



AFC Fylde



AFC Fylde was born from the 1988 amalgamation of Kirkham Town FC and Wesham FC, adopting the name of a club that had played in the West Lancashire League before the First World War. The newly formed Kirkham & Wesham entered the West Lancashire League's Division One for the 1988-89 season.

After an initial relegation and several years fluctuating between divisions, the club found its footing in the mid-1990s. They dominated the Premier Division between 1999-2000 and 2006-07, claiming seven championships in eight seasons. A remarkable unbeaten run from January 2003 to October 2004 lasted 21 months across all competitions.

Trophy Success and League Progression
The club's trophy cabinet grew impressively during this period, winning the Lancashire Amateur Shield four times in six years, including a hat-trick of consecutive victories from 2004-06. They also secured the Northern Counties Cup three times between 2005 and 2007.

Following their 2006-07 West Lancashire League championship, Kirkham & Wesham stepped up to the North West Counties League for 2007-08. Their debut season proved extraordinary.

The Wembley Dream (2007-08)
The 2007-08 campaign delivered unprecedented success. In their first FA Vase appearance, the club marched to Wembley, defeating Studley, Crowborough Athletic, and Coventry Sphinx along the way before overcoming Needham Market 4-2 on aggregate in the semi-finals.

On 11 May 2008, they faced Lowestoft Town at Wembley in front of 19,537 fans. Trailing for most of the match, two late goals from seventeen-year-old substitute Matt Walwyn in the final six minutes secured a dramatic 2-1 victory. They also won the Division Two knockout trophy and secured automatic promotion to the Premier Division.

For the 2008-09 season, the club rebranded as AFC Fylde.

Under long-serving manager Mick Fuller, the club continued progressing through the non-league pyramid. After reaching the Northern Premier League Division One North playoffs in 2010-11, losing the final to Chorley, Dave Challinor arrived as manager in November 2011.

Challinor's impact was immediate. Despite being 16 points adrift when appointed, he steered the Coasters to the 2011-12 Northern Premier League Division One North title. The following season brought playoff heartbreak against Hednesford Town, but 2013-14 delivered promotion to the Conference North via the playoffs, alongside the Lancashire FA Challenge Trophy and Northern Premier League Challenge Cup.

AFC Fylde adapted brilliantly to Conference North football. Striker Danny Rowe became a prolific goalscorer, netting 31 goals in their debut 2014-15 season as they finished second before losing in the playoff semi-final to Guiseley.

After another playoff final defeat in 2015-16, the 2016-17 season brought the breakthrough. Moving into their new Mill Farm stadium, the Coasters stormed to the National League North title with 88 points and an incredible 109 goals. Rowe made history by scoring a record 47 league goals, firing Fylde into the National League for the first time.

The 2017-18 season saw AFC Fylde reach the FA Cup second round, drawing 1-1 with Wigan Athletic at Mill Farm before narrowly losing the replay. They finished seventh and qualified for the expanded playoffs, though Boreham Wood ended their promotion hopes.

The 2018-19 campaign brought more history. After finishing fifth, the Coasters beat Harrogate Town and Solihull Moors in the playoffs but lost 3-0 to Salford City in the final. However, redemption came a week later at Wembley, where Rowe's stunning free-kick

defeated Leyton Orient 1-0 in the FA Trophy final, making AFC Fylde the first club to win both the FA Vase and FA Trophy.

After Dave Challinor's departure in 2019, Jim Bentley took charge and guided the club to their first FA Cup third round, losing narrowly to Sheffield United. However, the 2019-20 season ended with relegation after the campaign was decided on points per game due to COVID-19.


The Coasters topped the National League North table when the 2020-21 season was voided due to the pandemic. Playoff disappointment followed in 2021-22 under Bentley, who left before the 2022-23 season. Return to National League

Adam Murray arrived in October 2022 and masterminded a thrilling title race with King's Lynn Town. Victory at King's Lynn in March 2023, followed by wins over Curzon Ashton and Bradford Park Avenue, crowned AFC Fylde as 2022-23 National League North champions.

Back in the National League for 2023-24, Murray was replaced by Chris Beech, who steadied the ship to an 18th-place finish. Despite an optimistic start to 2024-25 under Beech, results declined and former England international Kevin Phillips took over in October. Unfortunately, relegation back to National League North followed, with club legend Nick Haughton departing for Forest Green Rovers after six memorable years.

