Poole Town v Chertsey Town

With our place in the 2Q Round of the FA Cup secured it is back to league action at Tatnam as we welcome Surrey based Chertsey Town on Saturday ko 3pm. Chertsey have not made the start to the season that they would have been hoping for, having won just one of their opening 5 matches. That win came on the opening day at Tiverton where they ran out 2-1 winners. (P5 W1 D2 L2 5pts) Their last league match was the 3-3 home draw against league newcomers Uxbridge on Bank Holiday Monday.

They narrowly avoided relegation last season, their first at this level, finishing on 47 points, just one point and a better goal difference than Winchester. The Curfews were our last opponents at The Black Gold last season and our 3-1 win went quite some way to securing our own place in the Southern League Premier South. The reverse fixture at Alwyns Lane was played on a very cold and dark January evening and was Pat & Joe's first game in charge. Unfortunately, they were not destine to start with a win and we lost that match 2-1.

After avoiding relegation, The Curfews decided on a change of manager and brought in Josh Gallagher, who enjoyed a long and successful career in the non-League game as a determined midfielder. He went on to cut his managerial teeth at Raynes Park Vale, where he took the club from Step 5 to the brink of the playoffs at the higher level.

He recently told the club website: "It's been great to get my teeth into preparations over the past month or so, I've been doing my research on the teams and players that we will be coming up against as well as evaluating what we have here and what was needed to add to it." He continued, "Having people like Toby Little and Jack Mazzone around has been a big help. Both were part of the team last season; Toby has taken on a player-coach role and he's been able to give guidance on the strengths and weaknesses of our opponents last season, which gives us something to work from even though there are sure to be plenty of comings and goings in terms of personnel throughout the league this summer.



The Dolphins are certainly, enjoying some good form and are one of five teams on 10 points from the 5 matches played. At home we have won one (Hanwell 1-0) and drawn one (Evesham 1-1) with our only defeat being the 4-3 reverse at Bracknell. We are hard on the heels, at this very early stage of the season, of leaders Sholing and Farnham Town who are both on 11 points and along with Uxbridge are the only remaining unbeaten sides.

Pat and Joe made seven changes on Tuesday night for the cup replay including bringing back Corey Jordan who started his career at AFC Bournemouth where he made his professional debut in a 3-2 defeat to Preston North End in the EFL Cup, replacing Tyrone Mings as a substitute. Whilst being under contract with the Cherries, Jordan had loan spells in the National League with Weymouth and Eastbourne Borough. Following his release from AFC Bournemouth, he signed for Gloucester City before swiftly moving on to Aldershot in the National League where he made 62 appearances over two campaigns there.

For the 2023/24 season, Jordan signed for Gosport Borough and worked under Joe Lea and Pat Suraci in a season where they finished comfortably inside the playoffs in 4th place. After a successful season, Jordan signed for Weymouth for his second spell with the club. We are very pleased that he has signed for Poole for 2025/26.

We are still looking for some consistency, but at the same time we are producing some very attractive attacking football which is giving the supporters some great entertainment.

Chertsey Town FC - History

The official founding of the club took place in 1890 when matches were played in the West Surrey League. The first success came in 1897 when the Surrey Junior Cup was secured. A one year gap took place before football resumed in the same competition which eventually became the East and West Surrey League. A further halt in football took place during the Great War but soon after, in 1919, the club joined the Surrey Intermediate League where it An invitation to become founder members of the membership was later assumed, on attaining senior status in 1946.

The club has played at various locations within the Relatively respectable positions were attained for the parish (Willow Walk, Free Prae Road Staines Lane and Chilsey Green) before settling down at the present home in 1926. The suffix 'Town' was added to its title some 24 years later. The ground was donated by Sir Edward Stern as a football ground to the 'premier club in the parish'. Next door, a similar trust provides facilities for Chertsey Cricket Ćlub. The main stand was constructed in the mid fifties; the original clubhouse added in 1960 and the first covered enclosure was built some three years later. Cover behind each goal was added in 1994 and 2010 respectively.

Chertsey became members of the Surrey Senior League in 1946, but success was scant until 1960 when winning the league championship. This was repeated twice in the next three years, The League Cup was also won on three occasions. The club could not progress to the preferred Corinthian League so, in A massive change occurred in the 2018/19 season that 1963 it controversially turned professional to enter the Metropolitan League. It gave an entertaining three but. the cost was too much. A drop to the Greater London League for one season occurred before a further shift Division. to the Spartan League was made in 1967.

