A GUTSY DEFENSIVE DISPLAY HELPED EASTLEIGH EARN THEIR SECOND AWAY WIN OF THE SEASON AGAINST TRURO CITY FOLLOWING GOALS FROM TEMI EWEKA AND AARON BLAIR. THE VICTORY ALSO SEES SCOTT BARTLETT PICK UP HIS FIRST VICTORY AS SPITFIRES MANAGER.

Both sides started the game strongly with chances coming in the opening exchanges. The Spitfires had the better opportunity with Jake Vokins picking up the ball on the left flank and drove inside before playing a delightful ball in behind for Harvey Saunders to chase. Saunders controlled the ball and tried to round Aidan Stone in the Truro goal before smashing his shot into the side netting.

The Tinners responded excellently with Luke Jephcott collecting the ball on the edge of the box and unleashing a venomous strike which forced Nick Townsend into an early save to keep the game level. From the resulting corner, the home side came inches away from taking the lead through a header at the back post with woodwork coming to the Spitfires' rescue before the ball was cleared downfield through the boot of Luis Fernandez.





Following a period of pressure, the Spitfires found themselves with a free-kick in the centre of the pitch with Jake Taylor receiving the ball on the right before delivering a delightful ball into the sixyard box. Defender Luis Fernandez used his strength to make a nuisance of himself in the sixyard box before meeting the ball with a looping header, for it only to be cleared off the line. The ball then fell to Temi Eweka who side footed it into the roof of the net to give the Spitfires the lead.

With the last chance to note of the first half, Lloyd Humphries picked the ball up in the middle of the park before releasing the flying Jake Vokins down the left. The left-back drove forward with the ball before playing a pinpoint cross along the grass to the back post for a sliding Aaron Blair to pass the ball into an open net to give the Spitfires a 2-0 lead heading into half-time.



The first opportunity of the second-half fell to the Spitfires following a long throw-in from Archie Harris on the left before the ball dropped to Lloyd Humphries who's sliced effort went high and wide of the Truro goal from 25-vards out.

Following this let off for the home side, they asserted some pressure themselves which resulted in talisman Johnson-Fisher cutting inside from the edge of the box and lifting the ball towards the back post. The cross was intercepted by Lloyd Humphries who appeared to have handled the ball in the process but the shouts of the Truro players and supporters were immediately ignored by the referee to the surprise of everyone inside the Truro City Stadium

Having dealt with the immense pressure from the home side, the Spitfires had an opportunity of their own as flying full-back Jake Vokins sprinted down the left and delivered the ball into the box for a leaping Harvey Saunders. The forward, however, couldn't quite divert his header towards goal and it skewed off wide of the post to

This opportunity for the Spitfires proved to be the last real chance of the game and the game finished 2-0 to the Spitfires. The gutsy defensive performance gave Scott Bartlett his first win as Eastleigh manager and another clean sheet to go with it.

SCOTT BARTLETT SPITFIRE IN THE SPOTLIGHT

From a personal side, how've you been finding life as the manager of Eastleigh Football Club?

Yeah, really good! I feel like I have been here for longer than I have! Everyone made me feel really welcome here, and it's been down to work since then. I think that t has been a really productive ten days, and I am really enjoying it. We've got a bit to do but there is plenty to work with, so I am really pleased.

How excited are you to see the Silverlake Stadium with fans in it from the dugout?

I am looking forward to it. We have an impressive venue here, and it's above the level in many ways. We are all geared up. It will be really good to see the fans tomorrow, we have had a really good following in our last two games, and they have spent a lot of money travelling to watch us. It will be nice to see them here, and I am looking forward to getting to know them.

Has much changed about the National League since you last worked in this division?

Pretty much every team is full-time now. The league has evolved and it's become a bit of a monster. I would say that it is very much an extension of the football league now.







What can fans who didn't manage to get to either of your first two games expect to see from your team?

