Fresh from a hard-earned 2-1 victory away at Tiverton Town, we turn our focus to back-to-back home fixtures against Weymouth and Dorchester - two clashes that could shape the rhythm of our

The win at Tiverton was more than just three points. It was a statement of intent. We showed discipline under pressure, character after conceding, and real quality going forward. The squad dug deep, managed the game intelligently, and proved that we can compete – and win – in tough environments.

Our goals that evening came from well-crafted moments and relentless drive. Hot on the heels of Weymouth comes another key matchup — Dorchester Town. Every derby carries its own story, but our approach remains the same: keep standards high, stay disciplined, and play with purpose.

Dorchester may be looking for form, but we won't underestimate them. Matches like this often hinge on small margins — first contacts, second balls, and maintaining concentration when the game gets stretched. If we stay switched on, we've got the quality to make the difference.

Squad rotation and recovery will play a part, but the core message is simple: build consistency. We want our performances to carry the same focus, aggression, and togetherness we showed in Devon — whether it's the first minute or the last.

The Tiverton result was a big step for us – not just because of the scoreline, but the way we earned it. We showed fight, unity, and composure. That's the identity we're building here. Now we have to take that energy into two important home games.

Weymouth and Dorchester are both big occasions for the club. and we'll be ready."

Momentum is everything at this stage of the season. The group has responded brilliantly in training, confidence is growing, and there's a real sense of purpose within the dressing room. Two home games, two big challenges - and the chance to show exactly what Poole Town are

Poole Town v Weymouth

Pitching In Southern League - Premier SouthSaturday 11th October 2025-3pm KO

What an amazing night it was on Tuesday as the Dolphins finally came away from Tiverton with all three points. It really does feel like the curse has been broken after four successive defeats at the lan Moorcroft Stadium.

As we know the games come thick and fast at this time of year so with no time to dwell on Tuesday, we move onto the first of our local derby's. We look forward to welcoming Weymouth to the Black Gold on Saturday ko 3pm. It's worth noting that there will be segregation in place for this game so perhaps allow a little extra time.

There have been many changes at Weymouth this season after the relegation from National League South last year. Not only changes to the playing squad but someone who we know well, Steve Claridge has taken over as first team manager. He brings a wealth of experience which is just what they appear to need now with many changes also at board level.

The Terras find themselves in 17th place in the table (P10 W2 D3 L5 9 points) and come into this match on the back of the FA Trophy defeat to Wimborne Town (2-0) last Saturday. Their best league performance of the season so far was the 4-1 win at The Bob Lucas Stadium against our last opponents Tiverton Town. Goals from Kieran Douglas, Tom Bearwish (2) and Luke Cook giving them an impressive victory. This was an improvement from the previous two home league fixtures against Gloucester City and Gosport Borough, both of which they lost. They have won one of their 4 away fixtures, the 2-0 win at Plymouth Parkway. They are 16th in the form table (P6 W1 D2 L3)

We last played a league match against Weymouth in 2018/19 season when they were promoted to the National League South as champions. We drew both matches with them, 2-2 at The Bob Lucas Stadium and 1-1 at The Black Gold.





As always there will be plenty of familiar faces in the visiting team, amongst them are likely to be defender Oakley Hanger who enjoyed a spell with us last season. Matty Burrows the pacey winger who was at Wimborne Town last season will almost certainly feature in their line-up. Steve Claridge has moved into the loan market with the signing of Bristol City U21 defender Max Davies. He has featured prominently in their recent matches.

The win at Tiverton moves us up to 3rd place (P9 W5 D3 L1 18 points) hard on the heels of the leading pack. The strike force of Shaq (9) and IK Hill (5) is proving to be extremely productive. We are also 3rd in the form table P6 W3 D3.

When the fixture list is released, the first match we look for are the local derby's against Weymouth, Wimborne and Dorchester. It's going to be an afternoon that we have really been looking forward to. We have played just four league matches at home due to our involvement in the cup competitions. We are playing in front of an average of just under 600 but there's little doubt that we will exceed this on Saturday.