Indifferent results then dogged the club for almost two decades. This situation was briefly relieved in 1974/75 when the club were league and league cup runners up to an up an coming Farnborough Town. Meanwhile, the fabric of the club was being built up behind the scenes and despite lack of prominence on the park, movement was made via the London Spartan (1975/76) and thenian leagues through to the Isthmian family with a place in Division Two South in 1984. Instant relegation to the Combined Counties League was suffered but a rejuvenated side won promotion back to Isthmian rank's within the year whilst winning the League Cup on the way.

The club was rewarded with good league positions but further promotion denied at first. The worst season after returning to the Isthmians came when the two Division Twos were split in 1991 and a place in the new Division Three had to suffice. This position was quickly rectified with a runner's up slot the next season. The club also reached the quarter finals of the F.A. Vase, emulating a similar performance in 1987/88. One year later, 102 points and a runner's up promotion place

together with the Carlsberg Trophy in the same campaign along with the League Charity Shield and the Isthmian 'Team of the Season' trophy.



Only one campaign was required in Division One before further promotion, to the Premier Division, The first season at that level was one of consolidation stayed, uneventfully, until 1939 and a further break. but the second was more difficult. A late rally was experienced, but was insufficient to avoid the drop to Surrey Senior League was not taken up in 1923 but Division One. Two subsequent Division One campaigns were comfortable but the third proved too difficult after a very poor first half of the season.

> next two seasons and then a return to Division One. taking a place in the revised south section in the Isthmian re-organisation. The side was not able to compete at this level and relegation to Division Two was suffered in 2003. With the dissolution of the division, the club was allocated to Combined Counties League in 2006. Promotionally hopeful situations were created regularly over the five terms in that competition.

> Finishing as runners up in 2011 was enough to secure promotion to Division One Central of the Southern League. Unspectacular, but safe, performances were achieved for two seasons but relegation was suffered in 2014, and with it a return to the Combined Counties League where four modest seasons prevailed.

> resulted in the league championship being secured with 13 points to spare. This led to promotion back to the Isthmian ranks and a place in the South Central

> However, more memorable, was winning the FA Vase after turning over the score in the final to beat Cray Valley 3-1.

> The combination of these two feats made the 2018/19 the most successful season ever for the club. Covid affected the next two campaigns, but then a runners up spot was attained at the end of the 2021/22 season but the side lost out in extra time of the final of the play offs.

> Following a turbulent season as far as managerial appointments was concerned, The current manager, Mark Harper, was appointed at the start of the current season. The chairman's role is held Mark Turner. The club, a Charter Standard member, also has a comprehensive junior section of boys at all ages. Chertsey Town's nickname, the 'Curfews' is derived from a locally famous bell that hangs in nearby St. Peters Church. The bell has rung out the evening curfew, now ceremoniously, for over five hundred years.

Chertsey Town FC - Players

Garry Abisogun (29)

First signed for The Curfews in September 2020 as a wide attacker and stayed for two seasons, scoring 18 goals in 65 outings before moving to Bracknell Town, then Slough Town and Chesham United. Rejoined for the start of this term.

Louis Birch (27)

A summer midfield signing from National League South side Enfield Town. Was previously at Welling United and over five years with Metropolitan Police.

Daniel Berry (22)

A right sided midfield player who signed in the summer from Raynes Park Vale. Previously was with Chipstead where he made 35 appearances in season 2023/24.

Eion Casey (34)

Enjoyed seven seasons at Chesham United, making 197 appearances with 26 goals for the Generals in that time. Was part of their 2023/24 championship winning side that took the club into National League South. Had a loan spell at Alwyns Lane last season which was cut short by injury.

Alex Fisher (28)

Was at the Oueens Park Rangers academy for over six years, when very young. Played at Metropolitan Police for the 22/23 season, joining the Curfews in the 2023 close season. A defender.

Jordan Gallagher (28)

A striker with 117 goals secured in the last four seasons, helping Raynes Park Vale to Step 4, and contributing goals to Farnham Town's Isthmian South Central title winning 2024/25 season.

Archie Harland-Goddard (25)

A right back who joined in the summer from Redhill. Spent seven seasons at Raynes Park Vale with 160 appearances, including that club's championship year in the Combined Counties League.

