From the Top - With the Hereford FC Chairman

Good afternoon and welcome to the MandM Edgar Street Stadium once again.

Today we welcome Chorley to Herefordshire and there is no doubt they will provide us with a very stern test. In Andy Preece they have one of the most experienced non-league managers in the game and year on year he puts together a squad capable of competing at the top end of the table.

While it is early days, the fact they travel here unbeaten in their first 3 games suggests they will again be one of the contenders this campaign and it's clear we will have to perform well to get a positive result this afternoon.

Looking at our own start, and there's no getting away from the fact that picking up all three points at Buxton on Tuesday night was much needed for everyone. The fact that the win was fully deserved made it all the more satisfying and I was absolutely delighted for Paul, our manager, his staff and all the players as I know they were hurting after last Saturday's defeat against Kings Lynn.

Looking back at last Saturday and I think it's important that I say no-one here left the ground feeling upbeat because we all care passionately about our club and want to continue to make as much progress as possible.

I think Kings Lynn deserved more credit than they received from many of our supporters and their outstanding result at Spennymoor on Tuesday night did provide plenty of context about the type of team they are in my view. We should always remember that the opposition want to win as much as we do and that unfortunately losing is always something that is a possibility.

We should also remember that we have no divine right to expect our team to play well and win football matches just because we get bigger crowds than most other clubs at this level. It really isn't that simple and I'm pretty confident no Hereford team has ever played poorly deliberately.

I will never be anything less than hugely appreciative of the fantastic support our club receives, but I do want to say that some of the

comments I have been made aware of after last weekend's defeat are incredibly disappointing.

I absolutely respect the right for everyone to have an opinion, but when it moves towards personal abuse of any kind, in my view it is out of order.

It is disappointing that both Paul and myself (and also the wider Board of Directors to a lesser extent) received personal abuse after last weekend and while much of it is water off a duck's back, it still doesn't make it right and for different individuals it could have a much more negative impact.

My request to every single supporter is to please retain your incredible passion, but also have some respect for those people who are trying to do their very best for our club, day in and day out. We will not get everything right – no-one does – but every decision made on and off the field is made with the best of intentions and to try to move our great club forward.

And for the record, when I hear that people are suggesting the club is happy to remain at this level, I am happy to categorically state that this is complete nonsense. Our ambitions remain to reach the highest possible level we can, but it is getting harder and harder every year and I hope

most fans would understand why we are not willing to put the club at risk again by overspending and heading back down the road towards financial disaster.

Anyway, that's probably enough of being serious now, so I'll finish on the subject that we all love – football.

I know I don't have to ask, but please do get right behind the lads again today. The support at Buxton in midweek was outstanding – and made a huge difference – so please ensure that is repeated today.

The players deserve a huge amount of respect and praise for their reaction and attitude as well as character at a really tough venue against a top side in the division.

Please stay positive and continue to back the players like you do.

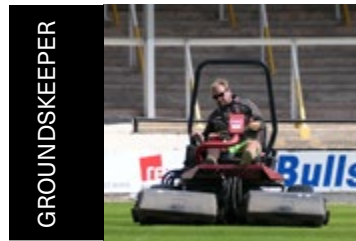

Chorley FC began life as a rugby club, before switching to association football in 1883. Known as 'The Magpies' since the 1890s because of their distinctive black and white striped shirts, the Club have played in six different leagues during an 140-year existence.

After a series of friendly matches against Wigan, Preston North End and Blackburn Rovers in the 1880s, Chorley joined the Lancashire Junior League in 1889. The following year the league became the Lancashire Alliance, where the Club played through 1894 before leaving to join the Lancashire League.

They also competed in the Lancashire Combination and Cheshire County League before becoming a founder member of the Northern Premier League in 1968. Promotion as champions of the NPL in '88 resulted in The Magpies highest finish on the English football pyramid the following year (17th in the Football Conference), before they succumbed to relegation back to the NPL in 1990.

After the brief spell in the fifth tier, Chorley slipped slowly down through the divisions and flirted with relegation to the North West Counties League. Then, with the appointment of Garry Flitcroft as manager in 2010, the Club began a remarkable revival.

Two promotions in four seasons saw the Magpies, roared on by an average crowd almost five-times higher than during the Noughties, catapulted into the National League North after a final day victory at Buxton in April 2014 secured a second NPL championship crown.

In what was to be Flitcroft's last season in charge, the Club almost made a triumphant return to the Football Conference.

Unfortunately, the Magpies failed to win a second-successive promotion after losing the NLN play-off final 3-2 to Guiseley in May 2015.

Assistant manager Matt Jansen took the reins that summer, and although the Magpies missed a play-off berth in 2015/16, they returned the following season only to lose a second play-off final. This time in front of over 8,000 fans at FC Halifax Town.

