TODAY'S VISITORS



The club was formed in 1884, and experienced many ups & downs during the early years, the storey below takes you from the 1970's to one of its most successful periods which arguably has been the last 5/6 years.

After a brief flirtation with the Athenian League in the mid seventies, the club returned to the Kent League, winning the Kent Senior Trophy in 1977. The following season they repeated this success and were also crowned Kent League champions, completing a famous "double".

The Lilywhites won the Kent League again in 1990, but league form dipped in the 92/93 season and was to stay that way for several seasons. The club managed to to reach the final of the Kent League Challenge Cup in 2000, but things were in rapid decline.

Matters reached crisis point in 2003, when the KCFA suspended the club for nonpayment of fines, with the club's operators blaming just about everyone for the mess except themselves.

In the following months, the once proud Salters Lane ground was systematically wrecked by vandals. Meanwhile, club trustees led by businessman Ray Leader fought a desperate battle to heal a widening rift with the previous regime over the ownership of the club and ground.



WHYTELEAFE MATCH REPORT

Things couldn't have begun any better for the home side who went ahead early on when Ricardo Thompson diverted a Rob Hutchings' cross past his own keeper.

Whyteleafe, one of the league's best teams on the road last season, almost replied immediately. Emmanuel Mensah, who shone all night, linked up with Antonio Walker-Barth but City captain Connor Cody managed to block the No.10's effort before fellow defender Corey Heath did the same with Renedi Masampu's strike moments later.

In an intense first five minutes Lloyd Rowlatt forced Tyler McCarthy in the visitors' goal into a smart save and then Man of the Match Scott Jones tested McCarthy with a shot on the turn. The Chi back four had a number of set pieces to deal with in the early exchanges and this would prove to be an issue as the game progressed.

Matt Axell, who bagged both goals at Ramsgate, stung McCarthy's gloves before Ronald Sobowale equalised with a thunderous free-kick in the 22nd minute.

Jones and Gicu Iordache combined effectively in Chi's next attack but the Romanian's cross was just too long for Callum Overton.

Next an Axell delivery found Heath at the back post who headed just off target. It was end to end stuff and Hutchings did well to turn Martin Sontan's cross out for a corner before keeper Steve Mowthorpe was quick off his line to clear danger.

The hosts regained the lead five minutes before half time as Jones got a glancing header on a ball whipped in by Cody and might have gone into the break 3-1 up when a good chance fell to Overton.

Jamie Horncastle hobbled off after the restart having rolled an ankle. Kaleem Haitham came on and was involved in the action straight away linking up with Iordache who pulled a super parry out of McCarthy.

Whyteleafe were level once more in the 56th minute when Sobowale stabbed the ball in from close range following a Jordan Clarke free kick.

And he should have grabbed his hat-trick on the hour mark from the penalty spot but Mowthorpe made a fine save diving down to his right.

The home side had a storm to weather. Clarke found himself on the ball a lot as Chi conceded a catalogue of free kicks; a turn of blistering pace presented Walker-Barth with an opportunity; and Matt O'Donoghue went close in a spell that the Leafe dominated.

Iordache then almost caught McCarthy out with a clever set piece that pinged off the post before Jones headed a delivery from Rowlatt inches wide.

Clarke was instrumental in the winner when it came with a minute to go, snaking past three City players in the box before putting in a low cross that nicked in off Ben Pashley.

In time added on Overton almost grabbed Chi a precious and deserved point with a fierce shot McCarthy somehow got behind.


After the match assistant manager Graeme Gee said, "It was a learning curve for our boys tonight. Every one of them gave their all."

BURGESS HILL MATCH REPORT

It was end to end stuff in the opening 15 minutes. Ryan Palmer kept City full back Rob Hutchings busy down the left flank with the home side feeding balls regularly into the channels.

A cross from the Hillians No.7 drifted out for a goal kick in the third minute before Hutchings forced a first corner for the visitors a minute later. Matt Axell's fine delivery was headed away to safety from an incoming Corey Heath.

Ben Pashley then did well to intercept a pass intended for Warren Mfula and Steve Mowthorpe got a strong glove on the resulting corner.

The hosts keeper Billy Collings was also called into action just getting to the ball ahead of Scott Jones before Gicu Iordache and Ryan Davidson linked up nicely to set up Jones but the Chiforward had strayed offside.

Chichester had to deal with three corners in as many minutes – the first, a low one by Palmer, was cleared easily enough but Pashley had to turn the second one over his own cross bar and Mowthorpe punched the third away.

A mix up between Collings and Drew Matthews from a short goal kick almost got Hill in trouble at the back before Aaron Smith-Joseph blasted over after he eluded City captain Connor Cody.

The visitors took the lead in the 19 th minute through Lloyd Rowlatt. Axell was instrumental in the move and an excellent cross from Kaleem Haitham was knocked back into the box at the far post by Jones to Rowlatt who beat Collings with a header at close range.

Smith-Joseph was given a long talking to by the referee for a foul on Pashley before a precision pass from Haitham to Jones just got away from the City striker.

Jones then had a shot blocked and Collings found himself back-peddling to claw away Iordache's cross-cum-shot.

And then it looked like Jones, who put in a real shift, might double the visitors' lead but his effort crept along the line and the wrong side of the post.

Some super skill from the tenacious Iordache led to another Jones attempt that Collings, the busier of the two keepers, saved before a timely tackle by Davidson broke up a swift counter-attack.

Pressure from Jones just before the break then forced Tolupe Jonah into a mistake and the Chi No.9 had the simple task of walking the ball into the back of the net for his fourth goal in three games.

A couple of crazy minutes in the second half saw two red cards and a penalty as Burgess Hill pulled one back.