Jermaine Green (25)

A right sided player who is equally comfortable in midfield or defence. Joined The Curfews in the 2025 close season after having spent several successful seasons at Raynes Park Vale.

Darryl Harrison (28)

Joined this summer for his second spell in central defence. Originally signed in 2021 but after 89 appearances for the Curfews, then moved to Bracknell Town where he spent two successful seasons.

Dan Hector (29)

A summer signing from Raynes Park Vale. Plays in wide attacking positions. Previously played at Merstham, Sevenoaks, Kingstonian and Leatherhead. Was also two years with Carshalton Athletic.



Conor Lee (26)

A full back who was formally at Spelthorne Sports, but then Metropolitan Police where he moved from over during the 2023 close season.

Toby Little (36)

A defender who signed in the 2023 close season. He has played for a number of clubs including Hayes & Yeading, wwwWoking and Chesham United, but more recently Beaconsfield Town. Signed in July 2023. Now also part of the coaching staff

Ashley Lodge (35)

Originally with Staines Town, Returned to Alwyns Lane for his second spell of 62 games in the midfield after two years and 99 appearances at Bracknell Town. Moved then to Chesham United where he helped to cement their place at Step 2 last season.

Ollie McCoy (27)

Signed as an attacker in October 2023 where he had a brief spell at Ascot United. Was also at Chesham United. He started off with Birmingham City with loans spells at Yeovil Town, Wealdstone and Beaconsfield.

Jack Mazzone (32)

A striker who has effectively returned to the club where he played in the Under 18 side. in the meantime, has played effectively with Woking, Metropolitan Police, South Park (Reigate), Godalming Town and more recently Horsham from where he last played before his 2024 summer move to Alwyns Lane.

Bill Montague (25)

Initially an Under 18 midfielder with the club but moved on for spells with Binfield and Southall before returning for the second time to Alwyns Lane, this time signing in the 2024 close season.

Wayne Ridgley (24)

Began in the youth set ups of Chelsea and Crystal Palace. Played latterly in midfield for Ashford Town (Middx) from where he signed in the summer of 2023, but had a short spell at Walton & Hersham at the end of last term.



Chertsey Town FC - Players

Aaron William-Fernandes (31)Signed in the past close season. Began at Walsall in 2011 making six appearances. Has had short loans at Step 1 or 2 clubs before appearing at Worcester City, Rushall Olympic, Nuneaton Town. Harrogate Town, AFC Telford then in 2021, then Newtown in the Cymru Premier League for the last three season. Considered moving to Spain but opted this season for The Curfews. Signed as an attacker.

Jerry Wiltshire (29)

A close season capture for the central defence from Hampton & Richmond Borough. He had previously been with Hayes & Yeading at a similar level. His formative footballing years were spent in the US College system. Returned home to sign for Maidenhead United, where he made15 National League appearances. Won 15 international caps with the British Virgin Islands.

Luke Wynne-Roberts (22) A goalkeeper who was an ever-

present between the sticks for Redhill last season, keeping 22 clean sheets along the way. Signed for the Curfews in the past close season. Was formally with AFC Wimbledon.

Josh Gallagher (Manager)

Following an extensive non league playing career including stints at Leatherhead and Corinthian Casuals, Josh turned to management in 2021, masterminding a promotion winning side at Raynes Park Vale that took the club into the Isthmian League and establishing its place at Step 4. His Chertsey Town appointment came in May 2025.

Non-League Paper Column



IT'S easy to forget quite how big the National League System is and the broad church it represents. From huge ex-Football League clubs with sevenfigure playing budgets for their season to very small community clubs run by a handful of volunteers. But that's what makes Non-League – and football in this country, generally – so unique and special.

You may have heard The FA last year introduced a new board to oversee this level of the game along with the women's pyramid.

We sat down with Head of National League System James Earl and National League System manager Matt Edkins to discuss all things Non-League for a three-part series in The NLP.

Don't miss this week's chat which covers club allocations, the pyramid's structure before we move into club licensing and technology the week after.

Last week we touched on the new National Leagues Pyramid Board, including the appointment of its first ever independent chair, Chris Brown.

"The important bit to say is it's still a fundamental moment where this level of the game in both the men's and the women's pyramid have a strong collective voice with a senior seat at the table at the FA," Earl told us.

"Historically, certainly the National League System has been positioned between the professional and the grassroots game and has sat in a governance structure that's been in and around the grassroots game.

