It's great to be back at home in front of our supporters. For some of our players, this will be the first time they hear our loyal supporters, and I'm really looking forward to introducing them to our environment.



OPENING DAY DEFEAT

We spoke to Paul Caddis after Saturday's defeat to Spennymoor Town.

It was a defeat for the Bulls on the opening day after the long trip to Spennymoor, but the performance showed good signs.

"I thought the first half we were very good", Caddis explained. "I thought we passed the ball well, I thought we got into brilliant areas, I thought we caused them a huge amount of problems.

"We must have had four or five balls flashed across the box, in comparison to not many from them.

"We found ourselves two-nil down, it's frustrating. Football's all about moments, and in those moments, we didn't score and defensively we switched off."

Two goals late in the first half from Glen Taylor and Dan Rowe proved to be the killer blow for the Bulls. The Bulls boss was frustrated with the manner of the goals.

"Theo made a good attempt for the second goal, but there are two free to tap it in at the back post. It's not good enough to be honest.

"It's difficult to get your head around. I don't think we were played through. We look at shapes and how we're asking the players to play, and the lads felt comfortable.

"The last 25 minutes I felt there was lots of effort but no real cutting edge at the end of the match"

There were plenty of positives to take from the match. Eno Nto was lively down the right.

"Eno's going to be a huge threat for us, but we'll have to be patient with him. He's not played a lot of senior football, and he was tiring after 50, 55 minutes."

The Brewery field is a place where Hereford have historically struggled, but Paul Caddis was happy with the overall performance.

"I'm really pleased with the performance, I'm really pleased with the group, but most importantly, I'm disappointed with the result."

King's Lynn Town FC - A Journey Since 2010 When the Linnets take to the field today, they do so representing not just a football club, but a story of resilience, rebirth, and relentless ambition. The name "King's Lynn Town" has become synonymous with persistence and progress, but it wasn't long ago that senior football in the town faced an uncertain future. Since rising from the ashes in 2010, the club has carved out a remarkable path through the English football pyramid, experiencing dramatic highs, testing lows, and countless memorable moments along the

A New Dawn - Foundation & Early Success The modern King's Lynn Town FC was born in 2010 after the dissolution of the original King's Lynn FC in late 2009 due to financial difficulties. For supporters, it was a painful blow—the old club had been a part of the community for over a century. But where some towns might have been left without a football heartbeat, King's Lynn's passion for the game refused to die. Within months, a phoenix club was formed, carrying forward the Linnets name, badge, and colours.

The journey began in the United Counties League Premier Division for the 2010-11 season. In what would set the tone for the years ahead, the new Linnets wasted no time making an impression. They finished runners-up in their debut campaign and embarked on a thrilling FA Vase run, reaching the semi-finals before eventually bowing out 6-2 on aggregate to Coalville Town. It was a taste of gloryand a clear sign that King's Lynn Town meant business.

Climbing the Pyramid

The club's momentum didn't fade. The 2011-12 season brought another second-place finish in the United Counties League, but this time the reward was promotion to the Northern Premier League Division One South. A year later, they went one better-2012-13 saw the Linnets crowned champions of Division One South at the first attempt, clinching a second promotion in just three seasons. Supporters who had feared for football's future in the town were now watching a side that was rapidly climbing the nonleague ladder.

Life in the Northern Premier League Premier Division brought stiffer tests, but the foundations for sustained success were being laid. Crowds at The Walks began to grow, and the club's profile within Norfolk football was steadily rising.

Southern League Years & County Cup Glory In 2015, as part of a regional reshuffle, King's Lynn Town were transferred into the Southern League Premier Division Central, It was a shift that brought new opponents and fresh challenges, but the Linnets adapted quickly.

One of the standout moments of this era came in 2016-17, when the club lifted the Norfolk Senior Cup after a 2-0 victory over Fakenham Town at Carrow Road. It might not have been the glamour of the FA Cup or a league title, but silverware always matters and for local pride, it meant everything.

