# WELCOME CHATHAM TOWN



The club was formed in 1882 as Chatham United, when Rochester Invicta merged with the football team of the Royal Engineers Band with the intention of creating a side that was capable of holding their own with the best in the country. Harry Hobart's plan being to bring together all the best players in the Medway Towns in one team.

They played their first match on 7th October that year, beating Harley Street F.C. 4-0. Owing to their strong Army connections, Chatham soon moved to a regular home on "The Lines", where they were to remain until 1889 - the beginning of season 1889/90 seeing them move to "Alderman Winch's Enclosed Ground", or as it is now better known, the Maidstone Road Ground.

Having been formed with an eye to competing in the F.A. Cup, they went on to reach the Quarter-Finals in 1888-89 - famously defeating Nottingham Forest after two replays, only to lose to the holders West Bromwich Albion.

This game, which was played on "The Lines" where an admission fee could not be charged owing to Army regulations, was instrumental in the decision by the Football Association that all future matches in the competition must be played on fully enclosed grounds, where the visiting club would receive a share of the gate money.

In 1894 Chatham were founder members of both the Southern League and the original Kent League, becoming the first winners of the latter competition. They were also winners of the Kent F.A. Badge in the three seasons it was contested, and the first winners of its successor, the Kent Senior Cup, in 1888/89.

They also became the first club to win the Thames and Medway Combination, the direct predecessor of the present Kent League, in 1896/97.

Chatham were forced to resign from the Southern League during the 1900/01 season, owing to financial difficulties, but they soon rebuilt the club - playing as Chatham Amateurs for a brief spell in 1901 - before winning both the Kent League and

Thames & Medway Combination in 1903/04 without losing a single game in either competition. They repeated the feat the following season, losing just three games, whilst also defeating Sittingbourne 3-1 in the Final of the Kent Senior Cup.

The First World War brought an end to football in the Medway Towns, but Chatham were one of the first clubs locally to return to action in 1919 - winning both the Kent Victory Cup and the Chatham Charity Cup (for the eighth time) in a shortened season.

They briefly rejoined the Southern League in 1920/21, after the formation of a Third Division for the Football League had taken half its' members, but once again withdrew at the end of the season finding that the increased travel costs were a severe drain on finances.

They once again had some success in the F.A. Cup during the 1920s, reaching the Second Round Proper in 1926/27 before losing to Norwich City - who beat them again, this time in the First Round Proper in 1928/29. They also reached the First Round Proper in 1925/26 and 1927/28, losing to Sittingbourne and Kettering Town respectively.

A third spell in the Southern League, starting in 1927/28 almost finished the club. They stuck it out for two seasons this time, but once again the increased expenses - coupled with dwindling attendances - saw them drop back into the Kent League. Things were to get progressively worse, and 1933/34 saw the club take voluntary relegation into Division Two of the Kent League, which they won in 1934/35 without accepting promotion, before opting to revert to Amateur status.

Having played in both the Kent League and Kent Amateur League in 1938/39, they decided to play in just the latter competition the following season - only to see all football suspended with the beginning of World War Two. They played just one game that season, beating London Paper Mills 2-0 on 26th August - and would not play again until 1946. Post War, Chatham won the Premier Division of the Kent Amateur League in 1946/47, which was to be their last honour under that name - having

previously dropped the 'United' in 1898. On 7th January 1947 they merged with Shorts F.C., the combined club taking the name Chatham Town at the request of the local Council, and a place in Division One of the Kent League for the following season.

There they were to remain until the League disbanded in 1959, whereupon they moved to the newly formed Aetolian League. During this latter period they appeared in the Aetolian League Cup Final in each of the five seasons it was contested, though winning only once in 1962/63.

The following year they finally captured the League Championship, as well as the Aetolian/London League Cup and then, when the Aetolian League formally merged with the London League they moved to the Metropolitan League, in 1964/65, in search of stronger opposition.

