














CULVER CHATTER



 ood afternoon evervone and welcome to Culver Road for this Isthmian League match against our near neighbours Whitehawk. Last season saw us win 2-1 away after an excellent display at the Enclosed Ground and then draw 1-1 at Culver Road following a late Whitehawk equaliser from the penalty spot after what is best described as a controversial decision to award the spot kick. There have been a lot of changes at Whitehawk since then and they have started the season very brightly, lying in second place at the time of writing after three wins and a draw from their opening four league games.

This Culver Chatter is being written before the game on Saturday away at Ramsgate, but you can read all about that match on our website. Our last match at home was in the FA Trophy when we went down 4-1 to Cray Valley PM. The game was pretty even until the turning point mid-way through the first half when Isiah Corrie was shown a straight red by

Those closer than me to the incident tell me that Isiah was unlucky to be on the wrong end of that decision. It took Cray Valley until just before half time to open the scoring. Two more goals followed just after half time although the Lancers could count themselves unlucky as both were deflected efforts. Marcel Powell hit the goal of the game in the 83rd minute to give us brief hope before Cray Valley added a fourth near the end. It was already a very difficult task to get a result

against one of the best teams in our division. but the red card made it almost impossible. We will have easier games during the course of the season and I fully expect to see Cray Valley near the top of the division in May. You can read Dave Wilmott's report later in this programme.

The Cray Valley game began, of course, with an impeccably observed minutes silence following the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. The last few days have been difficult for football and the country as a whole and I am sure the renditions of 'God Save the Kina' at England's matches over the coming days will be particularly poignant.

The decision to postpone the games the previous Saturday must have been a very difficult one for the FA – a case of damned if you do, damned if you don't - but it does seem a shame that football supporters were denied that moment of collective remembrance that most other sports were able to experience on the Saturday.
















FANTASY FOOTBALL

LANCING FC FANTASY PREMIER LEAGUE IS HOTTING UP!

The death of Her Maiesty Queen Eliabeth II resulted in a number of postponements in the Premier League so it is probably worth clarifying what happens when a game is postponed.

If a Premier League match is postponed and moved out of the Gameweek, any players who are affected will not score FPL points. They will be replaced in the starting XI by a manager's players off the bench, provided of course the replacements' matches go ahead. These swaps will be prioritised according to the order that the manager has selected for their substitutes on the bench.


Should your FPL team captain fail to feature, the armband will be moved to the vice-captain, who records double points instead. But if the vice-captain is also affected by postponements, managers will earn zero extra points from their armband

If a postponed match is rescheduled for the same Gameweek, any points scored by players in that match will remain in that Gameweek. However, if the match is rescheduled for another Gameweek. players will score points in that period, and not the initial one.

Free Hit

For FPL managers whose teams have a number of players not in action, they can address this by using the Free Hit chip. This chip allows managers to make unlimited free transfers for a single Gameweek. But, at the next deadline their squad is returned to how it was at the start of the Gameweek

Matches moved to another Gameweek often result in Double Gameweeks for some managers, where players are in action twice in the same Gameweek. This offers FPL managers a great opportunity to capitalise on such players, bringing



them in and using chips such as Triple Captain (where the captain's points are tripled) and Bench Boost (where the points scored by your bench players are included in your total) to secure big points hauls.

This international break gives us time to think about our teams and possibly play that first wildcard. Remember the wildcard gives you unlimited transfers.

You get one before the World Cup, one during it and one for the second half of the season. With Arsenal, Brighton. Liverpool and Man City all entering a period of difficult fixtures it may be time to reduce the number of players from those teams and perhaps look towards those teams with more favourable fixtures such as Fulham, Nottingham Forest and Crystal Palace.

It is well worth checking out the upcoming fixtures for teams in the Fixture Difficult Rating (FDR) to give you a better idea of who has potentially favourable matches.

OPPOSITION

WHITEHAWK FC



The club was founded as the Second World War ended in 1945 as Whitehawk & Manor Farm Old Boys FC. The original name refers to the local bovs' club, whose members wanted to carry on playing football together but were too old to play in the boys' club league. Ron Powell, Stan Butcher, Ray Anderson and the Boys' Club committee held the meeting to found the club at Whitehawk Senior Boys' School in the summer of 1945

The side subsequently played in various leagues, including Brighton, Hove & District Football League between 1946-1952. Sussex County League from 1952-1979 (during which time the club's name was changed to Whitehawk FC in 1958), and the Sussex County League between 1980-2010, before promotion to the Isthmian League in 2010.

