



### From the Archives



Tonight we go back 48 years, almost to the day, to our home match against Lewes in what turned out to be a championship winning season for The Salts in the Isthmian League Division Two.

Lewes were under new management after ex-Epsom forward Tex Wiltshire left the club with ex-Brighton player Terry Stanley running their team with Peter Medhurst.

The league table before the game showed Epsom & Ewell starting the season strongly in 4<sup>th</sup> place with games in hand on teams above. Lewes struggling near the bottom. At that stage Tommy Tuite was unsurprisingly already our top scorer for the season with 4 goals.

The match ended with a 2-0 win for The Salts. Lewes made a recovery that season ending in 8<sup>th</sup> place, but The Salts were clear champions with the Met Police also promoted.

### Welcome to Tooting & Mitcham



### **Origins & Amalgamation**

The roots of the club stretch back to Tooting Town, founded as Tooting Graveney in 1887. Over the years, the club moved through several home grounds: from the open pitches of Figges Marsh, to an enclosed ground at "Lonesome", then to Gorringe Park's "North Surrey Poultry Farm", and later to a site in The Ridgeway beside a railway line. After the First World War, the club reorganised and re-entered competition as Tooting Town.

In 1932, a landmark merger was agreed between two local rivals, creating the club we know today: Tooting & Mitcham United. The name "The Terrors" was soon adopted, and their distinctive black-and-white stripes earned them the nickname "The Stripes" as well.

### Sandy Lane: The Old Home

In 1922, Tooting Town purchased land at Sandy Lane. The ground was developed over 18 months and first used during the 1923–24 season. Over the decades, Sandy Lane grew into one of London's more iconic non-league stadiums. It hosted various Surrey and London cup finals and witnessed headline fixtures and exhibition matches. Its record defeats included 0–7 losses to Hayes in 1951–52 (Athenian League) and St Albans in 1970–71 (Isthmian).

Sadly, Sandy Lane's era came to an end in 2002. The ground was sold and redeveloped into housing, with road names paying tribute to past Tooting & Mitcham legends.

### Move to Imperial Fields

Upon leaving Sandy Lane, the club relocated to Imperial Fields (also referred to as the KNK Stadium), in Morden. The stadium officially opened in 2002, offering modern facilities and a capacity of 3,500 (612 seated). Notably, Dulwich Hamlet later groundshared here, and the stadium's highest recorded attendance (3,321) came during a play-off final in 2018. Tooting & Mitcham's own attendance record is 2,637, set in a 1–1 draw with AFC Wimbledon in April 2005. Imperial Fields also hosts two artificial 3G pitches used for training and community events.

### On the Pitch: Leagues, Triumphs & Trials

Following its formation, Tooting & Mitcham United joined the Athenian League in 1937–38. The Second World War interrupted many seasons. Post-war success came in 1949–50 when the club won the Athenian League title. They would go on to win it again in 1954–55.

In 1956–57, T&MU joined the Isthmian League, and in their second season (1957–58) they claimed the Isthmian title. They repeated as champions in 1959–60.

Over the years, the club has had its ups and downs. In 1989 they were relegated to Division One, and later in 1997 to Division Two. Nonetheless, the club has always retained a spirit of resilience and a passionate following.

n recent decades, the club's governance has evolved. The Members Club, formed in 2005, plays a central volunteer-driven role in supporting operations—matchdays, fundraising, and community outreach—while existing alongside the main footballing company. The current club structure is a hybrid of community support and more formal business management.

#### Notable Alumni & Influence

Tooting & Mitcham has acted as a springboard for talented players. Among the best-known is Michail Antonio, whose journey from non-league to Premier League and international recognition is well documented. Another promising name is Hady Ghandour, who came through the youth ranks before moving on to professional opportunities.

### **Today & Outlook**

As of the latest season, Tooting & Mitcham United competes in regional non-league football, striving for stability, success, and community engagement. Their home remains Imperial Fields, and they continue to rely on the dedication of volunteers, members, and supporters.

With a heritage spanning nearly a century, The Terrors wear their stripes with pride—honouring the past while pushing onwards into the future.

In the play off positions are Fleet Town who beat bottom of the table Guildford City 5-0 (Guildford's goal difference does not look very pretty with already a figure of minus 28). Abbey Rangers lie in third after 0-0 home draw and moving into the top six were Badshot Lea who won 2-1 and Sheerwater who crushed Camberley Town 6-2. the two teams dropping out of the top six after this weekends games are Corinthian Causals who were soundly beaten 6-0 by Chipstead with our former striker Carl Oblitey scoring 4 (he must be the top scorer in the division) and Tooting & Mitcham who held a two goal advantage until the 89th minute and then conceded then and another late goal in the 95th minute to end 2-2. We are currently lie in 11th place on 14 points, if we did win our two games in hand on the teams above us we would be in the play off positions, but what we need to do now is to consolidate todays excellent 4-0 victory over Thatcham Town and get a result against Tooting and Mitcham on Tuesday evening at Chalky Lane.

I thought I would follow our victors (Eastbourne Borough's) progress in the FA Cup as they took on a very good side in Boreham Wood at home in front of just over 1,000 spectators. Unfortunately, they lost 3-0. Our former player Kingsley Anokye did get onto the pitch in the second half but the game was nearly over by the time he was introduced. So I will follow with yourselves now Boreham Wood to see how they get on in the next round. Another notable result in the FA Cup was Farnham Town's 3-3 home draw with Sutton United, although Sutton are not having a great season thus far this is still a very good result for Farnham.