"But there's been a recognition of the importance of the National League System – and the women's football pyramid – and that it is unique in how we should be servicing it at The FA. So its introduction last year for the first time was a really key moment.

"That has had challenges and opportunities. Challenges is bringing two pyramids together that have been governed separately. "One of the pieces of work we've been doing is around the brand and identity for the board, but also the level of the game.

"So there has been some work done around a new brand and hopefully that will be launched soon, which will bring a collective identity for not just the board, but leagues and clubs and other stakeholders to stand behind.

"It has been important to not make the board a repeat of committees that still exist. The intent is to make this a strategic board that looks at the broader direction of travel for clubs and leagues and players at this level of the game.

"We've still got a journey to go on to really understand what it is we want the board to do to be able to drive standards up, not just in the competitions, but the club landscape as well.

"I think after a year there's been some great success. We've had some good debates and good conversations, but actually the proof will be in delivery and I think that's going to come over the next couple of years."

Club Chaplain



Welcome to our games against two Surrey teams, Chertsey and Farnham, and to our visitors – we wish you a safe journey home.

In my last programme notes, I considered the way in which our experience and circumstances affect our sense of perspective in life, and how this in turn

influences important choices. Today I want to look at the related subject of how the breadth or narrowness of our perspective impinges upon the way we see things around us.

When I was in my twenties, working in the overseas aid business and travelling extensively to various farflung places, I did not find it difficult to have a broad perspective. But, if I'm honest, now that I spend most of my life in just one town, I sense that I have become a bit more blinkered and short-sighted in my outlook, relying more on second- and third-hand reports in the media and things I have garnered from hearsay and anecdotes. I'm also increasingly aware of the way all of us tend to see the world through the filters of our worldview and the values of our society.

One of the things I was struck by in my years travelling the world was how the things that matter most transcend narrower things like geography, nationality and race. The Christian faith crosses boundaries of culture and nationality in a way that nothing else does: almost everywhere people can go, there are churches and believers (even in North Korea, for example, there are committed followers of Jesus in the underground church, facing death or imprisonment if they are discovered.)

Whatever culture we are from, loving, being loved and belonging are among the things which matter most, because that is the way God made us. One of the earliest missionaries, the apostle Paul, taught this as he travelled among the cultures around the Mediterranean: as he said in Athens, "in him we live and move and have our being" (Acts 17.28).





FA CUP - QUALIFYING

LAST year's FA Cup concluded with one of the biggest final shocks in modern history after Crystal Palace stunned Manchester City at Wembley.

And this year's episode has started in much the same vein with cup shocks aplenty already whetting the appetite for the campaign ahead.

Take last Saturday's preliminary round. Atherton Laburnum Rovers were handed the dream tie against higher-ranked town rivals Atherton Collieries in what was the first-ever competitive Flat Cap derby. Michael Clegg's Collieries, from Northern Premier League Division One West were strong favourites to show their superiority but it was Step 5 LR who turned on the style in front of a near 1,000 crowd to come through 5-1 to complete one of the most famous days in the club's history.

Victory earned Dave Jones' North West Counties League side a potentially lucrative second qualifying round trip to Clegg's former club, Macclesfield, where an estimated 3,000 crowd will welcome them in to Moss Rose.

"Winning the league [last season] will take some topping, but this is a close second," Jones told our reporters afterwards. "These lads have played in so many big games now, and they just weren't fazed." But you can't talk cup upsets without mentioning Tadley Calleva.

The Combined Counties League side hosted a Weymouth team who were playing National League South football last season and welcoming popular boss Steve Claridge back in their dugout for the first time in 21 years.

But, in a lunchtime kick-off in front of the BBC cameras, Joe Lawlor's Calleva rallied to a 4-2 victory to reach the second qualifying round for the first time in their history.

Whitstable Town know all about performing on the big occasion – they lifted the FA Vase at Wembley last season with an extra-time success over AFC Whyteleafe.

And the Oystermen were at it again last weekend when travelling a Dulwich Hamlet side who have started their Isthmian Premier season strongly under boss Mark Dacey and came away with an impressive

3-2 victory at Champion Hill.

Next up for them is a home tie against another club from the same Step 3 division, Chichester City, conquerors of Havant & Waterlooville. While Whitstable will fancy their chances of pulling off another upset next weekend, there are a number of other clubs with one eye on a third qualifying round berth.