For 2025-26, Craig Mahon was appointed Head Coach, bringing renewed optimism as the Coasters made a strong start to their National League North campaign, determined to bounce back immediately.

From West Lancashire League beginnings to Wembley glory and National League football, AFC Fylde's journey reflects ambition, resilience, and memorable moments that have established them as a notable force in non-league football.



Zac James - Goalkeeper

The New Zealand shot-stopper joined in July 2025 on a one-year deal after his contract expired at Haverfordwest County. The 24-year-old, who represented New Zealand at youth levels, won domestic titles before moving to Wales in 2022. His penalty heroics secured Haverfordwest's historic back-to-back UEFA Conference League qualifications, and he won the Golden Glove award with 15 clean sheets in 31 games.

Pat Boyes - Goalkeeper

Arriving in July 2025 from King's Lynn Town, Boyes is a highly-rated prospect who progressed through academies at Huddersfield and Grimsby before joining Hartlepool in 2021. After moving to Fleetwood Town, he joined King's Lynn for 24/25, playing 13 National League North games and keeping seven clean sheets.

Kieran Coates - Defender

The 23-year-old full-back joined in August 2025 from Boston United. Starting at Stoke City and loaning to Cork City, Coates spent two years at Chester before joining Boston. He finished 24/25 on loan at Hereford in the National League North.

Lincoln McFayden - Defender

A local product who joined in summer 2024, the attacking left-back came through Preston North End's academy before spending three years at Swansea City, making his debut in a Carabao Cup win. He signed a one-year deal after a successful trial.

Max Taylor - Defender

Taylor joined in summer 2025 from Morecambe. The centre-half came through Manchester United's ranks, making his professional debut and Europa League appearances before accumulating extensive non-league and Football League experience.

Liam Brockbank - Defender

The 24-year-old signed in August 2025 after a successful trial. Coming through Carlisle United's academy, he moved from Workington to Lancaster City in 2021, winning double Player of the Year honors before joining Altrincham. Loan spells at Warrington Rylands and Bamber Bridge followed.

Corey Whelan - Defender

Joining as Club Captain in summer 2024 from Carlisle United, the Chester-born defender reunited with Head Coach Chris Beech. A former Liverpool prospect and Republic of Ireland U21 international, Whelan has over 100 EFL appearances. He played in the USL Championship with Phoenix Rising before returning to England with Wigan in 2021, then

Carlisle, helping them win promotion to League One in 2023.

Cullen Meadowcroft - Defender

A Manchester-born AFC Fylde Academy product who joined at 16, the versatile defender starred in the club's FA Youth Cup run to the fifth round. He signed his first professional contract in May 2025.

Jesse Hailwood - Defender

The midfielder signed a one-year deal after impressing in pre-season, becoming the second academy graduate to turn professional in summer 2025. He helped the U18s reach the FA Youth Cup third round twice.

Ethan Mitchell - Midfielder

Initially joining on loan before signing permanently in summer 2024, Mitchell came through Wigan's academy, joined Tranmere at 15, then moved to Plymouth Argyle in 2020, captaining their U18s. He made his professional debut against Newport County before returning to Wigan in 2022.

Chris Merrie - Midfielder

The holding midfielder joined in summer 2025 from Tranmere Rovers, where he spent four years after coming through Wigan Athletic's academy. He brought over 100 EFL games of experience to Mill Farm.

George Wilson - Midfielder

Wilson joined in summer 2025 from Altrincham. The powerful midfielder played for Coalville and Loughborough during his university studies before making over 50 National League appearances and being labeled one of non-league's brightest talents.

Danny Mayor - Midfielder

Taking the number 10 shirt in August 2025, Mayor came through Preston North End's academy, earning Young Player of the Year in 2011/12 before joining Sheffield Wednesday. After loans and a permanent move to Bury, where he made over 200 appearances, Mayor joined Plymouth Argyle in 2019, playing 30 games in their 2022/23 title-winning season. He joined Fleetwood in 2023 before arriving with over 400 EFL appearances.

Taelor O'Kane - Midfielder

The academy graduate made 19 National League appearances last season, scoring four goals including a dramatic 96th-minute equalizer against FC Halifax Town. The 2022/23 Academy Player of the Year captained the U18s to their third consecutive Lancashire County Cup win.

