

HISTORY



aernarfon Town Football Club, affectionately known as The Canaries, are one of the most iconic and passionately supported sides in Welsh football. Based at The Oval, just a short distance from the town's historic castle, the club's story is steeped in community pride, resilience, and a deep-rooted love of the game that stretches back well over a century.

Football in Caernarfon dates back to the late 19th century, with the original Caernarfon FC formed in 1876, making it one of the earliest clubs in Wales. The current club was established in 1937, carrying forward that proud local tradition after a series of earlier teams came and went. From its early years, Caernarfon Town became known for its loyal fan base and its ability to produce spirited, competitive sides despite limited resources.

The club joined the Welsh League (North) in the post-war years, gradually building its reputation as a force in North Wales football. Success in regional competitions led to a significant milestone in 1979, when Caernarfon Town were elected to the Northern Premier League, allowing them to compete in the English pyramid system. This ambitious move reflected the club's growing stature and willingness to challenge itself beyond Welsh competition.

The 1980s brought some of the most memorable moments in the club's history. Under the management of John King, The Canaries enjoyed a superb run in the 1986–87 FA Cup, famously reaching the Third Round Proper — the furthest a North Wales club has ever gone in the competition. After defeating Stockport County and York City, they faced Barnsley at The Oval in front of a packed crowd, earning a 1–1 draw before bowing out 3–1 in the replay at Oakwell. That cup adventure remains one of the defining chapters in the club's story.

By the early 1990s, Caernarfon had returned to the Welsh system, joining the newly established League of Wales in its inaugural 1992–93 season. Despite fluctuating fortunes, the club remained one of the best-supported teams in the country, known for the colour and noise their fans bring wherever they go.

After a spell in the lower leagues during the 2000s, Caernarfon Town began a remarkable resurgence under manager Iwan Williams in the mid-2010s. The club won promotion from the Welsh Alliance League in 2013, followed by the Huws Gray Cymru Alliance title in 2018, returning to the Cymru Premier for the 2018–19 season. Their homecoming to the top flight was met with huge local support, restoring The Oval's reputation as one of the most atmospheric grounds in Welsh football.

Since their return, The Canaries have consistently held their own in the Cymru Premier, securing top-six finishes and regular appearances in European play-off positions. In 2022–23, the club made further history by qualifying for the European play-offs and, in 2023–24, reaching the Welsh Cup final for the first time in nearly four decades — a testament to the club's growth and ambition.

Off the pitch, Caernarfon Town remain proudly community-focused. Their Canaries in the Community programme has become a model for engagement, providing opportunities for local youngsters and promoting football participation across the region. The club's connection with its supporters — the famed "Cofi Army" — is one of the strongest in Welsh football, giving The Oval a unique atmosphere on matchdays that visiting teams rarely forget.

From humble beginnings on local pitches to memorable FA Cup runs, league titles, and a return to the Cymru Premier elite, Caernarfon Town's journey is one of perseverance, pride, and passion. Rooted in its community but unafraid of ambition, The Canaries continue to fly high — proudly carrying the name of Caernarfon across Wales and beyond.

ONES TO WATCH CAERNARFON TOWN



ADAM DAVIES

ATTACKER | 29 YEARS OLD | #9

Adan Davies has been in strong form this season, offering a consistent goal threat from midfield. With 10 goals and 5 assists in league play so far, he's proven himself to be one of the Cofis' most reliable outlets in the final third.

Earlier in the campaign, he grabbed the headlines with a well-taken hat-trick against Llanelli—a reminder of just how dangerous he can be when given time and space. But beyond the numbers, Davies brings drive and composure in key areas of the pitch. He times his runs well, strikes a clean ball, and links up smartly with those around him.

At 29, he's playing with confidence and clarity, contributing regularly and doing the simple things well—traits any side would value.

Keep an eye on Adan Davies this afternoon—busy, effective, and always a threat when Caernarfon go forward.



SION BRADLEY

ATTACKER | 27 YEARS OLD | #19

Back on loan from TNS, Sion Bradley returns to familiar surroundings—and his impact has been immediate. A fan favourite in his first spell with the Cofis, he brings directness, pace, and real quality in the final third.

Bradley's ability to beat a man and deliver from wide areas makes him a constant threat. He's sharp in one-vone situations, times his runs well, and has the eye for a final pass that opens up defences. With the ball at his feet, there's always a sense something might happen—and his return has brought fresh energy to Caernarfon's attack.

Familiar with the club, the fans, and the system, Bradley is already showing signs of hitting top form again. Expect him to play a big role in the Cofis' push this season.

Watch out for Sion Bradley this afternoon—back in yellow and green, and looking hungry.





GOALKEEPER | 32 YEARS OLD | #1

One of the most iconic keepers in the Welsh leagues, Conor Roberts remains a vital part of Caernarfon's spine. With over a decade of top-flight experience—including spells with Bangor City, and The New Saints—he brings calm, leadership, and big-game pedigree between the posts.

Roberts is an outstanding shot-stopper with sharp reflexes and a commanding presence in the box. He organises his defence well, stays vocal throughout, and comes up with crucial saves when the pressure is on. Whether it's diving low to his left or tipping over the bar at full stretch, he has a knack for producing the goods when it matters most.