Stalybridge Celtic, already conquerors of former Football League clubs Bury and Workington, will be looking to add a third when they host Chester, while Step 5 Chadderton, have been rewarded for seeing off Bishop Auckland in the last round with a glamour trip to NPL Premier leaders FC United of Manchester. Ben Herd's Hertford Town will relish a trip to fulltimers Chelmsford City, while Jersey Bulls manager Elliott Powell describes his side's visit of Worthing as "absolutely massive" and "the biggest fixture we have ever had".

The Rebels represent the highest-ranked side that Jersey will have faced since their foundation in 2018. Two Step 5 sides are gearing towards huge ties against Step 2 opponents.

In the south-west, Torpoint Athletic have reached this stage for the first time in their history and make the trip to Penydarren Park to face Southern Premier Central champions Merthyr Town, while Wessex League Laverstock & Ford head to the Ray Mac Stadium to take on Salisbury.

But, arguably, the standout tie of the round sees Step 2 Enfield FC host their rivals from Step 2, Enfield Town in an intriguing match-up.

This will be the first competitive match between the two sides for over 14 years, although the pair were drawn to each other in 2021 before Enfield Town lost their replay to Hadley.

Alex Salmon's FC underdogs need only look to Atherton LR for inspiration in a competition which just keeps producing the unexpected.

Who will be next to step up to the plate?

The draw for the Emirates FA Cup second round qualifying has been made, with 80 ties at the next stage of the 2025-26 season.

The second round qualifying will take place across the weekend of Saturday 13 September, with winning clubs at this stage picking up £3375 from the prize fund and losing teams collecting £1125.

Farnham Town FC - History

Farnham Town was established in 1906 through the merger of Farnham Bungs (the Farnham Brewery) and Farnham Star.

It became a member of the Surrey Intermediate League and were champions in 1929-30 and 1930-1931.

In 1947, The Town joined the Surrey Senior League, left in 1962 but returned in 1963.

The club won three successive league titles in 1965-1966, 1966-1967 and 1967-1968 and were runners up in 1969-1970 and 1970-1971 before joining the Spartan League in 1971.

When that league merged with the Metropolitan London league to become the London Spartan League in 1975, the club were placed in Division 1, which became the Premier Division in 1977.

After finishing bottom of the London Spartan Premier Division in **1979-1980**, Farnham transferred to the Combined Counties League and finished fourth in their first season.

The **1986-1987** season saw Farnham finish second to Ash United however, in 1990-1991, The Town would go one better by winning their first league title.

The following season the Town won a clean sweep of the major trophies by winning the Combined Counties Premier League, the Dan Air Elite Cup and the Dan Air Challenge Cup.

Having won the league, the club was accepted to the Diadora League (Division 3 of the Isthmian League). However, funds for the necessary ground improvements could not be generated and, since the club were unable to rejoin the Combined Counties League until the following season, it did not compete in the league during season 1992-93.

From **1995 to 1998** The Town would enjoy three consecutive top six finishes and, in 1995-96, won the Premier Challenge Cup for a second time.

Having finished bottom of the league in 2005-2006, the club was relegated to Division 1 and, although The Town won the Division 1 title the following season under the guidance of Barry Bridger, we were denied promotion due to ground grading issues.

In Paul Tanner's first season in charge, The Town finally gained promotion from the Combined Counties Division 1 in **2010-2011** having finished second behind Worcester Park and won the Combined Counties Fair Play Award having gone through the season without having a player sent off

In **2015-2016**, the club not only won the Cherry Red Records Premier Challenge Cup but also reached the final of the Aldershot FA Senior Cup.

Relegated back to Division 1 in 2017-2018, The Town performed strongly in the two COVID interrupted

seasons 2019-20 and 2020-21 and were rewarded with a move up to newly created Cherry Red Records Combined Counties Premier Division South in 2021 where they play today.



In **2021-22**, The Town consolidated themselves in the Cherry Red Records Combined Counties Premier Division South and built on that in 2022-23 under the new management of Paul Johnson and assistant Jimmy Hibburt.

After taking the reins in November 2022, Johnson helped guide Farnham to a top six finish in the league but also brought silverware to the Club as they defeated Balham in the Southern Combination Cup in May 2023, defeating Balham in front of a home crowd of over 1,150 people.

