Good afternoon everyone and welcome once again to the MandM Edgar Street Stadium.

Today we entertain Curzon Ashton and we know from experience this will be a very tough game. We have had some great matches against Curzon over the years and they normally try to play football the right way (in my view).

They come here in good form, off the back of a fine win over Kings Lynn in midweek, and therefore we'll need to be close to out best today to get a positive result.

It's fair to say our points haul from the last 3 games has been disappointing, but I do write those words feeling a little hard done by. Tributes Paid To Edgar Street Legend Colin Addison

Everyone at Hereford FC is devastated to learn of the passing of Hereford United Legend, Colin Addison, at the age of 85.

Colin's playing career took him to the top-flight of English football for the likes of Nottingham Forest and Arsenal, before a move to Hereford United came in 1971, where he joined the Bulls as player-manager.

Colin Addison was a major part of the famous FA Cup run of 1972, guiding the side to victories over Cheltenham Town, King's Lynn, Northampton Town, and, famously, Division One Newcastle United. He then led the Bulls into the Football League for the first time in the club's history, an achievement every bit as significant as the win over Newcastle.

A long and impressive career in management led him to the Spanish capital when he took the reins at Atletico Madrid before a return to Hereford in 1990.

After his retirement, Colin stayed a much-loved part of our community here at Edgar Street and supported both Hereford United and Hereford FC passionately, always wanting the best for the team from his adopted home city.

Hereford FC Chairman, Chris Ammonds, said:

"Everyone with an allegiance to Hereford United or Hereford FC will be devastated by this news. The word 'legend' is overused nowadays, but never has it been more apt than

it is for Colin's achievements in football, and particularly at Hereford United in the early 1970s.

"The team he managed – and played in – put our city on the football map and without the work he did it is unlikely Hereford United would have been elected into the Football League at that time. In my view, Hereford United's win over Newcastle United remains the greatest FA Cup upset of all time and his key part in that victory - and that cup run as a whole - will never be forgotten.

"Off the field he was a true gentleman and it always felt a real honour to be in his company. You knew he wanted the very best for football in Hereford and I feel privileged to have some spent time with him.

"Over the next few days we will discuss fitting ways we can pay tribute to Colin and it is likely that our home game against Southport will be dedicated to him. While the Curzon fixture will see us pay our respects to the fallen as our annual Remembrance Day game, in the 6th minute of the match – in acknowledgement of the number Colin wore against Newcastle - we would like supporters to come together in a minute's applause in memory of Colin as our first tribute to him and all he contributed to football at Edgar Street.

"On behalf of everyone associated with Hereford FC, I would like to send our condolences to all of Colin's family and many, many friends. The thoughts of us all are with them at this extremely sad time."







Curzon Ashton Football Club was founded in 1963 following the merger of Curzon Road and Ashton Amateurs. The newly formed club joined the Manchester Amateur League and made an instant impact, winning the title twice and finishing runners-up in each of their first three seasons. Promotion to the Manchester League soon followed, where early consolidation gave way to success in the 1970s, including multiple runners-up finishes and a league and cup double

In 1978-79, Curzon became founder members of the Cheshire League Division Two and won promotion at the first attempt, narrowly missing the title by two points. Their first season in Division One produced one of the club's finest moments - an historic run to the semi-finals of the FA Vase. They became the first North West club to reach that stage, only to lose 2-0 in both legs to Stamford, with a record 1,800 fans watching the home tie.

When the Cheshire League merged with the Lancashire Combination to form the North West Counties League (NWCL) in 1983, Curzon were founder members once again. Three years later, floodlights were installed at National Park, paving the way for entry into the Northern Premier League (NPL) First Division in 1986 - their third founding role in just over a decade.

Early NPL seasons proved difficult, with four managers in 12 months before Steve Waywell arrived in October 1987. Relegation was only avoided due to league expansion, but Waywell stabilised the team and remained in charge until 1993. The club's best NPL finish came in 1995-96, placing fourth, but financial and organisational challenges the following year brought their tenyear stay in the division to an end.

The 1996-97 campaign was chaotic both on and off the field. Several managerial changes and boardroom upheaval ended with the club's first-ever relegation. Worse still, Curzon were controversially moved to the Northern Counties East League (NCEL) by the league authorities an unprecedented administrative decision that caused major travel and financial difficulties. The club finished second from bottom, but after appeals and support from the NCEL committee, they were reinstated to the NWCL in 1997-98.

Under manager Joe Murty, Curzon rebuilt, earning promotion in 1999-2000 before Murty's departure that summer. Gary Lowe took charge and oversaw more than a decade of stability and progress. His

early teams were competitive in league and cup, reaching the Worthington League Challenge Cup Final in 2000-01. Off the field, the club made major strides when long-term plans for a new home were finally realised. After decades at National Park and a temporary ground-share at Stalybridge Celtic, Curzon moved into the purpose-built Tameside Stadium in 2005. The ground was officially opened by Sir Alex Ferguson on 8 September 2005, with Manchester United providing the opposition.

