

From the Top - With the Hereford FC Chairman

Good afternoon and welcome back to Edgar Street.

Today Worksop Town are our visitors and they make the trip to Hereford having made a solid start in their first season in the National League North.

Prior to their defeat at Merthyr in their most recent league fixture, they had gone four matches unbeaten which clearly demonstrates they will provide a tough test for us this afternoon. Whatever the outcome, I would like to wish everyone who travels to Hereford with Worksop a safe journey to and from the game.

We come into this game looking to extend our own unbeaten run to four league matches, but I do not want to focus on football in these notes. In reality, I need to address the events of last Saturday when our FA Cup tie at Sporting Khalsa was abandoned during the second half.

As a police investigation into allegations of racist abuse being directed at the Khalsa goalkeeper, Ravan Constable, is ongoing, I will not dwell on the specifics of that, other than to again reiterate that as a club we will not stand for discriminatory behaviour of any sort.

We have taken strong action against this type of thing in the past although we are not always able to publicise it - and will continue to do so moving forward. We want everyone to feel welcome at out matches and I would once again say to anyone who feels it is OK to act in a discriminatory or intimidating manner, YOU ARE NOT WELCOME AT OUR CLUB.

If there is a positive to come from last Saturday's incident, it is the way that our manager conducted himself and the way our supporters have rallied behind the stance taken at the game.

It is right that we are standing together and are united in our condemnation of the alleged incident, and while I felt real shame when the match was abandoned, I have been proud of the way that everyone who cares about our club has conducted themselves since. I would like to thank all our staff involved behind the scenes for their hard work since Saturday, but most of all I'd like to thank our manager, Paul Caddis, as I think his leadership in difficult circumstances has been outstanding. His post-match interview set the tone that had to be set and he has deserved the praise he has received from many quarters.

Looking ahead to the replayed match at Khalsa on Tuesday, I would encourage as many supporters as possible to travel to support our team, but offer advice that there will be eyes on that game that normally wouldn't be. It is vital that everyone who attends - home fan or away - behaves impeccably and shows both clubs in the best possible light.

To be transparent, it is also important that our supporters know that we will not be claiming our share of the gate receipts from the replayed match. We are not looking for praise for doing this, it is simply that we do not feel it is right to benefit from a match that is only taking place because of the actions of someone who has 'associated' themselves with our club.

We have explained this to our counterparts at Sporting Khalsa and advised we would be happy for them to donate our share of the receipts to a local charity or a charity of Ravan's choice. We are happy to leave this decision to them though.

Finally, is it vital that I take this opportunity to thank the vast majority of our fans for the support they give our team, both home and away. I know every decent fan will have been as gutted about

the events of last weekend as everyone inside the club was and that you may now feel unfairly tarred with the same brush. I can tell you categorically that we know that last Saturday's event is not reflective of true Bulls fans, and never will be.

Best wishes and please get right behind the lads today. Moving forward it's up to us all to show our team what Hereford fans really are about.

PAUL GADDIS From the Dugout - With the Hereford FC manager

Good afternoon,

I'd like to welcome Worksop Town's management staff, players and supporters to the MandM Edgar Street Stadium for this afternoon's Enterprise National League North Fixture.

It doesn't take a rocket scientist to work out it's not been a start to shout about in the league campaign. I won't sit back and give excuses because I've never done that, but I will try and bring a bit of calmness to the matter. We have had a really tough start, and the first few weeks were really tough - as tough as I've had for many reasons since taking over. I have got to say, though, the players have stayed really strong and together behind closed doors, and we have found ourselves unbeaten in our last three games, which is a positive from where we were before that.

It's a long, long season full of frustrations as well as highs and lows. Amongst the negativity, I have stayed extremely calm and tried to see the light at the end of the tunnel. I am seeing the anger and upset as a small positive in some way, and I'm happy to explain that.

When I first took over, the club had never competed at this level. That's a fact. We have taken the season to the last game of the league campaign for two years in a row now. That's also a fact. We have broken the total points records at this level for two seasons in a row. Again that's a fact. It's not arrogance on my part; it's just an idea of my thinking and my vision of staying positive rather than negative. We have raised expectations at a rate that no one will disagree with internally; that was never expected. I accept that, and that's the positives I see; however, I am also educated enough to know that I want to try and better what we have previously. There is no doubt about that.

