From the Top - With the Hereford FC Chairman

From the Dugout - With the Hereford FC manager

Good afternoon and welcome back to Edgar Street.

Before I speak about today's game, I want to start by expressing my deepest condolences following the sad loss of Colin Addison. Colin was a true Hereford FC stalwart, and someone I was fortunate enough to spend some time with in my early days managing the club. Listening to his stories about his time here was both inspiring and humbling. It was an honour to spend time with not just a great football man, but a gentleman who carried himself with class and respect. He'll be sorely missed by everyone in football, and of course, by his lovely family and friends. My thoughts are with them all at this difficult time.

Today we welcome Neil Danns, his staff, players, and supporters of Southport FC to Edgar Street. Neil is someone I have great respect for — both for his career and the way he has gone about his management journey. We know today will be another tough test against a well-organised side, and we'll have to be at our very best to come out on top.

Our recent form hasn't been good enough, and nobody feels that more than myself and the players. That said, we're five unbeaten at home, and while we know we must improve, we have to take belief and confidence from that. I understand the frustrations. When I came into this football club, my hands were tied behind my back and my legs tied together, but I've worked my way through that, and I'll continue to do so.

I also understand that criticism is natural when things aren't going well — it's part of football and comes with the job. But I'd ask one thing: please keep it respectful. The players are human beings with families. If you think someone isn't performing well, that's your opinion and fair enough — but please don't make it personal. For most of these lads, football is their second job, and as frustrating as that can be to get your head around, it's the reality we work in. Many of the lads share the same types of jobs that our supporters do — builders, delivery drivers, tradesmen, office workers — and

they give everything they can for this football club. All criticism, and I mean all of it, should come to me.

The players know the situation and are doing their best to turn things around. At the moment, we're making too many errors in both boxes, and at this level, you get punished for that. Those mistakes are hard to take, but those are my players, and I take responsibility for them.

I'm not naïve — I know how quickly things can change in football, and once people form opinions, they can be difficult to shift. But I'll always stand in front of my players when things are tough, and step back when it's time for them to take the credit.

What I can promise you is that I won't stop fighting, I won't stop working, and I won't change who I am. Nothing has ever been handed to me — I've had to climb hurdles and overcome challenges my entire life. I'm one of the small percentage who made it in a world where most don't, and that resilience is what keeps me going.

When things are going well, the noise is still there, but it's a whisper — easy to ignore. When things are tough, it becomes a roar, and everyone wants a piece. That's management, that's football, and I accept it. But I'll continue to fight alongside this group of players, as I have done for the last two and a half years, chasing and kicking every ball with them.

A week in football can change everything, and we're hoping for a positive one ahead. I won't stand here and ask for praise or applause — I understand that the affection towards me might have drifted. But I'll ask this: please keep backing the players. Your encouragement makes a huge difference, especially in tough moments.

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Tributes Paid To Edgar Street Legend Colin Addison

Everyone at Hereford FC is devastated to learn of the passing of Hereford United Legend, Colin Addison, at the age of 85.

Colin's playing career took him to the top-flight of English football for the likes of Nottingham Forest and Arsenal, before a move to Hereford United came in 1971, where he joined the Bulls as player-manager.

Colin Addison was a major part of the famous FA Cup run of 1972, guiding the side to victories over Cheltenham Town, King's Lynn, Northampton Town, and, famously, Division One

Newcastle United. He then led the Bulls into the Football League for the first time in the club's history, an achievement every bit as significant as the win over Newcastle.

A long and impressive career in management led him to the Spanish capital when he took the reins at Atletico Madrid before a return to Hereford in 1990.

After his retirement, Colin stayed a much-loved part of our community here at Edgar Street and supported both Hereford United and Hereford FC passionately, always wanting the best for the team from his adopted home city.

