Good evening all, and welcome back to Chalky Lane as we host Abbey Rangers.

Our recent form has been all about the real Late Show. We conceded late goals versus Redhill after being dominant for 70 minutes, and again conceded with the last kick of the game. From the Archives



Tonight we go back to the 1992/93 season in the Diadora Football League Division 3 when we hosted Aldershot Town at West Street (one of our last games there) on 17th April.

Aldershot Town were formed in 1992 after Aldershot FC became the first Football League team to fold, mid-season in March 1992; the new club started life in Division Three that August.

Aldershot were leading the league by 13 points with 3 games go, with The Salts 7 points clear of a 5-way battle against relegation. The match ended inevitably in a win for the league leaders but narrowly 2-1. With our guests destined to head back to the football league for the 2008/09 season.

That season Farnham Town were accepted into the league but didn't start the season due to ground-grading; Petersfield United, however folded.

It's noteworthy that we had a Women's team then too, albeit one struggling at the foot of National League Division 1 South.

Welcome to Abbey Rangers



Founded in 1976, Abbey Rangers F.C. began life as a youth club for boys aged 7–16, taking their name from the nearby historic Chertsey Abbey. From modest beginnings in the towns of Chertsey and Addlestone, the club's ambition has always been clear: to create opportunities and a pathway in football for young people in Surrey.

Early years and growth

In its first decades, Abbey Rangers operated primarily as a youth organisation, assembling teams and playing wherever pitches were available in the local area. However, by the early 2000s the club was ready to formalise its adult football provision and begin climbing the non-league ladder. They entered the Surrey & Hants Border League and in 2004-05 won Division One, signalling that the club's ambitions were beginning to translate on the pitch.

Climbing the leagues

Following that success, Abbey Rangers moved into the Guildford & Woking Alliance Division One, immediately capturing the Division title and earning promotion to the Premier Division. After finishing as runners-up in the Premier Division, they gained entry to the Surrey County Intermediate League (Western) Division One, then swiftly secured the title and League Cup in their first season at that level. In 2011 they joined the Surrey Elite Intermediate League, further consolidating their status as an ambitious club moving through the non-league pyramid.

Into the national non-league system

A crucial milestone arrived in 2014-15, when a fourth-place finish earned promotion to Division One of the Combined Counties Football League (CCFL). In their debut season in Division One of the CCFL they finished third and gained promotion to the Premier Division — a clear indicator that Abbey Rangers were now firmly established among the higher levels of regional non-league football.

Home at Addlestone Moor

Off the field the club's stability has grown too. Abbey Rangers call home the venue known as "The Moor", located at Addlestone Moor, Surrey (KT15 2QH). The ground features multiple pitches, a floodlit training area, and club-owned clubhouse facilities, reflecting a long-term vision for community and sporting development.

Cup runs and memorable moments

On the national stage, Abbey Rangers made their first appearance in the FA Cup in the 2016-17 season, debuting in the extra-preliminary round. One of the club's most celebrated runs came in the FA Vase during the 2018-19 season: they progressed to the fifth round, defeating clubs such as Lydney Town, Eastbourne Town and others, before eventually falling in the competition to eventual finalists. These cup exploits not only raised the club's profile but also demonstrated what could be achieved with ambition, strong leadership and community backing.

Community and youth development

While the first team continues to forge ahead, Abbey Rangers remains true to its roots. The club takes pride in its extensive youth section and expanding girls' football programme. From those early days fielding a few youth sides, the girls' section has grown to eight teams with further expansion planned. The emphasis on providing a safe, inclusive sporting environment for boys and girls remains a cornerstone of the club's identity.

Looking ahead

Today Abbey Rangers compete in the Premier Division South of the Combined Counties League, playing at Step 5 of the English National League System. The infrastructure, the playing levels and the community engagement have all reached a point of stability. But the sense of momentum remains: the club continues to seek further progress on and off the pitch, both in terms of league success and strengthening its place in the local community.

From a small youth club in 1976 to a competitive senior non-league side, the journey of Abbey Rangers F.C. is one of steady progress, community focus and ambition. At its heart remains the same purpose: to provide footballing opportunities for local young people, to foster sporting values and to build something lasting. Player to Watch

Luke Robertson, Abbey Rangers' captain and talismanic forward, is the heartbeat of the side. A powerful, intelligent striker, Robertson combines experience, leadership, and a natural eye for goal that makes him essential to Abbey's attacking play in the Combined Counties Premier Division South.

Having previously played higher up the non-league pyramid before joining Abbey, Robertson brings both technical quality and professionalism to Addlestone Moor. His work rate and ability to link play between midfield and attack have made him a constant presence in manager Adam Bessent's plans. In recent campaigns, he has regularly contributed double-figure goal tallies while leading the press from the front.

What sets Robertson apart is his leadership on and off the field. As club captain, he sets the tone in the dressing room and acts as a mentor to younger players progressing from Abbey's youth and reserve teams. His communication, positional intelligence, and willingness to do the unseen work make him a standout figure in the squad.

