BRIDON ROPES MATCH REPORT

Scott Jones, got Chi off to a perfect start in the third minute with a firm header from the first corner of the game.

The visitors, who were forced to make changes to the side that lost to Whyteleafe mid-week, suffered another injury blow when defender Ben Pashley limped off. Youngster Theo Bennetts came on in midfield and captain Connor Cody dropped back to partner debutant Ryan Davidson.

Jack Kirby then earnt the hosts a corner that came to nothing and James Murphy had an effort blocked.

A slide rule pass from Man of the Match Lloyd Rowlatt picked out Kaleem Haitham but he couldn't get a shot off.

Next Rob Hutchings pinged in a cross that was just too close to keeper Yves Bampelenga before Gicu Iordache found Callum Overton who fed the ball to Rowlatt only for his attempt to deflect off a Ropes player.

Iordache doubled Chi's lead on 14 minutes with a super first touch and strike.

Overton then cut inside and Jones flicked the ball into the path of Rowlatt but Bampelenga managed to get behind his fierce shot.

Three minutes later Jones went close with another header after a precision delivery from Corey Heath as City started to dominate.

Chichester had the ball in the back of the net again when Heath picked out Rowlatt this time who guided a header past Bampelenga but he was marginally offside.

The visitors were then awarded a rather harsh penalty but Bampelenga saved Overrton's attempt.

A Jones header whistled over the woodwork before the Chi No.9 bagged his second of the game, and his third of the week, on the half hour mark.

Overton was inches wide with a glancing header and was involved in the fourth goal when he played the ball back to Haitham who tucked it away with a neat finish.

Steve Mowthorpe came off his line smartly to deny Ropes skipper Nathan Simpson and saved well from the same player in the last action of the half.

Simpson was involved in the home side's first attack after the break, chesting the ball down for sub Gravlyn Kitondo after a bit of hesitation between Cody and Davidson, but Kitondo's shot skewed off-target.

Overton was then fouled on the edge of the box following a run down the right. Iordache whipped his free-kick in and Jones almost caught out Bampelenga with a cheeky back heel.

Jones then had a shot blocked after a clever piece of play between Haitham and Overton before Iordache smashed the ball past a despairing keeper to make it 5-0.

It looked like Chi might run riot and Jones might get his hat-trick on sixty minutes but he lifted his lob over the on-rushing Bampelenga and the bar.

A needlessly conceded free-kick in the 61st minute allowed the home side to pull one back with Simpson firing in from close range.

Kirby could have capitalised on another mistake as the visitors took their foot off the gas but Mowthorpe saved well.

Bennetts, who impressed throughout, set up an opportunity for Haitham and then Overton ran on to a lovely pass from Iordache and finished calmly with fifteen to go.

A slip up at the back gifted substitute Liam Donaldson the Ropes' second goal.

Jones almost got in again after good work from Rowlatt before Haitham finished things off in time added on latching on to a long kick from Mowthorpe.

Manager Miles Rutherford said, "It was good to win. The FA Cup is very big for the team and the club."

This third set of FA Cup matches this season involves 232 clubs, 160 of which have come through the Extra Preliminary and Preliminary Rounds, to join 72 teams from Step Three exempted until this 1st Qualifying Round.

Amongst their number are 23 clubs who've never ventured this far in the competition before. Sutton Athletic and AFC Varndeanians are both competing in their debut campaigns, but several other clubs have had to wait some time to get this far.

Bromsgrove Sporting are in their 6th campaign having only ever reached the Preliminary Round in each of their five previous attempts. They host Stourbridge, a familiar foe in the FA Cup for Bromsgrove's predecessor, Bromsgrove Rovers, with the two sides having five victories each in their 11 FA Cup encounters.

Heather St Johns won through their Preliminary Round tie live on BBC on-line to reach this 1st Qualifying Round for the first time ever in their 7th campaign. They have a tough away trip to higher league opposition in the shape of Loughborough Dynamo.

Bedfont Sports are competing in the FA Cup for the 9th time. They travel to higher league side Cray Wanderers for their first ever 1st Qualifying Round match.

Two clubs are participating in the FA Cup for the 10th time but have only made this far for the first time this season. Rothwell Corinthians had only three FA Cup wins under their belt before this season and victory over higher league side Royston Town would mean they had doubled their win tally this season.

