

Poole Town v Weston-super-Mare

The Emirates FA Cup 3rd Round Qualifying Saturday 27th September 2025

We look to continue our Emirates FA Cup journey this weekend when we entertain Enterprise National League South side, Weston-Super-Mare who were promoted in the 2022/23 season after finishing as Southern League Premier South champions.

There will be 40 ties played over the weekend with the clash between Westbury United and Farnborough being chosen as the BBC televised tie, which will kick off at 12.30pm. The winners of each tie will receive £5625 from the prize fund with the losers taking home £1875.

We have two other local sides in action; Wimborne are at home to Worthing, whilst Dorchester travel to Farnham

We continued our unbeaten run last weekend with a goalless stalemate at Hungerford. The point keeps us within reach of the top of the table at this early stage. (P8 W4 D3 L1 15 points). One of the most pleasing aspects of our performances has been the number of goals that we are scoring and the number of players who have found the net.

Shaq Gwengwe leads the way with 8, IK Hill has 4, then we have five players who have one each, Tyrell Sampson, Harvey Slade, Kris Campbell, Josh Staunton and Selim Saied.

We are currently in 6th place in the form table P6 W3 D3. Our last home defeat, which was on February 22 against Gloucester City, came at the end of the run of five straight 1-0 losses throughout February. We have certainly moved forward from those days.

Weston-Super-Mare are in great form thems elves sitting at the top of their league form table P6 W6. They earned their place in 3Q by beating Taunton Town 3-0 in a home replay after the sides drew 1-1 at Taunton. Their only defeat this season was the opening day 3-2 reverse at Hornchurch. Since then, they have accumulated 22 points from 8 matches putting them just one point behind Hornchurch who top the league on 23 points after nine games.

The basis of their success must be having the meanest defence in their league. They have conceded just five goals, in 9 league matches. Shaq and IK will certainly have their work cut out on Saturday, but as we know, they are only too willing to accept the challenge.





Callam Wood, the left-footed defender joined Weston on a permanent contract in May 2025, following his release from top Championship side, Bristol City. He has featured prominently for the Seagulls at the heart of their defence, making 8 appearances to date.

At the other end of the pitch, we will probably come up against Louis Britton, who has scored 7 goals in all competitions so far this season. After successful spells with Brislington and Mangotsfield United, Louis earned a move to Bristol City in 2019. Whilst at Ashton Gate, Louis spent time out on loan at several clubs gaining valuable experience, before joining Weston in March 2025.

The Seagulls, will come into the match under the supervision of temporary manager Scott Rogers after Weston agreed terms to release Scott Bartlett to take over at Eastleigh. He had been at Weston since 2019 and took them into the National League South in 2022/23 season. They narrowly missed out on a playoff place in their first season.

Scott Rogers enjoyed a playing career with the likes of Bristol City, Tiverton Town, Weston, Chippenham Town and Newport County before becoming player-manager at Willand Rovers in 2013. He joined Weston as Assistant Manager in July 2023, linking up with Scott Bartlett and helping to spearhead the club forward.

We can expect great backing on Saturday, with our average home attendance nearing 600. So come along early to take in the great atmosphere and get behind the lads as we strive to continue our participation in this year's FA Cup competition.

Non-League Paper Column



THERE can't be many clubs with a better record of producing players fit for the EFL – and higher – than FC Halifax Town.

The number that have passed through the Shay down the years is quite something.

Our Chris Dunlavy, chief writer on sister title The Football League Paper, caught up with a former Shaymen last week after he called time on his career.

One of the privileges of this job is watching young footballers thrive in Non-League before getting their chance and then carving out a successful career in the higher levels.

Lee Gregory certainly did that, scoring 112 EFL goals for the likes of Millwall, Stoke, Sheffield Wednesday and Mansfield Town

The striker began his journey at Staveley Miners Welfare and Sheffield FC and Glapwell before ripping it up at FC Halifax Town – alongside a certain Jamie Vardy. But Gregory still remembers the conversation he had with Nicky Law during a brief spell on trial at Alfreton two decades ago.

"I was 17 or 18 and Nicky was the manager at Alfreton," he recalls. "He said to me one day, 'You don't have to be a professional. You can have a good career in Non-League. Get a job, do this on the side, put the extra money towards a house and you'll pay it off in 15 or 20 years'.

"I remember thinking 'You know, he's right'. That was my mentality when I was playing for Staveley Miners Welfare and Sheffield FC and Glapwell.

"By the time I got to 23, when I joined Halifax, I was like 'OK, this is my life - let's buy that house and stop dreaming."

Thankfully for Gregory, now 37, an intervention from Kim Holloway - wife of Ian - changed the course of his life

Gregory scored 29 National League goals for Halifax in the 2013-14 campaign. Holloway, then in charge of Millwall, was considering making an offer but feared the forward would struggle with the jump to the Championship.

"You could be the best player in the world but if you've not got the right opinion behind you, you're not going to go anywhere," says Gregory.

"It only takes one person to believe in you and in my case it was lan's wife. She was the one who said 'Go on, why don't you take a chance on the lad from Non-League?' That one opinion changed my life.

