



Andrew Boyce joined Eastleigh from Grimsby in 2017 and spent five seasons at the Silverlake, 201 appearances for the Spittires. The centre-half spent time at Hartlepool on loan during his first stint at Scunthorpe United where he made nine appearances for the Pools before returning to the Iron where Boyce plays his football to this day.

WES MCDONALD

Wes McDonald joined Eastleigh from Partick Thistle in 2024, following his contract at the Scottish side ending. The winger made 6 appearance for the Spittires across the single season he spent at the Silverlake. Before joining Eastleigh, McDonald spent a season at Hartlepool United, where he made 33 appearances during the 2022/23 season. The forward now plays his football in Cyprus for Magusa TGSK.



CHARLIE SEAMAN



Charlie Seaman joined the Spittires on loan from Bournemouth in 2019 and made 22 appearances for Eastleigh during his time at the Silverlake. Five years later Seaman joined Hartlepool United on loan from Doncaster Rovers and the full-back went on to make 16 appearances for the Pools during his loan spell. Seaman now plays for National League South side Ebbsfleet United.

This Week in the Past

16th - 23rd November 2024

This time last year the Spittires travelled to this afternoon's visitors Hartlepool United where they were held to a 0-0 draw at the Suit Direct Stadium. The Spittires then returned to the Silverlake to take on Wealdstone where a goal from Noa Boutin helped the Spittires to a 1-1 draw against the Stones.

11th - 21st November 2023

During this week two years ago the Spittires claimed impressive wins over Altrincham and Boreham Wood respectively, with both coming at the Silverlake as well as holding Oldham Athletic to a 1-1 draw at Boundary Park. Against Oldham, a penalty half-way through the first half from Chris Maguire earned the Spittires a valuable point. The following weekend, goals either side of half-time from Scott Quigley and Paul McCallum helped the Spittires to a 2-1 victory over the Robins. Just three days later, McCallum was once again on hand to help secure three points for the Spittires as his double helped the Spittires to a 2-1 victory over Boreham Wood.

12th - 19th November 2022

This time three years ago the Spittires were defeated twice in successive games with the first a 2-0 defeat at the hands of high flyers Notts County at the Silverlake. The Spittires then travelled to Maidenhead United a week later and despite a goal from Charlie Carter, they lost the game 2-1 to a Maidenhead United side who were stuck in a relegation scrap.

13th - 23rd November 2021

During this week four years ago, the Spittires secured two wins from three games whilst keeping two clean sheets in the process. The Spittires travelled to York City Yeovil Town where unfortunately they fell to a 2-1 defeat despite a goal from Harry Pritchard half-way through the second-half. The Spittires then returned to the Silverlake where they took on promotion chasers Notts County. Goals either side of the break from Tyrone Barnett and Andrew Boyce respectively fired the Spittires to a 2-0 victory. The Spittires then travelled to Dagenham & Redbridge where a goal from Danny Whitehall earned the Spittires all three points.

14th - 17th November 2020

This week five years ago, the Spittires were due to play both Hartlepool United and Wealdstone, however, the game against Hartlepool United at the Silverlake was abandoned at half-time due to torrential rain. Just three days later, a ten-man Eastleigh side overcame Wealdstone 2-0 at the Silverlake thanks to goals from Cav Miley and Sam Smart.

EASTLEIGH COME AWAY FROM BRUNTON PARK WITH A 1-1 DRAW AFTER MAKING THE MOST OF THEIR CHANCES, WHILST DEFENDING BRILLIANTLY THROUGHOUT THE GAME. THE SPITFIRES BROUGHT A VITAL POINT BACK TO SO50 AFTER KIERON EVANS SCORED A WONDERFUL 89TH MINUTE EQUALISER!

The first chance of the game came via Regan Linney who latched onto a long ball forward and appeared to be in on goal, however a last-ditch tackle from Richard Brindley evaded the attack.

Harvey Macadam was then able to let fly for the first time just five minutes later when he picked up the ball and let off a shot from 30 yards out, but his effort didn't find the target.

Eastleigh had their first promising attack in the 13th minute when debutant Pearson beat his man and played in Josh Lundstram. The midfielder fired a dangerous low ball across the six-yard box, but it was dealt with before Harvey Saunders could latch onto it.

With the scoring still 0-0, Carlisle had a golden chance to go one up in the 20th minute when a corner fell perfectly for Aaron Hayden, who was unable to divert the ball goalwards, wasting the chance.



They had an even better chance just three minutes later when Georgie Kelly got the better of Aaron Pierre in the air. The striker managed to bring the ball down and just had Nick Townsend to beat. However, the striker's effort was tipped over the bar by the outstretched Eastleigh keeper.

The biggest scare for the Spittires came just before the 40th minute when Kelly's header smashed the left post after a great delivery from the right-hand side. The Blues were getting close but were just missing the finishing touch.

Seconds before half-time, Kelly once again had another header from close range, but once again the striker's header did not find the back of the net as it sailed over.



A lovely one-two between Humphries and Evans saw the Welshman in on goal with just Breeze to beat, and Evans did exactly that as he slotted it away brilliantly.

Eastleigh then very nearly got another one, which would have completed the ultimate smash and grab! Humphries played in McGuckin, who took the ball out wide and played Saunders, who was unable to get his shot off as his efforts were blocked off.

Despite this, it was Carlisle that got the last sniff on goal when substitute Luke Armstrong was clean through on goal with just one minute of additional time left. The striker's effort appeared to beat Townsend but not the far-right post.

After the hosts failed to capitalise on a big, final chance, the contest came to an end with both teams earning a point.

After a tough first half for the visitors, Eastleigh nearly struck within the first two minutes of the half when the ball fell to an unmarked Lloyd Humphries at the edge of the box. His shot, which was heading goal wards, was blocked and hit the side netting.

