From the Top - With the Hereford FC Chairman

Good evening and welcome to the MandM Edgar Street Stadium for what feels like our first league home game in quite some time.

Tonight we welcome AFC Telford United to Hereford and given that they come here having scored 10 goals in their last two games, I think we can be in no doubt that this will be a very difficult encounter.

While Telford currently sit below us in the table, their last two results probably suggest this is a false position and I'm sure they will be looking to prove that is the case. In recent years, promoted teams have generally done pretty well when arriving in the National League North and I have always expected tonight's visitors to be no different.

While some might say promoted clubs may look to 'consolidate', I imagine Telford will be looking to do better than that and it would not surprise me to see them competing in the upper reaches post-Christmas.

While we come into this game off the back of a defeat at South Shields, I have to say I made the long journey home feeling very positive about the performance our team put in. I felt we deserved at least a point for our second half showing and with a little bit of good fortune with key decisions in the match, we probably would have secured one.

The South Shields officials I spoke to after the game said we have given them their toughest game so far this season - which is a big compliment given they are flying high - and the sense of relief within the home sections of the ground at full time gave a real sense of how close we had run them.

Moving forward I am very hopeful we will continue to build on the positive performances we have seen of late and while there is no doubt we were a little slow out of the blocks, there remains an awful long way to go this campaign and I'm intrigued to see how things play out.

On a more sobering note, I'd just like to remind fans that there will be a fan-led minute's applause in the 22nd minute tonight in memory of loyal Hereford FC fan, James 'Jamo' Plumridge.

Jamo sadly passed away last month and his friends and family are rightly and understandably keen for him to be remembered tonight.

Later in the programme we have included a message of thanks from Jamo's family, who are incredibly grateful for the support they have received in the weeks following his death. The love that they have been shown from many quarters really has been quite something.

Finally, I'd like to pass on my thanks to every single fan who travelled to support us at South Shields. We are always grateful for the support we receive, but the long trip north to Newcastle really is a challenge and we can't thank fans enough for their commitment on the day.





The history of football in Telford stretches back long before the name existed. The roots of today's visitors lie in Wellington Town, founded in the 1870s as a team representing the Parish Church Institute. For decades they were one of the best-known names in Shropshire football, competing in the Birmingham & District League and later in the Cheshire County League.

Wellington Town enjoyed early success, lifting the Welsh Cup twice, in 1902 and 1906 - no small feat for an English side competing across the border. The club was a regular name in non-league cup competitions throughout the early twentieth century and built a loyal following from the industrial towns that would later form part of Telford.

The Birth of Telford United

In 1969, as the new town of Telford took shape, Wellington Town embraced change and re-named itself Telford United. The move symbolised both progress and ambition, with the club setting its sights higher than ever.

That ambition soon bore fruit. Telford became one of non-league football's strongest sides in the 1970s and 1980s, particularly in the FA Trophy. They were runners-up in the very first final in 1970, then went one better the following year, beating Hillingdon Borough to lift the trophy at Wembley. More silverware followed – further FA Trophy triumphs in 1983 and 1989, establishing Telford as a true giant of the non-league scene.

Their FA Cup runs of the 1980s also live long in local memory. Between 1982 and 1992 the Bucks claimed eleven Football League scalps, including Brentford, Lincoln City, and Darlington, and famously reached the Fifth Round in 1985, where they took on Howard Kendall's Everton at Goodison Park.

During this period, Telford United were founder members of the Alliance Premier League (the forerunner of today's National League) and regulars at the top end of the non-league pyramid.

The Bucks Head

The Bucks Head in Wellington had been the club's home since the nineteenth century, and it evolved alongside the team. By the early 2000s it had been transformed into a smart, all-seater stadium known as the New Bucks Head, with a capacity of over 6,000. Today, it remains one of the most impressive grounds at its level - and has hosted England C and youth internationals over the years.

Collapse and Rebirth

Despite its proud history, the original Telford United met a tragic end in 2004. The collapse of the owner's company plunged the club into financial crisis, and with debts of around £4 million, liquidation followed. For many, it felt like the end of football in the town.

But the people of Telford refused to let that happen. Within days, supporters regrouped, held public meetings, and announced the formation of a new, supporter-owned club: AFC Telford United. The motto chosen for the new crest - Numquam Obliviscere, Latin for "Never forget" - captured the spirit of defiance and continuity that would define the club's next chapter.