Non-League Paper Column

IS there any better weekend in the English football calendar than the FA Cup first round proper?

We've long felt this is where we see the true heartbeat of English football – even through the qualifying rounds there are clubs living out their FA Cup dreams.

But the anticipation certainly builds as the proper stage of the competition approaches.

This weekend, 64 clubs take to the pitch hoping they can be one of the 32 Non-League names in the big draw televised on Monday night. Dreaming they can get the plum tie that catapults them into the spotlight and, potentially, changes the course of their future.

We know there will be at least one Step 4 side in the famous velvet bag with Isthmian North title hopefuls Maldon & Tiptree welcoming Flackwell Heath, of Southern League Division One Central.

The hosts have a manager in Kevin Horlock who knows all about the big moments in football. He, of course, scored for Manchester City in that famous comeback play-off final win over Gillingham at Wembley in 1999.

And in their squad they boast former Premier League players like Freddie Sears and Gary Hooper, who even scored for Celtic against Barcelona.

Horlock freely admits the pressure is on when it comes to delivering promotion this season for their ambitious owners, but a big FA Cup run would be an added bonus. Not that he's getting carried away with Flackwell Heath showing what they're all about in their 3-0 win at Step 3 Bracknell Town to get to this stage.

Two of their goalscorers that night – Jamie and Matthew Ayres – are the sons of manager Chris! How's that for an FA Cup fairytale if they could make it through to the first round proper?

Chris will be tuning in from holiday this week, however, with a long-booked trip of a lifetime to South Africa!

Runcorn Linnets are the other Step 4 side dreaming of glory. They upset Ashton United in the FA Cup third round qualifying and will need to overturn the odds again when they host National League North Buxton.

But the lowest-ranked side left in the competition are from Step 5 – and a team already familiar with the national stage following last season's FA Vase triumph.

Whitstable Town have knocked out three Step 3 sides – Dulwich Hamlet, Chichester City and Hungerford Town – to set up their away trip to Wealdstone.

It's already the club's best FA Cup run and manager Jamie Coyle has been putting in the hours with his management staff to do their homework on the National League Stones.

A quirk of how the fourth round qualifying regions had to be split ahead of the third round qualifying replays means Billericay Town are making the long trip to Spennymoor Town on Saturday, while Gateshead are heading in the other direction to Aveley!

And how about up-and-coming Farnham Town hosting one of the biggest games in their club's history when Sutton United are in town.

Sutton know all about causing an upset to create FA Cup history. Their motivation, as for many of the National League clubs this time out, is not to be on the other end this year!

Welcome to the back-toback Dorset Derbies against local rivals Weymouth and Dorchester. A particular welcome to our visitors, we look forward to a good attendance at both games and we wish you a safe journey home.

I want to think today about an unusual subject ... The media tell us a great deal about

the British royal family: their working lives ... marriages ... divorces ... health ... illnesses ... personal lives ... love affairs ... I could go on. But there's one thing we never hear about: their toilet habits! (a reference to the king's enlarged prostate or favourite toilet seat is the closest we get). There are some things that just don't seem appropriate in polite society'.

The Bible is NOT like that; instead it's grittily realistic and not afraid to surprise its readers. One of the more memorable passages is 1 Samuel chapter 24, where king Saul goes into a cave at En-gedi alongside the Dead Sea to relieve himself. At the time, Saul and three thousand of his soldiers were in hot pursuit of the fugitive David, who Saul wrongly thought was conspiring against him.

Little did Saul know that David and his band of men were hiding in the back of the cave! David's men urged him to kill Saul while he had the chance, but David made the choice not to do this tempting thing. Instead, once Saul had finished his business and left the cave, David walked out after him and called to him. He allowed the evidence to speak for itself about him not wanting to harm Saul and, like innocent people facing a false allegation, he trusted in the power of truth to come out so he would be released.

