OPPOSITION EAST GRINSTEAD TOWN

1890s East Grinstead Town Football Club was formed on May 8, 1890 although it was another ten years before they played their first competitive match as founder members of the Mid Sussex Football League. In those early days the club played in blue and white with the town's coat of arms on the breast pocket. It was some years before they adopted their current colours of amber and black and were nicknamed 'The Wasps,' both of which survive to this day.

1900s They won the Mid Sussex League in 1902 and their first major honour followed seven years later when they shared the Sussex Junior Cup with Arundel.

In 1909 they were awarded senior status which they have held ever since apart from two seasons when they were relegated to the intermediate third division of the Sussex County League in 1989.

1910s In 1912 Grinstead reached the Sussex Senior Cup final for the only time in their history but lost 4-1 to St Leonards Amateurs in a ferocious snowstorm.

1920s The Wasps were original members of the Sussex County League when it was founded in 1920, but they struggled to make any impact and after finishing bottom in 1927 and replaced by Horsham, they were not re-elected.

1930s Rather than returning to the Mid Sussex League, they had four successful seasons in the Brighton League before stepping up to the Southern Amateur League. A fresh challenge reinvigorated the club and they won the Division Three title in 1932 with 15 victories out of 18. Three years later they played on the Test match cricket ground at Trent Bridge in Nottingham when they defeated Nottinghamshire Amateurs 6-0 in the old FA Amateur Cup.

Determined to regain their place in the Sussex County League, they were re-elected back in 1937 after winning the Mid Sussex League again and finished fifth in their first season.

1940s In those halcyon days either side of the Second World War, four-figure crowds

were the norm at their old ground in West Street, East Grinstead, which they shared with the town's cricketers. The club's record attendance is 2,006 for an FA Amateur Cup tie against Lancing in November, 1947.

1950s Success eluded Grinstead until 1952 when they won the Baldwin Cup, the forerunner of the Sussex County League Cup. That team is reckoned by many to be the finest the club has ever produced. It was certainly the most entertaining - 42 games that season in league and cup produced 222 applies!

Grinstead were third in 1955, but their fortunes began to decline along with crowd numbers after that. They left West Street in 1959 and had a spell at King Georges Field in the town centre.

1960s Following the spell at King Georges Field in the town centre it wasn't until 1967 that they finally moved to their current home at East Court after a protracted battle to get the ground, which was prone to waterlogging, fit for football.

1970s The club again finished third in 1973 but that was as good as it got for another 30 years although Grinstead did reach their first cup final since 1952 when they lost 4-1 to Haywards Heath in the RUR Cup in 1974 despite taking the lead.

Wasps found themselves in Division Two for the first time in 1979.

1980s During the 1980s the club regularly hosted Crystal Palace and Brighton in charity fixtures watched by crowds of over 2,000 spectators. However during this time the Wasps had dropped even lower with two seasons in Division Three before regaining senior status.

1990s They were promoted back to Division One in 1993, but lasted just two years Floodlights were installed in 1997.

2000s Bob Smith led Wasps back to Division One in 2003 and they also won their first trophy for 52 years, beating Three Bridges 4-0 in the final of the RUR Cup.

Unfortunately, the club were relegated back





to Division Two on the final day of the 2004-05 season and in October 2006 Smith, the longest-serving manager in the club's history, was replaced by former player Steve Norris.

In his second season Wasps romped to the Second Division title by a massive 18 points, losing just twice all season. Their winning run of 14 successive league games at the start of the season meant they became the last senior non-league team in the country to drop points.

Since then the club has established itself in the top flight, most recently under former Brighton striker Simon Funnell and their progress on the field has been matched off it.

A new drainage system laid in 2003 transforming the playing surface, which is now one of the best in Sussex.

The club were awarded the prestigious FA Standard Chartered Development Club award in 2003 and were registered as a Community Amateur Sports Club in 2005.

In 2008 two new stands and a pitch perimeter barrier were erected.

