From the Top - With the Hereford FC Chairman

Tonight we welcome Hemel Hempstead Town to Hereford for an Emirates FA Cup Third Qualifying Round Replay following Saturday's hard-fought draw.

I couldn't attend the game at the weekend, but all the reports I have read from both sides suggest that a draw was probably a fair result on the day. Having had a quick glance at the National League South table ahead of the game, it was no surprise that it was a tough game for us and I'm sure we can expect more of the same tonight.

Two free kicks in two weeks for Omari Sterling-James as he helps the Bulls secure a draw away at Hemel Hempstead Town.

A tough test away at Step Two side, Hemel Hempstead Town, on Saturday, as Sterling-James' free-kick got the Bulls back on level terms just after the break.

"We're happy to be in the hat for Monday, and I thought we showed great character to come back and take the lead. It's just disappointing that we didn't hold out for the win.

"We've come out with a replay at our place, so all in all, we'll take it"

Sporting Khalsa took Hereford to extra time on Tuesday night in a physically draining match. Could a slow start be down to fatigue? "Maybe it could have been down to that. But you can't go into games thinking like that.

"If you want to say 'it took us some time to get going', fair enough, but after that, we certainly did get going.

"We were winning our duels, we put them under pressure and scored two goals"

Sterling-James netted with yet another free kick, his second in his last three matches for the Bulls.

"I hit one [A free kick] in the first half, and I thought I'd hit it very well, but the keeper made it look way too easy. "The bench told me the keeper went early, so the next one let him go early and catch him out."

It's the free kicks that make the headlines, but Omari's work across the pitch that helps get the Bulls on the front foot.

"I try to lead by experience. I'm 32 now, I've been around for a while. It's just knowing what I've got and trying to show the boys what to do.

"If we need a little spark sometimes, I'll try to be that person. You can't always be, but more often than not, I try to be and do the right things"





Of the clubs that merged to form today's team, Apsley FC has the earliest roots. Formed in 1885 as Apsley End FC, they played at Salmon Meadow in claret and blue. Their first competitive game came in the 1889 Herts Senior Cup. A founding member of the West Herts FA, they entered league competition in 1891/92, changing their name to Apsley FC two years later. Their first major success was winning Division One in 1894/95. Like many clubs then, Apsley entered multiple leagues, including the Wolverton and Herts County Leagues, the latter as a founder in 1898/99. Before and after WWI, they won three Herts County League titles.

In 1922, Apsley joined the Spartan League, staying for 30 years. They moved briefly to Gee's Meadow, then to Crabtree Lane until 1972. Success included three runners-up finishes, a Division One title in 1933/34, and promotion to the Spartan Premier in 1951/52. Around this time, the club adopted the name Hemel Hempstead Town.

Hemel joined the Delphian League but struggled, finishing in the bottom two five times in 11 seasons, with a best of runnersup in 1961/62. After bad weather forced the league's abandonment in 1962, they moved to the Athenian League. That year, 3,500 fans watched their Amateur Cup First Round tie against Tooting & Mitcham. Promoted through league restructuring, Hemel reached the Athenian Premier by 1964/65 but were quickly relegated, beginning nearly 30 years in Division Two. They lost Herts Senior Cup finals in 1962 and 1966 and the 1967 Herts Charity Cup final.

In 1972, Hemel merged with Hemel Hempstead United, moving to Vauxhall Road. Remaining in the Athenian League for six more years, their best finishes were back-to-back fourths. They never advanced past the FA Cup First Qualifying Round.

Switching to the Isthmian League in 1977, Hemel spent 25 years largely in mid-table, with only seven top-half finishes and three fourthplace bests (1976, 1977, 1993). In 1993, they narrowly missed promotion to Berkhamsted

Town, A fire at Vauxhall Road in 1992 left temporary facilities for five years. The low point came in 1996/97 when they finished bottom and were relegated to Division Three, only the fifth relegation in their 112-year history.

The next decade was transformative. A new committee in 1997 reinstated the name Hemel Hempstead Town and hired Mick Vipond. He delivered the Division Three title immediately, scoring 86 and conceding only 28. Neil Price replaced him, winning Division Two in 1999, though promotion was denied due to ground grading. In 2001 Gary Phillips took over, finishing sixth, but left after a poor start. Tony Kelly followed, without success.

