After an absence of four years, the club almost passed straight up through the Ryman Premier Division, recovering from a difficult start to reach the play-offs. It was Boreham Wood, however, who won the final.

The 2015-16 campaign saw the K's lift their first cup in ten years, winning the Isthmian League Cup with a 5-0 victory over Faversham Town.

The 2016-17 season proved to be a difficult campaign, as the club flirted dangerously with relegation thanks to a dreadful run following Christmas. Tommy Williams was replaced as manager by former Billericay Town man Craig Edwards and he turned the club around immediately.

K's moved up to 16th after a five match unbeaten run to end the season. K's left the Kingsmeadow Stadium at the end of the season and moved to Fetcham Grove with Leatherhead FC.

At the beginning of the 2018-19 season, Kingstonian moved back to the Royal Borough of Kingston-upon-Thames and started a ground share with Corinthian Casuals at King George's Field

A difficult season saw K's have three managers, as Leigh Dynan was replaced by Dean Brennan and then by stand-in manager Kim Harris.

K's moved from second place in the table on New Year's Day to escaping relegation by a single place after a horror run of results.

The 2019-20 season may have been curtailed by the COVID-19 pandemic, but new manager Hayden Bird's arrival gave the club an enormous boost.

Kingstonian reached the First Round of the FA Cup for the first time since 2000-01, and defeated Macclesfield Town 4-0 at Moss Rose, before bowing out in the Second Round at home to AFC Fylde.

During the summer of 2022 the club moved temporary home once again, this time to Imperial Fields at Tooting and Mitcham United.

The 2023-24 campaign started poorly and got worse - relegation became inevitable and the club finished bottom of the league.

In preparation for Kingstonian's first season in the South Central Division of the Isthmian League, former Walton and Hersham chief Scott Harris was appointed as manager.

His almost totally new squad had an exciting season, reaching the play-off semi final and losing a penalty shoot-out to eventual winners Uxbridge.

LIAM ALLEN - GOALKEEPER

Liam was part of Walton and Hersham's rise up the pyramid system as the Swans went quickly from the Combined Counties League to just missing out on the Southern League Premier South play-offs. He started out in Chelsea's youth system before moving to Woking and then on to Badshot Lea and Molesey. Joined Kingstonian in June 2024.

CHARLIE BLAND - MIDFIELDER

A hugely influential member of Kingstonian's quadruple-winning under-18s squad, Charlie initially signed first team forms in January.

JOEL BROWN - MIDFIELDER

Signed for Kingstonian in the summer from Dorking Wanderers, having spent the majority of last season with Moneyfields. Joel (pictured right) spent several seasons in the Wanderers' under-19s squad, and made a couple of appearances for the first team, scoring once.

EWAN CARLIN - GOALKEEPER

Young goalkeeper who has impressed with the successful under-18s team, and signed first team forms in July 2024.

SONNY COOPER - STRIKER

A member of the highly successful quadruplewinning under-18s squad in the 2024-25 season, Sonny signed first team forms in August.

HENRY CURTIS - DEFENDER


Henry joined the K's in October, having spent the beginning of the season with Burgess Hill Town and Poole Town. Started his career playing in football academies, before joining Ipswich Town in January and he spent some time on loan with Hendon.

BRYAN EDWARDS - DEFENDER

Instrumental in Kingstonian's under-18s team last season which won four trophies. Bryan is a tall and athletic central defender.



YOAN EDOUKOU - MIDFIELDER
Signed for Kingstonian in September after a



spell in Kosovo, where he played for the likes of FC Prishtina, FC Ballkani, FC Malisheva and KF Istogu. Before his time in the Balkans, he played for Tower Hamlets in the Essex Senior League.

DARNELL GOATHER-BRAITHWAITE - STRIKER

Re-joined Kingstonian in September from Berkhamsted, whom he joined from Uxbridge in the summer. He began his career in the youth ranks at Queens Park Rangers and is now in his third spell with the K's, having also played for Carshalton Athletic, Potters Bar Town, Bracknell Town, Wingate and Finchley and Westfield.

JOSH HAMILTON OLISE - MIDFIELDER

Joined Kingstonian in October having spent the 2024-25 season with AFC Bournemouth. Prior to that he spent a couple of seasons in the Reading academy.

JAMIE HILTON - DEFENDER

Joined Kingstonian in the summer after impressing the then management team of Dean Thomas and Mitchal Gough while he played for

Binfield. A member of the Woking youth system, he also spent time on loan with Guildford City in 2024.

TOM JACKSON - MIDFIELDER

Joined the K's in October from Sevenoaks Town. He started the season with Cray Wanderers and in 2024-25 he played for Carshalton Athletic and Marlow. Tom came through the ranks of AFC Wimbledon and has also played for Bracknell Town, Guernsey, Hanwell Town, Corinthian-Casuals and Hendon.

IMRAN KAYANI - STRIKER

Re-joined Kingstonian in October from Whitehawk, having previously played for the Ks on a successful loan from Slough Town in February to March 2023. A full Pakistani international, Imran has also seen action for the likes of Westfield and Cray Wanderers, plus a couple of appearances in the National League for Dover Athletic.