Placed in the Northern Premier League Division One for the 2004-05 season, the Bucks began their journey back up the ladder. Under manager Bernard McNally, they earned promotion at the first attempt via the play-offs, reigniting belief across the

Rising Through the Divisions

The momentum didn't stop there. A second promotion in 2006–07 saw AFC Telford United reach the Conference North, and

their progress was underpinned by strong crowds and an ambitious, community-driven

In 2009 they added their first silverware of the new era, winning the Setanta Shield, and in 2010-11 came the biggest achievement yet - promotion to the Conference Premier after a dramatic play-off victory over Guiseley.

The stay in non-league's top tier was brief, but promotion again followed in 2013-14 as Conference North champions. That season's title win rekindled the proud days of old Telford United and reaffirmed that the Bucks were back among the elite of non-league

The FA Cup Spirit Lives On

Supporters of both Hereford and Telford will understand the magic of the FA Cup, and the Bucks have kept that tradition alive. In 2014-15, AFC Telford reached the Second Round Proper, defeating Basingstoke Town before bowing out to Bristol City. Those runs, echoing the club's 1980s exploits, remain cherished moments for their fans.

Recent Years: A Club Rebuilding

Like many community clubs, Telford have endured ups and downs in recent seasons. Relegated from the National League North in 2023, the Bucks regrouped quickly in the Southern League Premier Central. Under new leadership and a renewed focus on stability, they finished runnersup the following season, narrowly missing promotion in the play-offs.

Their perseverance paid off in 2024-25, when they finished third and clinched promotion back to the National League North with a thrilling 4-2 play-off final victory over Kettering Town. It marked yet another comeback in a history defined by resilience.



The Manager Kevin Wilkin

A vastly experienced non-league manager, Kevin Wilkin took charge of AFC Telford United in 2022, quickly restoring stability and structure to the Bucks.

Previously, he guided Nuneaton Town to successive promotions and led Wrexham to the 2015 FA Trophy final before a highly successful six-year spell with Brackley Town, winning the FA Trophy in 2018. Known for building disciplined, hard-working teams, Wilkin's sides are organised, competitive and difficult to break down.

With decades of experience and a proven track record at this level, he remains one of the most respected managers in non-league football.

Brandon Hall - Goalkeeper

Brandon Hall joined Telford in 2023, becoming one of Kevin Wilkin's first summer signings.

Standing around 6 ft 1 in, he's no stranger to big performances; in the 2023-24 campaign he kept 17 clean sheets across league and playoff matches.

Having come through Charlton Athletic's youth ranks and turned out for clubs like Woking and Hereford, he brings experience and solidity between the sticks.

Jamie Pardington - Goalkeeper

Jamie Pardington arrived on loan from Lincoln City.

A former Wolves youth product, he's had spells out on Ioan at Bath City, Stratford, Dulwich Hamlet, Mansfield and more.

At 25 years old, he offers a capable backup or alternate in goal, with hunger to show he merits more

Jordan Cranston - Left-Back / Fullback

Jordan Cranston brings both pedigree and versatility to the back line.

Born in 1993, he's had spells at Wolves, Notts County, Cheltenham, Morecambe, Solihull Moors, and recently Hereford before joining the Bucks.

Comfortable with the ball at his feet and steady in one-on-one duels. Cranston is a defensive rock with the ability to push forward when needed.

Orrin Pendley - Centre Back

Orrin Pendley has established himself as one of the backbone figures of Telford's defence.

Joining in 2023, he's had a standout campaign, earning plaudits and awards for reliability, defensive composure, and his leadership at the back.

Tall, strong and good in the air, Pendley is often first to organise the defence and keep shape in tight situations.

Oliver Cawthorne - Centre Back

Oliver Cawthorne is a younger presence in central defence.

Brought in to bolster depth and to grow into a starting role, he complements the more experienced heads in the back four. With agility, positional awareness and room to develop, he's becoming a name to watch.

Jordan Piggott - Centre Back / Defensive Utility

Local lad Jordan Piggott (from Tipton) started his career in the youth ranks at West Bromwich Albion, the side he supports.

