WELCOME WHITSTABLE TOWN

The first recorded football match took place in the town during October 1885 when, under the name "Whitstable United", a team played Whitstable College. Earliest use of the name "Whitstable Town" can be traced to the following season (1886-87) when matches were played were played on a Friday at "Mr. Saddleton's field" – an area of ground near the railway station.

The use of the club's current Belmont ground began in January 1888 with a friendly game against Herne Bay. There was a change in name briefly to "Whitstable Swifts" in 1893 but reverted to "Whitstable Town" just two years later.

Whitstable Town played their first competitive game in 1897 – a Kent Junior Cup match that resulted in a 7-1 defeat by Dover Star FC. Shortly after this, the club joined the "East Kent League" and later played in both the "New Brompton" and "Faversham & District" Leagues.

The club folded in 1904 only to be reformed in 1908. In 1908-09 Whitstable Town joined the Kent League Division 2 and achieved a respectable fourth place in their first season. Two teams were also entered in the Thanet League and they were both successful in lifting both the first and second division titles.

The first FA Cup campaign came in 1910. A 3-2 victory over Folkestone preceded a defeat by Dartford in front of a crowd of estimated at 2,150. Following the First World War, Town re-joined the Kent League and remained in the competition until the outbreak of World War II.

The club won the Division 2 title in 1927-28 and 1933-34. However, the key success came in 1928-29 when the team lifted the Kent Amateur Cup (now superseded by the Kent Senior Trophy).

After one season in the New Brompton League following the Second World War, Whitstable returned to Kent League in 1947-48 (also playing in the K Division of the New Brompton League). Success came to the club as they won the Division 2 Gradually, former Kent League clubs began to title in the 1949-50 season and gained promotion to the First Division until the League disbanded in 1959 leagues over the years.

These were sometimes considered the glory years as Whitstable temporarily became a professional club but the problems of competing with much wealthier clubs proved difficult and put considerable pressure on the club's finances.

The loss of the Kent League came as a hammer blow. Wealthier clubs moved onward and upward to the more prestigious Southern League leaving behind a small band of teams fighting for survival.

Town joined the Aetolian League briefly. Gone were the days of the money-spinning East Kent derby games against the likes of Folkestone, Dover, Sittingbourne and Margate. Matches against far off London-based sides were no substitute and, inevitably, the 1960's became a period of financial problems and decay.

The end of the 1959-60 season saw Whitstable bottom of the Aetolian League and a decision was taken to drop into the Kent Amateur League for a short period - an all-time low for a senior side with such a rich history - We were champions in 1960-61 and were as runners up in the Kent Amateur Cup. At the end of the 1961-62 season a decision was taken to enter the Seanglian League for the following season but this was a disaster as Whitstable mixed with the second string of a number of larger local clubs.

The club then had one season back in the Aetolian League before joining the Greater London League. One piece of success was that the Town finished runners up in the Greater London League Group B Cup in 1965-66 losing the final 3-1 against Crittall Athletic in the final staged at Cray Wanderers FC.

The Kent League was reformed in 1967 and Town re-joined immediately. However, this was not the Kent League of the "heady" 1930s and 1950s. Populated by a large number of reserve sides from Southern League clubs, there was little to appeal to supporters... but it was a start.

Others had encountered financial problems in the Southern League. At last, the League Management Committee was in a position to remove reserve sides from the competition and impose strict conditions governing grounds and facilities.

East Kent derby matches became a reality once more – against Ramsgate, Canterbury City, Folkestone, Deal, Faversham Town, Chatham and, of course, our oldest and nearest rivals, Herne Bay. The club responded – building a club house and attempting to restore the Belmont to its former glory on limited funds. The "Town" celebrated its centenary in 1985-86 in a healthier state and the occasion was marked by games against Charlton Athletic and Crystal Palace.

Both matches attracted large crowds to the Belmont. management team. There were many developments that followed the appointment of Joe Brownett as chairman in the late The club also laund 1980's and sponsorship by D&J Tyres of Herne Bay. club crest ahead of Since then, dressing rooms have been refurbished, continues to grow a the club house re-fitted, floodlights erected, a new snack bar created, committee rooms extended, the pitch levelled and a drainage system installed.