Although the club were drawing crowds of up to 1,000 playing against strong Non-League opponents as well as sides from Arsenal, Tottenham Hotspur and West Ham United, they lost no time in returning to the Kent League when it was reformed in 1968. Up until their return to the Southern League in 1983, they had won the Kent League on four further occasions, completing the League and Cup double in both 1971/72 and 1977/78.

For a brief period during the seventies they changed their name to Medway F.C., again at the request of the local Council, but happily reverted back to Chatham Town in 1979. In 1980 they achieved their biggest post-war success to date in winning the Eastern Professional Floodlight League, playing against some of the strongest Non League clubs of the day, including Maidstone United, and defeating Chelmsford City in the Final over two legs.

In 1983 Chatham returned to the Southern League for the fourth time, this time staying there until 1988, when having failed to gain re-election they were relegated back to the Kent League - once again in severe financial difficulties, with crowds often in double figures against poorly supported clubs, as opposed to the much healthier attendances they had

Following the resignation of James Collins in October 2019, the club turned to Scott Lindsey to take The Chats onwards.

Scott brought in ex Chats player Darran Smith as his assistant, whilst retaining the experienced Tony Hine as goalkeeper coach. Ex Arsenal Carl Laraman was installed as Director of football and so, yet another chapter in Chatham Town's rich history began

enjoyed in the Kent League against more local opposition. Scott Lindsey left the club prior to the 2021/22 season after he was appointed assistant manager at Swindon Town FC, Chairman Kevin Hake took over as manager and guided us to promotion at the first attempt, with a step 5 record goal tally and a record goal difference.

During this season Chatham Town also received the Queens Award for our work in the community of which we are immensely proud as we feel that work off the pitch is just as important and goes hand in hand with the progress on it.

The following year 2022/23 in their 140th year The Chats reached the highest level in their history by becoming Isthmian League Southeast Champions and gaining promotion to Isthmian Premier league. In the same year the club also reached the Isthmian League Velocity Cup semi finals narrowly losing on penalties to eventual winners Aveley and also became runners up in the Kent Senior Cup, again on penalties.

Season 2023/24 saw our progression continue. A terrific season saw us finish runners up in the Isthmian Premier League to reach once again our highest ever league position. We missed out on promotion however by losing in the play off final to Enfield Town.

However, we won the Velocity Cup Final for the first time, and we reached the Kent Senior Cup semi-final, losing narrowly to Ebbsfleet. We continued to break all our attendance records with average crowds approaching 2000 on a regular basis.

Records held by Kent FA show that Cray Valley Paper Mills FC (CVPM) was founded in 1919 - the team originally playing in green and white, matching the livery of the paper mills vehicles and company banner - and was supported by the Nash family who owned the paper mills until its closure in 1981

Playing in the newly formed Sidcup and Kent League Division 2, the Club's first match was a 1-0 victory against Hamilton House FC on September 20th 1919, followed by a 7-0 victory in our first away match at Sidcup Invicta. CVPM went on to win the division in their first season - gaining promotion to the Bromley & District League Division 1.

The following season they were again champions - also winning the Kent County Junior Cup, defeating Sittingbourne Paper Mills 3-0 in the Final. Their next success came as members of the Kent Amateur League Western Section in 1932/33 - winning the Divisional title that season before finishing runners-up in 1936/37.

Records between the late-fifties and the early-seventies are scarce, until 1975 when CVPM joined the South London Alliance League, winning Division 1 in 1979/80 and the Premier Division in 1980/81 - their final season playing at the sports ground of the mills at St Pauls Cray in Kent. Following a "nomadic existence" CVPM arrived at their present home at Badgers Sports Ground in Middle Park Avenue, Eltham for the season 1998/99, by which time "Paper Mills" had been abbreviated to "(PM)" in the Club's name.

The Club continued to enjoy success in the South London Alliance - winning Division 1 in 1983/84 and finishing as runners-up in the Premier Division in 1988/89 - before joining the Spartan League, gaining promotion to Division 1 in 1990/91 by finishing as runners up, only missing out on the title on goal difference. They moved to the re-structured Spartan Midland League in 1997/98, - finishing as runners up in their first season - and became founder members of the London Intermediate League – reaching the Final of the League Cup in 1998/99 – before, under the management of Mark Edwards, being elected to Division One of the Kent County League in 2001/02.

