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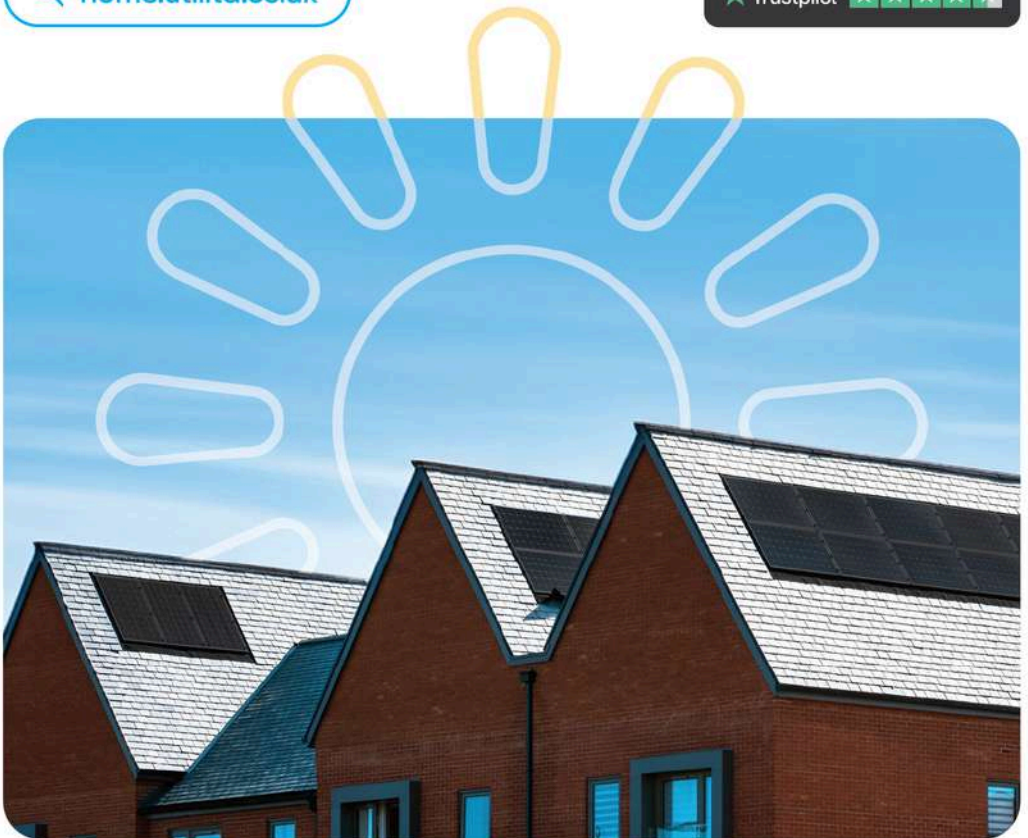


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# KELVIN DAVIS

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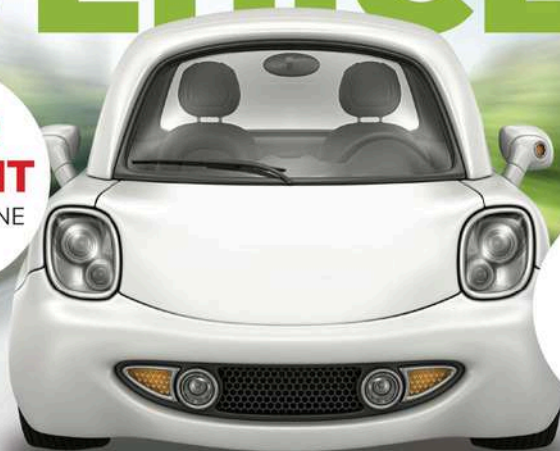
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## Silverlake: Shaping a Greener Future with Community at its Heart

## EASTLEIGH'S BLISTERING FIRST-HALF PERFORMANCE AT THE SHAY STADIUM PROMISED VICTORY, BUT A SPIRITED HALIFAX COMEBACK LEFT THE SPITFIRES FRUSTRATED.

The first real action of the evening came from the hosts, who worked the ball neatly down the left-hand side. Temi Eweka stepped in to clear the danger before David Kawa was able to latch onto it, but his clearance rebounded off the attacker and spun towards Nick Townsend's goal. The ball threatened to loop over the Spitfires' keeper, but he reacted well to parry it over for the first corner of the game.

In the 15th minute, completely against the run of play, Eastleigh struck the opener. Some excellent build-up play from the back allowed Sonnie Davis time and space on the right-hand side. He slipped the ball into Xavier Massiah-Edwards, who drove forward with purpose. With no Halifax players stepping out to close him down, the Watford loanee unleashed a precise strike from just outside the box that nestled into the bottom-right corner to give the Spitfires the lead.