2023/24 brought even greater success, with the Town going unbeaten on their way to winning the Premier Division South league title and promotion to the Isthmian League South Central Division; achieving the club's best ever runs in the FA Cup and FA Vase; and reaching the final of the Specsavers Surrey Senior Cup, where we went down to a 1-0 defeat to South Park (Reigate).

Last season saw the Town become back to back champions, winning the Isthmian League South Central Division and securing promotion to the Premier South Division of the Southern League, our highest ever level.

Farnham Town FC - Players

Zaki Oualah - Goalkeeper

Zaki is a vasty-experienced goalkeeper who joined the Club from from Isthmian Premier Division side Whitehawk. In the 2023/24 season, he kept 18 clean sheets for Chesham United as they were promoted as champions of the Southern League Premier South.

Signing an initial 18-month deal with the Town, Zaki made his debut in the 4-0 win away at Kingstonian on February 19th 2025, the first of nine clean sheets he would keep in 16 appearances to close out the season, helping the Club win the Isthmian South Central.

Jack Dean - Defender

Dean joined the Town in May 2023 coming from Step 3 side Bracknell Town to join his brother Owen at The Memorial Ground.

He is a combative full-back who loves a big tackle and has a very good leap for headers. His endless energy also means he is great at overlapping for the wingers.

Jack was a vital member of the Town's back-to-back title-winning squads seeing them move from Step 5 into Step 3 between 2023 and 2025, making 67 appearances in his two seasons with the Club so far.

Brandon Mason - Defender

Brandon joined the Club on a free transfer from National League South side St. Albans City, signing a contract until the summer of 2026.

The experienced left-back came through the ranks with Watford and made a handful of Premier League appearances as a teenager before being part of the Coventry City squad that earned promotion from League One into the Championship in 2019/20.

In recent years, Brandon has been a mainstay at National League level with Wealdstone and then St. Albans City.

Jordan Stepney - Defender

Jordan re-joined Farnham Town in the summer of 2024, arriving from Raynes Park Vale. He made 39 appearances for the Club during the 2017/18 season, scoring six goals.

Becoming an immediate mainstay in the defence, Jordan made 44 appearances for the Town in 2024/25 we romped to the Isthmian South Central title, helping the side keep 15 clean sheets in those games and scoring four times.

Ryan Kinnane - Defender

Kinnane is a tall and dominant defender. The defender is brilliant in the air and a huge asset in both boxes, often being the target for attacking set pieces.

The defender joined the club in the summer of 2023 after captaining Berkhamsted to Step 3 by winning the League and Cup double, and has been named the Farnham Town captain for 2023/24. His other previous clubs include, Hemel Hempstead and Hanwell Town.



In the past two seasons, Ryan has made 96 appearances for the Club, scoring nine times and skippering the side to back-to-back promotions.

Max Meaton - Defender

Meaton is a robust right-back with plenty of pace and a love for challenges. The full-back often joins in on the attack and helps the Town make the pitch as big as possible.

Meaton is a Farnham Town veteran who has completed eight seasons at the Memorial Ground and will forever be remembered as the man who scored the goal that secured the Combined Counties Premier Division South and promotion to Step 4 football for the first time in our history.

Throughout his lifelong association with the Club, Max has made 296 appearances for Farnham Town as of the end of the 2024/25 season, helping the Club earn a second successive promotion and into the Southern Leaque Premier South.

Joe Jackson

Jackson is an extremely versatile player who can fulfill a whole variety of positions on the pitch with great effect. His reliability in every position has made him an ever-present in the side since his arrival from Hanwell Town in August 2023.

Having had a lot of success under Paul Johnson and Jimmy Hibburt's management during his time at Bedfont Sports, Joe settled in quickly with the Town and has been a reliable performer wherever he has played, scoring 10 goals in 95 appearances over the last two seasons, helping the Club first win the Combined Counties Premier Division South and then the Isthmian South Central.

Tom Leggett - Midfield

Tom joined Farnham Town on a free transfer from National League South side Salisbury and is capable of playing across the back four and in a central midfield role.

After coming through the academy ranks with Aston Villa, Tom has established a great career in Non-League, and was named Player's Player of the Year at Salisbury in 2023/24 as one of their standout performers during their promotion campaign via the playoffs in the Southern League Premier South.

Farnham Town FC - Players

Over the last 12 months, Leggett made 39 appearances for the Whites in the National League South as they established themselves in the division.