During Edwards' reign, CVPM enjoyed regular success – winning Division 1 West in 2002/03 before winning the Premier Division by 11 points in 2004/05. They were also victorious in the London Intermediate Cup in 2003, 2004, 2010 and 2011.

Willie O'Sullivan became manager in season 2009/10, before leaving in January of the following season 2011/12, at the end of which the Club effectively gained two "promotions" – moving from the "Step 7" Kent County League to the "Step 5" Kent League. With Steve Chapman then taking over at the helm, their first season at that level saw them finish in a highly creditable 11th position while the following two seasons saw further progress, with 8th and 7th placed finishes, while reaching the semi-final of the London Senior Cup - narrowly losing to eventual winners AFC Wimbledon.

2012/13 saw their debut in the FA Vase, followed by a first appearance in the FA Cup the following season - beating Lancing away in a replay, before losing to Redhill in the Preliminary round. After Paul Gross took over from Chapman for the 2014/15 season, The Millers finished 7th in the newly named Southern Counties East Football League (SCEFL) - a late season slump resulting in a disappointing 10th place finish the following season.

Under James Collins, the 2016/17 campaign saw the Club finish in a very creditable 4th place in the league, and reach the Final of the Kent Senior Trophy - losing 2-1 to League Champions Ashford Town. They also became the lowest ranked team ever to win the London Senior Cup when, on a memorable night at Dulwich Hamlet, The Millers beat Ryman Premier Division opponents Metropolitan Police 2-1.

Kevin Watson was appointed as manager early in the 2017/18 campaign, guiding The Millers to 6th place, while again reaching the final of the London Senior Cup – on this occasion being beaten by Balham. The centenary season 2018/19 saw the Club again scale new heights – winning the SCEFL title by a single point, accruing 91 points from 38 matches while scoring 108 goals with a goal difference of +72, and securing promotion to the

Isthmian League. The Club also made their first appearance at Wembley – Combined Counties League side Chertsey Town beating Valley 3-1 after extra time in the FA Vase Final in front of a crowd of 42,962.

Their first season in the Isthmian League South East Division (Step 4) came to a premature end due to the Covid-19 outbreak, when they were in 3rd position and looking set to challenge for further promotion. While the 2020/21 season was also curtailed in December 2020 due to Covid-19, there was still time for The Millers to embark on a record breaking run in the FA Cup, reaching the First Round Proper for the first time.

Season 2021/22 finally saw The Millers complete a full season at step 4, achieving their highest ever finish in 5th place to secure a play off spot - a 1-0 defeat in the semi-final at Ashford United ending any promotion hopes. Following Kevin Watson's departure in November 2022, his assistant Tommy Osborne took over the reigns but narrowly missed out on a play off spot, finishing in 6th place.

A new era now beckoned with a complete managerial change in preparation for the 2023/24 season with the appointment of Steve McKimm. What followed contributed to a truly remarkable season. Isthmian South East Champions and with it promotion to step 3 for the first time, 97 points, 103 goals scored with just 32 conceded.

Reached the FA Cup First Round Proper taking Charlton Athletic to a replay at the Artic Stadium in front of a capacity crowd of 1,550 along with a FA Trophy Second Round Proper appearance for the first time. Forward momentum continued last season both on and off the field – achieving step 3 ground grading and a 4th place finish in the Isthmian Premier before agonisingly losing 4-3 in extra time of their play off semi-final at Dartford.





# CRAY VALLEY PM PLAYERS & OFFICIALS

## STEVE McKIMM (Manager)

Steve was appointed Cray Valley first team manager at the beginning of June 2023 bringing with him his assistant Barry Moore. They had worked together at Tonbridge Angels for eight years and the season before at Carshalton Athletic.