The game briefly flared up in the 26th minute when both Pierre and Josh Hmami were shown yellow cards following an off-the-ball incident. Just moments later, Harvey Saunders drove at the Halifax defence and was bundled over by Cody Johnson, who picked up the third caution of the evening.

From the resulting free-kick, Eastleigh doubled their advantage. Taylor delivered another teasing ball into the box towards the back post, where Luis Fernandez connected perfectly, guiding his effort into the top-left corner to double the Spitfires' lead.





After soaking up waves of pressure, Davis' men managed to carve out a chance of their own in the 72nd minute. A quick counter-attack saw Paul McCallum slide the ball through for Davis, who broke into the box and unleashed a powerful strike, only for Sam Johnson to get down smartly to make the save.

With just under ten minutes to play, the hosts' relentless pressure finally told. Owen Davenport finished from close range after a ball from the right-hand side to give Halifax hope.

And Halifax Town weren't done there. Substitute Thierry Latty-Fairweather managed to retrieve a ball into the box before any Eastleigh defender and squeeze his shot underneath Townsend to level the scoring at 2-2 with just two minutes of normal time remaining.

The Shaymen kept pushing deep into stoppage time and almost stole it at the death, as Capello struck the woodwork after a low-driven ball from the right made its way all the way to the back post. Ultimately, this was the last chance of the game as the points were shared after a 2-2 draw.

The Shaymen were relentless after the restart and pressed forward. Owen Bray picked out Angelo Capello at the back post, who was left unmarked. The winger's effort looked destined for goal, but Davis threw himself in the way to produce a fantastic, goal-saving block to preserve the lead.

Halifax's substitute continued to cause problems since coming on at half-time. Rather than crossing from the right on his next attack, he unleashed a powerful strike from distance, only to see it crash against the underside of the crossbar - much to the relief of the Spitfires.

In the 54th minute, Bray once again came close to breaking the deadlock. Cutting in from the right-hand side, he struck a dangerous effort, but once again Townsend stretched out brilliantly to tip the ball away.