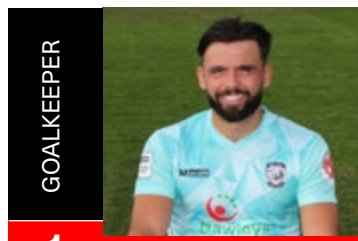

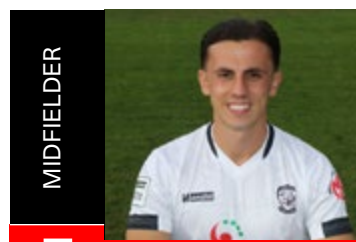

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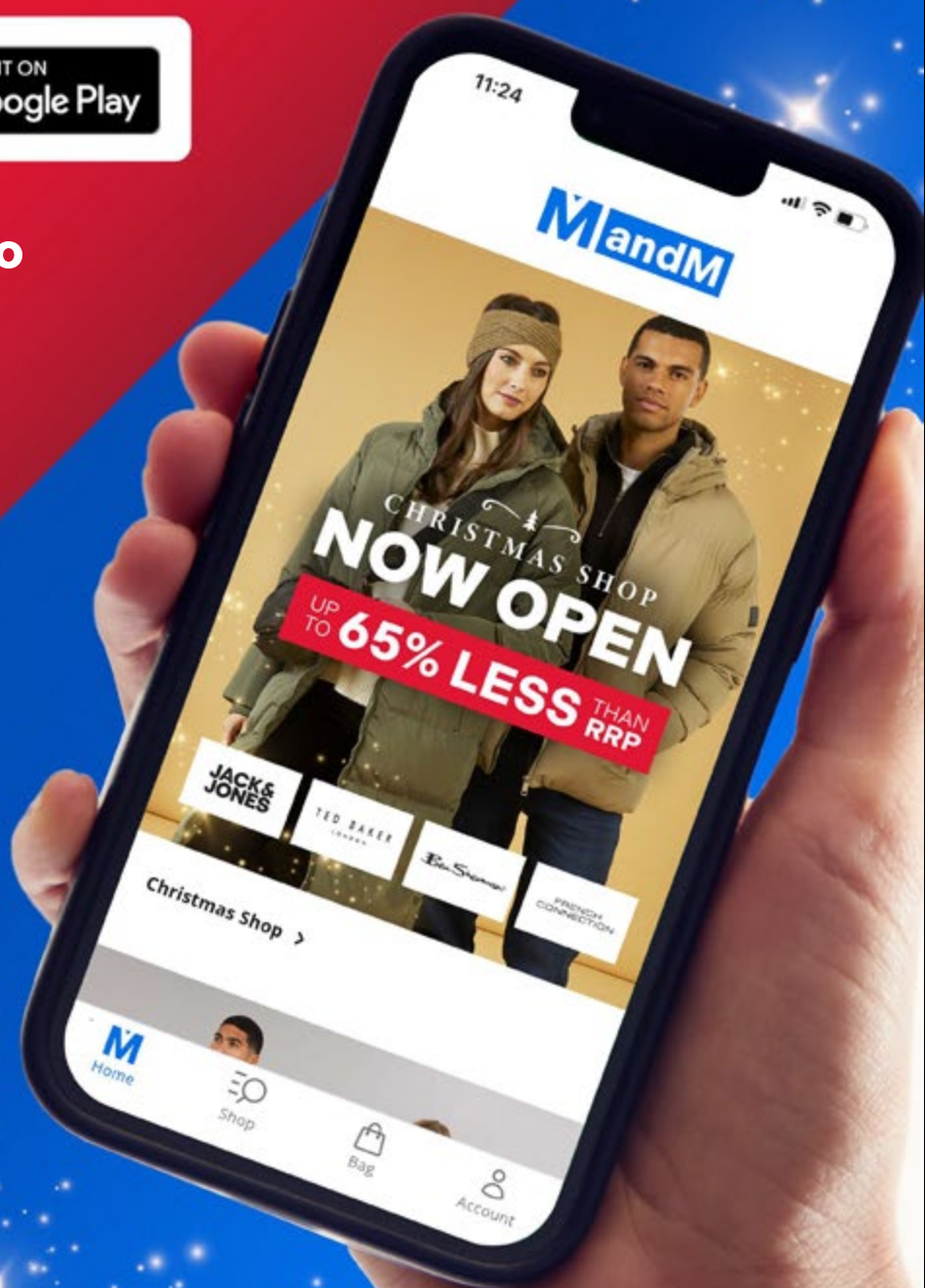

Southport Football Club was founded in 1888 by a group of influential local figures and the captains of several existing sides, who came together to form a new professional club capable of representing the town. The first meeting to discuss the new club took place on 2 June 1888, and the team was officially named Southport Central Association Football Club. With interest in the professional game growing nationally, and the Football League launching that same year, the timing was deliberate and ambitious.