The move marked a turning point. In 2006-07, Curzon finished NWCL runners-up, reached both the League Challenge Cup Final and the FA Vase semi-finals, matching the achievements of 1980. Their cup final against FC United of Manchester drew a record crowd of 3,210 to their new home. Promotion followed through league restructuring, returning Curzon to the Northern Premier League.

Their first season back (2007-08) saw them lead Division One North for much of the campaign before losing in the play-offs. The following year they again reached the play-off final but lost to Newcastle Blue Star. However, that season will forever be remembered for Curzon's superb FA Cup run - defeating Exeter City 3-2 at home in the First Round Proper before bowing out 2-0 at Kidderminster Harriers.

From 2008 to 2011, Curzon reached the play-offs four years in a row, consistently challenging for promotion under Lowe. They also made their debut in the FA Trophy First Round Proper in 2010-11, losing to Altrincham after the first tie was abandoned due to a power failure. That season marked the end of Lowe's impressive 11-year reign.

John Flanagan succeeded him in 2011, immediately leading the club to their highest-ever league finish - second place - and a play-off final in his debut season. His side went unbeaten in their first 17 games and were undefeated at home all season. Although 2012-13 brought a mid-table finish, the club reached the Doodson Sports Cup Final, losing on penalties to North Ferriby United after a shoot-out where the first seven penalties were saved.

A summer rebuild in 2013 produced a stunning campaign. Curzon went 16 games unbeaten, later embarking on a 12-game run that included a record ten straight clean sheets. A dramatic stoppagetime header from Niall Cummins at Harrogate Railway clinched the league title and promotion with five games to spare. The following season, the club competed at their highest-ever level in

the NPL Premier Division - and, remarkably, with largely the same squad, won promotion again. A play-off victory over Ilkeston, following a semi-final win over neighbours Ashton United, secured backto-back promotions and a place in the National League North for the first time.

Curzon adapted superbly to life at Step 2. Their debut 2015-16 campaign brought an 11th-place finish - a new club record. The following season saw them equal their best FA Cup run, reaching the Second Round Proper before losing to AFC Wimbledon. Subsequent seasons delivered solid mid-table finishes, though cup runs proved shorter, including exits to Stockport County and Southport.

The COVID-19 pandemic disrupted football nationwide in 2020, leading to the departure of manager Mark Bradshaw. Former Colne boss Steve Cunningham took charge, steering the club through uncertain times before being replaced midway through the 2021-22 season by Adam Lakeland, assisted by ex-player Alex Brown. Lakeland's appointment reinvigorated the side, continuing the club's steady progress until his move to King's Lynn Town during the 2023-24 season.

Experienced midfielder Craig Mahon then took over as player-manager and guided Curzon to another milestone - a seventh-place finish in the National League North, surpassing their previous best and securing the club's first-ever play-off appearance at that level. It was a fitting reward for a club that has built its reputation on persistence, unity, and ambition.

From their formation in 1963 to establishing themselves as a respected force in the National League North, Curzon Ashton's story is one of resilience and progress. They have overcome relocations, league restructures, and financial uncertainty to rise steadily through the non-league pyramid. The Tameside Stadium now stands as a symbol of their growth - a modern home for a proud community club with deep local roots.

More than sixty years on, Curzon Ashton continue to embody the values on which they were founded: hard work, determination, and belief. With a passionate fan base, a strong community focus, and ambitious leadership, the club remains committed to writing new chapters in its remarkable journey - representing Ashton-under-Lyne with pride in every competition they enter.



The Manager Mark Bradshaw

Mark Bradshaw (born 7 September 1969 in Ashton-under-Lyne) is an English former professional footballer and current head coach of Curzon Ashton FC. He made over 400 senior appearances, including spells at Blackpool FC, Stafford Rangers FC, Macclesfield Town F.C. and Halifax Town A.F.C., and earned an England semiprofessional cap in 1998.

After studying all levels of coaching, he returned to Curzon Ashton in 2025 to take on the role of first-team manager, drawing on deep roots in the club and region.

Callum Hawkins - Goalkeeper

Callum joined the Nash this summer from fellow National League North side Leamington, where he was instrumental in their promotion back to the National League North making 132 appearances for the Brakes and keeping 41 clean sheets. He joined the Nash following the departure of Bobby Jones.

Timi Sobowale - Defender

Timi Sobowale is a versatile defender and wing back known for his defensive solidity and attacking prowess. Last summer the Republic of Ireland international signed from Nantwich Town. Timi also had a winning stint with Manchester City's U18s while also playing in the USA with Real Monarchs before joining Wigan.

Jack Stafford - Defender

Jack Stafford is a promising young defender who brings flexibility to the squad being able to feature at centre back or left back. Stafford joins the Nash from Southport after making 18 appearances in the National League North last season and bolsters the defensive options.