Success on the pitch had been elusive since the re-formation of the Kent League. Despite a regular "top 10" position, the best league finishes had been two "third place" spots. Cup competitions yielded greater success but there has been heartache as well.... "Runners up" in Kent League Cup twice and the Kent Senior Trophy on three occasions.

The only major reward came in 1979-80 – a 4-3 victory over Chatham to lift the Kent League Cup at the Bull Ground at Sittingbourne. Trailing 2-0 and 3-1 in the final, the team recovered to score two late goals and an "extra time" winner. The club achieved it best FA Vase run during 1996-97.

Despite being drawn away from home in virtually every round, Whitstable reached the last 16...just 3 matches from an appearance at Wembley in this nationwide competition. With everyone praying for a home draw, luck deserted us...North Ferriby United (near Hull) ...away. A tight 1-0 defeat ended the dream on Humberside.

The summer of 2022 saw a major transformation at the club's Belmont Ground, with the installation of a 3G pitch, together with other ground improvements including new LED floodlights.

Manager Andy Drury left to manage Margate and former Lordswood and Tunbridge Wells manager Richard Styles was given the challenge of achieving promotion back to Step 4, but following a disappointing start to the season,

Marcel Nimani was appointed as first team manager in October 2023 and led the team for almost two seasons before parting ways with the club. Jamie Coyle was chosen as the Whitstable manager in the summer of 2024, with Matt Longhurst and long serving goalkeeper Dan Eason joining the new management team.

The club also launched a new brand identity and club crest ahead of the 2024-25 season, as it continues to grow and look forward to an exciting future.

That season certainly proved to be memorable one, ending with a historic FA Vase win at Wembley Stadium in May, when AFC Whyteleafe were beaten 2-1 in a thrilling encounter that went to extra time; Harvey Smith and Ronald Sithole scored the goals that brought the trophy back to Kent for the first time in 25 years.

Whitstable took nearly 10,000 supporters to Wembley and twice broke their home attendance record during the run to the final, with 2,905 watching the semi-final first leg. After a mixed start to the season, perhaps inspired by the Vase run, Whitstable played 28 games from mid-January, winning 22 and drawing 4, with the only defeats being in the Kent Senior Trophy final (3-2 to Larkfield & New Hythe) and after finishing third in the league, they conceded a late equaliser before losing on penalties to Fisher in the promotion playoff semi-final.

MATCH REPORT WHITSTABLE TOWN

FA Cup 1QR 13/09/25 By Ian Worden

Lloyd Rowlatt's wonder-strike in the 78th minute got Chichester out of trouble to set up an Emirates FA Cup second qualifying round replay after Curtis Da Costa inadvertently diverted the ball past his own keeper mid-way through the first 45 against Whitstable at the Primcura Healthcare Stadium on Saturday.

Gaffer Miles Rutherford, Dabba & Co made two changes to the side that amazingly beat Lewes 1-0 away with ten men last time out. Da Costa replaced Jamie Horncastle in the heart of the Chi backline with sitter Joe Moore, who came on at halftime mid-week, joining Ethan Prichard, Emmett Dunn, Isaac Bello, Rowlatt and Joe Clarke, the No9 on this occasion. Kieran Magee lined up in goal alongside full backs skipper Rob Hutchings and Ryan Davidson.

The two teams have faced each other a number of times over the years - Chi famously won 2-0 in the FA Vase back in 2017-18 thanks to goals from Josh Clack and Scott Jones but lost 1-0 at the Belmont ground in the season the Oystermen got relegated from the Isthmian South East division. That campaign Chichester beat the Kent-based side in the Javaun Splatt had a go that was turned out for a FA Trophy 4-0 and 2-1 in the league at home.

Here, it was the hosts, winners of the Vase at Wembley last season which was proudly on display in their clubhouse, who shaded the first period.