The following seasons were characterised by near misses and heart-pounding play-off drama. In 2017-18, the Linnets finished runners-up in the league and fought their way to the play-off final. After a memorable semi-final win over Weymouth, hopes were high—but Slough Town proved too strong in the final, ending King's Lynn's promotion dream for that year.

If anything, the setback only strengthened the team's resolve. The 2018-19 season saw the Linnets placed in the newly created Southern League Premier Division Central. Once again, they finished second. This time, however, they completed the job—winning promotion via the play-offs. The run included an unforgettable 3-2 victory over Warrington Town in the "super playoff" final, a game that will live long in the memory of anyone who was there.

The National Stage - National League North & National League

The 2019-20 season brought yet another leap forward. Competing in the National League North for the first time, King's Lynn Town were enjoying a strong campaign when the COVID-19 pandemic brought football to a halt. While the season couldn't be completed in the traditional way, the Linnets were crowned champions on a points-per-game basis, earning a historic promotion to the National League, the fifth tier of English football.

For a club that had been playing in the United Counties League less than a decade earlier, it was a remarkable achievement.

The Linnets' first season at non-league's top table, 2020-21, included a memorable FA Cup run. After beating League Two side Port Vale 1-0 in Round One, they travelled to Fratton Park for a glamour tie against Portsmouth. While the 6-1 defeat was a harsh lesson in the gap between the divisions, the day itself—and the cup journey that led there—was a milestone in the club's modern history.

The following year, 2021-22, brought another FA Cup First Round appearance, this time ending in a narrow 1-0 defeat at home to Walsall. Unfortunately, league form was less kind, and the Linnets were relegated back to the National League North.

Fighting Back - Recent Years

Relegation didn't dampen the ambition at The Walks. In 2022-23, the Linnets again made headlines in the FA Cup, defeating Doncaster Rovers in the First Round

before bowing out in Round Two. In the league, they finished as National League North runners-up, but the play-offs proved cruel once again as they fell in the semi-finals to Kidderminster Harriers.

The 2024-25 season was another competitive campaign. The Linnets secured a sixth-place finish, enough for another crack at the play-offs, but their promotion push ended in the quarter-finals with a tight 1-0 defeat to Chorley.

A New Era - James Rowe Takes the Helm Change is never far away in football, and the summer of 2025 brought a major shift in the dugout. On 14 May 2025, Adam Lakeland departed the club, ending his spell as manager. Just over a week later, on 22 May, James Rowe was confirmed as the new Head Coach of King's Lynn Town FC.

Rowe arrives with a reputation for progressive football and an eye for developing talent—qualities that could prove vital as the club looks to push once again for promotion to the National League. The challenge ahead is significant, but the ambition at The Walks remains as strong as ever.

Why This Story Matters

The journey of King's Lynn Town FC since 2010 is about far more than promotions and cup runs. It's a story of a community refusing to let its club disappear, of volunteers giving countless hours to keep things moving, and of players and managers striving to take the club to levels many thought impossible just 15 years ago.

From those early days in the United Counties League to battling in front of thousands in the National League, the Linnets have proved that with determination, smart planning, and the backing of passionate supporters, even the most daunting challenges can be overcome.

Looking Ahead

As the 2025–26 season approaches, there's a sense of cautious optimism in the air. With James Rowe at the helm, a core of experienced players, and a fanbase that has stood by the club through thick and thin, King's Lynn Town are once again eyeing the top end of the table.

Football, of course, is never predictable. There will be twists, setbacks, and—hopefully—moments of pure elation. But whatever happens, one thing is certain: this club will keep fighting, keep competing, and keep making its town proud.

So when you see the Linnets run out today, remember just how far they've come since that uncertain summer of 2010. Every pass, every tackle, every goal is another chapter in a story that is still being written—and one that belongs to every supporter in the stands.



DEFENDERS

Reece Hall-Johnson

A summer 2025 signing from Barnet, right-back Hall-Johnson brings both pace and a wealth of lower-league know-how. The 29-year-old began his career in the Norwich City youth ranks before spells at Grimsby Town and Wrexham, where his attacking runs and energy up the flank became a hallmark of his game. Comfortable driving forward into space and delivering dangerous crosses, Hall-Johnson offers a real outlet from deep positions. Today, the home wingers will need to keep an eye on his overlapping bursts.