Marcus Poscha - Defender

Marcus Poscha is one of the longest serving current players in the squad. He is a defender known for his defensive solidity and aerial prowess. Since joining The Nash in 2020 from Colne, Poscha has been a solid and consistent performer. Recognised as one of the top ball-playing defenders in the National League North, he combines strength with skill, making him a key asset in the backline.

Joel Amado - Defender

An imperious left sided defender, Joel joined the Nash last month from Hyde United after making 95 appearances. Joel started out his career as an U18 player at Curzon Ashton, playing under Assistant Manager Mark Bradshaw, before leaving to begin his university journey.

Christopher Stokes - Midfield

Stokes joined from AFC Fylde this summer after having plenty of experience at EFL clubs and in the Scottish Premiership. The experienced centre and left back has played 169 times in League Two and 59 in League One across spells for Bolton, Crewe, Forest Green, Coventry, Bury, Stevenage, Morecambe and Barrow. During 177 appearances for Forest Green, the most at the clubs he has featured for he scored 10 goals and 13 assists. He also played 44 times for Kilmarnock across the Scottish Premiership and Championship.

Jack Stobbs - Midfield

Stobbs arrives at Curzon Ashton with a wealth of experience across the EFL and National League. As a direct, pacey winger with crossing ability, he brings attacking intent and ambition. His blend of experience and flair should provide an exciting option on the flank for The Nash.

Alex Curran - Midfield

Alex returns with proven experience, creative flair, and a reliable goal threat from midfield. With a two year contract now in hand, he represents a core part of the Nash's hopes this season. Joining from fellow National League North side Macclesfield in February, expert Curran to play a pivotal role in the forward areas this season.

James Spencer - Forward

Leading from the front, Jimmy is a seasoned striker and respected leader whose blend has experience in the EFL. His presence up top, coupled with captaincy duties shows he is a crucial part for the Curzon furniture.

Tony Weston - Forward

Tony is a young striker that joined The Nash this summer following the expiration of his contract at Championship side Derby County. After starting his senior career in 2019 when he signed for Blackpool he then spent two season in Scotland, playing for Rangers, Cove Rangers and Partick

Thistle. He spent the last season on loan at National League team Boston United where he made 29 appearances.

Joseph Rodwell-Grant - Forward

Joe Rodwell Grant arrives with youth experience across the EFL and at non league level. A physical frame suitable for target striker duties and clinical finishing during short spells at lower levels provides a boost for the Nash's forward options with a blend of potential, athletic presence, and game time experience in National League North.

Crispin McLean - Midfield

The young Scottish midfielder started his youth career at Glasgow Rangers and Hibernian before singing for Fleetwood in 2023. Following the signing of his first professional contract with the club this summer Crispin joins The Nash on an initial 3 month

Joshua Ollerenshaw - Goalkeeper

Josh Ollerenshaw, a commanding goalkeeper known for his athleticism, joined in the summer of 2022 from Warrington Town. He is experienced across the Non-League pyramid, impressing with consistent performances. A standout moment came in April 2024 against South Shields, where he made 15 crucial saves, highlighting his shot-stopping prowess and reliability in high-pressure situations.

Charlie Weston - Midfield

The 21-year-old midfielder joined The Nash this summer from Rochdale AFC. Charlie signed his first professional contract with Blackburn Rovers in 2022 before joining National League side at the time side Kidderminster in 2024. His first senior goal game came in the Harriers relegation match in a 4-1 loss.

Bradley Holmes - Forward

Another new face in The Nash squad, Brad joined this summer from fellow National League side Marine. Brad has experience at northern level playing for multiple clubs on loan in the North West Counties league, Northern Premier League and National League North. Holmes also spent the second half of the 2024 at Scottish Championship side Dunfermline Athletic.

Ben Darby - Midfield

After joining the club last season from local side Mossley AFC, Ben signed a contract to 2027 stay at the Tameside Stadium. Last season injury meant Ben only made 28 league appearances last season hindering the chance of cementing his place in the team on a regular basis.

Ben Connolly - Midfield

The 17-year-old joined The Nash this summer from Welsh side TNS. This summer Connolly trialled for the new reserves team before impressing Mark Bradshaw and being signed for the first team and therefore playing in every pre season friendly including in Spain

Luke Griffiths - Midfield

Luke Griffiths is a dynamic, ball-winning midfielder known for his defensive prowess and ball retention. Notable for his solid performances, Griffiths secured a clean sheet against South Shields in April 2024 and scored his first goal against them in August 2024. Previously with FC United of Manchester, his career includes stints with Bolton's youth setup and a 2021 Ioan to Warrington Town.

Jordan Richards - Right Back

A versatile right back who known for his defensive solidity and offensive prowess. Joining from Farsley Celtic in January 2022, he quickly made an impact with a hat-trick of assists against Banbury United. Richards excels in link-up play and creating chances, and has plenty of experience with Hartlepool, Alfreton, Fylde, Southport, and Darlington all on his