Trusted by teammates and admired by fans across the league, Roberts gives Caernarfon confidence from the back.

Watch out for Conor Roberts this afternoon—an experienced keeper who always steps up on the big occasions.



RYAN SEARS

DEFENDER | 26 YEARS OLD | #27

Ryan Sears is one of the more experienced heads in this
Caernarfon squad, bringing a solid Football League background
and plenty of defensive know-how to the back line. Previously with
Shrewsbury Town and Grimsby, Sears arrived at The Oval with a
reputation for being reliable, aggressive, and difficult to beat in
one-v-one situations.

Playing primarily at right-back, he's strong in the challenge, good in recovery, and sharp when stepping out to press. He doesn't try to overplay—his game is about being disciplined, winning battles, and keeping things tight. But he's no stranger to getting forward either, offering support down the flank when the chance is on.

At 26, he brings both maturity and bite to the side—experienced, battle-tested, and fully committed to the cause.

Watch out for Ryan Sears this afternoon—hard-working, nononsense, and part of a back line that doesn't give much away.

LAST TIME OUT

Colwyn Bay 3 - 1 Llanelli Town JD Cymru Premier Matchday 16

Llanelli Town left North Wales empty-handed after a battling performance against Colwyn Bay, falling to a 3–1 defeat despite taking an early lead.

The hosts started strongly and put Llanelli under pressure from the opening minutes, forcing Alex Pennock into several early saves. Colwyn Bay created a number of half-chances, but Pennock dealt well with the attempts that came his way, including a couple of headers straight at him. Llanelli had to weather a period where Bay dominated the ball, but they continued to break forward with purpose.

A sharp turnover in midfield from Joe Hopkins allowed Tristan Jenkins to slide a pass into Ethan Cann, whose deflected strike was saved low by the goalkeeper. That spell of play lifted Llanelli, and soon after they took the lead. On 31 minutes, Tristan Jenkins picked up possession outside the box and struck a composed low finish into the bottom corner, giving the Reds a 1–0 advantage and rewarding their determination.

Colwyn Bay responded swiftly. Jordan Davies brought the game back level with a well-taken finish, and shortly before half time the hosts edged ahead when Louis





Robles converted from close range to make it 2–1. The home crowd – 792 strong and in full voice – erupted as the match swung in their favour.

The second half was competitive, with both sides pushing for the next goal. Llanelli worked hard defensively and continued to press when opportunities arose, but the key moment came when a long free-kick was delivered into the Llanelli half. Pennock stepped out to punch it clear, but the ball fell straight to a Colwyn Bay player, who hit a looping half-volley that bounced into the net to extend the lead to 3–1.

Llanelli pushed late on, forcing Colwyn Bay back and creating pressure from corners, but they couldn't find the goal needed to set up a tense finish. Bay also had further opportunities, including a late header over the bar, but the score remained unchanged.

Despite the defeat, the Reds showed good moments, competed well, and stayed in the game until the final stages — but Colwyn Bay's clinical finishing and the intensity of the home atmosphere proved decisive.

On Monday 3rd November, Llanelli Town AFC welcomed a packed room to the New Thomas Arms Hotel for the official presentation of the club's 2025–2030 Five-Year Strategy, delivered in partnership with the Football Association of Wales. The event formed part of a wider FAW initiative requiring all 12 clubs — including Aberystwyth Town and Newtown, recently relegated from the top flight — to host their own public presentation outlining long-term sustainability plans, future objectives and community-focused ambitions.

The purpose of this national programme is to ensure clubs across Wales are planning responsibly for their future: strengthening pathways, improving infrastructure, building deeper community ties and operating sustainably both on and off the pitch. By setting out clear, measurable and forward-thinking objectives, clubs are better equipped to grow in a stable and progressive manner.

Llanelli Town's event, held in front of FAW CEO Noel Mooney, FAW representatives Jack Sharp and Joseph Donkor, members of Llanelli Town Council, the Mayor of Llanelli Andrew Bragoli, Council Leader David Darkin, and representatives from the Carmarthenshire League (CAFL), showcased the club's vision for a stronger,





more community-driven future. The evening also saw a strong turnout from club members, supporters and volunteers, with Sgorio also present to capture the occasion.

The presentation was led by Colin Staples, who introduced the club's all-new Mission Statement, Vision and Values, Club Philosophy and the shared FAW-aligned objectives that will guide the next phase of the club's journey. A lively Q&A followed, featuring Lee John, Katie McAuley, Terry Boyle, Neil O'Brien, Noel Mooney, Joseph Donkor and Colin himself, offering those present the chance to hear first-hand the goals, challenges and ambitions that lie ahead.

A central theme of the night was the club's commitment to strengthening its relationship with the local area — deepening community engagement, widening opportunities, and ensuring the club remains a positive and accessible hub for the town. The strategy places significant emphasis on responsible growth, youth development, inclusivity, and building a long-term model that supports stability, progress and pride in representing Llanelli.

The club extended its thanks to everyone who attended and gave a special mention to host Gabriella Jukes for guiding the evening.

As Llanelli Town AFC now begins the next chapter of its journey, guided by the theme "My Town is Your Town is Our Town" and the badge motto Ymlaen (Onwards/Forwards), the club looks ahead with confidence, ambition and unity.