From the resulting corner, he very nearly scored again! The Spittires opted to play it short, and Evans' cross was met by the head of Humphries, but his effort went just wide of the right post.

The deadlock was then broken in the 50th minute when Carlisle hit Eastleigh on the counter-attack. Conn-Clarke broke forward and pulled it back to Luamba, whose low and hard shot found the back of the net.

After suffering all game, Eastleigh's first real chance of the game came in the 88th minute. The Spittires only needed one chance too.

SPITFIRE IN THE SPOTLIGHT

Having joined in the summer from Cardiff City, how have you found your first few months at the Silverlake?

I had a rough start which is not something I thought would've happened at the start of my career. But the new gaffer has come in and put his trust back in me and I'm starting to feel like the old me and that I know what I can do, and I'm just getting to build on that now.

What has been your favourite moment as an Eastleigh player so far during your time on the south-coast?

It would probably have to be the goal against Carlisle last weekend. We worked hard as a team and dug in and we managed to get the goal at the end.

You are one goal away from equalling your highest goal tally in a season, is this something that you've been actively trying to add to your game or do you just take the goals as and when they come?

It's something I always work on and I'm working on getting mentally right before games because I know physically I'm good enough to score goals at this level. It's just about being mentally strong and confident in myself that I can get more goals this season and I'm sure I will get past the mark



Obviously things change when a new manager comes in, how have you found it under Scott Bartlett's management?

I've loved it. Even at the start when I was coming back from injury and I was waiting for my chance to get in the team. We had a few chats and I was just waiting for my chance. Then when my chance came, I feel like I've taken it and it's been good. He's put his trust back in me and he believes in me so I can't thank him enough for that.

We've recently learnt our opposition for the FA Trophy, and I just want to chat to you about the FA Trophy. You probably know where I'm going with this Kieron. You've won at Wembley and scored in the penalty shootout. It's obvious that this is a major moment and a really positive moment in your career, but what do you take away from a high-pressure situation like this?

Looking back at my time at Gateshead, it was a really good because I came back from not playing much football and then went there and ended up playing in a really good team. We managed to get to the final at Wembley and won on penalties, which was probably the best moment in my careers so far. We've obviously got Aldershot at home and it's such a big competition, especially for this league as well. It's something you want to do well in and obviously the day out at Wembley would be great as well.



You've previously represented Wales at youth level which is something that as a child, footballers must dream of. How much did you enjoy that and what did that mean to you?

It was good. I went into the Wales setup at a young age and I was in and out. I think my last cap was U19s or U21s but it's a good experience, obviously playing foreign players as well. It's a change and it's different but it's helped me in my experience so far as well.

Finally, what are your goals for the remainder of the season?

The main focus as a team is to try to get as far up the table as we can and try to get into the play-offs. Personally, my aim is to add more goals and be more creative in games which will help us to create more chances and the more chances we create the more games we'll win. So yeah, just be more productive in the final third.







THE HISTORY OF EASTLEIGH FC

Eastleigh FC was founded on 22nd May 1946 by Derik Brooks and a group of friends at the Fleming Arms public house in Swaythling, Southampton.

OUR CLUB


The club's rise began then they were promoted to the Hampshire League in 1950 after two seasons in the Southampton Senior League (West). In just a year, they topped Division Three (West) and secured the Hampshire Intermediate Cup.

By 1955/56, Swaythling was competing in the Hampshire League Division 1. They returned to this level as champions on Division 2 in 1970. The club's name changed to Eastleigh FC in 1980, and they became founder members of the Wessex League in 1986.

Eastleigh won the Wessex League in 2002/03 and were promoted to Division One East of the Southern League. They went on to secure promotion to the Premier Division of the Isthmian League, eventually earning promotion to the conference South.

Over nine years in the Conference South, Eastleigh twice came close to earning promotion to non-league's highest tier but narrowly missed out on both occasions. They also had a memorable run in the FA Cup and secured silverware in the Hampshire Senior Cup in 2011/12.

In 2014, Eastleigh clinched the Skrill South title, gaining promotion to the National League and are now in the tenth season competing at this level.



OUR HOME

When formed, Swaythling Athletic began playing its home matches on Southampton Common behind where The Cowherds pub is now located.

In 1957, Swaythling Athletic moved to Ten Acres where the club has remained to this day and has been known as the Silverlake Stadium over the last ten seasons due to Eastleigh's stadium right naming partnership with local automotive recycling company Silverlake Automotive Recycling.

The stadium has undergone several renovations and expansions over the years, including the addition of floodlights in 1976, the construction of a grandstand, and since Stewart Donalds arrival, the ground has seen Sherwood restaurant, Brooks hospitality suit as well as the brand new south stand developed in recent years.



Hartlepool United will make a 620 mile round trip to visit the Silverlake Stadium for this afternoon's Enterprise National League fixture.

The Pool play their home games at the Prestige Group Stadium, which has housed them since the club was founded in 1908.

The ground has a maximum capacity of 7,855 and was formerly known as Victoria Park in celebration of Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee.

In 1967, Hartlepool became the penultimate club in the football league to install floodlights with Chesterfield FC being the only side without floodlights before installing them a few months later.

This is now the third consecutive season that Hartlepool United have spent in the Enterprise National League having previously spent two years in League Two.

Last season, the Pools finished 11th in the league standings just eight points adrift of the play-offs.

The club reached the semi-finals of the EFL Trophy during the 2021/22 season but lost on penalties against Rotherham.

Hartlepool's biggest rivals is Darlington, albeit the two sides haven't faced each other for 18 years.

The club's record appearance holder is Ritchie Humphrey's, who made 543 appearances for the club between 2001 and 2013.
