
EASTLEIGH WERE VICTORS AGAIN AFTER A CONVINCING WIN AGAINST MORECAMBE, THE SPITFIRES' WENT TWO GOALS UP AND DESPITE CONCEDING LATE ON MANAGED TO SECURE ALL THREE POINTS.

It was a cagey affair to begin with Eastleigh starting brightly, pressing high and looking to dictate the tempo, but the first real opportunity fell to the visitors when Joe Nuttall tried his luck from 25 yards, forcing Nick Townsend into a comfortable save. The Spitfires responded quickly, with Richard Brindley slipping in Ciaran McGuckin, though the striker could only find the side netting from a tight angle.

Morecambe threatened again just inside 15 minutes as they played out from the back, breaking the Eastleigh press leading to a ball from ex-Spitfire Lewis Payne aimed at the back post. However, some excellent defending from 17-year-old Skinner allowed the home side to clear their lines.

Eastleigh went close to breaking the deadlock on 27 minutes when Josh Lundstram's pinpoint cross found McGuckin on the volley, but his effort flew narrowly over the bar.





The second half began at a high tempo, with both sides posing an early threat. Archie Harris was involved at both ends of the pitch first delivering a dangerous ball into the Morecambe box before making an important block to deny a chance at the other end. Moments later, the visitors came close to breaking the deadlock when Elijah Dixon-Bonner found space on the edge of the area, but his curling effort fizzed narrowly wide of the post.





Eastleigh broke the deadlock soon after. A foul by Payne on Harvey Saunders just outside the box handed the hosts a promising free kick, and Lloyd Humphries made no mistake, smashing a stunning strike into the top right corner to score his first goal of the season.

Scott Bartlett's men almost instantly doubled their lead after youngster, Skinner found space just outside the box but his low strike went just wide.

McGuckin continued to cause problems for the visitors, dispossessing the Morecambe back line and charging forward from halfway before being brought down by former Eastleigh defender Ludwig Francilette. The striker made no mistake from the spot, calmly sending the goalkeeper the wrong way and placing his penalty into the bottom-right corner, his second goal in as many games.

The game was brought to a nervy end as the ball fell to Morecambe's Benjamin Lee Tollitt inside the box just inside 90 minutes, the substitute managed to fire home and half the deficit.

The visitors almost drew level immediately after as a corner came in from Jake Cain, Francillette leapt above everyone but his header flew wide of the post.







Walsall will make a 290 mile round trip to visit the Silverlake Stadium for this afternoon's Emirates FA Cup clash.

The Saddlers play their home games at the Bescot Stadium, which has housed them since 1990.

The ground has a maximum capacity of 11,300. Walsall's record attendance there came in 2004, when 11,049 spectators watched them take on Rotherham.

Before that, Walsall played their football at Fellows Park, from 1896, until their move to Bescot Stadium in 1990. 25,453 watched them take on Newcastle in the second-division there back in 1961. Just before the ground was demolished, one of the sections collapsed due to heavy snowfall.

Walsall have made it to the fifth round of the Emirates FA Cup on six occasions previously. With their most recent visit to that round coming in the 2002/03 season.

Their biggest winning margin in the tournament came back in 1890, when they beat Warmley 12-0 in the first qualifying round of the competition.

Walsall made it to the second round of the Emirates FA Cup last season. They beat Bolton Wanderers 2-1, before losing away from home to Charlton Athletic.

Their manager, Mat Sadler had been in charge of the Sadddlers since April 2023. He has won the League Two manager of the month award two times since he took charge of the club.