In their first season at the new level Whitehawk were in the title race but eventually had to settle for third place and the end-of-season play-offs against Leatherhead. The game at The Enclosed Ground ended 1–1 but the visitors won 4-3 on penalties. The Hawks completed a league and cup double the following season 2011–12, finishing as Isthmian League Division One South champions as well as lifting the Sussex Senior Cup after beating Crawley Down 2-1 at the Amex. Sam Gargan scored a late winner. They followed this up later by winnina the 2012 Sussex Community Shield in August, with a 4-1 win against Three Bridges. The club had planned to play the 2012-13 season at the Withdean Stadium in order to redevelop The Enclosed Ground but this was blocked by the Isthmian League, who were concerned that the club would not return to East Brighton.

The club achieved back to back promotions in the 2012–13 season, again under Darren Freeman, by winning the Isthmian League Premier Division at the first attempt to earn a place in the Conference South.

For the 2013-14 season, the club intended to change its name to Brighton City FC but the FA Council ruled against the proposal. The Hawks struggled in their first season in Conference South. After achieving three promotions in four years, Darren Freeman was sacked in January 2014 and replaced by former Lewes boss Steve Kina. Kina ensured the Hawks retained their place in Conference South.

The club enjoyed their most successful season ever in 2014–15, finishing fourth in Conference South and earning a place in the play-offs, losing in the final against Boreham Wood. Whitehawk completed the season with a 5-0 victory over Lewes at the Amex Stadium to lift the Sussex Senior Cup in front of a crowd of 2.585.

After a good start to the 2015–16 season, the Hawks reached the first-round proper of the FA Cup for the first time and beat National League Lincoln City 5-3 in front of a crowd of 1,342. In the second round the Hawks drew 1-1 at League Two Dagenham & Redbridge, and lost the replay 3-2.

The FA Cup run badly impacted on league form and in February 2016, Steve King was sacked. King's assistant, Argentine Pablo Asensio, took over as Caretaker Manager and was appointed in May 2016 as permanent manager. After a poor start to the 2016-17 season, with only one win in eight games, The Hawks replaced Asensio with former Eastleigh manager Richard Hill.

After ten league games in charge, five won and five lost, Hill left to join Aston Villa as a scout with Director of Football Alan Payne and player/assistant manager Ben Strevens taking temporary charge of the first team. Defender Paul Reid then stepped up to assist Alan Payne as joint player-manager after Strevens returned to Eastleigh after only three games. Payne and Reid were appointed joint managers until the end of the season on 22 December but with the Hawks in the bottom three at the end of January, the club advertised for a new permanent manager and on the 1 February appointed former Crystal Palace apalkeeping coach Andy Woodman. In his first managerial post. Woodman oversaw the club's survival in National League South before leaving at the end of the season and being replaced by Assistant Manager Jimmy Dack.

With the club at the bottom of the league after picking up only one point from the first seven games of the 2017-18 season, Dack resigned, with player-coach Dan Harding taking temporary charge, prior to the re-appointment

of former boss Steve King. Relegation for only the third time in the club's history was confirmed with a 4-3 defeat at Braintree Town on 17 April.

King departed at the end of the season to be replaced by Hawks successful U18 manager Jude Macdonald. The Hawks suffered backto-back relegations, dropping into the Isthmian South East Division for the 2019-20 season and after a poor start to the 2020-

21 season, former goalkeeper Ross Standen was appointed manager, with Stuart Tuck as his assistant. In January 2022, Billie Clark was signed by Brighton & Hove Albion after 11 first team appearances.

Shaun Saunders took over as manager shortly before the end of the 2021-22 season, with the team in its lowest league position since promotion from the county league in 2010.

off the bench. He was an unused sub for Barnslev in a League 1 game at Scunthorpe United in 2016. Charlie then made 35 appearances for Eastbourne Borough in 17-18 before joining Horsham.

ROB O'TOOLE (BELOW) 'Chief' signed for the Hawks for the 22-23 season, having been at Horsham since 2017



He immediately took over the captain's armband. Rob won league titles at all his previous clubs. He played also alongside Hawks former star Lucas Rodrigues at both Horsham and Burgess Hill.