As I reported in my last Musings, our landlords at Chessington and Hook are not having a good season as they lost again away at Bridon Ropes 2-1 in front of only 26 spectators - they are already 5 points from safety. Hopefully, better times are ahead for 'Chessy'. Our former landlords at Leatherhead FC are top of the table in their Isthmian League South Central League by 3 points with games in hand on the chasing pack; it will be interesting to see how they fare over the season; the crowds seem to be returning to Fetcham Grove with nearly 500 there for their 1-0 victory over Harrow Borough.

Lastly, I am very pleased to report that Spelthorne Sports did at last play a home match after the 'geese gate' incident of a few weeks ago and even ran out 3-1 winners over Chalfont St Peter - well done to them.

### Match report v Thatcham Town

The Salts bounced back in style with a dominant 4–0 win over Thatcham Town – the perfect response to last week's disappointment.



Debutant Harry Murphy came in at left-back, while Kionte Gillfillian-Waul moved up front to replace Obasanjo Akinniranye, who dropped to the bench despite being last week's man of the match. Jason Vincent also started ahead of Jake Brown.

This was the club's first game at their new home, Chalky Lane, shared with Chessington & Hook FC. In warm sunshine and in front of 189 supporters – including plenty of young Epsom & Ewell Colts mascots – it already felt like home. As Antonios Nazereth said afterwards, "We need to make this ground a fortress."

Thatcham, relegated from the Southern League last season and hit hard by illness and injuries, began brightly, forcing an early free kick that Faebian punched clear. But the Salts responded superbly. Jason Vincent set up Luke Miller on the edge of the box, and his first-time finish made it 1–0.

Just four minutes later, Miller struck again, chasing a long ball before his shot deflected over the stranded keeper for 2–0. Thatcham briefly threatened, with Paxford shooting wide and Winchcombe testing Faebian, but Epsom stayed composed. On the stroke of half-time, Adam Green released Miller, who unselfishly squared for Ali Fofahan to tap in for his fourth of the season. 3–0 at the break, and the Salts were cruising.

The second half continued in the same vein. Brendan Murphy-McVey's clever free kick found Vincent, whose header just cleared the bar, while Thatcham created little. A wave of substitutions followed, including Akinniranye and McShane, who combined for the fourth goal on 82 minutes – McShane bursting down the right and crossing for Oba to slot home his first for the club.

Epsom saw out the final minutes comfortably to seal an emphatic 4–0 victory. Thatcham battled gamely despite their depleted squad, but the Salts' quality shone through.

A vital win that lifts Epsom & Ewell back up the table – and sets the tone for making Chalky Lane a true fortress.

# Ground Regulations 2025-26



### Spectator Code of Conduct

All spectators attending home matches are required to read and comply with this Code of Conduct, and to respect the same principles when attending our away fixtures at other clubs. Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of this Code of Conduct, the rules and regulations of The Football Association and The Combined Counties League. The Club reserves the right to amend, alter or update this Code of Conduct and to eject, ban or prosecute as appropriate or necessary at their sole discretion. Please remember that your behaviour reflects on Epsom & Ewell FC and could result in fines and, in extreme cases, heavier sanctions being imposed upon the club.

### Entering and Leaving the Ground

If you have driven to the ground, please park your vehicle considerately, do not block in others, and in particular do not block our neighbours' access to their houses. Out of respect for our neighbours, please keep noise levels down, especially late at night, and do not litter the area. Do not attempt to bring flares, fireworks or any other dangerous items into the ground. We reserve the right to check all bags and confiscate any prohibited items found. No alcoholic drinks are allowed to be brought into the ground. Do not attempt to bypass the gate security checks, smuggle drinks of any kind into the ground, or bypass the turnstiles without payment. Anyone found doing so will be evicted from the ground.

#### Within the Ground

Be respectful to club officers, staff, security, stewards, and other fans at all times. Do not obstruct the normal activities of the Club and its officers. Do not stand in seating areas or block access gangways or steps. Do not behave in a manner that compromises the comfort, enjoyment or safety of others. Always behave appropriately and do not bring the Club into disrepute.

The following behaviour will not be tolerated and will result in immediate eviction and ban: being drunk or under the influence of drugs and behaving antisocially; threatening behaviour; use of obscene or abusive language; persistent swearing and/or making vulgar gestures; racial, homophobic or any other form of discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment; fighting; entering the field of play before, during or after the game; throwing any missile or object onto the field of play; and setting off any flare or firework.

#### Strictly Forbidden

The following are strictly forbidden and may result in immediate eviction and a ban for repeat offenders: the consumption of alcohol in bottles, cans or glasses in the stands, terraces and other open areas within the ground; climbing onto floodlights, stands, buildings, roofs, fences or any other structure; obstruction of any walkways and pedestrian routes; playing ball games in areas populated by ground visitors; allowing any animal to roam off the leash within the ground confines; and parking any vehicle that blocks emergency vehicle access.

The length of any ban imposed will be related to the severity of the offence and solely at the discretion of the Club. Any appeal may be made in writing through the Club Secretary and will be given full and due consideration.