The managerial duo of McKimm and Moore guided the Angels to an Isthmian League Premier Division play-off semi-final spot in 2015/16 before promotion to the National League South was secured via the Isthmian Premier play-offs in 2018/19. His first season at Valley brought immediate success winning the Isthmian South East Division. A knack for cup runs over the years, that same season saw Valley reach the FA Cup first round proper, going out to Charlton Athletic in a replay. Last season the clubs first at step 3 saw a fantastic 4th place finish and earned a play off semi final at Dartford only to suffer an agonising defeat in extra time.

## MANNY ADEBIYI (19)

Manny a central midfielder now age 25 joined Valley in October 2025. He was a product of the Watford Youth set up and last season made 46 appearances for Canvey Island winning their supporters player of the year award.

## DAN AJAKAIYE (25)

Daniel Ajakaiye joined the Millers ahead of the start of season 2025/26. A striker, now age 28, Dan was at Horsham for the past three seasons making around 134 appearances scoring 43 times. A Bromley youth player he has also played for the likes of Whyteleafe, Kingstonian, Hastings United and Havant and Waterlooville.

## IBBY AKBANI (23)

Ibby Akanbi a striker signed for the Millers in the summer 2025. Having played for Aveley and AFC Croydon Athletic the previous season, Ibby who celebrate his 28th birthday in July, brings with him a wealth of experience across various clubs in both the National League and National South.

## KENNY ALIERU (11)

Kenny a wide player, now 27, joined Cray Valley

(PM) in January 2025 from Aveley, scoring on his debut against Bognor Regis Town. Made 16 appearances scoring twice. He started his career in the Aldershot Town Youth academy set up and later went on to feature for Clapton and Phoenix Sports before joining Aveley in early December 2021 for whom he has made 104 appearances scoring 16 times.

## MARCEL BARRINGTON (9)

Striker Marcel now 29 re-joined Valley in November 2023 from Erith & Belvedere. He originally became a Miller at the end of April 2021, making 44 appearances and scoring 24 times before joining then newly promoted Isthmian Premier side Herne Bay in July 2022 where he made 38 appearances scoring 16 goals. Earlier in his career netted twice in 5 international appearances for Guyana, and won promotion from the National League South with Braintree Town in 2017/18. His Cray Valley appearances now total 104 with 32 goals.

## TOM BEERE (16) – Club Captain

Tom now 30 joined Valley after a short spell with Horsham at the start of October 2024, making 35 appearances, scoring 14 times. Voted last seasons supporters player of the year. The former Millwall trainee progressed through the Dons Academy and went on to make thirty first team appearances for AFC Wimbledon, scoring in the 2016/17 League Two Play-Off semi-final defeat of Accrington Stanley. Tom left Wimbledon in 2017 and dropped into non-league football, first with Hampton & Richmond with whom he'd had a spell on loan whilst with the Dons, and then the first of two spells at Tonbridge Angels. An experienced and combative midfielder, Tom has also played Isthmian League football for Leatherhead, Greenwich Borough, Kingstonian, Carshalton Athletic and Cray Wanderers.

## DAN BOWRY (12)

The 27 year-old defender re-joins us from Lewes whom he joined in the summer having made 32 appearances and scored twice for the Millers in season 2024/25. Prior to that he was at St Albans City of the National League South. A youth player with Charlton Athletic he has also represented including loan spells Kingstonian, Hampton and

Richmond Borough, Cheltenham Town, Bath City, Wealdstone, Kings Lynn and Worthing. Dan's father Bobby was a professional footballer who played for Crystal Palace, Millwall and Colchester United among other clubs. His paternal grandparents were born in the Caribbean and this has allowed Dan the honour of representing the Antigua and Barbuda national football team on numerous occasions.

## KURTIS CUMBERBATCH (5)

Joined the Millers in January 2025 from Hendon, where he made 55 appearances, scoring 4 goals. An experienced midfielder, now age 29, he is well known to Steve McKimm having played for him at Carshalton Athletic in season 2022/23. A former Charlton Athletic youth player Kurtis has played in both the National League and National League South during his career. Former clubs include Billericay Town, Slough Town, Dover Athletic, Farnborough, Harrow Borough, Welling United and Hadley.