2010s in 2014 with the GAC Stadium already meeting the requirements of the Isthmian Football League after installing additional seating, the club began work on a new dressing room and hospitality complex,

a new turnstile block and entrance and a resurfaced car park. Part of the 2014 funding included a £50,000 grant from FA Cup sponsors Budweiser, £100,000 from the Football Stadia Improvement Fund, £40,000 from Mid Sussex District Council and £35,000 from SITA Trust.

Funnell's side finished the season in second place, their highest ever County League position, and in May 2014, the club were accepted into the Isthmian League for the first time in our history.

Funnell left the club during our first season at Step 4 and Tony Beckingham returned to East Court for a second spell. 'Becks' kept the club in the League but he resigned in October 2015 and Matt Longhurst took over. Matt made sure Wasps retained their Isthmian status in his first season and in his two following seasons (bar a mini-break on the South Coast for a couple of weeks)

2018 also saw the Football Association annoucement of a revamping of the Non-League pyramid. From 2018/19 the two division step 4 Isthmian League Division One North and One South (which the Wasps competed in) was replaced by 3 divisions (North, South-Central and South-East). 2022-23 saw the The Wasps kicking-off their ninth season at this level.

THERE'S NOT much that grinds my gears like the debate around the FA Cup, the magic or lack thereof.

In early January, the usual debate will be trotted out about the FA Cup and how seriously Premier League clubs take it and question whether the competition has lost its lustre.

Maybe it has, maybe it hasn't when the elite clubs join. I still like it, will always watch the final and generally buy into the idea it is a pretty special cup competition.

Perhaps that comes from many years scribbling away for The NLP and having the chance to tell so many stories.

From Lincoln City's remarkable run to the quarter-finals, to speaking to firsttimers just happy to have their name in the hat at the extra preliminary round stage.

For me, it is these early rounds where the true heart of the competition really is. Where, for some clubs, just getting through a few rounds and getting, for example, a draw with a Step 2 club is reason to celebrate. Or where reaching the first round is the dream.

I spoke to former Bowers & Pitsea manager Rob Small recently. His side reached the first round proper last term after dumping out National League Aldershot Town in the fourth round qualifying.

They were draw at Lincoln and, for them, it really was the pinnacle, a day they won't ever forget.

Last Friday night I popped along

to Thetford Town and Soham Town Rangers.

Bodies desperately thrown in front of shots at goal, last ditch tackles, fullblooded challenges and a stoppagetime equaliser lashed into the top corner sparking wild celebrations.

Just 83 days after Liverpool lifted the trophy, the world's oldest competition kicked off again.

The sums of money are tiny in comparison, but still a vital £1,125 is up for grabs for the 208 winners in the extra preliminary. Indeed, even the losers at this stage take £375 – all vital pounds for Non-League clubs at the level.

Perhaps there's something to be said for Friday night football, with a healthy crowd in attendance. Fans pour through the turnstile block just before kick-off to pay their £7 - £4 for concessions – and £1 for a programme. Outside the Brecklanders' bar, the air hummed with that early season chatter of optimism and familiar faces catching up.

The game was great. Three goals in four first-half minutes before a netbusting stoppage-time equaliser from Soham's Luke Brown to set-up a replay. You could see what it meant. And we will see similar tales over the coming weeks and the competitions bounces from one round to the next.

Maybe those who think the magic has gone aren't looking in the right place...

LANCERS 2-3 BECKENHAM | ISTHMIAN LEAGUE SOUTH EAST | 13/8/22

Lancing needed a good start to bolster team confidence but they faced a scare as early as the first minute. Possession was given away on the half way line, allowing striker Louie Theophanous to launch an attack, but Conor Manderson was quickly off his line to block a goal attempt.

Lancing shrugged this off and their first shot on target came minutes later from Reece Hallard, cutting in from the left with a strike which was not powerful enough to trouble keeper Nick Blue.

The visitor's diminutive right winger Freddie Nyhus was showing pace and attacking flair but found himself receiving a caution after 13 minutes when the fast moving Ashley Mutongerwa beat him in a race for the ball, with Nyhus being guilty of a late and risky challenge.

