Macclesfield Football Club rose from the ashes of Macclesfield Town FC, a proud institution originally founded in 1874. After nearly 150 years of footballing history, Macclesfield Town was liquidated and expelled from the National League in 2020 due to debts exceeding £500,000. Its assets, including the historic Moss Rose Stadium, were put up for sale — even appearing on the Rightmove property website.

In October 2020, local businessman Robert Smethurst purchased the stadium and remaining assets, determined to bring professional football back to the town. From this ambition, the phoenix club Macclesfield FC was born. Smethurst appointed former Welsh international Robbie Savage as Director of Football, while club legend Danny Whitaker became the first team manager. Significant investment followed, with over £4 million poured into upgrading the stadium and improving the club's commercial foundations.

In May 2021, the FA confirmed Macclesfield FC's placement in the North West Counties Football League (NWCFL) Premier Division for their inaugural season. The club also partnered with the Robbie Savage Foundation to offer free tickets to young people, aiming to inspire the next generation of Silkmen supporters.

The club's competitive debut came on 31 July 2021, when 2,018 fans watched Macclesfield record a 1-0 home win over Burscough, Leon Arnasalam etched his name into the history books as the club's first-ever goalscorer. A thrilling 4-4 draw followed away at Winsford United, with Tom Clare scoring all four for Macc. The Silkmen also enjoyed early forays into cup competitions, including their first FA Cup and FA Vase appearances that August and September.

That same year, the club featured in the BBC documentary "Robbie Savage: Making Macclesfield", a two-part series that reached over three million viewers and showcased the rebuilding of football in the Cheshire town.

Macclesfield's first season was an emphatic success. In March 2022, they became the first club in the top nine tiers of English football to secure promotion that season. A 4-0 victory over Ashton Athletic sealed the NWCFL Premier Division title, with Whitaker's men

finishing fifteen points clear of second-placed Skelmersdale United. The success extended throughout the club — the Women's First Team lifted the Cheshire Women's & Youth League title, while the Under-16s celebrated a remarkable quadruple.

The Silkmen's momentum continued into 2022/23. They clinched the Northern Premier League West Division title at the first attempt. earning back-to-back promotions following a 3-1 victory over Trafford on 1 April 2023. Macclesfield finished fourteen points clear at the top, confirming their rapid rise up the pyramid. However, the season wasn't without turbulence — manager Danny Whitaker was dismissed after a cup defeat to Guiseley. His successor, David McNabb, resigned soon after, leading to player-coach Neil Danns stepping in, assisted by former Premier League midfielder Mark Duffv.

Under Danns, Macclesfield went on a remarkable 22-match unbeaten league run to storm to another title. Skipper Laurent Mendy, Tre Pemberton, Neil Danns, and James Berry were all named in the Northern Premier League West Division Team of the Season, with Berry collecting both the Golden Boot and Player of the Season awards. The Women's Team added the League Cup, and the club's youth sides continued to shine.

Ahead of the 2023/24 campaign, Mark Duffy took over as Head Coach following Danns' departure to Tranmere Rovers. Results, however, faltered early on, and Duffy was replaced in October 2023 by former Hull City and Ipswich Town defender Alex Bruce. Bruce guided the side into the play-off picture before leaving for Salford City in February 2024. His replacement, Michael Clegg, steered Macclesfield to the Isuzu FA Trophy semi-final, narrowly losing 2-1 to National League side Gateshead.

Clegg's men finished runners-up in the Northern Premier League Premier Division, earning a place in the promotion play-offs. After a 3-1 win over Worksop Town in the semi-final, the Silkmen were heartbreakingly beaten 2-1 by Marine in the final at the Leasing.com Stadium. Shortly after, Clegg stepped down, and Robbie Savage once again took the reins — this time as manager.

While the men's side narrowly missed promotion, the Women's Team celebrated another successful season, earning promotion as they continued their rise through the leagues. Determined to bounce back, the men entered the 2024/25 season with renewed focus and resilience.

That determination paid off spectacularly. The Silkmen dominated the campaign, winning the Northern Premier League Premier Division in commanding fashion and earning a place in the National League North. Their promotion was sealed on 22 March 2025, when they came from behind to beat Bamber Bridge — becoming the first side in the top seven tiers to secure promotion that season. Macclesfield went on to win the league by a stunning 26 points, finishing with 12 consecutive victories.