We will get better and better as we go along, I promise that. We have seen a big improvement already in the training sessions that we have had.

One thing my team will always do is to give the fans something to cheer about. Whether we are great on the day or not, I want people to be going away thinking that we have put a good shift in. We have seen that already from the players. Because of the proximity of the games, we have had challenges squad wise. Nothing major, but obviously we have played three games in six days, with two of those being away.

We will get better, we will be exciting, and we will have players who can beat people one v one.

Can you tell us a bit about your playing career?

I played at AFC Bournemouth for a couple of seasons as a young player. I really enjoyed it, and I think the experience I had there had moulded me into how I am now as a coach. After I left there, I went to Cirencester football academy, so I have had a bit of a journey. I left home when I was just 16.

Following that, I signed for Salisbury, and I played the majority of my career there. Salisbury is my home town club, and we saw three promotions when I was there, to get us up into the National League.

I played the remainder of my career at Weston, Bath and Forest Green. I went straight into coaching at Forest Green when I stopped playing.





What do you like to get up to away from the pitch?

I like spending time with my family. My kids are really important to me. We are renovating a property at the moment.

As much as I love football, I don't let it take over my whole life, and I have become quite good at separating the job from my personal life. You can only do that if you've got good staff, and we have that at Eastleigh.

I also like to travel, but obviously we don't get the opportunity to do that during the season. I think, certainly later in life, I want to travel all over the place if I am fortunate enough to.



Solihull Moors will make a 258 mile round trip to visit the Silverlake Stadium for this afternoon's league clash.

Solihull Moors were founded in 2007. They were promoted to the National League following a league title winning 2015/16 season in the National League North.

Since they were promoted, the Moors have remained in the National League. They came close to promotion in the 2023/24 season, when they missed out at Wembley Stadium in the play-off final against Bromley. They were beaten on penalties following a tightly contested game in the capital.

Solihull Moors have played their football at Damson Park since they were established just 18 years ago. The ground has twos seated stands which are on ether side of the pitch, and it can hold up to 5,500 supporters.

Their record attendance was set back in 2022, when they hosted Chesterfield in a play-off semi-final match in front of 4,020 hopeful supporters.

Former Spitfire, Oscar Rutherford, who made 70 apperances across two seasons of playing for Eastleigh's first-team will make his return to the Silverlake Stadium this afternoon, wearing the number 21 shirt for Solihull.



WALKING FOOTBALL



SO MANY PEOPLE SAY 'I COULD NEVER PLAY WALKING FOOTBALL', 'I COULDN'T STOP MYSELF FROM RUNNING'! WELL, GUESS WHAT – ALL OUR GAMES ARE REFEREED AND ONCE YOU'VE BEEN BLOWN FOR RUNNING A FEW TIMES, YOU SOON GET THE HANG OF IT. YOUR TEAM MATES AND OPPOSITION WILL ALSO HELPFULLY POINT OUT THE ERROR OF YOUR WAYS!

It can be a bit more serious in tournaments. One tournament we play in, the rule is that if the referee blows 4 times for running (for the team, not the individual) then a penalty kick is awarded. Other differences between the football we all grew up with and walking football include protection for goalkeepers. No one is allowed in the goalkeeper's area and the 'keeper cannot leave his area. If a defender encroaches, then a penalty kick is the punishment. If a forward encroaches, then the defending team gats a free kick.

Physical contact is not permissible, so no shoulder charging (or shirt pulling!). Tackling from behind is outlawed. These laws are designed to enable us 'oldies' to continue to enjoy the sport we played all of our lives, whilst the risk of physical injury is minimised. We have seen over the years that it is not the coming together of players that is the problem, it is the outcome. Our bones are inevitably a bit mor brittle as we get older and we have seen incidences of injury resulting from the subsequent fall, rather than the actual tackle

So, every possible step is taken to minimise the potential for injury to our players whilst still retaining a competitive form of play.