Truth is a powerful thing, but it's not just something abstract and impersonal. A thousand years after David, Jesus (born in the town and line of David) called himself THE truth and said (in John 8.32), "The truth will set you free". Whatever tempting shortcuts come your way, I hope you will choose truth.



The win takes Poole into third in the southern league premier south table. It also marks the first victory away at Tiverton in over 5 years, proving to be a tough place to go but now that curse has been broken

A cold night in Tiverton under the lights this evening on a tricky pitch, but it was a bright start from dolphins when Diaz had his shot cleared off the line.

That set the tone and from then it was pure Poole dominance, which led to an early penalty being given after Josh Staunton headed the ball onto a Tiverton hand and the ref pointed to the spot.

Shaq Gwengwe stepped up and had his penalty saved well but on the rebound managed to win a second penalty, getting to the ball before the Tiverton player and the defender brought him down.

On second attempt Shaq fired the ball into the top left corner and Poole took a deserved lead.

Tiverton responded with their own pressure, but it wasn't long before Poole doubled their lead after Selim Saied slid a delicate through ball to Ik Hill who beautifully slotted the ball away into the bottom corner.

Poole tried to finish the game off in the first half with a flurry of chances towards the end of the first half but were unable to and took a deserved 2-0 lead into the

The second half started in the same fashion as the end of the first with Poole trying to kill the game off, however Tiverton then started applying some real pressure which was the story of the second half.

Tiverton scored in the 51st minute after a cross was whipped in and the ball headed into the top corner by Asa Hall. Despite Poole responding almost immediately Tiverton were the ones on the front foot with their home fans cheering them on trying to find that equaliser.

The goal scorer Asa Hall had the best chances of the game for Tiverton in the second half but was unable to convert from inside the area.

Poole for the majority of the second half had to defend strong and the entire team had to be disciplined with the entire backline defending superbly and staying strong to hold on for the win.

Tiverton really threw everything at it towards the end but the Dolphins stayed resolute and stood firm to earn a hard fought win and take all three points back to Poole



Weymouth FC - History

Weymouth Football Club was founded in 1890. Formed as an amateur club the club is nicknamed "The Terras" due to the terra-cotta and blue quartered shirts they originally wore.

The club's impact on Dorset's football scene was immediate and we won the Dorset Junior Cup for the first three seasons, prompting the Dorset FA to re-classify us as a senior club.

After winning the Western League Championship in 1923, the club joined the Southern League and adopted professionalism. However financial difficulties led to the club returning to amateur status and the Western League in 1928.

After the Second War the club were forced to start again, in the Western League Division 2, but achieved promotion in 1948 and then third place in Division 1 the following season

Weymouth returned to the Southern League for the 1949-50 season and remained until becoming founder members of the Alliance Premier League in 1979-80, finishing as runners-up in the inaugural season.

The Terras became Southern League Champions in 1964-65 and 1965-66 and they share with Yeovil Town and Telford United the distinction of playing all 20 seasons in the Premier Division prior to it's temporary disbanding.

Weymouth have enjoyed considerable FA Cup success: in 1949 they became Manchester United's first FA Cup opponents back at Old Trafford after the War and were not disgraced in a 0-4 defeat, in the 3rd round. In 1962 we reached the Fourth round before losing 0-2 away at Preston North End.

In 1987 the club moved from its harbourside Recreation Ground to the Wessex Stadium and - for a while - it looked as if promotion to the Football League would materialize. After coming close, however, the club were relegated back to the Southern League (1989) - and even lower - before returning to the Premier Division in 1997.

Following a succession of seasons treading water, the club was taken over in 2004 and a new board of directors installed Steve Claridge as player-manager with a mission to bring success to the club.

Galvanising club and town, with league attendances averaging 1490, Claridge led the Terras to runners-up spot in his first season and promotion to the Nationwide South League.

The club returned to full time professionalism in 2005 and celebrated with the Nationwide South title at the end of that season.