The club which has had to wait the longest to appear in the 1st Qualifying Round is Shepton Mallet, who are participating in the FA Cup for the 16th time this season. An avenging win over fellow Western League side Tavistock would take the Mallets as far as the original Shepton Mallet Town went in the competition.

Eight other clubs in this year's 1st Qualifying Round have never been further than this round before. At the top of this list is London Colney who are making their 9th appearance in this Round. They face a tough trip to higher league side Wingate and Finchley, where defeat would mean they'd have the joint 4th highest number of 1st Qualifying Round exits of all clubs never to have gone further in the competition.

There are seven clubs who currently ply their trade in Step Six of the non-league pyramid who have made it this far. Kirby Muxloe, Sutton Athletic and Hythe and Dibden all have home ties, but four clubs have tough away trips to Step 4 opposition.

Sutton Common Rovers have already doubled their number of FA Cup wins this year and host Beaconsfield Town on Friday night with a hope to adding to that tally.

Lichfield City travel to Halesowen Town, AFC Varndeanians go to Tooting and Mitcham United, and Arundel visit Ramsgate. All of those Step Six clubs have never ventured too far in the FA Cup in the past, but March Town United, who travel to Grays Athletic, actually appeared in the 1st Round 'Proper' 41 years ago.

On the flip side there are three clubs who've never exited the FA Cup as early as the 1st Qualifying Round before putting that record to the test this season. City of Liverpool are only in their 3rd campaign and they travel to Warrington Town to try to maintain that record. Salisbury are in their 4th campaign and they travel to Thatcham Town in the BBC On-line game portecting their unbeaten record at this stage of the competition.

Hayes and Yeading United have participated in the FA Cup more often than the Merseyside club, a dozen times in fact, but even their constituent clubs hadn't exited this early in the competition for 16 years. They travel to lower league Haywards Heath Town in the hope of keeping that run going.

Returning to the 1st Qualifying Round after an absence of 18 years is Chichester City who are looking to set a best FA Cup run since merging with Portfield in 2000 by beating their fellow Step Four opponents Chalfont St Peter.

A couple of clubs have had to wait considerable longer to re-appear at this stage of the FA Cup. Portland United last appeared in the 1st Qualifying Round 49 years ago, although they are only in their 7th campaign since then. They travel to 1st Qualifying Round debutants Longlevens in the hop of posting their best run for 52 years.

You have to go back 60 years for the last appearance of Whitton United at this stage of the FA Cup, although they've only had 11 campaigns since then. They have a tough trip to higher league side Soham Town Rangers to try to go even further.

Only eighteen of the 116 ties in the 1st Qualifying Round pit teams together who will meet each other twice in league fixtures this season. This will guarantee two Step Five clubs are in the 2nd Qualifying Round.

North West Counties League Premier Division sides Charnock Richard and Irlam are drawn together. As are Tavistock and Shepton Mallet from the Premier Division of The Western League.

That all-Western League tie is one of another group of 18 ties wehere clubs have faced each other in the competition before. Most of these ties have just one past meeting between the two teams but a couple have had a few more.

Stalybridge Celtic and Marine have contested eight FA Cup matches, have played out three draws and have knocked each other out three times each. The discrepancy in numbers is because one of those ties was won by Stalybridge Celtic on penalties after an eight goal thriller.

The two clubs also are the only ones in this year's 1st Qualifying Round to have met each other in the 'Proper' Rounds of the competition, and one of those was a two legged affair in the 1945-46 season.

The most common match-up in this round features two clubs who've met 11 times but not for 73 years, have never met whilst both clubs were playing in their current name, and one of the sides met a different club who used to have the same name their opponents this year now have. Confused?

Hastings United and Worthing go head to head for the 12th time in FA Cup history, but whilst Worthing have always played under that name, Hastings United have had a few different names.

The last time the two clubs met was in the 1946-47 season when Worthing won a second replay against Hastings and St Leonards.

However, Hastings United have a six to two win ratio over Worthing in the FA Cup, with their first meeting coming as far back as the 1905-06 season when St Leonards won 2-0 at Worthing. Whilst Hastings United were called Hastings Town, Worthing won a replay against the original Hastings United. They also twice lost heavily to Hastings and St Leonards United!

