EASTLEIGH FOOTBALL CLUB ARE PLEASED TO CONFIRM THE SIGNING OF FORWARD ZAVIER MASSIAH-EDWARDS, WHO JOINS THE SPITFIRES ON A MONTH-LONG LOAN!

The 18-year-old attacker arrives on loan from Watford, having progressed through the Hornets' academy after initially developing at Brentford at a young age. Zavier was first integrated into Watford's U18s and U21s teams during his scholarship and impressed enough to earn a senior debut shortly after turning 17. His first appearance came in a Championship fixture in May 2024, marking the start of his involvement with the first-team squad.

In July 2024, he signed his first professional contract with Watford and went on to feature in several U21 matches, while also making additional Championship appearances in the 2024/25 season.

In February, Zavier scored the winning goal in an FA Youth Cup quarter-final against Southampton before the Hornets were eventually knocked out by Manchester City in the semi-final.

Upon signing for the club, Kelvin Davis said: "Zavier's a tenacious, young man who's hungry for more first-team action. He's had experience at Watford, playing at first-team level in the Championship.

"He's got a really hunger and desire, and I think he's someone who can add a bit of pace to the frontline."

WITH A DERBY THAT HAD EVERYTHING, THE SPITFIRES EARNED THEIR FIRST THREE POINTS OF THE SEASON IN A DRAMA FILLED GAME AT THE EBB STADIUM.

Eastleigh came out on top in a dramatic Hampshire derby, defeating Aldershot Town 3-2 in a game that had everything — goals, penalties, and a late red card. Aaron Blair's first goal for the club set the tone before headers from Aaron Pierre and Temi Eweka put the Spitfires in control, but two penalties from Ryan Hill dragged the Shots back into contention. Despite Paul McCallum's dismissal in the dying moments, Kelvin Davis' side held firm to claim a memorable derby win at the FBB Stadium

The Shots threatened first when Temi Eweka was forced into a smart interception to block a dangerous break down the left, conceding a corner. From the resulting set piece, a header was sent over Nick Townsend's bar before Josh Barrett came even closer a minute later, chesting the ball down on the edge of the area and looping a volley over Townsend — only for the upright to come to Eastleigh's rescue.





Barrett remained lively and flashed another strike just wide of the far post after cutting in from the left, while at the other end Paul McCallum, making his 150th appearance for the Spitfires, caused problems with his trademark long throws. One such delivery fell to Eweka, but his header was comfortably saved by Ollie Dewhurst.

The derby continued in end-to-end fashion, with Waruih again breaking forward and sending an effort narrowly wide of the far post, before Eastleigh capitalised on the 30th minute from a defensive error to take the lead on the half-hour mark. A wayward back pass fell kindly to Blair, who showed great composure to race through on goal and slot home his first Spitfires goal, putting Eastleigh 1-0 up.



Eastleigh made the perfect start to the second half, doubling their lead in the 49th minute. Archie Harris delivered a superb free-kick from the right, and Aaron Pierre rose highest to power his header past Ollie Dewhurst, making it 2-0 in the derby.

Just three minutes later, it was 3! Following a well-placed corner, Temi Eweka climbed above his marker and directed a powerful header beyond the helpless Dewhurst to make it 3-0.

Aldershot were given a lifeline almost immediately. In the 55th minute, Hargreaves drove into the box and was brought down by Luis Fernandez. Ryan Hill stepped up and coolly converted from the penalty spot to pull the score back to 3-1

Eastleigh came agonisingly close to restoring their three-goal cushion when Aaron Blair's low cross was met by McCallum inside the six-yard box, but his effort was dramatically cleared off the line by Jed Meerholz.

The hosts struck again in the 73rd minute after being awarded a second penalty, this time when Taylor was fouled right on the edge of the area. Hill once again took responsibility and converted to make it 3-2

As the clock ticked into the final minute of normal time, Eastleigh were reduced to ten men when McCallum was shown a red card for a late challenge on Dewhurst. Nine minutes of added time were signalled, and Aldershot came close to levelling in the 94th minute when Keane Anderson's header flew just wide of the far post from a Ryan Hill cross.

That proved to be the final chance of the game, as Eastleigh held firm to claim a dramatic 3-2 victory in the Hampshire derby.

Following a slow start to last seasons National League campaign for the Pilgrims. They turned things around and found a rise in form which saw them win 13 league games from January onwards.


Striker, Jacob Hazel, found the back of the net on 13 occasions last season, and provided 6 assists for his teammates, making him a crucial player in Boston's survival push.

This afternoon's visitors ended up finishing 19th in the standings.