Bailey Clements

Operating on the opposite side of defence, Clements arrived ahead of the 2025/26 campaign having previously turned out for Ipswich Town, Chesterfield, and Hornchurch. Tall and composed, the left-back blends defensive discipline with the ability to push forward and support the attack. His grounding in the Ipswich academy has given him a solid technical base, and his experience across National League and EFL environments means he's comfortable adapting to different match situations.

Tom Wilson

Under contract for the 2025/26 season, Wilson has been a dependable presence in the heart of the back line. While not as high-profile a signing as some, he's valued for his positional awareness, aerial strength, and consistency. Wilson often takes on the responsibility of organising the defensive unit, particularly when under sustained pressure, and his calmness in possession helps his side build from the back.

Tai Fleming

A member of the current first-team squad, Fleming is another option in central defence who can also fill in at full-back if needed. Still developing his game, he brings raw athleticism and a willingness to compete for every ball. Fleming's energy and appetite for the physical side of the game make him a useful presence when the opposition looks to play direct.

MIDFIELDERS

Michael Clunan (Captain)

The heartbeat of the side, Clunan rejoined the Linnets from Scunthorpe United in June 2025 and immediately reclaimed the captain's armband. A central midfielder with an excellent range of passing, he dictates the tempo and isn't afraid to put a foot in when needed. Clunan's leadership qualities are matched by his vision — he's equally adept at threading a through ball as he is at switching play to stretch the opposition. With deep ties to the club

from his previous stint, he's a figurehead both on and off the pitch.

Collins adds energy and graft to the midfield. Known for covering every blade of grass, he supports both defence and attack, linking play with quick, simple passes. While he may not always grab the headlines, his industry and tactical discipline are vital in ensuring the side maintains balance across the pitch.

Ross Crane

Retained for the 2025/26 season, Crane has become a versatile midfield option. Equally comfortable out wide or tucked inside, he offers creativity and a willingness to take on opponents. A player who can change the rhythm of a match with a burst of pace or a clever pass, Crane has the ability to unlock stubborn defences when given time on the ball.

Jack Lambert

One of the notable new faces, Lambert joined from Chester in June 2025. Bringing experience and a touch of flair, he thrives in advanced midfield roles where he can influence play in the final third. With an eye for goal and a knack for arriving in the box at just the right time, Lambert could be one to watch for late runs and link-up play with the forwards.

Emmanuel Maja

Signed from Aldershot, Maja is a tenacious midfielder who loves to break up play and launch quick transitions. He's strong in the tackle and possesses a sharp sense of when to press opponents high up the pitch. Maja's style is all about disrupting the opposition's rhythm and winning the ball back in dangerous areas.

Cameron Forde-Brown

An academy graduate who made senior appearances in 2024/25, Forde-Brown represents the club's commitment to nurturing homegrown talent. Agile and composed in possession, he's often used as an impact substitute to bring fresh legs and energy late in games. His development will be closely watched as he continues to gain valuable minutes.

William Van Lier

A squad member with the ability to slot into various midfield roles. While not yet a regular starter, his adaptability and work rate make him a handy player to call upon in busy fixture periods.

Morgan Williams

Confirmed as joining for the 2025/26 season,

The Manager

James Rowe

Known for building fast, attacking sides and developing young talent, Rowe was appointed as the Linnets manager in May 2025

His managerial record includes impressive spells at Gloucester City, Chesterfield, and AFC Fylde, delivering strong performances and ambitious football. Earlier, he was Assistant Manager at Aldershot Town, helping them to back-to-back National League play-off finishes.

A former striker, Rowe began coaching at Birmingham City and earned his UEFA A Licence by 28. In 2014, he joined West Ham United as Assistant Academy Manager, helping nurture future Premier League players such as Declan Rice and Ben Johnson, and continues to mentor EFL midfielder Conor Coventry.