Our initial season back in the Conference resulted in an 11th place finish, but the club struggled the following season before being led to safety by manager John Hollins. His tenure ended at the start of 2008 and Alan Lewer became manager in January 2009.

At the start of 2009 Weymouth's financial difficulties surfaced, leading to the resignation of chairman Curtis. Former chairman lan Ridley replaced him in March and - days later - Lewer

was replaced by former Welsh manager Bobby Gould. Despite his experience the club was relegated, having only gained a single point since the majority of the first team had walked out in February.

In May the club brought in Matty Hale - a popular explayer - as their new manager, with another ex-player lan Hutchinson as his assistant.

After a disappointing start to the 2009-10 season Hale stepped down and Hutchinson was appointed caretaker manager. Following months of financial problems and near liquidation the club was taken over by George Rolls at the end of November 2009. After defeat by Chelmsford City in mid January 2010 Hutchinson was dismissed - followed by his assistant Andy Mason - and replaced by ex-Birmingham City player Jerry Gill. However, Gill only lasted 44 days before he resigned leaving assistant Andy Harris in charge.

At the end of the 2009-10 season the club were relegated from the Blue Square South to the Zamaretto Premier League. Ian Hutchinson and Andy Mason returned to the club at the beginning of the following season with the task of rebuilding the Terras' squad on a vastly reduced budget.

After two post Christmas defeats Hutchinson was again relieved of his duties and succeeded by the vastly experienced Martyn Rogers, a former successful manager of Tiverton Town and ex-Weymouth player. Rogers successfully steered the club away from the relegation places but was not awarded a contract for the 2010-11 season as the club appointed local man (and another ex-player) Brendon King to the manager's role with Mattie Groves as his assistant.

In February 2012 a consortium of local men and club supporters, led by then Chairman Nigel Biddlecombe, were able to buy the club and set about trying to both stabilize the Terras and lead it's recovery.

After a good 9th place finish in 2012-13 results were disappointing as 2013-14 got going and King paid the price when he was replaced by the club's vastly experienced goalkeeper Jason Matthews, initially as caretaker, who has taken to the mantle of playermanager with fantastic enthusiasm.

Jason certainly made his mark during his first season in charge but the Terras fell agonising short missing out on the play offs after being well placed at Christmas. The same story occurred in the following season where the Terras again missed out on a play off place on the last day of the season.

The 2016-2107 season was also a major disappointment for the club as yet again we fell

short finishing 10th. Matthews paid the price for the underperformance and left the club after the final of the Dorset Senior Cup with Mark Molesley and Paul Maitland acting as caretaker managers. Mark's credentials and skill immediately impressed the club's board who acted quickly to appoint Mark as manager before the last game of the season. This faith was repaid by the influx of quality players and a brand of exciting football. It was so near yet so far as despite qualify for the end of season play offs the Terras were undone by three wonder goals after a long midweek trip to Kings Lynn to miss out on the chance of promotion.

The Terras went one better in 2018-2019 by not only winning the Southern League Premier South on the last day of the season in front of nearly 2700 fans but they also won the overall Champions of the Southern League by defeating the Premier Central winner Kettering Town on penalties. We now look forward to playing in the National League South in 2019-2020.

The 2019/20 season turned into a very strange season indeed. The Terras performed really well and when the outbreak of Covid-19 kicked in and lockdown followed the Terras were in

3rd place in the league. Many months passed and then finally it was decided that the play-offs would take place and on Saturday 1st August the Terras defeated Dartford on penalties in the National South Play-Off Final to gain a double bonus promotion and find themselves back in the National League after a long ten year wait. Double promotion winning manager Mark Moseley moved onto the EFL with Southend Utd and under new manager Brian Stock, the Terras faithful are really looking forward to the season ahead. Following two seasons in the National League, the Terras returned to the National League South with the Terras miraculously escaping relation on the last day of the season at relegation candidates Dover Athletic. Both survived as results relegated Dulwich Hamlet.

