#### Poole Town v Hanwell Town

Rarely has the new season been more eagerly anticipated at The Black Gold as we prepare to kick off the 2025/26 campaign on Saturday at home to Hanwell Town.

We have lost Merthyr and AFC Totton, who were both promoted, as well as Winchester City, Swindon Supermarine, Frome Town and Marlow who were all relegated. This means that we welcome the following teams to the Southern League South Premier Division:

Farnham Town - Isthmian League South Central Champions

Uxbridge - Isthmian League South Central Runners Up (Play-off winners)

Yate Town - Southern League South Champions Evesham United - Southern League South Runners Up (Playoff winners)

Berkhamsted - Southern League Central Division Runners Up (Play-off winners)

Weymouth - Relegated from National League South

Pat & Joe, with the help of Andy Rossiter and the board, moved very early in the close season to bring in the players that they feel will give us every opportunity to have a successful season. They have brought in some very high-profile players who, between them, have a great deal of experience of playing at this level and above. We have seen some competitive pre-season friendlies against some very good sides, cumulating in the excellent 2-2 draw with Salisbury last Saturday.

Speaking in mid-week Joe said how disappointed he is at losing skipper Jamie Whisken for a few more weeks, but apart from one or two knocks and bruises we should have a full squad to select from. He stressed how important it is to get off to a positive start as the games will come thick and fast, playing Saturday and Tuesday in many weeks in the early part of the campaign.

We know from last season that Hanwell Town will be a very well organised and physical team. We lost the home fixture 2-1 last November and drew 3-3 away in March.



The Geordies are managed by Chris Moore who has a wealth of experience in league and non-league football, he began his playing career at Uxbridge before moving onto Northwood. He then made a name for himself when he signed for Dagenham & Redbridge. He had a brief spell with Brentford before returning to the Daggers and helping them win promotion to the Football League. Chris took sole charge of the Club for the 2022/23 season. In his first season in sole charge, and Hanwell's first at Step 3, he guided the club to 50 points, 13 points clear of the bottom four, and a 14th placed finish. In their second season in the Southern League, they picked up 48 points, which was enough to survive on goal difference in 17th place.

Last season saw a great improvement with the club finishing in 8th place on 58points. They won 8 games on the road taking 28 points away from the Oliver Connell & Sons Community Stadium.

The club captain is goalkeeper Sam Beasant who joined the club from Beaconsfield in October 2023. He won the Supporters' Player of the Year and the Southern League Goalkeeper of the Season in the 2023/24 season. His father, Dave, famously was the first goalkeeper to save a penalty in an FA Cup final, lifting the famous trophy with Wimbledon FC in 1988 and won two England caps in 1989.

There has been a lot of work going on at the ground since the end of the season so come along early to have a look at what has been achieved. Let's get behind the lads from the first whistle and get the season off to a great start. Enjoy the game.

The Dolphins secured a 2-2 draw in their final pre-season match against Salisbury at Tatnam on Saturday afternoon.

Joe Lea and Pat Suraci's side came into the game in fine form having had a strong pre-season campaign but their biggest test yet was against National League South outfit Salisbury.

Injury doubts for Josh Staunton, Antonio Diaz and Jamie Whisken kept them out of the squad, but the Dolphins still set up with a strong starting eleven with the season getting underway in just under a weeks time.

The match got underway on a sunny afternoon at Tatnam with the visitors on top in the early stages.

Despite the Dolphins growing into the match and creating a number of chances themselves, it was Salisbury who struck first through Mike Atkinson as his long range effort beat the outstretched Adam Parkes in goal.

Ik Hill looked a bright spark in the first half for Poole, creating numerous openings down the left hand side, but were unable to find the back of the net as of yet.

Salisbury doubled their lead on the 25th minute as Charlie Davis was robbed on the edge of his own area and Noah Coppin casually placed the ball in the back of the net to give Salisbury a second.

Only five minutes later, Poole responded after great work down the flank from Ik Hill found Henry Spalding in space in the area who fired past the goalkeeper to get the Dolphins back in the game.

With Poole looking dangerous every time they ventured forward, a Charlie Davis free kick found the head of Kris Campbell who gracefully glanced home to draw the scores level again and go into the break at two a-piece.

The second half got underway in similar fashion with both sides showing high intensity and promise going forward but neither side were able to find a third in this one.

Selim Saied, Tyrrell Sampson and Pietro Almeida all entered the fray as the second half progressed.

As the half progressed, Salisbury were on top for the latter stages but a valiant defensive effort from Poole ensured they remained resolute and were able to hold onto a draw in the end as the referee's whistle brought proceedings to an end at 2-2.

A comprehensive performance from Lea and Suraci's side and certainly a promising one with the opening fixture right around the corner.



# Hanwell Town FC - History

#### Overview

The history of Hanwell Town needs to be understood in three distinct but nevertheless linked phases. The first was the original foundation of the Club as Hanwell FC which lasted from 1884-1912. The second was the re-founding and renaming of the Club as Hanwell Town in 1920, a short period which lasted seven years before the Club folded for a second time. Finally, the third phase of the Club's history was the reestablishment of Hanwell Town in 1947.