In 2004, Hemel joined the Southern League Premier. After early struggles and managerial changes, Steve Bateman led them back in 2006/07, reaching the play-offs but losing in the semis. In 2008/09 Bateman was sacked, Paul Byrne took over, but Hemel lost another play-off semi-final. The following year saw three managers; Dean Brennan eventually kept them up, winning the St Mary's Cup, with relegation avoided through restructuring.

For the 125th anniversary in 2010, Colin Payne became manager, finishing 15th. He was replaced by Tommy Widdrington in 2011, but after four months he departed. Mark Eaton and Alan Biley oversaw relegation, though the club was reprieved.

Brennan returned in 2012/13, signing new players and leading Hemel to a record fourthplace finish and the play-off final, lost on penalties. The season ended with the club's first Herts Senior Cup since 1926. In 2013/14. Hemel dominated the Southern League Premier, winning the title with Ben Mackey scoring a record 43 goals and attracting the league's best crowds.

In 2014/15, their first season in Conference South, Hemel finished 9th, reaching the FA Cup first round and FA Trophy third round. The following season, despite inconsistency, they finished sixth, narrowly missing play-offs. Brennan and Stuart Maynard became the club's longest-serving managers in 30 years.

The 2016/17 season was Chairman Dave Boggins's 20th year, with the team finishing 12th. A year later Hemel achieved a record 5th in National League South and a play-off place, losing to Braintree on penalties. They also reached the Herts Senior Cup final but withdrew due to pitch concerns.

The 2018/19 season was poor, finishing 16th, their lowest since entering the National League South. After Brennan and Maynard left, Sammy Moore took charge, starting the 2019/20 season strongly. COVID-19 halted the season with Hemel in 11th, though they reached two cup finals. Moore's contract was not renewed.

Lee Bircham and Steve Bateman led during the disrupted 2020/21 season, replaced by Mark Jones in 2021/22. Despite strengthening, Hemel finished 15th. The 2022/23 campaign saw more inconsistency, with Jones leaving in December. Brad Quinton took over, sparking a short revival, but the team finished 15th again.

Ahead of 2023/24, Vauxhall Road became the Focus Community Arena, thanks to new sponsors. A 1-0 win over Yeovil opened the renamed ground before 1,200 fans. After a bright start, poor winter form was partly reversed by a Boxing Day derby win over St Albans, but the reverse fixture ended in a last-minute defeat. Hemel struggled, Quinton departed, and Alan Dowson stepped in to steer them clear of relegation on the final weekend, securing a 10th consecutive season in National League South.

In 2024/25, former Weymouth boss Bobby Wilkinson was appointed. Hemel went unbeaten in the first 10 games, topping the table briefly after a win over Slough. But a shock FA Cup defeat to Bishop's Stortford triggered a 14-game winless run, and Wilkinson departed. Lee Allinson replaced him, revitalising the squad with fast, attacking football. Hemel climbed from 17th to finish 12th, with optimism for a play-off push and potential National League promotion under Allinson.



The Manager Lee Allinson

Son of former Arsenal winger lan Allinson, Lee is a young manager at the age of 39, having started his managerial career at Biggleswade in 2019 before a move to Hendon later that season.

A long and successful stint at Hendon earned Allinson a move to the National League South side in December of 2024, helping to turn their form around after a poor first half of the season.

Michael Johnson (Goalkeeper)

Signed from St Albans City, Johnson is an experienced keeper who thrives under pressure. Known for his penalty saves and commanding presence, he's confident with crosses and quick distribution. Johnson reunites with the Allinsons, familiar with their style, and is ready to compete fiercely for the number one shirt this season.

Steve Arnold (Goalkeeper)

Arnold adds vast experience to the squad, boasting a 17-year career across the EFL and non-league. Having played for Norwich, Stevenage, Northampton, Southend and Sutton, his leadership and calmness provide assurance. At 6'4, he's an imposing figure and offers guidance to younger players as well as competition for Johnson.

Kyle Ajayi (Defender)

Club captain and fans' favourite, Ajayi has been a pillar at the back since joining in 2020. Strong, consistent and reliable, he passed 100 appearances last season and was named Player of the Year in 2023/24. His leadership and commitment make him the heartbeat of the Tudors' defence.

Samuel Adenola (Defender)

A right-back who followed Allinson from Hendon, Adenola has impressed with his blend of defensive strength and attacking support. Scoring on his debut against Weymouth, he quickly became a mainstay. Consistent and hardworking, Adenola silenced any doubters about stepping up and looks set for another strong season.

