Schools Provision

In September 2024, we launched extra-curricular offers for schools across Pembrokeshire. We aimed to ensure our provision would be tailored to the specific needs of each school, enhancing the impact made through the sessions. Each offer included a visit from a First-Team player and an assembly highlighting the schools specific values related to football. Looking ahead to the 2025-26 season, we will be continuing these offers across the county, aiming to recruit more partner schools and increase the impact made through our delivery.

Lunchtime Clubs

We have supported schools to create positive environments for football matches at lunchtime and ensure pupils return to the classroom with no distractions, ready to learn.

After School Clubs

Our most popular offer welcomed by schools has been our after school football clubs.
Ranging from mixed to girls only sessions across multiple year groups.

HWB Clubs

Improving the Health and Wellbeing of children across Pembrokeshire is vital to us. These clubs have highlighted the importance of living a healthy lifestyle and provided opportunities for pupils to increase their physical activity.

Stadium Visits

We also provided schools with the opportunity to visit the Ogi Bridge Meadow Stadium to engage in a stadium tour, First-Team player Q&A and a workshop chosen by the school. We look forward to welcoming more schools to the stadium during the 2025-26 season.






How much has your confidence grown from attending the sessions?







Have the sessions helped you make new friends or feel more comfortable around others?


How much have the sessions improved your physical fitness?





Case Study Pembroke Dock Community School

This season, we created a fantastic partnership with Pembroke Dock Community School allowing us to deliver weekly Health & Wellbeing sessions to pupils in years 3-6. Our sessions provided pupils with the opportunity to remain physically active and socially connected every Friday afternoon. The sessions were optional for the pupils and supported the schools wider Health and Wellbeing offer, so to have such well attended sessions each week was extremely pleasing. It was fantastic to work with pupils on a weekly basis, allowing us to make a true impact on their development and provide memorable real life learning experiences.







We were delighted to be able to provide primary school pupils across Pembrokeshire with the opportunity to design our 2025-26 Warm-Up Kit. Players and staff initially shortlisted four kit designs that were then voted on by the public via a social media poll. An incredible final design that used the Pembrokeshire flag and Haverfordwest County AFC colours for inspiration was selected, and we would like to congratulate year 5 pupil Joseph Davies once again for producing such an incredible Warm-Up Kit.



Holiday Provision Soccer Camps

We hosted our popular Soccer Camps at the Ogi Bridge Meadow Stadium in February, April and May 2025, providing consistency of events and opportunities for children to keep active during the holiday periods. Our FAW & UEFA qualified coaches' engaging delivery style and creative activities, ensured children had the best and most enjoyable experience whilst in our care.



Throughout the 2024–25 season, we focused on enhancing our matchday experience at the Ogi Bridge Meadow Stadium for the whole family. 




Pay & Play


What impact has Pay & Play sessions had on your child / children?




How would you rate the overall quality of the sessions?



What motivated you to take part in Walking Football sessions at the Ogi Bridge Meadow Stadium?




"The ability to still play football, to enjoy the sport I have played all my life and to have competitive opportunities to represent the club and to have an international cap in my 40s is an absolute honour."