Yet another play-off appearance was booked in April 2018. However, Harrogate Town edged the semi-final 2-1 with an injury time winner. The defeat was Jansen's last game in charge.

Assistant Jamie Vermiglio took over the day after Jansen departed and led the Magpies to National League North playoff success 10 months later, returning the Club to the fifth tier of English football with a 4-3 penalty victory over Spennymoor Town at Victory Park.

The Magpies' return to non-league's top table lasted just one season, as covid put pay to any hopes of survival with eight games of the season cancelled. A further covid-hit season in the National League North followed, with the season abandoned in February, before a rebound campaign in 2021/22 ended with a playoff berth for the fifth time since 2015.

Having been assistant manager to Vermiglio, Andy Preece now rules the reign at the top of the Magpies' tree and is into his third season as the gaffer.

Preece managed a 12th placed finish in his opening campaign, losing 4-3 to Gloucester City to send his side down from fourth to 12th within less than half an hour.

Chorley continued to kick on in our previous campaign, finishing fourth to set up a play-off eliminator vs Curzon Ashton. The Magpies triumphed on penalties before ultimately

falling short at the hands of Brackley Town in the semi-finals by a goal to nil.

In the 1980s a highlight was knocking out Wolverhampton Wanderers 3-0 in the First Round second replay at Burnden Park, Bolton. The second round of the 1986/87 season saw Preston North End taken to a replay at Deepdale, before the Club succumbed 5-0 in front of 16,308.

The second round was also reached in 1990 with a 2-1 win over Bury at Victory Park, before the Magpies were knocked out 1-0 at Shrewsbury Town.

The 2017/18 campaign saw a return to the first round after a 27-year absence, only for Fleetwood Town to come from behind to win 2-1 at Victory Park in front of the BT Sport cameras.

The following season Doncaster Rovers were taken to a replay after a 2-2 draw at Victory Park, before a third round one appearance in as many years ended in a 1-0 defeat at Mansfield Town.

A record-breaking fourth consecutive season in the competition proper materialised during the covid-hit 2020/21 campaign, and following wins at Wigan and Peterborough, the Magpies beat Championship Derby County in round three, before bowing out to Premier League Wolves in round four.

Chorley's best season in the FA Trophy was 1995-96, when they made the semi-finals before losing over two legs to eventual winners Macclesfield Town. Previously the Magpies qualified for the quarter-finals in 1976-77, going out to Dagenham.

During that run the Magpies knocked out non-league giants Wimbledon in a second round replay at Fellows Park, Walsall. The first replay, at Victory Park, attracted Chorley's highest Trophy attendance of 6,310.



The Manager

Andy Preece

Holder of the prestigious UEFA Pro Licence, 'Preecey' has taken charge of over 1000 games as a manager with the likes of Bury, Worcester City, Northwich Victoria & Airbus UK (Wales) and played over 500 professional games as a centre forward for Worcester City, Wrexham, Stockport County, Crystal Palace, Blackpool, Bury & Carlisle United. Spent four years as Chorley's assistant manager and Director of Football before taking on the manager's job in May 2022.

1 Matt Urwin – Goalkeeper

A modern-day Chorley legend who's made 337 appearances for the Magpies. Originally signed on loan from Fleetwood Town in August 2017, before making the move permanent 18 months later. Combines his playing role at Victory Park with academy goalie coaching duties at Blackpool.

2 Adam Henley – Defender

Experienced right back with over 100 games for Blackburn Rovers under his belt. Joined the Magpies from Bradford City in 2020; has also played in Major League Soccer.

3 Mark Ellis – Defender

Experienced central defender with over 400 competitive league appearances, largely in the Football League. The 36-year old signed for the Magpies in July 2023 having been released by Barrow in the summer, following loan spells with Solihull Moors, Torquay United and York City. Made almost 50 appearances in 2023/24, scoring eight. Hit double figures in 2024/25.

4 Scott Wilson – Defender

Manager's Player of the Year in 2022/23 after a terrific debut campaign saw the former Burnley youngster make 44 appearances for the Magpies before being voted into Vanarama's 'Team of the Season'. The 25-year-old central defender has also played for Barrow and Curzon Ashton.

5 Harvey Smith – Defender

Bristolian central defender who joined the Magpies after signing from Bristol City in August 2020. Has made 164 appearances for the club.

6 Joe Nolan – Midfielder

The 23-year-old played 43 games for his hometown club in 2022/23 after originally signing non-contract terms in August 2022 – a permanent contract followed in December. Joe has made 118 appearances, scoring once, against Boston United.