CHARLIE LAMBERT (BELOW)

Charlie re-signed for the Hawks in July 2022 after 8 appearances in an earlier spell on dual registration from Eastbourne Borough in October 2021. His first goal for the Hawks was at Corinthian. Charlie was an unused sub against the Hawks whilst at Three Bridges in 2022. Charlie, who was a right back earlier in his career, played in the Peacehaven side that knocked the Hawks out of the Sussex Senior Cup 3-1 at the **Enclosed Ground in December** 2019. His performance in that competition in the semi-final against Eastbourne Borough earned him a move to the Sports.

So the players stripped off to pose for photos with a bia launch at the club next month set to be attended by the OddBalls Foundation to provide an education talk for youth team and first team players, plus a pop-up testing centre.

ON REPORT ...

LANCERS 1-4 CRAY VALLEY PM | ISUZU FA TROPHY 1Q | 13/9/22

After Saturday's postponement, following the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, Lancing were able to welcome Cray Valley players, management, coaches, committee and supporters for this FA Trophy match.

Cray Valley have made a sound start to the league season with two wins, one draw and one defeat but it was their 3-0 FA Cup defeat of Hastings which sent warning signals to Lancing telling them to expect a difficult game. That proved to be very much the case.

But it was the dismissal of Isaiah Corrie around the half hour mark, which was to have a crucial effect on the outcome. Until then, Lancing were managing to contain a very impressive Millers attack, despite being under pressure once the visitors had settled.

Lancing looked bright and full of confidence early on with Marcel Powell and Louis Veneti getting in the faces of the Millers defence. The opening salvo was delivered by Isaiah Corrie whose strike was just wide of the upright.

The Millers were exploiting the pace of Jamaican born Denzil Gavle wide on the right. He was running at Mo Zabadne at every opportunity. Mo is no slouch but he was finding it hard going to keep him under control. The closest The Millers came to scoring was a diving header from a free kick conceded by Mo Zabadne just outside the box.

Shortly afterwards, the incident occurred which led to Isaiah Corrie being given a red card. This came after a scintillating piece of skill by Isaiah, slaloming his way through three defenders but the ball, which hitherto seemed to have been alued to his boot, ran away from him. In his enthusiasm to reach it he slid towards his opponent bringing him down. No serious injury seemed to have been inflicted and, at one point, it looked as if referee Jordan McCritchie was going to be content to issue a yellow card caution but it was a red shown to Isaiah.

As if Lancing's task was not challenging enough, this would inevitably compound their difficulties. From climbing up Devil's Dyke, Lancing now faced attempting Mount Everest.

Hassan Ibrahiym drove a powerful effort from distance which Alieu held superbly. Marcus Allen was in the wars again suffering a nasty head injury but, once again, he shrugged off the pain and got on with the game after treatment.

The pressure on the Lancing goal was mounting. Alieu brought off a stunning save at full stretch to divert the ball heading for the top corner over the cross bar. As half time approached, it was backs to the wall for Lancing. Alieu Secka came to the rescue racing from his line to clear a penetrating through ball, followed by a good low save from a free kick and then another race from his line to dive at the feet of an onrushing attacker. As it so happened, the offside flag had been raised but Alieu would not have been aware of this. Just when it looked as if Lancina could reach half time with the sides all square, Sonny Black pulled away from his marker to head home from inside the six-yard box.

Lancing attempted to hit back immediately with Darius Goldsmith heading towards the visitors' box only to be tugged back. He had managed to free himself and continue his run but, instead of allowing advantage, the referee halted play to award a free kick. You would be mistaken for thinking that this would result in a yellow card for the offender. Guess what !!! Tom Butler was able to reach a high ball to the far post from the free kick and direct his header back across the face of the goal but no Lancing player could get near it.

Immediately afterwards, Jake Le Grange earned himself a caution for what looked a strong but legitimate tackle. The half ended with Mo Zabadne getting his body in the way to deny a goal bound effort from Gayle.

Any chance of Lancing salvaging a comeback in the second half looked beyond them when, a few minutes into the half. Alieu Secka was completely deceived by a shot from Adam Coombes which took a wicked deflection into the corner. They say lightening does not strike twice but The Millers took a 3-nil lead with the half less than 10m minutes old, from what appeared to be another slight deflection which caused the ball to loop up and over Alieu, who was rooted to the spot.

Ben Bayoko came on for the hard-working Louis Veneti and his fresh legs helped to get Lancing forward on the right with Sean Stephenson and Jake LeGrange combining well in support. Jake made way for debutant James Hatch and he helped Lancina to enjoy a decent spell of attacking play on the right. Despite the overwhelming odds against them Lancing



continued to show fighting spirit, spurred on by the tireless Finn Daniels-Yeoman and Darius Goldsmith. Marcel Powell continued to take up good positions on the left. Marcus Allen came close with a header from a free kick and Ben Bayoko also got on the end of another free kick but could only plant his header straight into the arms of keeper Chris Lewington.