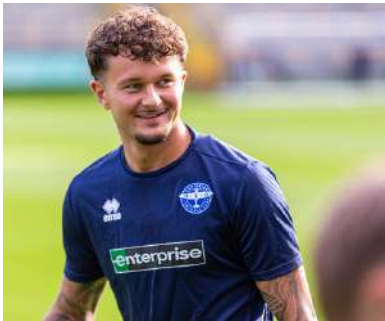

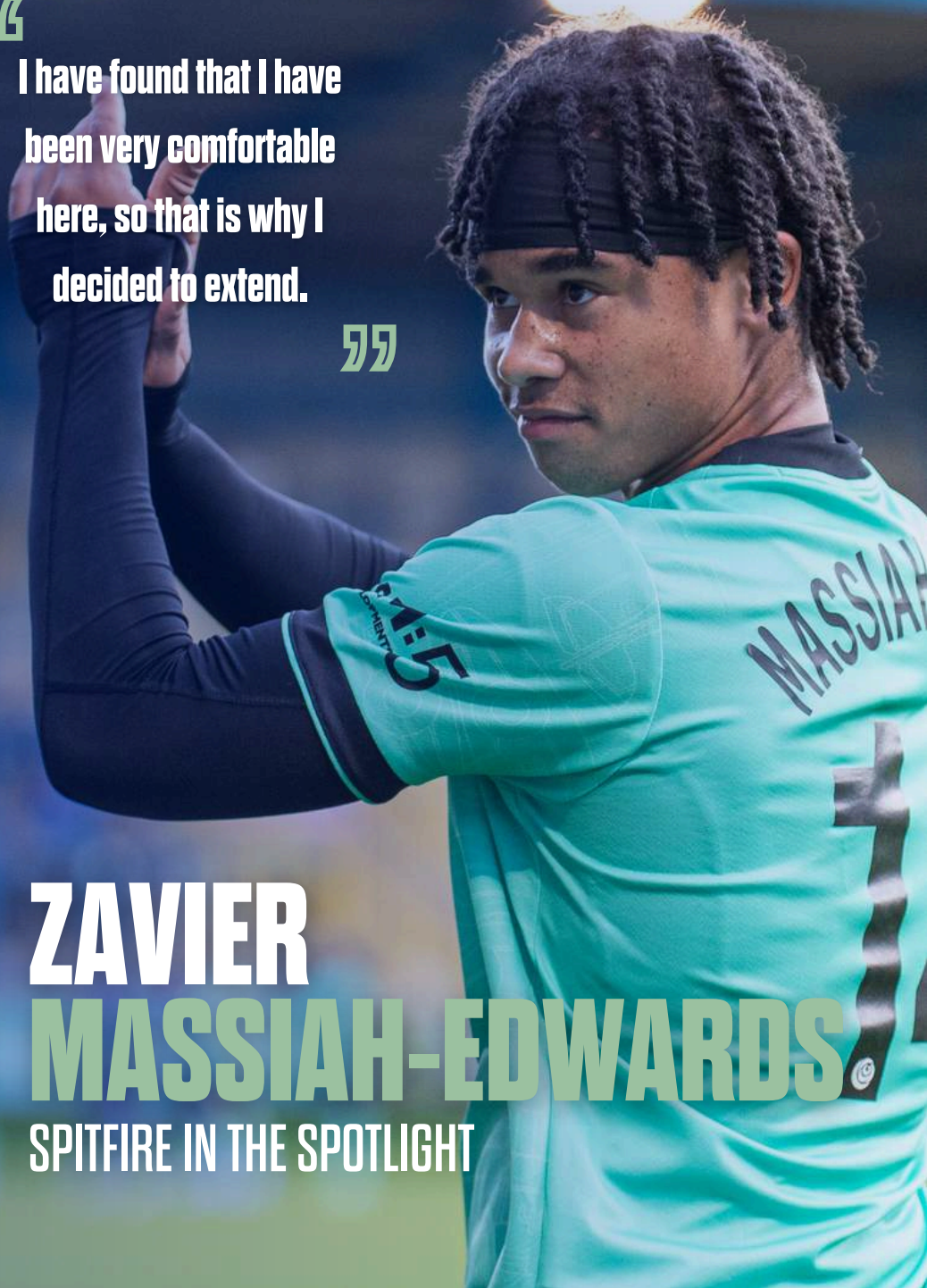

# ZAVIER MASSIAH-EDWARDS

SPITFIRE IN THE SPOTLIGHT





**You extended your stay with Eastleigh during the week. How've you been finding things here so far?**

I have enjoyed the challenge and the experience. My teammates and coaches have helped me through the process of my first loan. I feel comfortable here, and I have all of the things that I need to play as well as I can in an environment where I am always going to be a little bit uncomfortable. I have found that I have been very comfortable here, so that is why I decided to extend.

**Last time out, you scored your first goal in professional football. Describe that feeling.**

It was probably the most emotional goal that I have scored. It was a proud moment, and I want to keep going now. Hopefully I can get some more.

**We have players here at Eastleigh who have had successful careers. Have you been able to pick much up from them during your time here?**

Jordan Cousins has helped me vocally on the pitch. Comparing U21s football to this is totally different, the smallest things can make a big impact. Aaron Pierre has also helped me off the pitch. It's a really good group here.



**What would you say the biggest difference is between National League football, and academy football at Watford?**

Winning is everything here. For me personally U21s football is a bit more individual. If I score a hattrick and the team loses, I am not going to be that upset. Here, the desire to win games is much higher. We want to do anything that we can to win games.

**You played the majority of your youth football at Watford, and have recently had first-team appearances there. How's that journey been for you?**

Last year, I got a very good taste of first-team football, and it's made me hungry for more. It has prepared me to come on loan. I can use the experiences from here when I go back.

**What is your favourite footballing memory?**

FA Youth Cup quarter-finals. Throughout the tournament, we were the underdogs. Then we played Southampton, we scored first before they equalised and then we got a goal late on and it was really good afterwards with all the boys.



**During your time away from the pitch, what do you like to get up to?**

FC26i s coming out, and that will definitely keep me busy. The more boring one is going to the gym, I try to go every day. Because obviously i am a bit smaller, I try to keep my body in shape. My mum is a chef and she keeps me ticking with my diet.

Ever since I was a youngster at Watford, I have always played up and the physical side was something that I knew I would have to get stronger rather than taller. My dad took me to boxing and that' where I started to get stronger. From there I learned how to use my body against bigger players.

**What do you want to take away from your experience at Eastleigh.**

I want to play as many games as possible, and I want to learn thingss off the pitch as well. That comes from me in training and then showing up in games.

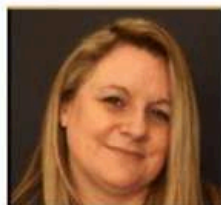

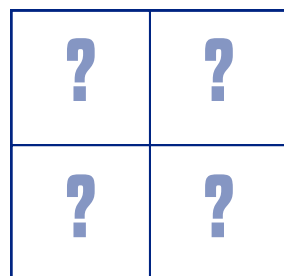

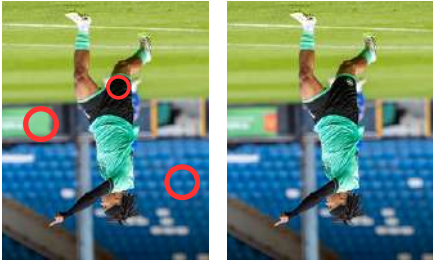

**Braintree will make a 276 mile round trip to visit the Silverlake Stadium for this afternoon's league clash.**

The Iron play their home games at the Rare Breed Meat Co. Stadium, which has housed them since it was opened in 1923.