Devante Stanley (Defender)

New signing Stanley brings blistering pace and boundless energy down the right flank. With experience at St Albans, Havant & Waterlooville and other non-league clubs, he reunites with the Allinsons and offers attacking width as well as defensive cover. Determined to make an impression in his first Hemel season.

Darion Dowrich (Defender)

A breakout star at Cray Wanderers last season, Dowrich played 48 games, kept 18 clean sheets and registered 10 assists. Winning both Young Player and Players' Player of the Season, he now steps up to the National League South. Athletic, adventurous and confident, he's one to watch for the future.

Charlie Rowan (Defender)

Former Watford academy player Rowan joins from Weymouth, bringing composure on the ball and experience of promotion with Oxford City. Comfortable in possession and steady at the back, he strengthens Hemel's defensive options as they look to build resilience after a tough previous campaign.

Jordon Thompson (Defender)

A versatile central defender who began at QPR and Coventry, Thompson even featured in the Championship. Loan spells at Wrexham, Barrow and Boreham Wood added valuable experience. Strong, adaptable and used to high-level football, he bolsters Hemel's defensive depth this season.

Jack Bateson (Defender)

A promising young centre-back, Bateson captained Luton Town's U21s before joining Hemel this summer. After gaining senior minutes on loan at Hitchin and Farnborough, he now takes the next step in his career. Calm under pressure and eager to learn, he's a player for both present and future.

Kyran Wiltshire (Midfielder)

Wiltshire brings balance and composure in midfield, joining from St Albans last season after more than 100 appearances for the Saints. Athletic and reliable, he has also played for MK Dons, Maidenhead and Oxford City. A consistent performer, he's expected to anchor the middle of the park again.

George Williams (Midfielder)

An attacking midfielder with a sharp eye for goal, Williams has become one of Hemel's key men. He scored 12 goals in 2023/24 and added 12 assists last season, thriving in central and wide roles. A former Fulham youth and Wales international, he provides creativity and end product in equal measure.

Hamza Semakula (Midfielder)

A versatile young player, Semakula can operate in midfield or at full-back. Having worked under Allinson before at Hendon, he knows the system well and brings energy, adaptability and enthusiasm. At just 21, he has plenty of scope to grow into an important squad member this campaign.

Jermaine Anderson (Midfielder)

Anderson offers EFL pedigree, having spent seven years at Peterborough before spells with Doncaster, Aldershot and Woking. Technically sound and experienced at Step 1, he brings composure and leadership to Hemel's midfield, helping knit together play while adding strength in defensive transitions.

Jake Gray (Midfielder)

A former Crystal Palace youth, Gray made over 100 appearances in the EFL, mainly with Yeovil and Hartlepool. Most recently captain at Hampton & Richmond, he joins Hemel this summer with proven leadership qualities. A hardworking, all-round midfielder with experience across non-league and the Football League.

Mathew Achuba (Midfielder)

Arriving from Wingate & Finchley last year, Achuba quickly adapted to National League South football. Energetic, consistent and reliable in midfield, he established himself as a regular starter under Allinson and will look to continue his progression in 2025/26.

Isiah Noel-Williams (Midfielder)

Joining from Kettering and Matlock, Noel-Williams has built a strong reputation in non-league. Notably scored against Doncaster in last season's FA Cup. At 22, he combines physicality with attacking drive and adds another exciting option in the Tudors' midfield unit.

Millar Matthews-Lewis (Forward)

Matthews-Lewis impressed during his loan from Farnborough last season, dazzling with skill and flair. Now a permanent Tudor, the lively attacker has become a fan favourite for his direct play and ability to unlock defences. Still developing, but a potential game-changer in tight matches.

Mauro Vilhete (Forward)

With years of National League South experience, Vilhete joins from Hampton & Richmond. Previously a Barnet regular, he is comfortable across the front line or in behind the striker. His versatility and nous provide Hemel with valuable attacking variety and experience.

Finley Wilkinson (Forward)

A summer signing from Barnet, Wilkinson enjoyed loan spells at Hitchin, Chelmsford and St Albans. Sharp movement and an instinct for goals make him an exciting young prospect. He will be eager to make his mark in his first full National League South campaign.

Joe White (Forward)

Signed from Hendon midway through last season, White hit the ground running with five goals in 23 appearances. A proven goalscorer in non-league with 73 goals in 174 games at Hendon, he offers creativity, tenacity and an eye for goal. A player capable of deciding matches.