"I did have other clubs in the pipeline. I was always going to end up in the EFL that summer. But none of them were in the Championship. I know you make your own luck, but you need help along the way. I was very lucky that she said that to him, and that he listened to her."

Gregory is just another example of how different players will take different routes into the Football League. We're lucky we get to see a lot of them at before they really make it.



In 2020, Staunton moved to the Glovers and was an ever-present in their side, making almost 100 appearances; he captained the side and departed with the status of a club legend. Due to a lack of game time last season, the defender made the decision to move to National League outfit Boreham Wood.

However, after a short time with Boreham Wood, Staunton decided he needed to be closer to home and the opportunity of playing for Poole Town seemed the right move for him as he signed the contract on the 4th February and has started every league game since!



Weston-super-Mare FC - History

After Weston-super-Mare AFC were disbanded during WW2, the present club reformed in 1948 after a meeting at the Town Hall decided to form a semi-professional club.

Weston spent much of the next forty years or so in the Western League, until eventually claiming the title in the 1991/92 season under the management of John Ellener, who had taken over from the legendary Harry Thomas only a few years earlier. Thomas played over 700 games for the club and was also the player/manager for a five year spell.

This proved to be an exciting time in The Seagulls' history, particularly as strikers Matt Lazenby and Paul Elson scored goals for fun.

After Ellener left the club in 1993, he was replaced by coach Pete Amos. Len Ashurst then took over and oversaw another exciting period with excellent players such as Stuart Jones and Ryan Souter, who were sold to Sheffield Wednesday and Bury respectively to raise much-needed cash.

The new millennium brought more change for Weston as Frank Gregan was named manager and won the club promotion from the Southern League Western Division in 2002/03, with the runners-up spot clinched after a memorable victory at old local rivals, Clevedon Town.

The following season also proved to be successful as the side finished high enough to qualify for the brand new Conference South that started at the beginning of the 2004/05 season. That summer of 2004 was hugely significant as Weston also moved to their new Woodspring Stadium home, where The Seagulls still play to this day, although the ground is now known as the Optima Stadium.

In subsequent years, Weston often flirted with

relegation but were reprieved on each occasion, although there were also some happier times for

the club, particularly when manager Craig Laird led the side to seventh place in the Conference South in 2012/13. This proved to be Weston's highest ever finish in the footballing pyramid.

A few years later, in 2018/19, Weston were relegated. This has proved to be The Seagulls' only relegation ever. In the summer of 2019, Scott Bartlett took over as manager for the second time. Unfortunately, Weston's hopes of returning to Step 2 football were scuppered by Covid 19 as the next two seasons were declared null and void.

However, in Bartlett's second full season back in charge in the 2022/23 campaign, he led his side to the Southern Football League Premier South title. Bartlett's title-winning side was captained by Dayle Grubb, another player to have amassed hundreds of appearances for The Seagulls, either side of a two and a half year spell in the Football League with Forest Green Rovers.

The return to Step 2 football has helped continue Weston's progress. In 2023/24, The Seagulls finished thirteenth and equalled their longest ever run in the FA Trophy, before another exciting 2024/25 campaign where Weston qualified for the First Round Proper of the FA Cup for the sixth time before unluckily losing 3-1 at Bristol Rovers after extra-time, as well as finishing eighth and narrowly missing out on the play-offs in National League South, despite claiming their highest ever points tally in a Step 2 season.

After time at Hereford, Oxford United, Oxford City and AFC Totton, Max eventually joined Cheltenham Town in 2021.

During his time at Whaddon Road, Max spent four successful loan spells at Weston where he chalked up well over a hundred appearances for the club, and kept many clean sheets in the process. Max has also spent time at Redditch, Cinderford and Bath City before joining The Seagulls on a permanent deal in May 2025.

Jakob Glover

Since breaking into the Mangotsfield United first team at the age of 16, goalkeeper Jakob has also spent time with nearby Nailsea & Tickenham as well as training with Weston during the 2024/25 season, before formally signing for The Seagulls in July 2025.

Sam Avery

The popular central defender joined Weston in January 2020 after earlier spells at Chipping Norton, Carterton Town, Shortwood United, Bishops Cleeve and Gloucester City.

As well as being a composed defender, Sam also has an eye for goal as he is a threat from set-pieces, and his vital goals have endeared himself even more to the Optima Stadium faithful.

Emlyn Lewis

Club captain and centre-half Emlyn joined Weston in May 2024 after a long spell with Cardiff Met FC, where he combined playing with his extensive academic studies. Emlyn has also represented and captained the Wales C side, as well as featuring in the UEFA Europa League for Cardiff Met.

Dan Martin

The left-sided full-back joined Weston in May 2025, his second spell with The Seagulls having played on loan from Cardiff City in the 2019/20 season. Dan went on to feature on loan at Bath City before leaving Cardiff for Torquay United.

After leaving The Gulls in 2024 he joined Welling United but returned to Weston once more following The Wings' relegation.