The club played their first five seasons of football at Fair Field, when they were known as Manor Works. Following this, they would then spend the next 20 years playing their home matches at Spaldings Meadow.

The Essex side have only been known as Braintree Town since 1981. Before this, they played their football as Manor Works, Crittall Athletic and Crittall & Braintree Athletic.

Braintree's best FA Cup run to date came during the 2016/17 campaign. After beating Bromley and Eastbourne Borough, they made it to the second round proper of the competition. In this match, they travelled to The Den to face Millwall. Michael Cheek and Jack Midson both got their names on the scoresheet, but it would not be enough for them to qualify for the next round, with Millwall putting five goals past them that day.

This is the Essex sides second year back in the National League, following five consecutive years in the National League South.

Former Spitfire, George Langston is Braintree's club captain, and will be looking to lead his side out this afternoon in SO50.

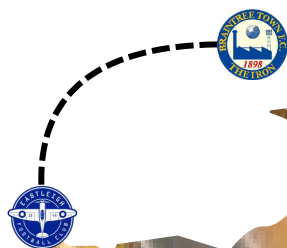

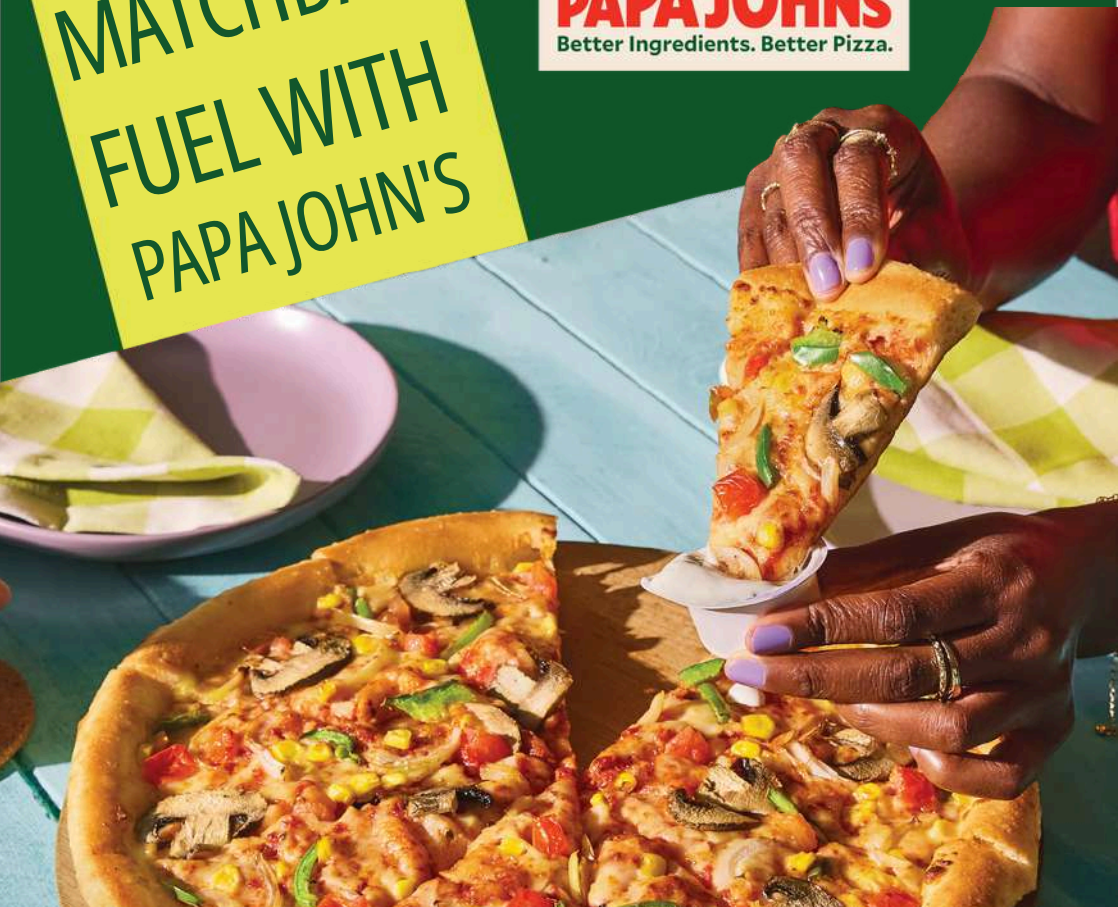
