From the Top - With the Hereford FC Chairman

Good evening everyone and welcome to our first 'home' game for some time.

Obviously, this evening's match is being hosted at Sixways - which I'm sure will feel very surreal - and I'd like to place on record my thanks to the team at the stadium for helping us switch the game so smoothly.

I'd also like to place on record my enormous gratitude to all our office staff - led by General Manager Jamie Griffiths - for all their hard work over the past few weeks making arrangements and contingency plans due to the ongoing issues with the playing surface at the MandM Edgar Street Stadium.

Welcome to Hereford AARON DOWNES

Hereford FC are delighted to announce that Aaron Downes has been appointed the club's first team manager on a contract that initially runs until the end of the 2026 National League North season.

During a 15-year playing career, Downes made more than 350 senior appearances for Chesterfield, Bristol Rovers, Torquay United and Cheltenham Town, before moving into coaching and becoming Gary Johnson's Assistant Manager at Torquay in 2018.

He was then appointed Interim Manager at Plainmoor in February 2024, overcoming administration, an 11-point deduction and a transfer embargo to guide the Gulls away from the National League South relegation zone.

More recently, Downes was Mike Flynn's assistant at Cheltenham Town from June 2024 until September 2025, before leaving the club when Steve Cotterill was appointed the Robins' new manager.

Downes will be bringing in former Hereford United midfielder, Harry Pell, as part of his staff, and he is hoping to retain Adam Rooney and Shaun Edwards on his coaching team as Player Coach and Goalkeeping Coach respectively.

Speaking about this appointment, Bulls Chairman, Chris Ammonds, said:

"We are very pleased to have reached an agreement with Aaron for him to become our new manager.

"He brings considerable experience as an assistant manager to the MandM Edgar Street Stadium and, importantly, has previously shown his ability to galvanise a squad of players in challenging circumstances as Interim Manager when he was appointed manager at Torquay for the final 13 games of the 2024 season.

"Aaron was a stand-out candidate among the applicants and we were very impressed by his positivity, his personality, his belief in his own methods and how badly he wanted this job. He is also highly thought of by people he has worked alongside since moving into coaching.

"Before we spoke to him, Aaron put forward a detailed plan to navigate us through the rest of the season, and he has clearly already spent a lot of time watching our matches and assessing the options available to him.

"We will be offering Aaron support to freshen up the Bulls squad in the coming days and weeks and we are very much looking forward to working with him for the rest of this campaign, and hopefully beyond."

Commenting on his appointment, Downes said:

"I am absolutely honoured to be given this opportunity and cannot wait to get started.

"After several years as an assistant manager, I have been waiting for the right opportunity to become a number one and as soon as the role at Hereford FC became available, I expressed a strong interest.





Darlington Football Club was formed in July 1883 when representatives from several town teams met at a local grammar school. The new club made Feethams their home, leased from John Beaumont Pease in 1866, with the first turf from the nearby cricket pitch. They entered the FA Cup in 1885 but lost 8-0 to Grimsby.

Darlington were original founder members of the Northern League in 1889, winning titles in 1896 and 1900. The club turned professional in 1908, joining the North Eastern League after losing their opener 5-1 to Sunderland. They won that league in 1913 and reached the FA Cup's last sixteen in 1910/11, playing eleven games across eight rounds and beating First Division Sheffield United before losing 3-0 to Swindon.

The First World War caused financial problems, leading to a takeover by Forge Albion. New chairman J.B Haw cleared debts and built Feethams' east stand. In 1921, after winning the North Eastern League, Quakers joined the newly-formed Third Division North, finishing runners-up in their first season. They won promotion to the Second Division in 1924-25, opening with a 0-0 draw against Nottingham Forest before 13,000 fans. After finishing 15th, they were relegated the following season after finishing second bottom.

Darlington won the Third Division North Cup in 1934, their only Old Trafford appearance, beating Stockport County 4-3. They remained in the Third Division North until World War Two, attracting big-name players like Scotland international Bob Thynne due to the nearby Catterick army base.

In November 1955, Darlington made history in the FA Cup's first floodlit match, drawing 0-0 at Carlisle. They won the second replay 3-1 at St James Park before 34,257 fans. In 1958 they joined the new Fourth Division and enjoyed a memorable FA Cup run, beating Chelsea 4-1 at Feethams after a 3-3 draw at Stamford Bridge before 15,150 fans, then losing 6-1 to Wolves.

The 1960s brought ground improvements. Floodlights were installed in November 1960 for a 5-2 win over Millwall, though an electrical fault gutted the West stand, later

rebuilt identically. The Town End received a roof, earning the nickname "Tin Shed." A record 21,023 attended a 1960-61 League Cup match against Bolton (lost 2-1). Darlington finished runners-up in 1966, securing their first promotion in 41 years, but were relegated immediately. They reached the 1967-68 League Cup quarter-finals, losing 5-4 to Brian Clough's Derby County.