Matty Burrows

Although born in Sheffield, Matty is very much a local lad having honed his skills in local football in Weymouth for Melcombe, Redlands, Balti Sports and Portland United.

The promising youngster featured heavily for our U23s in 2022/23 and made five appearances for the first team that season before moving on to pastures new at AFC Totton and then Wimborne. This season marks a second stint at the club for the popular forward-thinking player.

Callum Smalley

Our imposing gloveman Callum has returned to the club following a spell at fellow Dorset club Hamworthy Recreation.

As a teen he was involved in the youth setups at Bristol Rovers and then YeOvil before enjoying first team football at Bridport.

His first taste of football at the Bob Lucas stadium was mainly for the U23s for whom he starred but he did break into the first team squad on many occasions in 2024/25, featuring twice. We are very pleased to have him back for another spell at the club!

Calvin Brooks

Probably a shoe-in for the next player to be called "Mr. Weymouth", Calvin will be looking to break more club records this season as he moves towards 400 competitive appearances in his 11th season at the club.

Born in Dortmund, Germany, the right back who likes to get forward started his career at Yeovil Town but

first joined the Terras back in 2014. He has had spells away from the Bob Lucas with Dorchester and Salisbury but he returned to the fold in 2023.

Already 15th on the all-time competitive appearances list, he will be looking to pass some other legends this campaign as he cements his place at one of the Weymouth greats.

Reuben Reid

Born in Bristol in 1988, Reuben was a promising youth cricketer, making the second XI of the Gloucestershire county cricket team before concentrating on football.

He joined Plymouth Argyle at the age of 17, embarking on a 12 year career in the football league at various clubs before dropping into non league to play for Yeovil in 2020 for two seasons. Most recently he featured for Westonsuper-Mare for a trio of campaigns.

Andreas Robinson

Midfielder "Sonny" enjoyed a dream debut season with the Terras in 2019/20, helping to secure promotion to the Conference National through the playoffs.

He would go on to feature heavily in both seasons in the top tier of the non-league before leaving for Gosport Borough but he rejoined for his second spell in claret & blue from the start of last season.

A Bournemouth lad, he actually joined rivals Southampton academy from the age of 8 but only make a couple of first team appearances before signing for Bolton Wanderers although he never turned out for the Lancashire side.

Born in Poole, the Dorset man enjoyed a youth career with AFC Bournemouth but was released in 2017 at the age of 23 and, following a brief spell at Yeovil, signed for Weymouth for the 2017/18 season. His impact was immediate with 38 league goals as the Terras reached the Southern league playoffs.

However his 37 goals and numerous assists the next season were instrumental in the club winning the Southern league and promotion to the Conference South and, for Brandon, an England C cap against Wales.

Brandon left in the summer of 2018 for Southend United in the football league but would return for two more spells in 2021 and then from 2023.

Goodship then spent a season at Salisbury. Before making his second return to the Terras over the summer prior to the 23/24 season!

Callum Watts

Signed from Salisbury for an undisclosed fee, attacking midfielder Callum boasts a wealth of experience at conference south level with the Whites as well as Taunton, Bath & Chelmsford City.

Dorchester Town FC - History

The history of Dorchester Town Football Club can be traced back originally to 1871 and the founding of The Dorchester Football Club. Like many clubs of that era, the Club played the rules of football that later evolved to become what is known today as rugby, but nevertheless the club quickly "attained an enviable reputation for respectability and skill" according to the Dorset County Chronicle.

By the end of the decade, the craze of Association Rules for the game of football had swept along the south coast, and on Monday, 18th October 1880, the town's men gathered in The Kings' Arms Hotel to "resuscitate" The Dorchester Football Club under association rules. They would play their home games at The Recreation Ground on Weymouth Avenue, which was home to the cricket club in the summer months. Leonard Robinson became the club's first-ever captain, a position he would hold for many years.