The club's first ever match was played on 1 September 1888 facing a Liverpool side called Stanley. Their first competitive fixture followed a month later on 6 October, an FA Cup tie against Irwell Springs, which Central won 5-4. The club joined the Lancashire League in 1889 and played their first league game on 14 September, beating Rossendale 3-1.

Central initially played at the Sports Ground on Sussex Road, before moving a year later to a new ground on Scarisbrick New Road, which had previously been used by Southport Olympic Rugby Club. They remained there until 1905, when they moved to their present home on Haig Avenue, then known as Ash Lane.

The club's formation was traditionally dated to 1881, based on a short-lived amateur side that switched from rugby to association football that year. In the early 1880s, many other amateur teams sprang up locally, including Southport Wanderers. When the original club disbanded in 1886, Wanderers took on its name, along with many of its players and supporters. Both the original team and Wanderers referred to themselves as Southport Football Club, which likely contributed to the long-held assumption that the current club is a continuation. However, later research has clarified that Southport Central, formed in 1888, was not connected to these earlier efforts but was a completely new organisation.

For one season in 1918-19, the club played under the name Southport Vulcan after being taken over by the Vulcan Motor Company. This is widely recognised as the first instance of an English club playing under a sponsor's name. While not a sponsorship in the modern commercial sense, the name change reflected the club's ownership and financial backing by Vulcan. In 1919, following their withdrawal, the club adopted the name Southport Football Club, which it has retained ever since.

Southport held membership of The Football League from 1921 to 1978, never progressing higher than the third tier (League One) in the football pyramid.

The biggest achievement was winning the fourth division (L2 nowadays) in 1972-73, under Jimmy Meadows having previously been promoted from the same division in 1966-67 under the management of Billy Bingham.

After a number of years in the lower reaches of the fourth division sadly Southport became the last ever club to fail to be re-elected to the Football League in 1978 with Wigan Athletic taking over their Football League place.

Southport's best performance in the FA Cup as a Football League side came in the 1930-31 tournament when after reaching the quarter-finals (last eight) lost 9-1 to Everton at Goodison Park. The record home attendance of 20,010 came the following season in the same competition when hosting Newcastle United at Haig Avenue.

Other good FA Cup runs include reaching the fifth round (last sixteen) in 1965-66 before going down 2-0 to Hull City.

Southport took part in the Football League Cup from 1960 to 1978 but never progressed beyond the first two rounds.

Upon leaving the Football League Southport

joined the Northern Premier League, then considered the fifth tier. After turning down the opportunity to join the new Alliance league (later to be renamed the Football Conference and now known as the National League) upon its formation due to travelling costs and in doing so alienating hundreds of Southport fans, effectively suffered relegation to a sixth tier and remained in the Northern Premier League until 1993. Promoted to the Football Conference in 1993 and if play offs had been in place back then could well have found a route back to the Football League having finished in 4th 3rd and 6th position they remained at the fifth tier until 2003 before suffering relegation back to the Northern Premier League Premier Division (2003-04). Southport were then transferred to the new Football Conference North (now National League North) in 2004 and became the first side to win National North in 2004-05 under Liam Watson who in three spells with the club had a total of 660 games as manager.

On a never to be forgotten day in May 1998, the team reached the final of the FA Trophy under the guidance of Paul Fitcher and played at the old Wembley Stadium and whilst they lost 1-0 to Cheltenham Town it was a day many supporters never thought they would see having had some difficult times since leaving the Football League.

Southport have reached the third round of the FA Cup twice as a NL side losing 2-0 at home to Leyton Orient in 1998-99 and 1-0 at Derby County in 2014-15 when a penalty 30 seconds from time ended the dream of a replay. The goalkeeper that day was David Raya on loan from Blackburn who hasn't done too badly for himself since.

The 2025-26 season will see the club playing its 48th season in Non League Football and the previous 47 seasons have seen 34 permanent managers in the Southport hot seat.