Michael Smith

After spells in his native Northern Ireland with Ballyclare Comrades and Ballymena United, Michael moved to England in 2011 when he signed for Bristol Rovers. After earning a place in the PFA League Two team of the year in 2013/14 he then earned a move to Peterborough United. Michael spent three years with The Posh before joining Heart of Midlothian. During his six seasons in Edinburgh he won the Scottish Championship and was a Scottish Cup

runner-up on three occasions. In 2023 he moved to Yeovil Town and helped his new club to the National League South title in his first season, before joining Weston in July 2025 when he left Huish Park.

Michael is the owner of 19 Northern Ireland caps, scoring one goal against Germany in 2019.

Callum Wood

Left-footed defender Callum joined Weston on a permanent contract in May 2025, following his release from Championship side, Bristol City.

Callum is no stranger to the Optima Stadium having spent a loan spell there in March 2024, as well as temporary stints at Bath City and Hereford at Step 2 after starting his footballing journey at the age of 16 at Cinderford Town.

Jordan Bastin

Jordan signed from Tiverton Town in the summer of 2021 and has scored some important goals for Weston, including some Goal of the Season contenders along the way. Jordan spent time at Exeter City and Plymouth Argyle before a prolific spell at Elmore, prior to his move to Tiverton.

Ollie Chamberlain

Another 2024 signing, Ollie has played on the right side of defence and midfield in his first season with The Seagulls. Ollie started in the Taunton Town youth set-up before going on to play locally with Bridgwater and Wellington. After returning to Taunton he helped The Peacocks to two promotions and an appearance in the First Round proper of the FA Cup against Barrow.

Jason Pope

Jason is a versatile player, capable of playing on either flank as a full-back, at centre-half or as a midfielder. Jason came through the Exeter City Academy and then went on to spend part of the 2015/16 season at Weston. After being released from St James' Park in 2016, Jason joined Weston on a permanent deal. 'Popey' then spent time at Hereford and Bath City before signing for The Seagulls again in the summer of 2021.

Jacob Jagger Cane

Jacob came through the famous Exeter City ranks and had loan spells with Poole Town and Weymouth before joining Weston in August 2014. The popular midfielder has gone on to play over 400 games for The Seagulls and is an integral member of the squad. Jacob also had a spell in National League North with Hereford before re-joining Weston.

Will Dawes

Will started out as a Cheltenham Town scholar before being released in 2019. Will then turned his attentions to studying at Loughborough University, and whilst at Loughborough, Will played for Stratford Town. After his

impressive spell at Stratford, Yeovil Town signed Will in 2022. After two years at Huish Park, during which time he also spent time on loan at Weymouth and Oxford City, Will signed for Chippenham Town in June 2024, before joining Weston in March 2025, where he has played at both rightback and right-wing.

James Dodd

Another fine player to have emerged from Exeter City and went on to play a handful of games for The Grecians. James initially joined Weston on loan in September 2021 before joining permanently in the summer of 2022 despite interest from other clubs. During his time at the Optima Stadium, James has been a virtual ever-present and has chipped in with his fair share of goals.

Jake Hicks

In his final season at the Hand Stadium, Freddie scored 34 goals and assisted with 18 as The Seasiders narrowly missed out on promotion. On the eve of the 2025/26 Western League campaign, Freddie joined Bridgwater United on loan. He was recalled by Weston before going out on loan to Portishead in September 2025.

Upon leaving FGR, Scott returned to the Optima Stadium in May 2019. Since then, Scott has led The Seagulls to the Southern League Premier South title in 2022/23, before then guiding Weston to their highest-ever points tally in a Step 2 season in 2024/25. Has now managed Weston for over 300 games.

Scott Rogers

Rogers joined Weston as Scott Bartlett's assistant in the summer of 2023.

Rogers had been the manager of Tiverton Town, alongside his family member Martyn Rogers. Before being in charge at Tivvy, Scott was also player-manager at Willand Rovers.

His playing career took in the likes of Forest Green Rovers, Bath City, Newport County and Tiverton, where he scored the only goal in the 1999 FA Vase Final, the penultimate played at the old Wembley Stadium.

Taylor Cornish

Physiotherapist Taylor joined Weston from a similar role at Dorchester Town in September 2021. Physiotherapy is obviously a family trait as his dad Tony is the current physio at Tiverton Town.

Steve Laker

Goalkeeper coach Steve joined Weston in 2020 from Bridgwater United. 'Lakes' has earned UEFA B qualifications in Goalkeeping and Outfield and is Head of Goalkeeping for Weston's Academy.

Richard Joyce

Richard has been Weston's Opposition Analyst since the start of the 2023/24 season. He is also the first-team manager of Hellenic Premier League side, Thornbury Town.

Prior to this, Richard has been an analyst at Forest Green Rovers, Redditch United, Evesham United and Brimscombe & Thrupp, as well as being the Media Manager at Cheltenham Town.

Sam Trego

Sam has supported the football club from the terraces for many years, dating all the way back to Weston's Western League days. He is also a keen cricketer and eventually became groundsman at Weston-super-Mare Cricket Club. He now combines this role with being the Head Groundsman for Weston AFC.