The first six weeks of the season have, in truth, been the toughest for me personally and professionally since taking over the manager's job. The nasty on-field collision of Preston Bitemo was such a horrible sight to witness. I wasn't aware how serious it was until a few minutes later. To see a young player that you have huge adoration for lying unconscious was sad for us all as a group and his teammates, and it was a worrying sight. Thankfully, Preston has made a full recovery. I made my way down the tunnel right after the game to check on Preston, but let me stress I also came back onto the pitch to applaud the supporters that were sat behind the goal as well as shake the officials' hands.

Then, to add to those moments above, the shambolic behaviour on Saturday was sickening. I have been involved in football now professionally as a player, coach and manager since 2003 and I have never witnessed racist abuse at any match I've played or any football club setting I have been in.

I want to address this as the manager of your football club and the first spokesman for our club when incidents like this happen. I acted on instinct on Saturday with a human thought process to it and not as a football manager leading a game. I have players of different races in my dressing room, and I will go to hell and back with those lads, whatever race you may be.

Thank you for your support and please keep being positive and supportive of our players through the good and the bad times.

I won't allow those who have supported the club, whether that for 40+ years or for 4 days, to be brought down by those incidents. Don't think for one minute that because you don't stand up and shout and sing and scream that you are not appreciated. We appreciate every single individual - whatever race or gender - who comes into our club and represents themselves as good people and good supporters of our club.

It's now my job to continue improving the results on the pitch but also to show as your manager that we are a proud football club and that one abhorrent incident by an uneducated individual and/or individuals doesn't define me, my players, my staff, our chairman and board of directors and, most importantly, our fanbase.

Thank you for your support and please keep being positive and supportive of our players through the good and the bad times.



Worksop Town is one of the oldest football clubs in England, with its origins traced back to 1861 through early minute books and press reports from 1873. The first matches were played at Netherton Road, where the team wore green and white stripes and was run by a fifteen-man committee of local figures.

Early Grounds and Growth

In 1886 William Allen of the Worksop and Retford Brewery became president, guiding the club through difficult times including the First World War. With football in Sheffield growing, Worksop sought a more central ground, moving in 1891 to Bridge Meadow, leased from the Duke of Newcastle. This multi-sport venue had football, cricket, and cycling facilities, and quickly became the town's sporting hub.

Later that year, the freehold of neighbouring land was secured, and Central Avenue became the club's new permanent home. Though basic, with wooden dressing rooms and a communal bath, it gave the Tigers security and a base for

Midland League and Early FA Cup Highs

Worksop soon competed in the Midland League and gained popularity with strong crowds. The 1908 season brought national attention when Worksop reached the FA Cup Sixth Round and were drawn at Chelsea, losing in front of 70,184 fans - still the biggest crowd ever to watch Worksop.

In 1921-22, local goalkeeper Jack Brown emerged as a star. He later moved to Sheffield Wednesday and won an England cap at Wembley in 1927. Another famous Cup tie followed in 1922/23, when Worksop drew 0-0 away at Tottenham Hotspur. But with debts looming, directors controversially agreed to replay at White Hart Lane rather than at Central Avenue - Spurs won 9-0, and many disillusioned supporters drifted away.

Retween the Wars

Facilities remained modest, with stands often damaged by storms and teams sometimes changing in local pubs. Despite difficulties,

Worksop retained its place in non-league football, supported by a loyal fanbase.

Post-War Struggles and the Northern Premier League

After WWII, Worksop remained under the management of the cricket club but benefited from strong support. They won the Midland League in the mid-1960s and were founder members of the new Northern Premier League in 1968, though relegation followed after just one season.

The late 1970s under chairman Fred Horne brought stability and a memorable FA Cup tie at Barnsley in 1978, featuring future Republic of Ireland boss Mick McCarthy. New changing rooms and floodlights modernised Central Avenue, though the ground was showing its

1980s - Success and Setbacks

The mid-80s brought some strong Northern Premier League finishes, peaking at sixth in 1987/88. But in 1989 Worksop were relegated and, worse, lost their Central Avenue ground to redevelopment. Homeless, they survived thanks to supporters' efforts, ground-sharing at Gainsborough Trinity.

1990s - Sandy Lane and Recovery

In 1992 the Tigers moved to Sandy Lane, a former quarry and landfill site redeveloped into a stadium. Kenny Clark became a prolific goalscorer, and managers Paul Mitchell and Danny Hague restored Worksop to the Premier Division in 1998. A best-ever runners-up finish followed in 1998/99, and in 2000 Worksop reached the FA Trophy quarter-finals.