Before this though there was a chance for Heath after Cody threaded an intelligent pass into his path but he got his feet all wrong and then Max Miller was shown a yellow for a tackle from behind.

Next Jones took a cross on his chest and got a shot off on the turn that fizzed over the bar.

Chichester were then reduced to ten in the 55 th minute as Heath got his marching orders for denying the hosts a goal scoring opportunity after he pulled Mfula down when he attempted to get to the rebound from Mowthorpe's impressive stop.

Mfula picked himself up and dispatched his spot kick with some aplomb. There was a change of fortune almost immediately for the hosts when they too found themselves a man down after Miller was given a second yellow for simulation.

Iordache, Axell and Haitham then combined effectively but the latter couldn't quite pick out Jones before Axell gave Collings something to think about with a long-range drive that wasn't far off target.

Chichester's back line dug in. Matthews headed a Smith-Joseph corner wide and then Mfula smartly turned his defender but Axell was there to cover. Cody made another fine tackle on Palmer who had pounced on a ricochet before Mowthorpe raced out to collect a knock on.

CCFC - What brought you both to the club?

JH - I was playing at Pagham last season, but I still kept in touch with Gee (Chi Assistant Manager) I'd been at the club a couple of year before, so I knew the managers and coaches and It felt right to come back. Chi had gone up a level and that appealed to me, I like the challenge and I'm enjoying it.

CO - I played for a lot of clubs and you didn't necessarily get in the teams when you deserved to, but here I like the honesty of the managers who give you good feedback and also they really know their football, they know what they're talking about and that's important to me.

At other teams there wasn't the togetherness, there would be small groups doing their own things, but at Chi we have a real solid unit, we arrive together, we train and play together, and we leave together, which I think is important when it comes to the games, and maybe that can be the edge over some teams we play.

JH - I have played for a few clubs, but really for me it's about enjoyment at this level, obviously I'm here to win and I want to win things, but at this level you've got to make sure you're enjoying it or else it's pointless, and the most I enjoyed playing was a couple of years ago under Miles and Gee.

It's a higher level and I want to challenge myself, I don't want the years to roll by and have just played at a lower level, I want to play as high as I can for as long as I can.

- CCFC What about goal targets for the season? Callum you've had a good pre-season.
- CO Yeah I scored 8 in pre-season and 3 in the FA Cup so far, but I'm looking for more than 30 goals, that would be a good season for me.
- CCFC Jamie? probably less than that for you?
- **JH** Yeah , I'd be happy with 5 for the season, that would be good. Dabba's always saying I've got to make the penalty spot for the cutbacks.

CCFC - That would be a good total as you are also a covering midfielder.

JH - This year I'm playing box to box, so in attack I can be on the edge of the box, and also If I need to I can sit in. So with my fitness being good, I can get up and down. It's just a shame I've got a niggle at the moment.

CCFC - You are both fitness instructors, does that give you a head start in pre-season?

JH - Yeah It probably does help and you think you are as fit as a fiddle, but you're really not match fit. I teach weights, circuits, spin classes, but It's not football based.

CO - We are lucky that we do fitness for a living, and that probably gives us a better base than someone who doesn't, but most player will have their own routines.

TONIGHT'S VISITORS



The present Hastings United Football Club has existed continuously since 1901 having undergone three changes of name. One consequence of those name changes has been that the club's history has become inclined to be interwoven with that of other clubs with similar names and only recently has its history been disentangled which is why it may now read somewhat differently to previous versions.

The origins of the club begin with the founding of old town side Rock-A-Nore in 1894; however, five years later they became defunct but in 1901 a new club started-up using the same name. They won the East Sussex League Championship in 1907/08 and were to be amongst the foremost local sides regularly winning trophies until World War One called a halt to proceedings.

In a separate development, the Faversham Town Independent Supporters Club had been formed, and quickly gained a membership of over 300 paid up members in the market town. This was despite the fact the club had no team, no manager, and a ground that had been totally wrecked by vandals and now resembled a bomb site.

Resuming in 1919, the club won five local trophies plus the Sussex Junior Cup, the latter success being crucial as it not only secured them an invitation to become a founder members of the Sussex League when it started in 1920 but led to the Council developing a community ground.

They purchased Pilot Field Meadow where the first pitch was prepared on the upper area, later "The Firs", with Rock-A-Nore having first call upon it. Their opening match there was a County League fixture against Chichester on September 11th, 1920 when a crowd of over one thousand saw them lose by the odd goal of three.

Having previously rejected a proposal to add Hastings the club name, in April, 1921 it was agreed to change the name to Hastings and St. Leonards Football Club. As Hastings & St. Leonards, the club attracted the area's better players and immediately achieved a second place finish in the County League, a feat they repeated in 1926.

During this period the Council invested substantial amounts in developing the lower pitch turning it into a stadium, complete with the concrete grandstand that still graces the ground.

After rejecting ideas of turning professional but having failed to gain admission to the Athenian or Isthmian Leagues, the club joined Eastbourne in the Southern Amateur League who accepted them but only in Division Two which they won at the first attempt in season 1927/28.

Promoted, the club made a sensational entry to the top division playing their opening league game at Wembley Stadium, the home for one season of Ealing Association, where they lost 0-1.

After an excellent season which ended with a play-off semi-final defeat, on penalties, away to Dorking Wanderers, Darren Hare resigned. His replacement is Adam Hinshelwood who once again had to rebuild the side as a number of players moved on. Adam resigned during September to take on the managers role at Worthing FC and was replaced by his assistant Chris Agutter.

Last season Hastings again reached the play-offs, losing 3-2 at home to Ashford United after extra time.