Whilst St Neots Town only a two win to three deficit against this year's opponent's Biggleswade Town in past FA Cup meetings, they will be concerned that their record 9-1 defeat in the competition came at the hands of the same team.

Northwich Victoria have had to wait 81 years to avenge defeat to Lancaster City in the FA Cup. The Vics are one of three sides in this 1st Qualifying Round who have actually appeared in the last eight of the competition in the past. Glossop North End and Sheffield complete the trio.

Finally, Lowestoft Town versus Leighton Town and Haringey Borough versus Herne Bay are the only two ties in this year's 1st Qualifying Round that pits two teams against each other with the same initials.

FAVERSHAM TOWN MATCH REPORT By Ian Worden

Miles Rutherford & Co were able to name an unchanged starting eleven for the first time this season. Jimmy Wild, back at the club for another spell, joined Rory Biggs and Denis Gurau, a product of the youth set-up, on the bench.

A couple of opportunities came and went for the Oaklands Park outfit early on. Lloyd Rowlatt had two stabs at getting to a Jones' knock-down but the ball wouldn't sit up for him and the visitors' keeper Luke Watkins managed to deal with the danger.

Watkins then had to face a Matt Axell set-piece but the midfielder's effort was a bit too central and Watkins gathered easily enough.

Chi fell behind in the 8th minute when a burst of pace from Anthony Adesite got him past Ryan Davidson down the left. The No10 played in a precision cross to striker Max Morgan who gave Steve Mowthorpe no chance.

Adesite won Faversham, a team also nicknamed the Lillywhites, a freekick moments later that didn't trouble Mowthorpe.

Chi weren't clicking. A neat exchange between Morgan and Donvieve Jones almost led to another chance but Mowthorpe and Rob Hutchings managed to tidy things up.

Rowlatt then sent lordache away down the wing only for the Romanian to shoot wide before a powerful header from Faversham's Jones went narrowly the wrong side of the upright.

A mistake from Corey Heath gifted Michael Freiter an opportunity but Man of the Match Mowthorpe pulled off a fine stop. And the Chichester keeper was called into action again four minutes before the break with an excellent double save to deny first Adesite and then Morgan. There was still time for chances at either end. A clever flick from lordache almost got Jones in before Mitchell Chapman nutmegged Axell in the Chi penalty box.

Hutchings made a timely tackle and launched a counter-attack where Kaleem Haitham jinked through a couple of challenges but couldn't pick out a teammate with his cut-back.

A minute later Haitham found a marauding Connor Cody only for his attempt to curl just round the post. And in the last move of the half nice play between Adesite and Steve Mills set up another opportunity for Faversham that was smuggled away by home side defenders.

Wild came on for Heath at the interval to partner Jones up top and it was Chichester's leading goal scorer who was key in the equaliser two minutes after the restart when a bit of persistence and a smart flick by him led to a super cross from Davidson to Iordache who lashed the ball into the back of the net.

The tricky winger had another chance in the next attack with a cheeky attempt that might have caught Watkins out and crept in at the far post.

Next Wild had a shot on the turn blocked and in on 56 minutes a Rowlatt free kick deflected off the wall for the corner from which Chi scored what would prove to be the winner.

Axell delivered the ball and Davidson nodded it back into the six yard box to the in- form Jones who headed in his fourth goal in a week.

Chi pressed and it might have been 3-1 on the hour mark but Watkins somehow palmed away Cody's firm header from another Axell corner. Watkins punched the ensuing corner away and blocked Axell's follow up.

Faversham spurned a real chance to equalise when Morgan couldn't find the target after a measured cross from the right.

Morgan then linked up with Makhosini Khanye and Chapman only for Ben Pashley to clear the final downwards header.

Things quietened down for a bit as Chi, conscious maybe of the last home fixture against Whyteleafe, looked to take the sting out of the game.

Cody made a fine tackle to break up Khanye's determined run and Mowthorpe was on hand to deny Adesite with seven minutes to go. And the City shot-stopper came off his line in commanding fashion to claim Khanye's set-piece in the three minutes of time added on

It might not have been pretty at all times, and the hosts certainly struggled to get going in the first 45, but an important three points nevertheless.