Memorable moments included a 2-1 FA Trophy win at Chester City in 2003 and a Sheffield Senior Cup victory the same year. Promotion to Conference North was achieved, but financial problems forced a Creditors Voluntary Agreement, leaving the club weakened.

2000s - Ups and Downs

Ronnie Glavin briefly managed the club, leading them to FA Trophy quarter-finals again in 2006, but by 2007 Worksop were relegated. Worse followed in 2008, when they were locked out of Sandy Lane by new leaseholders Parramore FC. Worksop spent three nomadic seasons at Hucknall, Ilkeston, and Retford before returning to Sandy Lane in 2011 as ground-sharers.

Under Mark Shaw, the club reached promotion play-offs in 2013/14, but when backer Jason Clark departed, Worksop resigned from the Northern Premier League. They dropped to Step 5 for 2014/15, finishing runners-up in the Northern Counties East League.

Revival and Promotions

After several inconsistent seasons, 2018/19 was a turning point. Worksop won both the NCEL Premier Division and League Cup, stringing together 22 consecutive wins to earn promotion back to the Northern Premier

Off the pitch, new chairman Peter Whitehead invested in Sandy Lane, installing a 3G pitch and new facilities in 2020. Manager Craig Parry and assistant Craig Rouse arrived, building a strong side. The 2020/21 season started well but was cut short by COVID-19.

Recent Years - A Return to Glory

In 2021/22 Worksop rebuilt, finishing mid-table but winning the Sheffield & Hallamshire Senior Cup for a 13th time. The following season, strengthened by prolific striker Liam Hughes (42 goals), the Tigers stormed to the Northern Premier League East title, losing only once and breaking several records.

Back at Step 3 in 2023/24, Worksop finished fifth, losing in the play-offs to Macclesfield but lifting another Senior Cup. The next year brought further progress: runners-up to Macclesfield in the league, then play-off winners, earning promotion back to National League North after an 18-year absence. They also set a record with a 15th Senior Cup triumph.



The Manager Craig Parry

Parry goes into his fourth season as manager of the Tigers, joining the club after four successful vears at Pontefract Collieries. Before making his way into management, Parry was a goalkeeper.

TOMMY TAYLO - GOALKEEPER

Experienced 'keeper signed from Darlington. He started in the Sheffield Wednesday youth teams before joining Brighouse Town. Taylor has also played for Halifax, Farsley Celtic (where he was the Evostik First Division North player of the season), Buxton and Scarborough Athletic.

DEEGAN ATHERTON - DEFENDER

Deegan joined the Tigers in 2018 from Rotherham United. The dependable defender is comfortable at full back and centre back.

JOSH WILDE - DEFENDER

Josh joined the club from Alfreton Town FC. Josh started his career at Sheffield Wednesday before moving onto Buxton FC, North Ferriby United where he was an FA Trophy winner, and Halifax

REGAN HUTCHINSON - DEFENDER

Regan is in his fourth season with the Tigers having joined the club from Farsley Celtic. He started his career in the academies of Sheffield Wednesday and Rotherham United before joining Chesterfield. He left the Spirites to join Guiseley before joining Farsley.

HAMZA BENCHERIF - DEFENDER

The French born defender joins us from Guiseley AFC, where he was club captain. His previous clubs include Guingamp, Notts County, Lincoln City and Macclesfield Town.

MASON O'MALLEY - DEFENDER

The former Republic if Ireland U21 international is in his first season with the Tigers having previously been at Bradford Park Avenue. He came through the youth ranks at Huddersfield Town and Scunthorpe United, appearing in the EFL Trophy for the Irons. Whilst at Scunthorpe he went on loan to Ilkeston Town before joining Bradford Park Avenue after leaving Scunthorpe.

DYLAN COGILL - DEFENDER

The former Gainsborough Trinity skipper joined the Tigers at the start of the season. He started his career at Huddersfield Town before joining Clyde. Cogill went on to play for Farsley Celtic and Scarborough Athletic, leaving the Seadogs to join the Holy Blues.

BAILEY GOODA - DEFENDER

Previously at Scarborough Athletic where he had spent the last 4 seasons. The centre half spent 8 years at Barnsley coming through the youth sides before captaining the U21s. After leaving Barnsley he signed for Harrogate Town, spending some time on loan at Scarbough Athletic. He went on to play for Hyde United and Matlock Town before joining the Seadogs for a second spell in 2021.