Finn Daniels-Yeoman was quick into the tackle, as is his wont, and sent Reece Hallard clear down the left. He reached the byeline and was just able to get in a fine cross before the ball ran out of play. The ball dropped just below the cross bar and keeper Blue failed to hold on to it. The ball dropped close to the goal line and Tyrone Madhani reacted quickly to force it across the line on 17 minutes.

Play was end to end. Jake LeGrange did well to clear a dangerous ball into the box and Marcus Allen made the first of a number of excellent headed clearances. Lancing were also getting forward with intent. Louis Veneti used his strength to win a tussle for the ball on the half way line, switching it to Reece Hallard who played on to Tommy Boyle, whose run on goal produced a corner.

Lancing's lead was cancelled out on 30 minutes. Beckenham's central striker was close to getting into scoring positions, only to find himself being flagged offside but, on 30 minutes he timed his advance well, getting on the end of a ball in from the left, which found its way past the Lancing defence, and which he was able to put way unchallenged.

A couple of minutes later, there was a rare sight of Finn Daniels-Yeoman being dispossessed on the half way line, as a ball was played out to him from the back. A pass was threaded through for Theophanous which would have put him in on goal but for the pass being over hit.

Another error from keeper Blue proved costly. A poor clearance was seized upon by Darius Goldsmith who sent it forward to Tyrone Madhani, who unleashed an unstoppable drive which was in the back of the net in the blink of an eye. Lancing were back in front with less than 10 minutes to go before half time.

Beckenham's tricky right winger was proving to be a real threat but Mo Zabadne was matching him every inch of the way. Mo needed to be at his most alert.

Beckenham were forced into making their first substitution on 42 minutes with Luke Hedges coming on for George Goodwin. They were putting the Lancing defence to the test in the latter stages of the half but some well timed tackles by Ashley Mutongerwa, a powerful headed clearance by Marcus Allen, from a free kick and two saving blocks from Mo Zabadne to halt the dangerous Nyhus enabled Lancing to reach the break with their lead intact.

No changes were made by either side for the second half. A goal kick by Blue forced Jake LeGrange into conceding a corner, with 5 minutes gone, from which Beckenham came close to restoring parity with a header just wide of the upright. Ashley Mutongerwa and Marcus Allen had quickly developed a good understanding and were looking calm and composed under pressure. A second yellow card was handed out to a Beckenham player, Jamie Humphris, who was forced into pulling Finn Daniels-Yeoman back by the shirt to halt a





powerful run into the opposition half. From the free kick the ball ran to Marcus Allen, whose first time effort fizzed just wide of the upright.

At the other end Conor Manderson came to his side's rescue as the ball ran loose after a break down the visitor's right flank. Beckenham made a double substitution 13 minutes into the second half with the exceptionally tall Alfie Bloomfield coming on for Humphris and Ishmael Erskine replacing Nick Curran.

Reece Hallard continued to be a threat on the left for Lancing and hit another excellent cross which reached Tyrone Madhani but he was unable to keep his effort down.

Mo Zabadne was penalised for a foul deep on Lancing's left and this almost proved costly as the well struck free kick curled just wide of the angle between upright and cross bar. Lancing were pressing high against the visitor's defence and they were getting some success in winning the ball. Tyrone Madhani did just that and set Tommy Boyle in on goal but Tommy's control let him down resulting in a tame effort which rolled wide of the far post.

The dangerous Theophanous came close to bringing the sides level with a fierce drive which Conor Manderson did well to palm against the cross bar, with the ball then being cleared for a corner. When the ball was played in to the box, Alfie Bloomfield used his height advantage to good effect, winning the ball and nodding on to skipper Danny Waldron who volleyed it home from 10 yards. Just under 20 minutes to go and the sides were level again .

Lancing tried to regain the lead with Tommy Boyle working hard to win the ball and get in behind. This almost paid off when Ashley Mutongerwa picked him out as he ran in behind. He was able to get a strike on goal with the outside of his boot but keeper Blue was well positioned to hold on to it. With 10 minutes of normal time to go Tommy succeeded in getting in behind again but this time he rolled the ball across the six yard box where it was met by Tyrone Madhani. He hammered the ball goalwards, but a defender was positioned on the goal line and he managed to prevent the goal from going between his legs and over the line.