Between 1969/70 and 1979/80, Darlington applied for Football League re-election five times, always succeeding, likely due to good transport links. Sir David Frost featured their plight in a documentary.

The 1980s brought financial crisis. Fans raised £50,000 in six weeks, with Southampton providing a fundraising match. Under Cyril Knowles, they won 1985 promotion to the Third Division but suffered two relegations in three years, finishing bottom in 1988/89 and dropping to the Conference. Brian Little led them back immediately with a final-day win at Welling, then to Third Division promotion in 1990-91 by beating Rochdale. After Little left for Leicester, they were relegated again.

In 1996, Quakers reached Wembley for the play-off final against Plymouth, backed by 13,000 fans, but lost to a second-half goal. In 1997, the east stand was demolished and rebuilt. Chairman Mike Peden resigned, and George Reynolds took over, constructing a new 27,000-seater stadium.

The 1999/00 season saw another play-off final at Wembley against Peterborough, lost to another second-half goal. In 2000/01, after losing to Gillingham in the FA Cup, Darlington were reinstated when Manchester United withdrew for the World Club Championship. The FA drew Darlington as the lucky losers, and they lost 2-1 at Aston Villa.

In 2002/03, Darlington left Feethams after a 2-2 draw with Leyton Orient, moving to Neasham Road. The opener drew 11,600 but Kidderminster won 2-0. Crowds dwindled, and the club entered administration. David Hodgson returned as manager, saving them from relegation, though problems continued.

After reaching 2008 play-off semi-finals (lost to Rochdale), owner George Houghton put the club into administration in 2009 despite promotion form. Points were deducted, and the squad departed. Under Raj Singh, they were relegated to the Conference in 2009-10. They reached Wembley in the FA Trophy, with Chris Senior heading a last-minute winner against Mansfield after overturning a two-goal semi-final deficit against Gateshead.

In 2012, the club entered administration for the third time. A supporters group took control, but the FA controversially relegated them from the Conference to the Northern League—four divisions. They left the Arena, groundsharing with Bishop Auckland at Heritage Park. Averaging over 1,300 fans, they won the Northern League with triple-figure points, goals, and goal difference. In 2013-14, they finished second but lost in play-off semi-finals. In 2014-15, they beat Spennymoor 3-2 and Bamber Bridge 2-0 for promotion, then won the EvoStik League title with a 7-1 win at Whitby, playing six games in the season's final fortnight.

On Boxing Day 2016, Quakers returned home to Blackwell Meadows, beating Halifax 3-2. They finished fifth but couldn't contest play-offs due to ground standards. Mark Beck scored the last goal at Heritage Park and first at Blackwell Meadows, which featured a rebuilt Tin Shed from Feethams. Fundraising exceeded £1 million over six years.

Alun Armstrong, appointed in 2019, led them to the FA Cup first round (lost to Walsall). In 2020-21, they beat League One Swindon 2-1 before losing to Bristol Rovers. They topped the table at Christmas 2022 but finished midtable. The Boost the Budget campaign raised £166,000 in 2023, bringing total fan contributions over £2 million.

In 2023-24, Armstrong departed early, replaced by Josh Gowling, who was sacked at Christmas with Quakers second bottom, eight points from safety. Steve Watson and Terry Mitchell achieved twelve wins and a draw from 22 matches, finishing 16th, six points clear—their Great Escape. In 2024-25, they spent most of the season in the top half but missed the play-offs.

Peter Jameson - Keeper

Pete had two spells at Darlington, helping win EvoStik League promotions into National League North before loans to South Shields and Blyth Spartans. Steve Watson signed him for York City in 2019 (102 games). He played 27 times for Harrogate in League Two before his June 2024 release. Steve re-signed him. Pete joined Gateshead as player/goalkeeping coach but has been loaned back to Quakers.

Scott Barrow - Defender

Scott started at Swansea before Port Talbot (100+ appearances, Welsh Premier team of the year). After 100 appearances at Tamworth and a season at Macclesfield, he joined Newport County in League Two. Following a season at Merthyr, he joined Gateshead under Steve Watson for three years, then York in 2020. He helped York win promotion but suffered a play-off final injury. He loaned to Darlington in 2023-24 (19 matches), made it permanent in summer 2024 (67 appearances by season start).

Kallum Griffiths - Defender

Kallum came through Sunderland's academy alongside Jordan Henderson and Martin Waghorn, then Bradford City youth. He joined Spennymoor in 2009, making 389 appearances as they climbed from Northern League to National League North, winning the FA Vase (2013), Northern League four times, and EvoStik promotions. He moved to York City for two seasons, then Gateshead before signing for Quakers in 2021 (111 appearances, four goals).

Ben Hedley - Defender

Ben plays right back, left back and midfield. After Morecambe's Academy and two seasons as a pro, he was released in 2019. He signed for Quakers in September 2019, debuting against Gloucester City. He signed a new contract in 2022. Longest-serving player with 189 appearances.