7 Craig Hewitt – Midfielder

Signed for the Magpies in the summer of 2024 having made over 40 appearances in the Vanarama National League North in 2023/24 with Banbury United, a livewire, direct winger who came through the youth ranks at Coventry City.

8 Mike Calvey – Midfielder

Played 220 times for Chorley since joining from Curzon Ashton in the summer of 2020. Originally came through the ranks at Port Vale, enjoying loan spells with Leek Town & Nuneaton along the way. Calvs hit double figures for goals in 2023/24 and 2024/25, a real mainstay and powerhouse in the Magpies' midfield.

9 Jack Sampson – Forward

Target man who joined the Magpies for a second time after leaving AFC Fylde in February 2022. Jack has scored 31 goals in 121 appearances for the Magpies and was voted Clubman of the Year in 2023/24.

10 Tom Carr – Forward

Tom signed for the Magpies in the summer of 2024, having hit the ground running at Leek Town in 2023/24, with 20 goal contributions. TC played a pivotal part in Leek's title-winning season before becoming Andy Preece's first signing ahead of the 2024/25 season, hit double figures in his first campaign at this level.

11 Warren Clarke – Midfielder

Signed for the Magpies in the summer of 2024, Warren, a versatile, hard-working player came through the youth ranks at Sheffield Wednesday. Previously played under now chairman, Jamie Vermiglio at Buxton. Made 49 appearances in his first season at Chorley last time out.

12 Jack Moore – Defender

A bright young full-back, who has a number of loan spells with the Magpies to his name, but signed permanently this summer, has made 51 total appearances for the club.

14 George Horbury – Midfielder

Young midfielder who made the move to the Magpies permanent in the summer of 2024 having had a successful spell on loan from Harrogate Town in the second part of the 2023/24 season. Won YPOTY for Chorley in 2024/25, scoring 6 in 52.

16 Adam Blakeman – Defender

Has now made 351 appearances for the Magpies, across two spells. A full back with a wand of a left foot, 'Blakes' was a member of the club's 2019 National League North playoff-winning squad. Started his career with Bolton Wanderers.

17 Tom Walker – Midfielder

Tom, a versatile and experienced midfielder player who joined Chorley in the summer of 2025. Tom came through the ranks at Bolton Wanderers as a youngster, and his illustrious CV includes the likes of Salford City, Stockport County, AFC Fylde, and more recently, Radcliffe Boro.

18 Sam Bird – Defender

Sam, who can play right-back or in the heart of the defence joined Chorley in the summer of 2024 having departed from Stirling Albion in Scotland. Sam has played at Fleetwood Town and Stockport County, made 11 appearances for the club in 2024/25.

20 Milan Lalkovic – Midfielder

The Slovakian winger joined Chorley bringing vast experience from clubs including Walsall, Portsmouth, and Chelsea's youth setup. Known for his pace and dribbling, he adds flair to the Magpies' attacking options.

21 Kole Hall – Forward

Signed for the Magpies in the summer of 2024. A strong, quick and powerful striker, Kole, a Bermudan International made the move following his departure from Scarborough Athletic having been on loan there from Chester. Kole hit double figures for goals in 2024/25.

22 Sonny Reeves – Midfielder

18-year old Sonny has risen through the ranks at Chorley having come through the youth system with the Steven Gerrard Academy, previously had loans at Step 5, but a tricky winger with lots of potential.

23 Billy Whitehouse – Midfielder

A tricky winger who recently returned to Chorley for a second spell with the club having departed Alfreton Town. Now racked up 150 appearances for the Magpies.

24 Noel Brindle – Midfielder

The 18-year-old midfielder is another graduate from the Magpies' Education Programme. Made the substitutes bench for the club away at Gloucester City in October 2023, made his first appearance for the club against Solihull Moors in the FA Trophy in 2023/24.

26 Harry Ibbitson – Forward (ON LOAN)

Harry joined Chorley in August 2025 on a one-month loan deal from Bradford City, has played on loan at Kidderminster Harriers and Guiseley AFC, highly thought of by the Bantams.

29 Ben Layton – Midfielder

Ben, 18, signed a first team contract with Chorley in August 2025. A product of the Magpies' youth setup, who has since been fast-tracked into the first team and played a part in the 2025/26 pre-season.

31 Oliver Green – Goalkeeper

Oliver, another young stopper who has been at Chorley for a number of years, has senior experience under his belt having played at Skelmersdale United and Euxton Villa.

32 Kier Barry – Goalkeeper

Kier, a highly rated young goalkeeper with close to 100 senior appearances under his belt across the lower leagues. Spent time out on loan at Longridge Town on more than one occasion, impressing. Kier has had more opportunities to play in this pre-season as he continues to grow.