Against the run of play, Beckenham were gifted a goal which was to prove the winner, with 5 minutes of normal time remaining. Conor Maderson rushed from his goal line to try and reach a ball bouncing high at the edge of the box. It looked to be just outside the area and Conor attempted to head clear. He was unable to make a good contact and the ball fell invitingly to Alfie Bloomfield, who calmly lobbed the ball into the empty net.

THE UNTOLD GAME

THE BIRTH OF BRAZIL

When we look at the history of football, one nation stands out above every other. Brazil have won the World Cup five times, a record, and have produced not just some of the best players of all time, but arguably the greatest of them all.

But they are more than just a successful side; they have defined the sport in the imaginations of generations of children across the globe. O Jogo Bonito – the beautiful game – the phrase that most emphatically defines football, was popularised by Pelé himself. When people think of the way the game should be played, they think of Brazil. So it may be surprising to learn that this journey began, just over one hundred years ago, in Devon. And it wasn't supposed to happen at all.

In the summer of 1914, following the example of several more successful European sides, Exeter City accepted the invitation of a nascent Argentinian FA to tour the country. These tours were lucrative for all involved, and despite being in the Southern League at the time, Exeter were chosen as a "truly representative" example of English football.

Fifteen players set off for Argentina, but almost didn't make it at all. Their ship stopped off in Santos, where the entire squad was arrested, having not realised that public swimming was illegal. Fortunately for the history of football, they were released and went on their way to a successful tour of Argentina. Despite not having initially been invited to Brazil, their popularity prompted a few games to



be organised as the Grecians stopped off on their way home, the first time an English professional team had played in the country.

The first game was against a group of English expats, a simple 3-0 win for the Southern League side, and the second was a more competitive 5-3 victory against a side representing the clubs of Rio de Janeiro. For the third, Rio and Sao Paulo joined forces, something of a surprise given the rivalry between the two cities, to present a side made up of their best players. This side is now recognised as the very first Brazilian national team. The Estádio das Laranjeiras – Fluminense's home to this day – was chosen for the auspicious occasion.

The footballing authorities saw the game as a good test before an upcoming international tournament in Argentina, but it was more than practice to the fans. 10,000 packed into the 6,000-capacity stadium – and onto it, with no room even on the roof – to see their side in brilliant white shirts with a blue stripe on the arm; Brazil wouldn't adopt their famous yellow



shirts until after their defeat in the 1950 World Cup final.

When Oswaldo Gomes opened the scoring for the hosts, the thousands went wild, "waving hats and walking sticks, and in the stands ladies and young girls waved handkerchiefs, shouting hurrahs" according to local newspapers.

Exeter responded, displaying all the cynicism that would hamstring English football for nearly half a century, by making the game for physical, reportedly causing facial injuries to star Brazilian striker Arthur Friedenreich, pictured opposite, costing him two teeth. His suffering, however exaggerated, has become a touchstone for Brazilian football. standing up against the imperial injustices of the Europeans. He responded by finding Osman for Brazil's second, after which (according to the Brazilian story), Exeter descended into violence, but to no avail.

The final whistle saw the players carried off on the shoulders of the crowd and praised for the "mastery" of their style

in undoing the English professionals. They were proclaimed national heroes.

And in most nations, that would be that. A victorious introduction to international football, part of a sporting history but not a part of the national ideology.

But Brazil was different. It had only been truly independent for 25 years in 1914, and because of its size it was unwieldy and difficult to unite. Travel was a challenge, with the most reliable method of going from north to south still being by steamer along the coast, and the different regions acting, in some ways, as autonomous states.

Brazil was desperate for an outlet, an identity on which they could pin their nationhood. And in these national heroes, they found just that. Which is why in Brazil, more than any other nation, football reigns.

Enjoy the game.