Harry Cookley - Midfield

Cooksley is a midfield maestro, known for his sensational ball-playing abilities. The midfielder joined from Hartley Wintney in May 2023 having finished the campaign playing at Step 3.

Other previous clubs include Aldershot Town, Farnborough and a stint in Austria for FC Pinzgau.

Over the past two seasons, Harry has made 96 appearances for the Club, scoring 22 goals and providing 31 assists, helping the Town achieve back-to-back promotions.

Darryl Saunders - Midfield

Sanders is a midfield technician that can provide the killer ball for his teammates while also having a keen-eye for a goal.

Darryl joined Farnham Town from Step Three side Bracknell Town at the beginning of the 2023/24 season. The season prior he scored 12 goals as the Robins reached the play-off finals where the midfielder played a pivotal role.

Despite an injury-hit two years with the Town, Darryl's final third output remains remarkable, with 63 goal contributions – including 28 goals – in just 58 appearances for the Club as we've earned back-to-back promotions.

Bobby-Joe Taylor - Midfield

After Leaving Dorking Wanderers in the summer of 2025, Bobby signed with the Town on a one-year contract.

A vastly experienced player in full-time football, Bobby spent most of the last decade playing at Step 1, tallying over 210 appearances with clubs such as Maidstone United, Aldershot Town, Dover Athletic and Bromley prior to joining Dorking Wanderers in the summer of 2021 where he would become a mainstay in their side for much of the next four seasons.

lmran Uche - Midfield

Imran is an imposing yet extremely technical midfielder, and is a player familiar to Paul Johnson and his management team, having spent the 2019/20 campaign under their tutelage at Bedfont Sports where his impressive performances in the Isthmian South Central earned him a move to Hampton & Richmond Borough in the National League South, making 27 appearances for the Beavers in 2021/22.

Uche spent the following campaign with Billericay Town in the Isthmian Premier Division where he made 30 appearances, scoring twice before returning to Step 2 with Eastbourne Borough in July 2023. He appeared 27 times, scoring once for Eastbourne during the 2023/24 season.



In the 2024/25 season, Imran spent the early months of the campaign with Rayners Lane in the Isthmian South Central, but returned to the National League South with Aveley where he made 27 appearances between November 2024 and April 2025.

Matt McKenzie - Midfield

Mat rose up the levels quickly as a teenager, breaking through at Redhill in the Combined Counties Premier South before moving on to South Park in the Isthmian South Central in February 2022 where he continued to make a name for himself in local non-League circles.

Hanwell Town spotted his potential and they brought him to the Club during the summer of 2022 where he quickly established himself as one of the best young players in the Southern League. His debut season with Hanwell saw Mat reel in the Club's Supporter's, Committee's and Young Player of the Season award for the 2022/23 campaign.

Over the last two seasons, he further cemented himself as one of the first names on the teamsheet at Hanwell, and eclipsed 100 career appearances for the Club in March 2025 en route to finishing out a strong season, finishing eighth in the Southern League Premier South.

Ben Purcell - Midfield

Ben is a talented young midfielder who arrived from Bracknell Town having also come through the academy at Reading before spending time with Farnborough.

After arriving in November 2024, Ben made 29 appearances for the Town, helping the Club eclipse 100 points as they won the Isthmian South Central in 2024/25.

His one and only goal for the Town came in the 4-0 away win at Kingstonian in February 2025, and was voted by the fans as the Club's Goal of the Season.

Kai Tanner Midfield

Tanner came through the ranks at the Town and after breaking into the first team he left for League Two side Sutton United. An injury during a loan at Corinthian Casuals cut his time there short and forced Sutton United's hand so Tanner rejoined the Town in August 2023.

Kai, the son of Club Director and former manager Paul Tanner, is a tricky attacker he beats players with his low centre of gravity and sharp movements. He scored

the goal that sparked the comeback for our 2-2 draw at Jersey Bulls which clinched our promotion to Step 4 for the first time

Over the last two seasons, Kai has scored 11 goals in 75 appearances as the Town have earned back-to-back promotions.

Owen Dean - Forward

Despite a short spell away at Badshot Lea, Dean is a fan-favourite labelled as 'One of Our Own' having come through the Farnham Town Development Team.

Year on year, Owen continues to improve, winning the Club's Golden Boot for the last three seasons in a row between 2022/23 and 2024/25, scoring 62 goals and providing 34 assists in 133 appearances during that spell.