Due to the importance of the town's economy to the wider region, while most of the country typically took their half-holiday on a Saturday afternoon, the townsfolk of Dorchester took theirs on a Thursday, the day after market day. While the Saturday team of Dorchester Football Club struggled in the Dorset League, the Thursday team excelled. The town's unique weekend arrangements meant that many Dorchester clubs struggled to organise matches with opposition on Thursdays or to muster a team for Saturday matches outside of town. In the 1908/09 season, the club imposed a policy of only playing fellow Dorchester teams and visiting military teams.

However, this policy only lasted for one season, and in the following year, an alternative plan was drawn up. On 26 August 1910, representatives from Dorchester United (cricket), Rovers (cycling), Athletic, and Wanderers attended The Dorchester Football Club AGM and agreed to join them to create "a team worthy of the good old town of Dorchester."

It was here that the club adopted its new name of Dorchester Town Football Club to signify its new united ambition for the town. In 1929, the club moved from the Recreation Ground to the dedicated Avenue Football Ground. Just five years later, a remarkable event took place at the ground on 30 August 1934. To commemorate the centenary of the Tolpuddle Martyrs, Lloyd George MP, the last of the Liberal Prime Ministers held a rally at a packed Avenue Ground. In the afternoon, Dorchester Town hosted the London Labour Football Club, followed in the evening by a game against an international workers' XI.

With post-war football thriving across the country, the club joined the Western League in 1947 and two years later turned professional with Mr. K.W. Holland declaring, "People will not turn up in large numbers to watch Dorset league football." With the club now averaging gates of between 1000-1500, the club were able to attract bigger names to the club - none more so than former Wolves Goalkeeper, Ken Bird, who joined as player-manager from AFC Bournemouth. Bird quickly led the Magpies to success, winning the Western League Championship in 1954/55. The same year also saw us reach the First Round Proper of the FA Cup. Oualifying rounds saw us score victories over Poole, Bournemouth Gasworks, Portland and Winchester. In the first round, the club hosted fellow non-leaguer's Bedford Town in front of a gate of 3,500. A 2-0 win saw the club rewarded with the

plum tie of York City at home. A record crowd of 5,750 packed out the Avenuem Ground, but despite taking the lead, the Magpies would fall short, losing 5-2. York would go on to make the semi-finals that year.

The following year (1955/56), Dorchester Town once again made the first round proper. Having put aside Newport IoW in the final qualifying round, the club was drawn away to Norwich City. A packed Carrow Road saw the Magpies fall to a 4-0 defeat. They again reached the First Round proper in 1956/57. After being taken to a replay by Bideford, their reward was a trip to Loftus Road to face Queen's Park Rangers, where they once again fell to a 4-0 defeat. For the fourth year running, Dorchester Town reached the First Round Proper in a campaign that really turned heads. A local derby was on the cards in the fourth qualifying round as the club was drawn away to then high-flying local rivals Weymouth. Almost 6,000 were in attendance as a 2-2 draw brought them back over the Ridge, where a packed-out Avenue Ground watched the Magpies defeat the old enemy 2-1. The prize was the visit of the then-famous amateur team and indeed holders of the FA Amateur Cup - Wycombe Wanderers. The Magpies ran out 3-2 winners in a pulsating game. An away trip to Plymouth Argyle would await, but again, they would stumble to a heavy defeat to league opposition, this time 5-2. Then in '59, Dorchester Town were at it again. A Dinky Curtis goal against Weymouth gave the club another derby cup victory and put them in the First Round hat, where they were drawn away to Port Vale. Bill Gillett equalised, but the team slipped to a narrow 2-1

The club joined the Southern League (South) in 1972 and five years later finished runners-up to Margate to gain promotion to the Premier Division. The following season saw the Magpies curtailed by the formation of The Alliance League (now The National League). Struggling in their initial season in the Premier Division (1978-79), they fell four places short of making the cut into the new league and were placed into the reformed Southern Division. Dorchester Town celebrated their centenary season by winning the Southern Division at the first time of asking, but with no promotion to the Alliance Premier in its first season of existence, they were denied the chance to play at the highest level of non-league football.