Joe Healy set Ashdon Day up for a cross in the opening minute that Hutchings headed away before a move involving Bello and Prichard earned the visitors the first corner of the match from which Davidson's header forced Whitstable keeper Dan Colmer to gather.

Referee Nick Dunn didn't think Rowlatt was fouled when captain Jake McIntyre and Day broke but the final pass was too long anyway.



Prichard had a shot in the fifth minute which went out for a Chi throw off a Seasiders' defender which Bello launched long and the home side headed clear. Another Lillywhites' corner a minute or so later was also headed away, and at the other end Day kept the ball in play and the much-travelled Whitstable corner which came to nothing.

Clarke had a wild swing moments later but it was off-target and Rowlatt got caught for a Chichester free-kick. Then Clarke had another opportunity after a nice Bello cross before Prichard won a third corner for the visitors that Hutchings once again delivered and it went off Clarke for a goal-kick.

Splatt carved a second chance on 13 minutes as the away team conceded a corner only for Magee to claim when the influential Jack Peters fizzed one into the penalty area.

Another Oystermen corner was cleared by Moore this time before Magee held Peters' header.

A linesman flagged Splatt offside a couple of times in the 17th minute and Bello got fouled by No16 Mikey Dalton. And then Da Costa misdirected the ball past Magee at the mid-point after Peters whipped a cross over to put the hosts in the lead.

Five minutes later they won won another corner when Splatt delivered a ball in and it nicked off a Chi ease. McIntyre tidied up after Dunn, Bennetts and player. Moore headed this away without any trouble and Magee gloved the ball clear after a further Whitstable corner.

McIntyre played in a decent cross on the half-hour mark before Bello was felled by Will Thomas who received the game's first yellow card of four. Prichard took the resulting set-piece which was cleared easily enough and then Bello hit one high over the bar.

Next, Day crossed invitingly although no one could get on the end of it; Clarke headed over after Colmer for impeding Day this time just ahead of the hour. made a hash of things; Splatt got caught offside again; Clarke placed a Bello bomb into the side-netting; Colmer then palmed clear; and the hosts struck an attempt over the woodwork.

The game ebbed this way and that as we headed towards half-time before Dunn headed over and Moore saw his shot blocked as the whistle for the break went.

Theo Bennetts came on for Da Costa with Chi rejigging for the second 45.

Hutchings blocked a pass by McIntyre a minute in and Davidson hacked the ball out for a corner that Clarke headed away before Bennetts tried his luck from some distance only for Colmer to save with Bello sprayed the ball about before Bello's hit was deflected for a Chichester corner.

Hutchings delivered this as usual but it was punched away for another on the same side. Then Rowlatt had a shot cleared off the line ten minutes in and Hutchings' subsequent cross missed out everyone.

Then Healy's long-ranger was blocked awkwardly by Pashley following Magee's poor clearance and Davidson picked up a sixth booking of the season Spaltt was exchanged for Jake Abrahams and a poor Kent-side cross went out for a Chi goal kick.

Striker Billy Vigar replaced Moore as the visitors rolled the dice before a wicked cross from the hosts' skipper somehow drifted out for another goal kick. The home side ramped things up in a spell of pressure as Magee miraculously denied Day with his feet who was also repelled





on 65 after good work from the Whitstable substitute. Peters was adjudged offside a minute later and Vigar's cross was diverted for a Chichester throw.

With 20 minutes to go Prichard's pass was too long for Bello before Prichard and Davidson one-twoed and the hosts' keeper intervened. Next came a period of Chi pressure with no end product but a thunderbolt from Rowlatt following a lovely move got the Sussex side level in the 78th minute.

60 seconds later Dunn shot just wide as the visitors cranked it up and Prichard fired a shot high and wide as both teams sought a winner with time added on approaching.

Rowlatt spurned another opportunity late on before Hutchings was booked with little choice but to take Abrahams out. The Oysterboys behind the goal chanted loudly "Oh Whitstable, Oh Whitstable, Is wonderful...' hoping McIntyre's free-kick would beat Magee but the Chichester custodian saved comfortably.