The Manager Neil Danns

Neil Danns is a former professional footballer born on 23 November 1982 in Liverpool, England.

He enjoyed a playing career spanning over two decades, featuring at clubs including Crystal Palace, Leicester City and Bolton Wanderers, and earned 23 caps for the Guyana national football team, scoring 11 goals. Transitioning into management, he took charge of Southport F.C. in May 2025 and brings his rich playing experience and international pedigree to his leadership role.

Known for his midfield energy, Danns now applies his competitive drive to guiding Southport's first team.

Chris Renshaw – Goalkeeper

Player of the Year for 2024–25, Chris is now in his third season at Haig Avenue and has passed 100 appearances in all competitions. Since joining from Curzon Ashton in 2023, he's made the No.1 shirt his own, missing just one game last season through suspension.

Tom Moore – Defender

Voted Media Player of the Year last season, Tom made an instant impact after joining from Bury. Scoring on his debut, he went on to make 50 appearances and net three times, earning praise for his commitment and consistency.

Danny Lloyd – Forward

Back at the club after 12 years away, Danny rejoined at the end of 2023–24 and quickly became a key figure. The former Stockport, Peterborough, and Salford attacker led Southport's scoring charts last season with 15 goals across all competitions.

Mo Touray – Forward

A summer arrival, Mo brings pace and flair to the frontline. The former Newport County Academy graduate enjoyed a standout 2023–24 season with Warrington Rylands, finishing as their top scorer with 18 goals before joining Chorley, where he made over 40 appearances last term.

Aaron Pickles – Defender

The 20-year-old centre-back returns to Southport permanently after a solid loan spell from Accrington Stanley last season. Making 14 appearances in the National League North, his performances earned him a full-time move back to Haig Avenue.

Arthur Gnahoua – Forward

Arthur re-signs after an impressive pre-season, adding valuable experience and attacking strength. The 32-year-old forward featured briefly last season before injury struck, but boasts Football League

experience with Bolton Wanderers, Grimsby Town and Carlisle United.

Jordan Keane – Defender/Midfielder

Injuries restricted Jordan to just 12 appearances last term, but his pedigree is unquestionable. A two-time title winner with Stockport County, where he's regarded as a club legend, he also brings experience from spells with Derby, Lincoln and Boston United.

Sonny Hilton – Midfielder

An energetic box-to-box midfielder, Sonny impressed in his debut campaign with 50 appearances and five goals. A Fulham Academy product and former Premier League 2 captain, he has also represented England at U16, U17 and U19 levels.

Nathan Sandison – Defender

The 19-year-old full-back joins on a one-year deal after catching the eye at Bootle and Nantwich Town, where he led the assists chart with 13. A product of Wigan Athletic's Academy, Nathan adds pace and creativity on the flanks.

Luke Burgess – Midfielder

An attacking midfielder with an eye for goal, Luke became Jim Bentley's first permanent signing in October 2023. Formerly with Wigan, Salford and Oldham, he's now made 78 appearances for Southport, contributing nine goals and plenty of craft in the final third.

Paul Murphy-Worrell – Defender

A young defender with strong pedigree, Paul arrives from Blackburn Rovers after progressing through their U18 and U21 sides. Previously part of Liverpool's Academy setup, the 18-year-old joins on a one-year deal with an option for a further season.

Sam Minihan – Defender

Now in his second season at the club, Sam

joined from Buxton in 2024 and brings valuable experience at right-back. A tireless and determined performer, he made almost 200 appearances for Stockport County before spells at Halifax and Buxton.

Dana Amaral – Midfielder

Mozambique-born Dana adds youthful energy and composure in midfield. The 21-year-old joins from Warrington Town, having previously featured for Preston North End's first-team squad in cup competitions and gained senior experience with Rylands and Skelmersdale United.

Ne-Jai Tucker – Midfielder

A creative midfielder from Bermuda, Ne-Jai joined after impressing in pre-season. Formerly with Burnley, where he signed his first pro contract in 2021, he also represents the Bermuda national team, scoring his first international goal in 2023.

Jordan Slew – Forward

A powerful and experienced striker, Jordan arrives following his departure from Morecambe. The former Sheffield United Academy graduate has featured for several EFL clubs including Blackburn, Plymouth and Port Vale, and brings proven quality and leadership to the front line.