The following season, the club once again tasted FA Cup glory. A replay win over Minehead saw them rewarded with an all-Dorset clash at home to AFC Bournemouth in front of a sold-out Avenue Ground

A famous Paul Thorne goal took the club back to Dean Court, where a last gasp extra-time goal broke Magpies hearts.

A severe financial crisis hit in the mid-eighties, with relegation and near bankruptcy. However, a remarkable season in 1986/87 saw the club win the league and return to the Premier Division. Having come so close to losing the club in the late 80s, Peter Aiken and the board realised that the old Avenue Ground had begun to outlive its purpose and brokered a deal with Tesco and the landowners, the Duchy of Cornwall, to develop a new stadium for the club. The move saw Dorchester Town establish themselves in the Southern Premier in the early 90s, before Stuart Morgan took over and led the club to sixth in 1994/95 and fourth in 1997/98, along with cup success including reaching the FA Cup First Round Proper once again, where they were knocked out away at Oxford United,

That season also saw the club reach the last sixteen of the FA Trophy. Having beaten Slough, Sutton, and Salisbury, the club hosted Woking at a sold-out Avenue Stadium. In a highly eventful game that will go down in club folklore, the Cards (and eventual winners) scored in the last minute to win 3-2. After a poor start to the 1999/2000 season, manager Stuart Morgan was relieved of his position as manager and was replaced by Mark Morris. Morris was able to steer the club out of the relegation zone in his first season but was unable to repeat the feat the following season when the Magpies lost the Premier Division place they had held for fourteen seasons. That season did see the club again reach the FA Cup First Round Proper, where, despite taking the lead, they lost 2-1 away to high-flying Wigan Athletic.

The Magpies threatened to regain their Premier Division status in their first season in the Eastern Division but finished in third place. However, they achieved their objective the following season, when after a fine campaign with only five defeats, the club returned to the Premier Division as Champions.In the first season back in the Premier Division, the club reached the play-offs for promotion to the newly launched Conference South. Having won away at Bath City, a swan-song Matty Holmes performance inspired the stripes to a 2-0 victory over Tiverton at Exeter City's St James' Park to become founding members of the Conference South. The Magpies almost reached the play-offs once again in their inaugural season in the Conference South, but missed out on another promotion opportunity on the final day of the season. The following season saw Mark Morris resign to be replaced by Mick Jenkins. Jenkins reign was short lived and the club went through a handful of managers until former Dorchester player and reserve team manager Phil Simkin took over. The club stalwart guided the Magpies to their greatest FA Cup triumph in the modern era as the club beat Plymouth Argyle 1-0 in the first round proper, in a

match televised live. The reward was a trip to Luton Town in the second round, where the Magpies narrowly lost 2-1 in a pulsating game. Simkin would lead the Magpies to eight in the Conference South the following season, before financial difficulties hit the club and they were subsequently relegated to the Southern Premier League South. Whilst the club fought to get its finances back in order, the club spent many years in the wilderness, constantly fighting against relegation.

That would eventually change when former player Glenn Howes returned to the club as manager and sparked a revival. That revival was further enhanced when Howes invited Tommy Killick to return to the club half way through the 23/24 season, to take over as manager, with Howes becoming his number two. Killick - an Avenue cult hero in his playing days - had seen remarkable success as manager at Poole Town, spanning well over a decade. Howes had been his number two at Poole for a number of years before embarking on his own managerial career, where he led Blackfield & Langley from the Wessex 1 to the Southern Premier League. Now reunited, the pair led Dorchester to 9th place in the 2023/24 season, before reaching the play-offs the following season. The Magpies would lose out to eventual play-off winners AFC Totton in the last minute of extra-time in a remarkable game.