Toby Lees - Defender

Toby started at Harrogate with loans at Harrogate RA, Boston, Whitby and Gateshead before joining Gateshead permanently in 2020. After Alfreton, he moved to Blyth Spartans where he was player of the year. Joined Quakers summer 2023 (89 appearances, five goals).

Elliot Forbes - Defender

Elliot plays centre-back and midfield. Starting at Gateshead in 2018 (56 appearances, promotion to National League 2022 under Steve Watson). After loan spells at Spennymoor and Blyth, he left

Gateshead in January 2024, joined Blyth permanently before leaving. Rejoined Steve Watson summer 2024 (35 appearances, three goals in 2024-25).

Alfie Myers-Smith - Defender

Alfie joined after his release by Middlesbrough at the end of 2024-25. He captained their under-18s and played in under-21 Premier League North. An injury in a friendly ruled him out of the season's opening games.

Josh Scott - Defender

Josh helped Queen's Park beat Rangers in the Scottish Cup (February, 72 minutes at Ibrox—first win since 1882). He started at Newcastle, gaining experience in Under-18 Premier League, Premier League Two and EFL Trophy before joining Queen's Park (33 appearances, two goals).

Will Hatfield - Midfielder

Will is in his second spell after returning from Fylde (September 2023). Started at Leeds, joined Accrington Stanley 2012 (90 appearances, 9 goals including four in one FA Cup tie). After Halifax (11 appearances) and Guiseley (150+ appearances), he joined Quakers 2019, becoming key and scoring the 2020-21 goal of the season. After 87 appearances and 11 goals, he joined Fylde 2022, won promotion, then rejoined Quakers. Brief spell as joint caretaker manager. Total: 181 appearances, 25 goals.

Tom Platt - Midfielder

Tom started at York City in League Two (2013) before Harrogate (2016), Alfreton (2017) and Boston (2019, four seasons, two play-off finals). Joined Quakers summer 2023 as captain. His performances helped avoid relegation 2023-24 (68 appearances, one goal).

Will Maddison - Midfielder

Will came through the Under-23s, debuting in the FA Cup against West Didsbury and Chorlton. He signed a one-year deal in summer 2025.

Will McGowan - Midfielder

Will is in his third loan spell from Gateshead. He scored on his debut against Southport, returned for six matches and scored on his second debut against Warrington. He started at Sunderland and Doncaster before two seasons at South Shields, then moved to Blyth as an ever-present before joining Gateshead in summer 2024.

The Manager

Steve Watson

Steve has extensive managerial experience in this division with York City, Chester, and Gateshead. He nearly achieved promotion with York five seasons ago before Covid intervened. He also coached at Birmingham City and Macclesfield.

As a player, he made 557 appearances, scoring 38 goals for Newcastle United, Aston Villa, West Bromwich Albion, Everton and Sheffield Wednesday, playing in the Champions League, Cup Winners Cup, UEFA Cup and Premier League.

Appointed New Year's Eve 2023, he and assistant Terry Mitchell transformed the team from second bottom to 16th place, winning twelve and drawing one of the last 22 league matches to avoid relegation.

Matty Cornish - Midfielder

Attacking midfielder Matty played Northern League football for Newcastle Benfield, Whitley Bay and Consett (2020 FA Vase final) before USA stints including Nova South Eastern University (national semi-finals). Returned July 2022 for Blyth Spartans, then joined Marske United 2023-24. Left when Marske resigned from NPL (63 appearances, 12 goals across two seasons).

Tom Allan - Forward

Tom started at Newcastle, playing in the FA Cup at Rochdale, with loan spells at Accrington Stanley and Greenock Morton before joining Gateshead where he won the FA Trophy in 2023-24. Gateshead loaned him to South Shields and Spennymoor last season before releasing him.

Cedric Main - Forward

Cedric, 26, started in Holland (FC Groningen) before CF La Nercia in Spain. Moved to England January 2021, joining FC United (6 goals in 19 NPL games), then South Shields (3 goals in 18 games). Joined Blyth September 2022 (16 goal contributions, four in one FA Trophy win). York signed him but loaned back to Blyth (9 goals in 16 matches, six assists). Steve Watson signed him January 2024 (18 goals in 58 matches).

Jack Maskell - Forward

Jack started at Horden, winning Northern League Second Division young player of the year (play-offs, FA Vase fourth round). Joined Dunston June 2023 (26 goals in 36 league games, play-off final hat-trick). Quakers paid undisclosed fee summer 2024, two-year contract (nine goals in 45 matches last season).

Aidan Rutledge - Forward

Aidan was a prolific scorer at Birtley before signing for Gateshead in 2023. After a loan to Scarborough, he moved to Darlington late in the season, scoring twice in six games. In 2024-25, he loaned to South Shields before moving to Spennymoor, helping them reach the Trophy final at Wembley. Quakers signed him for an undisclosed fee in summer 2025.