Callum Edwards – Winger

On loan from Wrexham until January, Callum is a lively wide player who spent pre-season touring Australia and New Zealand with the Red Dragons. The 19-year-old, who also had a spell at Bala Town, offers pace and direct attacking play down the wings.

Jim Simms – Forward

A young forward with strong potential, Jim signs from Wythenshawe after previous spells with Hull City, Buxton and Darlington. The 21-year-old adds energy and movement to Southport's attacking options for the new campaign.

The Bulls are back at home on Saturday as they host Southport.

Hereford will be looking to return to winning ways after a 3-0 loss away to Oxford City on Tuesday night, which extended their winless run to five games.

"We were very good for the first 44 minutes, but the red card changed the game, individual mistakes in those moments are killing us currently," said Paul Caddis.

The Bulls' last win came in early October, a 2-1 away win over Leamington.

Hereford enter the game on Saturday in 19th on 16 points, with four wins, four draws and seven losses.

Southport have had a poor start to the season as they are currently bottom with 12 points, with three wins, three draws and nine losses.

The Sandgrounders are coming off the back of a huge 2-1 win away to Buxton on Tuesday night, which brought to an end a run of five games without a win.

Neil Danns' side have only won once at home this season, which came back in August in the second game of the season.

Southport finished in the lower half of the table last season but stayed up comfortably, as they finished in 18th on 53 points, 14 above safety.

The two sides met twice last season, a 4-1 win at Haig Avenue for the Bulls and a 1-1 draw at Edgar Street.

Hereford fans will be hoping to see their side earn all three points on Saturday.

We first played Southport in the Football League during the Colin Addison era and have gone on to play them in the National Game too. Unusually they find themselves at the wrong end of the table which will make them doubly determined to give us the toughest of games today.

Tribute to Colin Addison

We celebrate the life of a true 'Hereford Great', Colin Addison

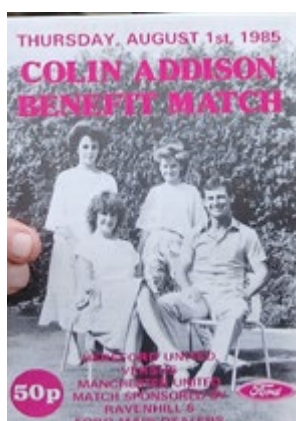
HUST, like all Hereford fans, are greatly saddened at his loss. He gave us special times.

Richard Tomkins, HUST Chair, shares some personal memories.

"For those of us who witnessed that period in the Club's history, they were remarkable times. John Charles had left. Now who would go on to manage us? Fans were at a low ebb. Then out of the blue we heard that a young Sheffield United player wanted to come and manage us! The Blades were in the First Division (now Premier League) at the time, and here was this young chap who wanted to come and manage us. What an accolade to our small club!

The rest is history. He led that team to a wonderful replay victory against Newcastle United at Edgar Street. The match launched John Motson's career, and I recall John interviewing Colin afterwards and Colin used his favourite word 'tremendous' but with feet still firmly on the ground.

That event got us into the Football League for the first time, and Colin went on to an illustrious career at home and abroad, showing his calibre. We have lost a former manager, but his legend will live forever."

Tony has been coming to Edgar Street since the Alex Massie era. His first match when just a lad was Boxing Day 1952 when Hereford United beat Cheltenham Town 7-0 in front of 5,498 spectators.

"The previous day was Christmas Day and Cheltenham had won the reverse fixture 3-0. Yes, they also played derbies on Christmas Day back then! What a turnaround! I was hooked!"

Tony has a 'Memory Match of all Memory Matches'. He says "Undoubtedly, it is Colin Addison's benefit match on 1st August 1985 when Hereford United played Manchester United. I should know, I refereed it as I'm a qualified referee! That was an era when First Division (now Premier League) clubs held pre-season friendlies in this country and sent first team squads to help lesser clubs in the land. Yes, I graced the Edgar Street turf that evening with some big names of the era, and here's the autographed programme to prove it! Man. United won 1-0 in front of 7,076 fans. Just a friendly but what an atmosphere!"