## MARVEL EKPITETA (15)

Marvel Ekpiteta joined from Aveley at the end of August 2025. A vastly experienced centre back just turned 30. Last season he was at Folkestone Invicta and the seasons prior to that Hayes and Yeading and Billericay Town. Whilst on the books at Newport County back in 2019 and 2020 he appeared on loan for Ebbsfleet Town and can count numerous other clubs along the way over the years.

## DENZEL GAYLE (7)

Jamaican born Denzel now 31 years old is currently the club's longest serving player who up to the end of last season had made 289 appearances, scoring 65 goals since joining from Erith & Belvedere in 2017. A pacy right sided raider vice captain Denzel now has two championship medals for the Millers, adding the Isthmian South East 2023/24 to his SCEFL Premier one in 2018/19. He also appeared at Wembley in the FA Vase Final that season against Chertsey Town.

## CROSSLEY LEMA (3)

Crossley 26 a defender joined towards the end of last season from Tonbridge Angels where he made 36 appearances scoring once. Crossley began his career through the youth ranks at Sutton United,

before making a permanent move to Leatherhead in 2020. Subsequent clubs include Margate and Carshalton Athletic where he played under Steve McKimm winning the Robins player of the year award season 2022/23 making 46 appearances scoring 6 goals. He later joined Welling United for season 2023/24 where he played 40 times.

## ROWAN LIBURD (18)

Experienced striker now age 33 recently joined from Aveley. Last season made 44 appearances for Chatham Town.

## SHAUN PEART-ROWLEY (1)

Now age 28, Shaun joined the Millers in the summer of 2025 after three seasons at fellow Isthmian Premier side Cray Wanderers in which he made 147 appearances, 40 clean sheets and save for two matches a league ever present over that time. He was voted Supporters Player of the Year in both 2023 and 2025.

## FUMNAYA SHOMOTUN (21)

Funmaya now 28 began his career at Barnet making his football league debut for them in 2014, going on to make around 20 first team appearances along with loan periods at Staines Town, Margate and Wealdstone before being released in 2019. After a short spell at Kingstonian he moved to Sevenoaks Town in October 2022 where he made 52 appearances, scoring 10 goals. In February 2024 he joined Dartford where he played 16 games scoring twice. He started the season at Tonbridge Angels before joining Valley in September and made 31 appearances scoring 4 times.

## CEM TUMKAYA (6)

Versatile defender Cem now 27 made his Millers debut as a 16 year old. He missed a large part of last season through injury but has now amassed 274 appearances scoring 18 goals for the Millers. After a brief spell with Dulwich Hamlet two seasons ago he returned to the Artic Stadium and added a second championship winning medal to his collection. The Isthmian South East 2023/24 being added to the SECEFL Premier one earned in season 2018/19. Cem also played at Wembley in the FA Vase final that same season.

# MATCH REPORT

## FOLKESTONE INVICTA

ISTHMIAN PREMIER 29/11/25

**League leaders Invicta condemned Chichester to a third Isthmian premier division loss on the spin thanks to second half strikes from forwards Jake Hutchinson and Joe Pigott and Ronnie Dolan's wonder goal in time added on at the Alcaline Stadium in Folkestone.**

Miles Rutherford, Dabba & H brought Miles Obodo on loan from Reading into the starting XI up top and Misha Djemaili also got the nod. Otherwise it was Kieran Magee between the sticks alongside the usual back four of skipper Rob Hutchings, Emmett Dunn, Ben Pashley and Jamie Horncastle. Joe Moore, Joe Clarke, Lloyd Rowlatt and Isaac Bello once again began in the middle of the park, with Theo Bennetts, Olly Munt, Curtis Da Costa and Ethan Prichard on the bench.