LUKE WATERFALL - DEFENDER

Joined from Hartlepool United. The experience defender has an impressive CV having twice won the National League with Lincoln City and Grimsby Town as well as winning the EFL Trophy. He came through the ranks at Barnsley before joining Tranmere Rovers. His other clubs include Gainsborough Trinity, Scunthorpe United, Mansfield Town, Macclesfield, Wrexham and Shrewsbury Town.

JAY ROLLINS - MIDFIELD

Joined the club from Boston United where he had spent 7 seasons. Prior to that he played for Armthorpe Welfare and Askern Villa.

ALEKSANDRS STARCENKO - MIDFIELD

The Latvian midfielder joined the club in October 2020, but due to the COVID 19 pandemic it was not until after that we saw the young attacking midfielder's full potential.

JOE LEESLEY - MIDFIELD

Joined the Tigers from Darlington before. The experienced midfielder played in the Football League for Stevenage and has represented at England C level. His former clubs include Scunthorpe United, Kidderminster Harriers, Boston United, Harrogate Town, Stockport County, Alfreton Town, Matlock Town and Winterton Rangers.

MARTIN WOODS - MIDFIELD

The vastly experienced midfielder joined the club from Boston United where he won the National League play-offs as well as having a spell as interim manager. He started his career at Leeds United and was capped by Scotland at U17, U19 and U21 level. His other clubs included Sunderland, Doncaster Rovers, Rotherham United, Barnsley, Shrewsbury Town, Dundee, Partick Thistle, Ross County, FC Halifax Town and Brackley.

OLUWATOBI JOSEPH - MIDFIELD

Tobi started his career at the Bethesda SC academy in the United States before moving to Germany to play for FC Nurnburg before playing for SV Zirndorf and DJK Ammerthal to gain experience. Last season he played for Raynes Park Vale in the Isthmian League.

VAUGHAN REDFORD - FORWARD

The enigmatic forward is in his second spell with the Tigers after re-joining the club from Pontefract Collieries FC. Previously at Liversedge

LIAM HUGHES - FORWARD

The former Matlock Town FC Captain was a long time transfer target for Tigers Manager Craig Parry. The vastly experienced forward is a major presence both on and off the pitch. In 2022/23 season he was the League's leading scoring winning numerous awards in the process, including the Non-League Paper's Step 3 & 4 player of the year.

JORDAN BURROW - FORWARD

The former England C international joined the Tigers from Buxton. Burrow came through the ranks at Chesterfield before joining Morecambe. He went on to play for Stevenage, Lincoln City, FC Halifax Town, Gateshead, York City, Boston United and Buxton before joining the Tigers.

AARON MARTIN - FORWARD

Joined the club from South Shields. He played In the youth teams at Sheffield Wednesday, Sheffield United and Barnsley. His former clubs include Sheffield, Brighouse Town, Guiseley Harrogate Town, FC Halifax Town and Gateshead before joining South Shields.

DAN BRAMALL - FORWARD

The pacy forward spent his youth career playing for Chesterfield and Everton before joining Matlock Town. Dan moved to Buxton then signed for Barnsley where he had a loan spell at Barrow. After leaving Barnsley he played for Ballymena United, Scarborough Athletic and Caroline Springs George Cross in Australia before joining the Tigers.

LEWIS WHITHAM - FORWARD

Signed for the club from Guiseley at the start of the season. Whitham started his career as a winger at Stocksbridge Park Steels where has converted to a striker. His form earned him a move to Liversedge where he starred in their NPL East title winning season. He went on to sign for Alfreton Town before joining Guiseley.

CHAE WHITMAN-BROWN - FORWARD

The young striker signed for the club after impressing in Mansfield Town's academy. During his time with the Stags he had a loan spell at Hucknall Town



The Bulls are back at home on Tuesday night as they host Bedford Town.

The Bulls are back at home on Saturday as they host Worksop Town.

Hereford will be looking to return to winning ways after a 1-1 draw away to Darlington in the last league game, which made it two draws in a row and three games unbeaten overall.

Paul Caddis' side found themselves 1-0 down at half-time but fought back in the second 45 with a late equaliser from Sam Osborne, who scored his first goal for the club.

"Darlington is a very tough place to go; we've never had much luck up here, so we've got to respect the point, we showed great character again to come back from a losing position to gain a point," said Caddis.

The Bulls enter the game on Saturday in 19th place, with eight points, having won two, drawn two, and lost four.

Worksop have had a great start to their first season in the National League North since 2007, currently sitting in 11th with three wins, two draws, and three losses.