Sam Evans - Forward

Sam became Farnham's record signing and first-ever recruit for a transfer fee on March 14th 2025 when he completed a switch from National League South side Slough Town.

A tall, physical and athletic centre-forward, Sam came through the ranks at Woking before joining Paul Johnson and Jimmy Hibburt at Bedfont Sports in the summer of 2022. He went on to net back-to-back 16-goal seasons with Bedford Sports and Hanwell Town as he worked his way up the football pyramid before signing for Slough Town in the summer of 2024.

Ogo Obi - Forward

Ogo came through the ranks at Watford before establishing himself in Non-League football with Hampton & Richmond Borough in 2018. Obi is a player familiar to Paul Johnson and his management team, having also spent time with Bedfont Sports early in his career.

Following their promotion to Southern League Premier South, Obi joined Hayes & Yeading United for the 2019/20 season where he finished the campaign as their top scorer with 13 goals before making the move to Hanwell Town where he would continue to impress over the next two years.

At the start of the 2022/23 season, Obi made the step up to the National League South with Hemel Hempstead before joining Slough Town in December 2022. Over the course of the campaign, he would score 10 goals in 44 league games across his spells with both clubs.

The following season, he would join Maidstone United where he appeared 10 times prior to joining Chesham United on loan for the remainder of the 23/24 campaign. He would go on to score eight goals in 25 league games for the Generals as they won the Southern League Premier South.

From there, he would join Wingate & Finchley in the Isthmian Premier Division, netting 27 goals and providing eight assists in 41 games, ending the season as the league's second top scorer.



Great Evans - Forward

Great arrived at the Club in September 2024 from Bracknell Town of the Southern League Premier South and has settled in quickly at the Club.

Having played for the likes of AFC Wimbledon, Leatherhead and Hayes & Yeading as well, Great's come in with plenty of experience at higher levels and has the ability to operate through the middle or in wider attacking areas.

In 2024/25, Great scored 12 goals and provided 13 assists in 35 appearances for the Town as we earned promotion to the Southern League Premier South.

Adam Liddle - Forward

Adam is an energetic striker who loves to work the channels and bring his fellow teammates into the game through his hold-up and link-up play.

He came through the ranks at Reading before working his way around non-league, eventually joining the Town in September 2024. In two years with the Club, he's scored 31 goals in 78 appearances, playing a big part in our back-to-back promotions.

We enter a run of Saturday / Tuesday matches with the visit of newly promoted Farnham Town to Tatnum ko 7.45pm.

Farnham Town have been on quite a journey in the last couple of seasons. They won promotion to the Isthmian South Central League in the 2023/24 season. They won this at a canter, finishing on 102 points, a massive 20 points ahead of runners up Uxbridge on 82. Along the way they scored an amazing 120 goals. (P42 W32 D6 L4 102 points). So quite a performance. They have also enjoyed impressive cup runs in the FA Vase and FA Cup.

They have started this season where they left off last season and at the time of writing they are joint top of the league with Sholing, having picked up 11 points from their opening 5 games. (P5 W3 D2 L0 11 points). They are one of only three unbeaten sides along with Sholing and Uxbridge.

A lot of this success has been credited to the appointment of manager Paul Johnson, who has impressed in non-league firstly as a player and then as a manager, guiding Spelthorne Sports to promotion before taking Bedfont Sports up into Step 4. In November 2022, he became the Farnham Town manager and won silverware in his first season as Farnham beat Balham 3-2 in the Southern Combination Cup Final in May 2023.

The 23/24 season was a historic one for the Club under Johnson as they enjoyed their best-ever runs in the FA Cup and FA Vase, reached the Surrey Cup Final for the first time ever, but most importantly, were crowned champions of the Combined Counties Premier Division South after completing an invincible league campaign.

A player who has made a huge contribution the club in the last couple of seasons is Adam Liddle the energetic striker who loves to work the channels and bring his fellow teammates into the game through his hold-up and link-up play. He came through the ranks at Reading before working his way around

non-league, eventually joining the Town in September 2024. In two years with the Club, he's scored 31 goals in 78 appearances, playing a big part in their back-toback promotions.

For the beginning of the 2023/24 campaign, the goalkeeper joined Plymouth Parkway and impressed at Bolitho Park earning him a move to Taunton

Last season, after a spell with Taunton Town, Adam signed for Gosport Borough under the management of Joe Lea and Pat Suraci and made 30 appearances at Privett Park.