Robertson's movement off the ball is exceptional for this level of football. He often drifts wide to stretch defences or drops deep to create overloads, allowing Abbey's quick wide players to exploit gaps. His set-piece threat—both as a finisher and organiser—is another key weapon in Abbey's armoury.

In the 2025–26 season, Robertson continues to lead by example, captaining a side that blends youth and experience. His influence extends beyond goals; he is the emotional anchor of the team. When Robertson is on song, Abbey Rangers invariably perform at their best.

If Abbey are to mount a serious top-half challenge this season, expect Luke Robertson to be central to it—driving the press, scoring crucial goals, and leading from the front in true Abbey Rangers fashion.

Match report v Horley Town



Epsom & Ewell 1 Horley Town 1

Combined Counties Premier Division South Saturday 25th October 2025

Scorer: Limpo 29

It's the third time in four matches Epsom & Ewell have let points slip late on — two draws and the 82nd-minute defeat to Tooting & Mitcham still fresh in memory. Even Tuesday's dramatic 2–2 comeback at Alton, against ten men for over an hour, left the side frustrated not to take all three.



A decent crowd of 102 braved a grey, rain-threatened afternoon to watch a much-improved Salts performance despite further injury disruptions. Ayran Kugathas came in at right-back for Luis Oliveira, Stefan Aiwone returned for the brave Toby Young — who played 20 minutes midweek with a dislocated shoulder — while Shane Dunne replaced the injured Callum Wilson. Jason Vincent was unavailable, so Ali Fofahan led the line with Obasanjo Akinniranye wide right.

Epsom began brightly, earning early corners and with Akinniranye's pace causing repeated problems, though his final ball was lacking. On 15 minutes he saw a goal-bound shot cleared off the line. Horley rarely threatened, forcing only one real save as keeper Fabian Witter tipped a long-range effort over. The breakthrough came on 29 minutes from the opposite flank: Adam Green fed Emmanuel Limpo, who weaved into the box and calmly slotted home into the bottom corner. Despite controlling the half, Epsom failed to build on the lead. Dunne sliced wide from distance, and Horley's best opening saw Kendall's shot blocked by Witter before the interval.

The second half followed a similar pattern, with Akinniranye fouled repeatedly but continuing to torment Horley's defence. One break on 60 minutes nearly produced a second goal when Fofahan chased his through-ball, only for a defender to scramble clear. From the resulting corner, the keeper punched clear under pressure from Aiwone. After 70 minutes, Akinniranye's afternoon ended following more rough treatment, replaced by Kionte Gilfillian-Waul, who soon set up Limpo for a headed chance that flew over. Epsom looked comfortable but failed to kill the game, and the punishment came late. A scrappy goalmouth exchange saw Witter make two saves before the ball dropped to Kendall, who finished neatly into the corner to level.

Late substitutions — McShane, Bloor, Ralph and Bell — couldn't spark a response, and Horley finished the stronger side. After six added minutes, the referee's whistle confirmed another missed opportunity. Post-match, the management team rued the late lapse but praised the improved display, noting only one defeat in five games — though just one win in six leaves the Salts mid-table, searching for a cutting edge and a long-term replacement for Kingsley.



Match report v Sutton Common Rov



Sutton Common Rovers 6 Epsom & Ewell 0

Combined Counties Premier Division South Monday 27th October 2025

Epsom & Ewell crashed to their heaviest defeat in years as a young, energetic Sutton Common Rovers side ran riot, winning 6–0. Given Rovers' recent form — four defeats in their last five — hopes were high for a result, but a devastating ten-minute hat-trick from Courtney Swaby in the first half ended any chance of that.



Two changes were made from the draw with Horley Town: Callum Wilson replaced Stefan Aiwone, and Luis Oliveira returned from injury for Shane Duffy. Antonios Nazareth marked his 50th appearance, and the Salts' bench looked strong.

From the outset, SCR attacked with pace down the right. Aryan struggled to contain Swaby, who cut inside and rifled home with his left foot after six minutes. Two minutes later, Swaby again broke through, this time slotting past Witter. A handball from a 15th-minute corner gifted Rovers a penalty, and Swaby converted confidently to seal his hat-trick.

The Salts rarely threatened as Rovers dominated. On 29 minutes, Swaby crossed from the left for Harlem-Lee Bouchez, who rose above Nelson-Roberts to head in the fourth. Limpo had Epsom's first effort on goal on 31 minutes, but his strike lacked power. Things worsened when Wilson pulled his hamstring two minutes later and was replaced by Toby Young. Soon after, Bouchez again caused havoc down the left and, following a goalmouth scramble, back-heeled home from close range to make it five.

Epsom showed flashes late in the half — Oliveira linked with Limpo, who fired over, and Murphy McVey's free kick caused brief concern — but they went in 5–0 down for the second time this season, the previous being against Step 3 Farnham Town.

Despite the deficit, the same eleven reappeared after the break. Five minutes in, Alex Body finished a low cross to make it six. With the game gone, substitutions on 55 minutes — Vincent, Stilwell and Gillfillian-Waul replacing Kugathas, Limpo and Nazareth — brought stability. Stilwell also marked his 50th appearance.

