EASTLEIGH SUFFERED DEFEAT ON THE ROAD AGAINST BOREHAM WOOD AT THE MANGATA PAY UK STADIUM IN THE ENTERPRISE

The game came into life within three minutes when a wayward back pass from Sonnie Davis sprung Nick Townsend into immediate action. He he had to get to the ball first

action. He he had to get to the ball first before oncoming Abdulmalik, Eastleigh's number one made a fantastic sliding tackle which fell to Zak Brunt just outside the box. Brunt attempted to chip Townsend but his

effort went over the bar.

Two minutes later after Evans brilliantly won the ball back in midfield, the Spitfires gained a good spell of possession. Captain Jake Taylor received the ball and picked out a great pass into the run of Jake Vokins. Vokins decided to cross early, but his ball was fired across the box above the head of Ciaran McGuckin

By the 40th minute, Boreham Wood had begun to grow into the game and were relentless in their attacks. Matt Rush got to the byline and crossed low and hard for Bush. Bush struck his shot low and hard, but once again Townsend got down to deny the hosts to keep it 0-0 going into half time.





Eight minutes into the second-half, the hosts were rewarded for their persistence. Abdulmalik drove with the ball towards the heart of the Eastleigh defence, cutting in from the left-hand side. The winger was not closed down and bent a right-footed shot into the far-right corner, leaving Townsend with no chance. After starting the half with real intent, Boreham Wood found themselves 1-0 up against Eastleigh.

Similar to the goal that put Boreham Wood ahead, Brunt found himself with plenty of space at the edge of the box with the ball at his feet, the midfielder continued to drive forwards and the Spitfires continued to back off. This time, though, the shot went straight down the throat of Townsend, who parried to safety.



In the 64th minute, Boreham Wood had a golden chance to double their lead and potentially seal the victory. However, the chance was wasted when Rush missed a close-range effort from Joe Newton's low cross

However, with just ten minutes to go, Boreham Wood did get that elusive two-goal lead.

Abdulmalik, who caused a lot of problems for the Eastleigh defence all afternoon, managed to beat Davis on the left-hand side and pick out Lewis Richardson, who fired home to make it 2-0.

With five minutes to go, Temi Eweka managed to deny the chance for Norris to make it 3-0 when substitute Charles Clayton fired a fantastic ball across the floor from the left-hand side into the path of danger. However, Eweka got there first.

Ewekas decisive action was the last of the 90 minutes as Eastleigh fell to defeat for the first time under Scott Bartlett at the helm at the hands of Boreham Wood.



Scunthorpe will make a 472 mile round trip to visit the Silverlake Stadium for this evening's league clash.

The Iron play their home games at the Attis Arena, which has housed them since 1988.

Their record attendance came in the National League North play-off final last season, when 9,086 supporters were in the ground to watch the Iron earn promotion back to the National League.

This is now the fifth consecutive season that Scunthorpe have spent outside of the football league.

The Iron spent the 2009/10 and 2010/11 campaigns plying their trade in the Championship. Following this, until they were relegated to the National League in the 2021/22 season, they spent their time either in League One or League Two.

In the 2008/09 season, Scunthorpe finished as runners-up to Luton Town in the EFL Trophy. Over 55,000 spectators watched on as they fell to a heart breaking defeat after extra-time at Wembley Stadium.

Former Spitfire, Danny Whitehall has scored four in his first four games this season for Scunthorpe, and he will be one to watch out for in this evening's game.
















FA YOUTH CUP REPORT



EASTLEIGH MANAGED TO LEVEL THE SCORING THROUGH A GREAT EFFORT FROM CHIKA UGWUMBA AFTER BEING ONE GOAL DOWN AT THE BREAK. HOWEVER IT WAS CHIPPENHAM TOWN THAT WOULD ADVANCE TO THE FIRST ROUND PROPER AFTER A LATE GOAL FROM IDRIS THOMAS JONES.

The first shot of the game arrived in the ninth minute when George Cook broke well down the right-hand side for Chippenham Town. The full-back then cut in and tried his luck, but the Eastleigh keeper took it into his grasp.

The hosts were awarded their first corner of the game when Sean Hart's pace allowed him to get onto a loose ball down the right-hand side. Hart opted to cross early, but this cross was seen out for a corner.

Keegan Kelly decided to go low across the edge of the box, finding Hubert Cegielka, but the striker's shot towards goal was blocked.

After a bit of pressure from the away side, the hosts very nearly opened the scoring. A free-kick on the left side of the pitch was perfectly sent in towards Jayvon Cowill, but his headed effort was just wide of the post.

Following a moment of brilliance, the Bluebirds found themselves ahead when Banfield scored a wonderful free-kick from 25 yards out, placing the ball into the top-left corner making it 1-0 to Chippenham Town.

Just on the brink of half-time, the away side very nearly doubled their lead. Lewis Roystone broke into space on the far right, the defender continued his run all the way to the Eastleigh box, but his effort trickled just wide of the far post.

With just twenty minutes to go
Eastleigh had their best chance of the
game to level the scoring. In a very
similar position to the goal in the first
half Chika Uguwumba smashed his
effort onto the bar.

With 12 minutes of normal time to go the Spitfires got there leveller, after striking the bar before, Uguwumba got more fortune with his next effort as his deflected effort sailed over Massimo Sardo in-between the Chippenham sticks to level the scoring at 1-1.

However with very little time left to go Idris Thomas-Jones cross attempt looped over Hale and found its way in off the post, giving the visitors a 2-1 lead with very little time left.

Chippenham Town managed to see out the game and therefore advance to the next round of the FA youth cup.

WALKING FOOTBALL



OUR LADIES SECTION HAS BEEN BUSY DURING THE MONTH OF OCTOBER. WEEKEND BEFORE LAST THEY WERE IN ACTION ON BOTH DAYS IN DIFFERENT PARTS OF THE COUNTRY.

On Saturday 11th October they headed up to Ruislip, Middlesex, as the Hampshire winners in the first round of the FA's national cup. They competed against Chesham, Oxford, Thames Valley and Newhaven for a place in the finals day, as representatives of the south.

The standard was high and after starting with a 0-0 and 1-1 draws against Newhaven and Oxford respectively, lost 2-1 to a late penalty against Thames Valley. The final game resulted in a 2-1 win to Chesham, who were group winners and will go on to represent the south in finals day at St George's Park next month. We wish them well

On Sunday the girls headed west for the first round of fixtures in the Dorset league, which includes teams from outside that county. Showing dedication and commitment, a number of Saturday's squad also played on the Sunday.

They started with a 1-0 loss to Lilliput, and a 2-0 defeat at the hands of Swanage. Things got better with a 1-0 win over Bournemouth in another tight game. A tough final game against Plymouth ended 0-0. After the first round of fixtures the girls are 4th with 4 points, Plymouth being the league leaders with 8 points.

Ladies captain Sarah Harper is playing for England next week in Spain, as captain of England Ladies over 50's in the world cup of nations. We will report on that next month.