Williams brings enthusiasm and a desire to make an impression. He's tipped to offer drive from midfield, and his arrival adds another competitive edge to the battle for starting spots.

FORWARDS

Gold Omotayo

A towering striker who has re-signed for another season, Omotayo is a familiar figure to National League followers. Known for his aerial dominance and physical presence, he can unsettle defences simply by occupying centre-backs and winning headers. Omotayo's hold-up play allows teammates to push forward, and he's always a danger from set pieces.

Michael "Micky" Gyasi

Returning to King's Lynn from Peterborough Sports in June 2025, Gyasi is a direct forward blessed with pace and trickery. Equally comfortable out wide or through the middle, he relishes running at defenders and creating space for others. His return will delight supporters who remember his previous exciting performances in the club's colours.

Adam Marriott

A name that brings a smile to many fans, Marriott rejoined in June 2025 after a prolific spell at Boston United. A natural finisher with superb movement, he has a knack for finding pockets of space and punishing lapses in concentration. Marriott's finishing instincts make him one of the most dangerous players on the pitch, and his reunion with the club adds a touch of romance to the campaign.

Joseph Nyahwema

A younger forward in the squad, Nyahwema is still carving out his role but offers raw pace and enthusiasm. He's capable of making darting runs in behind defences, and his willingness to press high can force errors in the opposition's back line.

Theo Williams

Signed in 2024 after time with Sheffield United and Fleetwood Town, Williams also gained valuable senior experience during loan spells at Darlington and elsewhere. Quick, agile, and always eager to take on his man, Williams is the sort of forward who can turn a match with a single moment of inspiration. His versatility across the front line makes him a valuable asset.



King's Lynn Town

The Bulls are at home for the first time this season on Saturday as they host King's Lynn Town.

Hereford will be looking to get their first points of the new campaign after a disappointing 2-0 loss on the opening day away to Spennymoor Town.

"I thought we were very good in the first half, we caused them huge amounts of problems, but we found ourselves 2-0 down at half-time,

"I always say football is all about moments, and we switched off defensively in two key moments, which lost us the game," said Paul Caddis.

The Bulls sit 23rd in the National League North after just one match, but they'll be aiming to get points on the board at the first attempt in front of their own supporters

King's Lynn also had a frustrating start to the season, drawing 1-1 at home to newly promoted AFC Telford.

The Linnets came close to promotion last season, finishing 6th and losing in the play-off Quarter-Finals to Chorley, and will be eyeing another push after a summer of strong recruitment.

Off the pitch, the Norfolk club underwent significant change over the summer, with the club being taken over by a Singapore-based investment firm and a change in manager, with James Rowe coming in.

The two sides met twice last season in the league, a goalless draw at Edgar Street and a 2-0 away win for the Bulls courtesy of goals from Tate and Remaye Campbell.

Hereford fans will be hoping their side can pick up their first points of the season on Saturday.

Team News

Kai Williams was absent from the squad against Spennymoor after he rolled his ankle in training, but he is a possibility ahead of Saturday.

Matt Preston also picked up an injury in training to his Achilles and has been ruled out of the game on Saturday by Caddis.

Lawson D'Ath and Chris Wreh both pulled their hamstrings during pre-season and have also been ruled out.




FSA Supports The National League's '3UP' Campaign

Fan Feature – Paul Sheeran – Hereford

One of the 'D' Block "back row boys" is Paul Sheeran, whose first match goes back to the 'Old Old' Southern League days and an encounter with Weymouth in 1965. He recalls "sitting on the old railway sleepers in the cow shed". Senior fans will remember this was on the Merton side of the ground, on the area that became today's Merton Stand.

Paul's memory match is the FA Cup Fourth Round replay in 1972 at West Ham United. "I was with a large group of Hereford fans who were locked out. There was a dock strike down there and it was pay on the gate only. 42,000 piled in to watch, a lot of them being the striking dock workers! West Ham relented to let us in, just before the end. I saw Billy Meadows score at the West Ham end!"

This was just prior to Paul going off to the Army where he had a distinguished career attached to many famous regiments.