He's versatile, primarily a centre back but capable of slotting into other defensive roles as needed. His familiarity with local non-league circuits gives him the experience needed in the National League North.

Jahdahn Fridye-Harper - Defender

Fridye-Harper arrived from Barwell in February, bringing fresh defensive options into their squad.

Aged in his later 20s, he offers physicality and nononsense defending. His experience in similar levels means he can step in without fear and maintain defensive solidity.

Luke Rowe - Midfielder

Luke Rowe rejoined Telford from Bromsgrove Sporting in February 2025, returning to the SEAH Stadium with ambition.

As a central midfielder, he offers work rate, passing range and link play-bridging defence and attack. His familiarity with the club makes settling into matchday routines smoother.

James Armson - Midfielder

Veteran midfielder James Armson brings experience and composure to the middle of the park.

At 35, he has seen many seasons, and that experience can be invaluable in tight games, especially to steady the ship and help younger teammates.

Remi Walker - Midfielder

Playmaker Remi Walker joined the Bucks in July 2023 following a successful trial.

He's creative, dynamic, and a key conduit in Telford's attack transitions. His vision, passing and ability to find pockets of space make him a threat when the team shifts forward.

Rhys Hilton - Attacking Midfielder

Joining the Bucks in the summer of 2024, Rhys Hilton adds attacking flair to their midfield options.

He is capable of playing further forward or wider, using dribbling, pace or the ability to cut inside to influence attacks.

Ola Lawal (Oluwasegun Lawal) - Midfielder

Ola Lawal has dual Irish and Nigerian citizenship and joined early in 2025.

His role tends to be a box-to-box one: breaking up play, pushing forward when opportunities arise, and offering balance in the engine room. With energy and tenacity, he helps protect the defence and support attacks.

Dylan Allen-Hadley - Forward

Dylan Allen-Hadley joined in March 2025 from another non-league side.

He brings pace, directness and an eye for goal. Often used to stretch defences or chase runs behind, he's one for the manager to deploy when a spark is needed up front.

Matthew Stenson - Forward

Matty Stenson's story is one of perseverance and revival.

Originally a midfielder, he was converted into a central striker during his time at Leicester Road.

He rejoined Telford in 2024 after spells elsewhere, and in the 2024-25 season he notched an impressive goal tally, earning both Players' Player and Supporters' Player awards.

Strong in physical duels, capable of leading the line, and with a hunger to score, he is the focal point of Telford's attack.

Ricardo Dinanga - Forward

Ricardo Dinanga currently plays on loan at Telford from Shrewsbury Town.

Born in Ireland (with Congolese roots), while at Telford he found good form, scoring 12 goals in 28 games before his move to Shrewsbury.

He remains on loan, so they retain his goal threat. With directness, positioning and finishing ability, he adds attacking potency when deployed.



Hereford will be looking to return to winning ways after a 2-1 loss to table toppers South Shields on Saturday, which ended their fivegame unbeaten run in the league.

"I'm really pleased with the effort from the players, they're a brilliant football team and it was an overall great game of football for the National League North," said Paul Caddis.

South Shields are unbeaten in the league and the Bulls can feel positive about the fact that they went toe-to-toe with them.

Hereford enter the game on Tuesday in 14th, with 14 points, having won four, drawn two and lost five.

Telford have had mixed fortunes so far this season as they currently sit in 17th with 12 points, having won three, drawn three and lost five.

The Bucks' most recent form has been impressive, with back-to-back wins against Darlington and Scarborough, which saw them score 10 goals.

Their emphatic 6-0 win against Darlington in the FA Cup earned them an away trip to Sutton United in the first round.

The 4-1 victory against Scarborough on the weekend was a muchneeded one, as they had gone three games without a win.

Kevin Wilkin's side finished third in the Southern League Premier Division Central last season and were promoted via the play-offs.

Hereford and Telford last met back in the 22/23 season when the Shropshire side were last in the National League North.

There are a number of Bucks' players that will be familiar faces to the Edgar Street crowd, with Jordan Cranston, Orrin Pendley, Brandon Hall and Ricardo Dinanga all being former players.

The Bulls fans will be hoping to see their side pick up their third home win of the season on Tuesday night.


Walker came through the academy at Birmingham City and joined Telford in 2023 after he was released, prior to that, he had a loan spell at Alvechurch.