DENNIS KELMENDI - MIDFIELDER

Signed for Kingstonian in the summer having left Bromley. A former Peterborough United youth player, he moved to Hayes Lane in the 2024-25 season and spent three months on loan at Harrow Borough.

HEESU LEE - STRIKER

A member of Kingstonian's undet-18s squad, Heesu was top scorer for the team in 2024-25, scoring 28 goals in his 48 appearances. Heesu



originally signed first team forms in February.

ADAM MORI FY - DEFENDER

A full back/winger who joined Kingstonian in October, Adam is also a member of Boreham Wood's under-19s. In the 2024-25 season he spent some time with both Leverstock Green and Leatherhead.

JACOB MUNTING - MIDFIELDER

A former Millwall academy product, Jacob joined Kingstonian in July 2024 from Walton and Hersham. He has also spent some time with Walton Casuals, Cray Wanderers and Beaconsfield Town.

SEAN O'BRIEN - MIDFIELDER

An exciting attacking midfielder, Sean signed for Kingstonian in the summer. He started his career with Millwall, moved to Forest Green Rovers in 2022 and has seen action for Gloucester City, Hayes and Yeading United and Carshalton Athletic.

JOE PRATLEY-JONES - DEFENDER

Joined Kingstonian in May 2024 after a hugely successful time with Walton and Hersham, having signed for them in 2020 and being an integral part in the Swans' rise up the pyramid system. He has also played for Egham Town and Molesey.

OLLIE RAWLINS - STRIKER

Joined the Ks in October from East Grinstead Town. A product of AFC Wimbledon's academy, Ollie spent a couple of seasons with Dorking Wanderers as well as having spells with Steyning Town and Cray Wanderers.

LORENZO STRACHAN - STRIKER

Joined Kingstonian in October after leaving Queens Park Rangers. Lorenzo (pictured left) joined the blue hoops as a six year old.

REPORT: ROYALS HAVE TO TAKE A POINT IN EIGHT GOAL THRILLER

AFC Portchester and Westfield shared an eightgoal thriller in their league meeting at Woking Park.

The Royals took the lead three times and led 4-2 with around 18 minutes to go but Westfield were able to peg the visitors back each time they got an advantage on the scoreboard and eventually battled back to nick a point.

The visitors made the perfect start to the game when they took the lead on three minutes. Charlie Williamson crossed the ball in from the right and Lee Wort was there to guide his header into the net.

Portchester came so close to doubling their advantage on nine minutes when Wort picked up the ball in the left hand side of the box but his low shot was blocked by keeper Lewis Gallifent. The re-bound ran to Alfie Stanley but his shot was also blocked by Gallifent.

Westfield made it 1-1 on 16 minutes thanks to a quickly taken free kick on the halfway line. A good turn in midfield saw the ball played through to Didi Ndombe, who then saw his shot well saved by Steven Mowthorpe but Michael O'Connor lifted the re-bound over the keeper and into the net.

The home side almost took the lead on 22 minutes when Finn Evans was played in behind the defence but after racing into the penalty area he dragged his shot wide.

Portchester were back in front on 38 minutes thanks to a corner from the right. Jack Lee timed his run perfectly to meet the ball and he headed home from six yards out.

However, the home side came back at the visitors immediately and a minute later O'Connor had the chance to shoot from 15 yards out and Mowthorpe had to get down quickly to his left to push the ball around the post.

On 41 minutes another quick break set up the chance for Conor Lee to shoot but Mowthorpe was able to push his shot away and then smother the re-bound.

Westfield did then make it 2-2 a minute before half time when a defender had to try and cut out a cross from the right with two home players

waiting for the ball behind him but he diverted the ball into his own net.

At the start of the second half the home side looked to push on to go in front and take control of the game but the Royals had other ideas.

They re-took the lead for the third time on 55 minutes in a move which started with a ball in from the left. The home defence initially managed to block it but the ball ran to Josh Clack, whose shot was partially blocked by Gallifent but it rolled on and over the line.

The Royals were in dreamland when they netted their fourth goal six minutes later. They won possession of the ball in midfield before a pass was slipped through the home defence to

set Wort clear. He took the ball into the box before firing his shot low past Gallifent and into the net.

Portchester were repelling the attempts by Westfield to find a way back into the match but you could sense their attacks would eventually find a way through and that proved to be the case on 72 minutes.



A long throw in was launched into the penalty area from the right and after a bit of a scramble the ball found its way to Evans who turned and fired his shot past Mowthorpe.

The home side then threw the proverbial kitchen sink at the Royals to try and find an equaliser and the visiting defence held firm until 90 minutes ticked on to the clock.

Westfield had the ball wide on the left and after managing to get past his marker the attacking player fired a cross into the near post and it flew into the net off a Portchester defender.

Over ten minutes of injury time followed but the only incident of note was a red card shown to a home player for an off the ball incident.