Rovers remained in control but Epsom began to compete. Oba's fine run and cross led to Vincent striking the post on 60 minutes, while Murphy fired over from distance ten minutes later. The Salts at least prevented further damage, though their goal difference was wiped out in the process. It was a sobering night. Rovers, far sharper and fitter, looked every bit a top-three side. The management team were left searching for answers.



Match report v Camberley Town



Camberley Town 2 Epsom & Ewell 1

Scorers: Merrett 90+1

Epsom & Ewell fell to another frustrating defeat against 10-man opposition, losing 2–1 away at Camberley Town on a wet, sloping, bumpy pitch.



There were several changes to the Salts line-up. Connor McShane started at right-back, Ali Fofahan at left-back in an unfamiliar role, and Adam Green partnered Toby Young in the centre. New signings Karl Bailey and Callum O'Keefe started wide, Shane Dunne returned to midfield with the recalled Niall Stillwell, and Jason Vincent led the attack.

The match had a chaotic opening. Bailey's debut ended after just nine minutes, forced off with a shoulder injury from an early challenge, replaced by Ethan Nelson-Roberts. Soon after, play was stopped while animal excrement was removed from the pitch — done by the away bench, not the home team.

Both sides struggled to create clear openings. Green was booked for a sliding tackle, and Nelson-Roberts shot over after a positive run down the left from O'Keefe. Camberley put two free kicks wide from similar positions, while Murphy-McVey also fired over from the edge of the box. O'Keefe continued to threaten, putting Fofahan through for another chance which went wide, and McShane's free kick near half-time was headed behind. Neither goalkeeper had a save to make before the break.

After half-time O'Keefe was booked, and on 56 minutes Camberley's Rippon received a yellow for a studs-up challenge, then immediately talked himself into a second yellow and a dismissal. Despite that, the hosts took the lead soon after — Witter first saving from Ewing, then from the resulting corner Camberley captain Larrieu-Price tapped in at the near post. Two minutes later it was 2–0, as a through ball wasn't dealt with and the home No.9 lobbed the keeper.

Epsom & Ewell made further changes — Kugathas replacing McShane, then Akinnirayne, Bloor and Merrett introduced — but still struggled to test the Camberley keeper. Dunne fired over late on, and Camberley also shot over from a promising move.

In added time, a perfect left-footed in-swinging corner from the right found Merrett unmarked to finish from close range, but the goal arrived too late to influence the result.

The Salts' run now reads six points from seven games.

Ground Regulations 2025-26



Spectator Code of Conduct

All spectators attending home matches are required to read and comply with this Code of Conduct, and to respect the same principles when attending our away fixtures at other clubs. Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of this Code of Conduct, the rules and regulations of The Football Association and The Combined Counties League. The Club reserves the right to amend, alter or update this Code of Conduct and to eject, ban or prosecute as appropriate or necessary at their sole discretion. Please remember that your behaviour reflects on Epsom & Ewell FC and could result in fines and, in extreme cases, heavier sanctions being imposed upon the club.

Entering and Leaving the Ground

If you have driven to the ground, please park your vehicle considerately, do not block in others, and in particular do not block our neighbours' access to their houses. Out of respect for our neighbours, please keep noise levels down, especially late at night, and do not litter the area. Do not attempt to bring flares, fireworks or any other dangerous items into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and confiscate any prohibited items found. No alcoholic drinks are allowed to be brought into the ground. Do not attempt to bypass the gate security checks, smuggle drinks of any kind into the ground, or bypass the turnstiles without payment. Anyone found doing so will be evicted from the ground.

Within the Ground

Be respectful to club officers, staff, security, stewards, and other fans at all times. Do not obstruct the normal activities of the Club and its officers. Do not stand in seating areas or block access gangways or steps. Do not behave in a manner that compromises the comfort, enjoyment or safety of others. Always behave appropriately and do not bring the Club into disrepute.

The following behaviour will not be tolerated and will result in immediate eviction and ban: being drunk or under the influence of drugs and behaving antisocially; threatening behaviour; use of obscene or abusive language; persistent swearing and/or making vulgar gestures; racial, homophobic or any other form of discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment; fighting; entering the field of play before, during or after the game; throwing any missile or object onto the field of play; and setting off any flare or firework.

Strictly Forbidden

The following are strictly forbidden and may result in immediate eviction and a ban for repeat offenders: the consumption of alcohol in bottles, cans or glasses in the stands, terraces and other open areas within the ground; climbing onto floodlights, stands, buildings, roofs, fences or any other structure; obstruction of any walkways and pedestrian routes; playing ball games in areas populated by ground visitors; allowing any animal to roam off the leash within the ground confines; and parking any vehicle that blocks emergency vehicle access.

The length of any ban imposed will be related to the severity of the offence and solely at the discretion of the Club. Any appeal may be made in writing through the Club Secretary and will be given full and due consideration.