The Manager

Craig Mahon

Craig Mahon was appointed Head Coach of AFC Fylde in June 2025 after leaving fellow National League North side Curzon Ashton.

The Irishman had done a sterling job with the Nash whilst continuing in his player/coach role, guiding Curzon to an eighth-placed finish whilst making 27 appearances himself.

As a player, Mahon enjoyed a short spell in a Fylde shirt, featuring for the club whilst on loan from Chester back when the Coasters played at Kellamergh Park.

Tom Whelan - Midfielder

The 29-year-old Liverpool-born midfielder joined for 2025/26 with over 200 National League appearances. Starting at Bury, he moved to Yeovil before loan spells at Salisbury and Weymouth, winning promotion in 2019/20. After joining Chesterfield in 2020 and becoming a fans' favorite, he moved to Boreham Wood in 2023, playing 48 games with 12 goal contributions as they won the National League South Play-Off Final.

Jack Morris - Midfielder

An AFC Fylde Academy product awarded a professional contract in June 2024. He debuted in late 2023/24, impressed in pre-season, and had his contract extended in summer 2025.

Max Fisher - Midfielder

The third Fylde academy product to debut, Fisher featured in the final moments of Fylde's 5-1 win over Macclesfield in November 2025. The young midfielder made his first appearance at just 17 after impressing in training with Craig Mahon's side.

Charlie Jolly - Forward

Coming through Wigan Athletic's youth system, Jolly turned professional in 2019, featuring in league and cup while also spending time on loan at Curzon Ashton. The Liverpool-born forward joined Tranmere in January 2021 for an undisclosed fee. In his first full season at Prenton Park, he made 12 appearances and scored four goals, including a last-minute winner at Oldham in December 2021. He arrived at Mill Farm in summer 2024 on a two-year deal.

Jonathan Ustabaşı - Forward

Ustabaşı joined in summer 2023 as a free agent from Chorley FC. The 29-year-old wide man had enjoyed one of his best seasons, notching 15 goals in the National League North for the Magpies throughout 22/23. A pacey, attacking player, Ustabaşı spent several years in Turkey starting with Denizlispor U21s, playing for Bursaspor and FC Schkupi before returning to England with Stalybridge Celtic. After two seasons there, he moved to Chorley before signing a contract extension at Mill Farm until summer 2026.

Danny Ormerod - Forward

The 18-year-old broke into the first team in 2023/24 after impressing at youth level, amassing seven goals across 26 National League appearances. Having come through Blackpool's academy before signing for Fylde, Ormerod was rewarded with a new two-year contract through to 2026. He scored a brace against Rochdale on New Year's Day and, after a loan spell at Chorley for match minutes, returned to Mill Farm by scoring a last-minute equalizer against Eastleigh.

The Bulls return to FA Trophy action on Saturday as they host AFC Fylde in the fourth round.

Hereford will be looking to return to winning ways after a 2-2 draw away to Merthyr over the Christmas period, which extended an unwanted run of four games without a win.

The Whites came from behind twice in that game, with a last-minute equaliser from Kyle Howkins rescuing a point.

"The character of our players is excellent. That was the least we deserved. We took the game to one of the best teams in the league," said Paul Caddis.

Due to fixture postponements, that was Hereford's last game, just over 10 days ago.

The Bulls beat Sudbury 5-1 in the FA Trophy second round, before a 1-1 draw against Radcliffe and an eventual win on penalties in the third round.

Fylde have had a good season so far, as they currently sit second in the league, just two points behind leaders South Shields.

The Coasters enjoyed a successful Christmas period with two wins against Chorley and Bedford, and a draw away to Radcliffe.

Craig Mahon's side beat Spennymoor away in the second round of the trophy before also winning in the third round on penalties against Solihull Moors.

The side from Lancashire have been excellent away from home, picking up 31 points on their travels and losing just twice — the best away record in the National League North.

The side from Lancashire were relegated from the National League last season, finishing 23rd with 40 points, 13 points from safety.

One name familiar to the Bulls in the Coasters' squad will be Kieran Coates, who joined Caddis' side on loan at the end of last season and played six times as Hereford finished just short of the play-offs.

The two sides met in the league back in October, with Fylde securing a narrow 2-1 victory thanks to a last-minute winner from Jonathan Ustabasi.

Hereford fans will be hoping to see their side progress into the next round on Saturday.