Chi did the double over Folkestone last season and drew the opening game of the 2025-26 season 1-1 at Oaklands in the reverse fixture and here on another wet afternoon the visitors won the first corner of the match four minutes in after good play from Rowlatt. Then Montel McKenzie linked up with Mikey Berry as the home team pressed and a bit of trickery led to a cross which City cleared.

Another delivery was cut out by Magee this time moments later and Berry and No9 Hutchinson got flagged offside on two separate occasions. Next, Dunn combined with Obodo who won a throw which Bello unsurprisingly launched long before Magee made a fine stop at the other end to deny Berry and concede a corner that the Invicta No7 took.

On 10 minutes the Chichester custodian had to save another shot and did well to intercept Hutchinson's subsequent threatening cross.

Berry and Pigott combined but the final effort was parried by Magee for a corner which got headed out



for another on the other flank by Pashley before Dean Rance fired wide of the mark in the 18th minute as things ebbed and flowed. Ted Collins then easily denied a weak shot from Bello, and Pashley cleared impressively as the home side ramped it up again.

Hutchings and Berry battled for the ball down the right wing and the first yellow card of the afternoon came on the half hour for Berry's nasty challenge on the Chi captain. Collins ballooned one out for a throw on 33 before Pashley tried to pick Bello and Folkestone right back Ben Mason cut inside and had a go which was blocked.

Bello then blazed an attempt over the bar and Horncastle steered Mason's delivery away and Hutchinson's cross also didn't cause any trouble. A quick counter attack by the Kent side resulted in a shot wide of the post in the 41st minute and a slick move involving Djemaili and the two Joes led to a City corner which Rowlatt floated in and Collins gathered unchallenged.

Next, Hutchings conceded a throw-in up against Pigott before Pashley's pass towards Obodo was too long and referee David Spain's whistle brought a goalless but entertaining first half to a close.

Neither side made any changes at the break and after two minutes of the second period left back Mckenzie drove dangerously into the Chi penalty area and forced a corner before Man of the Match Invicta captain Kevin Lokko was felled in the box – no pen according to Mr Spain.

Joel Odeniran was then cautioned for a foul on Obodo, who really shone in his first appearance for Chichester, and Magee claimed a Berry set-piece before the No7 was caught offside. Dunn conceded a corner needlessly on 54 minutes which Magee convincingly punched away and Clarke made a good block to deny Berry.

Djemaili then crossed looking for Rowlatt although Collins intercepted and the Chi No10 struck a pass with the outside of his boot searching for Obodo.

Rance hit an effort off target and Berry was replaced by Donnel Thomas just ahead of the hour mark before a couple of long Bello throws caused some problems for the Seasiders.

Hutchinson struck one wide on 62 before he did Horncastle and bagged the opener in the 63rd minute tucking the ball beyond Magee.

Rowlatt and Obodo might both have equalised moments later and the visitors earned a corner thanks to Bello's endeavours.

The hosts then broke swiftly and Hutchinson blazed a shot over this time before Magee was lucky to get away with just a yellow card for something he said to the ref and Horncastle saved one on the line.

Dolan came on for Rance with 21 minutes of normal time to go and Mckenzie had a cross cleared before Hutchings' effort was deflected for a Chichester corner.

Munt then replaced Horncastle as Chi shuffled the pack and Hutchinson was withdrawn for Ade Yusuff.

On 78 Collins claimed Hutchings' cross without any problem and neat stuff from Obodo led to a Chichester corner that got headed clear. A rapid break from sub Thomas instigated the home side's second goal through Pigott in the 80th minute to make it 2-0.

Dunn was booked; Clarke was exchanged for Bennetts; and a mistake by Pashley almost allowed the hosts to get in again but Magee hacked the ball away. As we entered five minutes of additional time Djemaili headed a corner over that he should have got on target and Folkestone sub Dolan's spectacular strike into the right hand corner of the net from some way out wrapped things up.

So, that's seven straight wins for Folkestone who are top of the table by six points while Chi are three points above the relegation zone after firing blanks now in four of their last six games.