#### The first phase

In 1884 four young men: J.D. Brayne, J.R. Mathias, John Wark and Charles Richins founded Hanwell Football Club playing at Church Fields at a rent of £4 per year and using the Viaduct pub as its club house. The Club continued to grow and by 1892 was running three teams. In 1893, it moved its headquarters to the Royal Victoria pub. In 1897, the Club won its first trophy, the West Middlesex Cup, sensationally defeating Brentford 1-0 and in 1898 joined the London League.

Unfortunately, the Club led a hand to mouth existence. The reason for the Club's financial predicament went back to 1898 when it joined the London League which had begun two years earlier. The the cost of travel proved prohibitive and the Club took what proved to be an ill-fated decision to resign from the league at the end of the season and join the newly created and local Middlesex League for season 1899-1900. The folly of that decision quickly became evident as that league lasted for only one year before disbanding.

Committee dithering meant that although the Club decided to re-apply for admission to the London league it missed the date for applications and was forced to play friendly fixtures. Indeed, it was to be two more years before it successfully re-joined the London League playing for three seasons from 1902-1905 when the Club joined the Great Western Suburban League. In 1908, Hanwell reached the final of the Middlesex Senior Cup but lost the final to Southall 1-0.

Despite being moderately successful and holding its own in the leagues, the Club's best achievement was its solitary Middlesex Cup final appearance. Caught in a footballing triangle of three local well-established and successful clubs (Brentford, Ealing and Southall) it failed to make a significant impact and attendances remained stubbornly low. The Club struggled on but beset by small crowds and high ground rents was always in a financially precarious position and in 1912 it folded.

The second phase

In 1920 the Club was reformed, this time taking the name of Hanwell Town. Local folklore and tradition maintain that it was founded by Geordies, many of whom were demobbed servicemen after the Great War. Many of them worked on major projects such Sir Robert McAlpine's construction company building the Great Western Water Treatment works pipeline from Hammersmith to Isleworth. Unfortunately, the names of these playing pioneers have been lost as there are no surviving official club records from this period.

It was around this time that the Club began to play in the famous black and white stripes of Newcastle United. Once again, financial pressures and low attendances meant that the club was always operating on a shoestring and in 1927 it folded once again. Nevertheless, the link with West London was maintained and in the 1930s the Walker family from Gateshead was one of hundreds who came down from the Northeast to London in the 1936 depression looking for work. It was to be the family's eldest son Ron who went on to re-establish the Geordie heritage and transform the fortunes of the Club.

#### The third phase

During the Second World War, Walker served in the RAF. After demobilisation he joined Hanwell Town Sports & Social Club in 1948 and played for the first XI with his two brothers Raynor and Albert. It was the start of a 60

year love affair with the Club. Initially, the Club played in the Dauntless league. From 1949-1969 it played in the Harrow and District League. In 1969 the Club won election to the Middlesex League and played there until 1983 when it joined the London League playing there until 1987 when it joined the Spartan League.

The Club joined the Isthmian League in 2018 then in 2021 it won election to the Southern League Premier Division (South) which is Level 7 / Step 3 in the football pyramid. This is the highest standard of football that the club has ever achieved in its history.

#### Club honours include:

Spartan League Champions 1983-4, London Senior Cup Winners 1992-3 and again in 1993-4, Premier Division Cup Winners 2002-03, Premier Division Champions 2013-14, and most recently Middlesex Senior Cup Winners 2020-21.

No account of the history of the club would be complete without paying tribute to four other men who have been prominent in the history of the club:

- Bob Fisher the Club Chairman who has been involved with the club since 1955 and has been first XI captain, manager, Treasurer, Chairman and President in his long career;
- Phil Player who holds the record number of first XI appearances;
- Ray Duffy who as player and manager amassed 997 first XI games; and
- Dave Iddiols the current President who has been with the club for nearly 50 years.

With such a strong commitment to the local community, a first-class ground, a youth section that has over thirty teams and an ever increasing and fiercly loyal supporter base, the future of the Club is brighter than ever.

#### **Players**

#### Sam Beasant

Sam joined the club from Beaconsfield in October 2023. He won the Supporters' Player of the Year and the Southern League Goalkeeper of the Season in the 2023/24 season. An incredibly popular figure around the club. Previous clubs include Maidenhead United, Cambridge United, Chelmsford City and Chesham United. His father, Dave, famously was the first goalkeeper to save a penalty in an FA Cup final, Lifting the famous trophy with Wimbledon FC in 1988 and won two England caps in 1989.

#### Dan Carr

Dan made a return to Hanwell midway through last season, having spent the early part of it at Southern Premier South sides Bracknell Town and then Met Police. He was named Supporter's and Player's Player of the Season during our promotion campaign, as well as being named in the Isthmian South-Central Division Team of the Season

Dwayne joined the club in the 2018/19 season, and has been a constant feature of the Geordie's defense ever since. His headed finish against Chertsey Town set Hanwell on their way to victory in the Isthmian South-Central Playoff Final in 2022. #### Harry Seabrook

Having previously played for Leighton Town in their promotion winning team, Uxbridge and Harrow Borough, we're excited to see the Centre Back in action for the Geordies!

#### Rod Orlando-Young

The pacey attacker has previously played for Exeter City, Welling United, Long Eaton and Royston to name a few. Having just returned from a serious knee injury, we're excited to see him in the black & white of the Geordies!

#### Callum Woodcock