It was a dream debut season in management for Robbie Savage, whose side broke numerous club records, including setting a new all-time points record in the Northern Premier League with 109 points. The transformation of the club — both on and off the pitch — was complete. What had begun as a rescue mission in 2020 had become one of the most remarkable revival stories in non-league football.

On 1 July 2025, Savage departed the club to become manager of Forest Green Rovers in the Enterprise National League. Later that same day, Macclesfield announced that John Rooney - brother of England legend Wayne Rooney would become the club's new manager, bringing an illustrious playing career to a close as he transitioned into management.

Now under Rooney's leadership, optimism is high as the Silkmen prepare for life in the Enterprise National League North. With a modernised stadium, a thriving academy, and a fanbase rekindled with pride, Macclesfield FC stands as a shining example of rebirth through community, ambition, and belief.

From liquidation to league champions in less than five years, the Silkmen's story is one of resilience and redemption — proof that with passion and persistence, even the darkest days can lead to a brighter future.



The Manager **John Rooney**

Appointed in July 2025, John Rooney — younger brother of England legend Wayne took charge following Robbie Savage's departure. With experience at Stockport, Oldham and Barrow, Rooney now leads the Silkmen into their first **Enterprise National League** North campaign.

1. Max Dearnley - Goalkeeper

Standing 6ft 5in, Max joined from Buxton in 2024 after facing Macclesfield in the FA Cup. With National League North experience at Buxton and Chorley, his commanding presence proved vital in last season's title win. Dearnley's consistency earned him both the Sponsors' and Directors' Player of the Year awards, and he signed new terms in May 2025.

13. Joe Nicholson - Goalkeeper

Joe arrived from Rochdale to compete with Dearnley for the No.1 spot. The former Preston North End scholar impressed in Dale's FA Youth Cup runs and earned his Silkmen deal after a strong pre-season.

31. Shea Callister - Goalkeeper

Nineteen-year-old Shea joined on dual registration from Maghull after time with Hull City's U21s. Formerly with Blackburn, Burnley and Salford, he's gained valuable non-league experience and adds promising depth between the posts.

2. Luke Matheson - Defender

Best known for scoring against Manchester United for Rochdale aged 16, Matheson later joined Wolves, earning England U17 and U18 caps. After spells with Bolton, Ipswich and Hamilton, the 22-year-old brings pace and pedigree to the backline.

3. Brandon Lee - Defender

Signed in 2021 from Longridge Town, Brandon has been a key figure throughout Macclesfield's rise. A former Bolton and Blackburn youth player, his attacking runs from defence and commitment have made him a fans' favourite.

4. Lewis Fensome - Defender

Joining from Lancaster City in 2022, Fensome has become a defensive leader. Commanding and composed, he's helped deliver three promotions and signed a new deal in 2024 to continue his journey with the Silkmen.

5. Rollin Menayese - Defender

The powerful centre-back joined from Aldershot Town in January 2025, bringing EFL experience from Walsall and Grimsby. Strong and reliable, Menayese quickly established himself and extended his stay that summer.

12. Sam Heathcote - Defender

Fearless and physical, Heathcote arrived from Runcorn Linnets in 2023 after standout spells at Hyde United and West Didsbury. A vital part of last season's title-winning side, he signed a new deal ahead of 2025/26.

15. Luis Lacey - Defender

Versatile and energetic, 20-year-old Lacey joined from Curzon Ashton. A former Barnsley and Tranmere academy player, he impressed at Flint Town, earning a Cymru North Team of the Season place in 2023/24.

24. Josef Yarney - Defender

Yarney arrived from Boreham Wood in 2025, reuniting with boss John Rooney from their Oldham days. The ex-Everton and Newcastle youth product has EFL experience with Tranmere and Chesterfield, plus stints in India and Palestine.

8. Regan Griffiths - Midfielder

A Crewe Alexandra academy graduate, Griffiths signed in 2025 after spells with Notts County and Boreham Wood. Calm in possession and industrious, he adds control and experience in midfield.