Lancing had to be admired for finishing the game strongly and had their reward after Finn Daniels-Yeoman had won a corner on the right. The ball found its way to Marcel Powell who hit a superb drive into the top corner from the edge of the box. Some respectability restored by what would only be a consolation goal but a real confidence booster for Marcel.

Unfortunately. The Millers had the last word with what can only be described as a rather soft agal to complete a 4-1 score line. Not even the most diehard and biased Lancing supporter could deny the fact that Cray Valley fully earned their win.



THE UNTOLD GAME


JULES RIMET & PARISIAN FOOTBALL ORIGINS

Paris has become one of the most productive factories of football talent in the world in recent years, with world class players seemingly coming out of the city like there is no tomorrow.

And when we think of football clubs in Paris, one name springs to mind. But Paris Saint-Germain, founded by the merger of Paris FC and Stade Saint-Germain, only came into being in 1970. Paris FC have since split from the project, but themselves were only founded a year earlier in 1969, while Stade Saint-Germain have a much longer history, going back to 1904. But if we want to find the origins of football in Paris, we have to go back even further than that, and to a man whose name echoes as loudly as anyone's through footballing history.

In 1897. Ernest Webber sat in a Paris café with a friend, discussina the lack of a welcoming sports club that they could join. The friend proposed that they start their own, which would open its doors to anybody of any background, and any income. His name, as it happened, was Jules Rimet. above right, and his club, named after the ferry company chosen by his childhood governess, was Red Star FC.

Always taking the English variant of the name (no L'Etoile Rouge here, though it has become a nickname). the club initially started life playing in the Champs de Mars, a beautifully picturesque space right next to the Eiffel Tower, in the third division of a nascent national French championship.



They soon moved to Meudon, in the southwest of the city, and just as rapidly, moved up the leagues. By 1904, under the presidency of Rimet, they were in the top flight.

In 1907, the club moved to Saint-Ouen in the north of the city, to the brand new Stade de Paris, which is still its home (though it is now called the Stade Bauer). The forerunner to the French FA, the USFSA, was in disarray, so the club joined a new organisation, and a new league, which they won in 1912, but by 1919 the French Football Federation had been established, and with it some efficiency and, auspiciously for Red Star, a new national cup competition. They became founder members of Lique 1.

In 1921, Red Star began providing increasing numbers of players to the national team, most notably

goalkeeper Pierre Chayrique, right (who had been approached by Tottenham as early as 1913) and star striker Paul Nicolas, and this core of internationals saw them to the first of three consecutive Coupe de France victories, against city rivals Olympique de Paris, who would later merge with the Saint-Ouen based club. The following season saw them defeat Rennes 2-0, before a 4-2 victory in 1923 against CA Paris (who, incidentally, were one of the clubs that rejected Rimet) and secure three-in-a-row. and meant that Red Star had won three of the first five iterations of the competition (or six, if a wartime dummy run is included from 1918). The would beat CA Paris again in 1928 for their fourth.

1930 saw the beginning of what would become a long-lasting decline for the club. The Federation voted for a professionalisation of the league, and despite their success in the 1920s and their early adoption of the motion. Red Star would finish in the bottom three in the first professional season of French football. Ironically, this just meant a little more history for the club, as relegation made them founder memvers of Lique 2, just as they had been founder members of Lique 1. They won the division at the first attempt and returned to the top flight, but the appointment of player-manager,





legend of the future Guillermo Stabile was not enough to re-establish them at the top of French football. In 1939, as war was breaking out, he left to manage the Argentine national side.

A wartime Coupe de France in 1942. with another legendary Argentinian manager, Helenio Herrera, as a player, was the last honour Red Star secured. and their decline in the post-war period was stark. In 1950 they dropped as far as the third division, and despite a handful of individual seasons back at the top table, they have spent the rest of their history bouncing between the second and third divisions.

Despite the rise and fall, however. Red Star have retained Jules Rimet's initial belief in remaining an open and inclusive club for all in Paris. While their billionaire-backed neighbours break world records to bring the global footballing elite to the Parc des Princes. Red Star run community outreach programmes in textiles, literature, music, and of course football. Who knows, if Paris keeps producing talent like it has been, this outreach might just drive them back to the top.