23. Danny Whitehead - Midfielder

A Silkmen favourite, Whitehead rejoined in 2024 after earlier helping Macclesfield Town win National League promotion in 2018. The former AFC Fylde man's experience and versatility make him a key part of the squad.

16. Elliott Whitehouse - Midfielder

Whitehouse joined in 2024 after strong seasons with Chester and Scunthorpe. The ex-Lincoln City man who scored at Wembley in the 2018 EFL Trophy Final brings energy, goals and leadership to midfield.

17. Carlos Dos Santos - Midfielder

A graduate of Macclesfield's academy and IFG University programme, Dos Santos earned his first-team deal in 2025. Athletic and adaptable, he impressed on Ioan at Newcastle Town and is one of the club's brightest young prospects.

22. Justin Johnson - Midfielder

Dutch winger Johnson signed from Chorley after making the 2023/24 National League North Team of the Season. Previously with Hamilton Academical, his pace and flair make him a constant attacking threat.

11. Luke Duffy - Midfielder

Duffy arrived from Warrington Town in 2023 after starring in their promotion campaign. Direct and skilful, he contributed goals and assists last season and extended his deal into 2026.

6. Paul Dawson - Midfielder

The club captain joined from Bamber Bridge in 2023. A tough-tackling and passionate leader, Dawson was instrumental in last season's success and renewed his contract in May 2025.

27. Josh Kay - Midfielder

On loan from Oldham Athletic, Kay is a versatile 28-year-old who won the National League with Barrow in 2020. Formerly of Barnsley and Fylde, his energy and creativity bolster the Silkmen's midfield.

28. James Edmondson - Midfielder

Back on loan from Blackburn Rovers, the 19-year-old impressed in his first spell, scoring on debut in the FA Trophy. A composed and technical midfielder, Edmondson has captained Rovers' U21s and is highly rated.

9. D'Mani Mellor - Forward

The Manchester United academy graduate joined from Gateshead in 2024. Quick and hard-working, Mellor has grown into a key attacking outlet and extended his deal after an impressive debut season.

10. Danny Elliott - Forward

Elliott joined from Scunthorpe United in 2024 and enjoyed a sensational debut year, scoring 41 goals and winning both the Silkmen's Player of the Year and the Northern Premier League Golden Boot. The 29-year-old is a proven goalscorer at this level.

14. Dontai Gabidon - Forward

Signed from FC United of Manchester in 2024, Gabidon's pace and power make him an exciting forward option. Having scored 19 times for the Reds, he adds further firepower to the attack.

18. Tom Clare - Forward

The 6ft 5 striker rejoined in 2024 after helping the club to consecutive promotions earlier in his career. A former Barnsley and Bradford City man, Clare remains a physical and aerial threat in the final third.

7. Isaac Buckley-Ricketts - Forward

Signed from Curzon Ashton in 2025, Buckley-Ricketts brings pedigree from Manchester City's academy and England youth caps. The pacey winger previously played for Peterborough, Oxford and Southport and adds real flair out wide.

20. Ethan McLeod - Forward

The 21-year-old joined after a successful trial in July 2025. A former Wolves academy product, McLeod's directness and speed have already caught the eye. He previously featured for Alvechurch, Rushall Olympic and Stourbridge.

30. Max Woltman - Forward

A recent addition, Woltman started his career at Liverpool, making his senior debut in the UEFA Champions League against AC Milan. After a spell at Oxford United, he joined Macclesfield in October 2025, bringing technical skill and top-level



The Bulls are at home again on Tuesday night as they host Macclesfield FC.

Hereford will be looking to return to winning ways after a 2-1 loss away to Southport on Saturday, which extended their winless run to six games.

"I thought we were good in the first half, we are extremely disappointed and we know we have to do better, this was a game we should have been winning, but I am confident we can turn things around," said Paul Caddis.

The Bulls' last win came in early October, a 2-1 away win over Leamington.




A warm welcome to supporters of Macclesfield today. We hope you've had a good journey. Their newly promoted team is going well and will be tough opponents.




We hark back to the days of Macclesfield Town v Hereford United. Tonight, it is a clash of the 'FCs' but we both have a lot in common.