Goalkeepers

Gerard Benfield

Gerard Benfield re-joined the Magpies for a second spell in August 2024. Born on 28 September 1997 in Poole, Benfield began his career at Hamworthy United, before moving stepping up a couple of levels with Wimborne Town. His exploits at Cuthbury attracted the attention of Salisbury where he featured during the 19/20 season, before once again stepping up a level to join then National League side Weymouth in 2000. In August 2021, Benfield joined Dorchester Town on a short-term loan, making 16 appearances during the 2021–22 season. Spells with Weymouth, Salisbury and Wimborne followed, before he rejoined The Magpies on loan from Weymouth in 2024. His reliable performances in the first half of the season led to the move being made permanent in January 2025. Known for his commanding presence and shotstopping abilities, Benfield brings a wealth of experience to the squad.

Josey Casa-Grande

Josey joined the Magpies in August 2025 on loan from Bristol City, as injury cover for Gerard Benfield. Highly thought of at Ashton Gate, the young Welshman had spells on loan in the National League South last season at Bath City, Weymouth and Chippenham Town.

Defenders

Jack Dickson

A versatile right-sided player, joined Dorchester Town in 2023 following a long stint with Poole Town. Comfortable in both defensive and attacking roles, Dickson's pace and ability to beat a man one-on-one has often seen him hailed as one of the best right backs in the league. In 2020 he spent a year in the National League with Weymouth, before returning to Poole Town the following season. Dickson made over 242 appearances for the Dolphins before moving to the Avenue Stadium in September 2023, where he has quickly established himself as one of the first names on the team sheet and one of the best right backs in the league.

Thomas Fu

A promising, young centre back, Fu was a member of Dorchester's U23's last season as well as spending time with Christchurch and Shaftesbury to gain further experience. Previous clubs: Hong Kong FC

Brooklyn Genesini

Young right back who came through AFC Bournemouth's academy. He joined Swindon Town in 2023, where he had loan spells at both Yeovil Town and Weymouth. Joined The Magpies in August 2025.

Ollie Haste

A versatile left-sided defender, Haste signed with Dorchester Town permanently from Yeovil

Town in August 2024, following an impressive season on loan. Haste's all action displays during his seasonlong loan saw him win the Supporters' Player of the Season award and he further delighted Dorchester fans by making the move permanent the following summer, despite interest from numerous other clubs. Haste said at the time



of signing: "It feels great to be a Dorchester player. I fell in love with the club the moment I came in on loan. The club has a clear vision to succeed that I want to continue where we left off. I had options at the end of last year but after discussions with family and friends, Dorch was always the right answer."The 21-year old previously won the Southern Premier League South whilst on loan from the Glovers at Truro City and also spent a period on loan at his hometown club, Barnstaple.

Harry Hutchinson

A versatile left-sided defender who is also comfortable further forward on the wing, Hutchinson signed for the club in June 2023 from Poole Town. Hutchinson was a regular in the Dolphins side for

a couple of seasons before making the switch to link up with boss Tom Killick again, while also previously impressing during his time whilst at neighbours Portland United. Son of former Magpie Ian Hutchinson, he also spent a month at fellow Southern League Premier South side Winchester City last campaign before returning to The



Avenue and becoming a regular in the Magpies side.

Will Spetch

Experienced defender Will Spetch, joined the Magpies in September 2023 from neighbours Poole Town. A hugely experienced centre back, Spetch made over 450 appearances for the Dolphins, having first joined them in the Wessex League in 2007-08. Spetch quickly made a name for himself with his leadership

and aerial prowess, attracting the likes of AFC Bournemouth and Portsmouth. He made the move in to full-time football in March 2014, joining Sutton United. Injury however hampered his season with the U's and he returned to Poole the following season, where he'd go on to play for Tommy Killick for another 11 seasons. Following Killicks departure from Poole, he made the move across Dorset along with Corby Moore and Jack Dickson, where his powerful displays and obvious leadership qualities soon endeared him to the Magpies faithful. His threat at set pieces saw him score eight times in his debut season. He scored four the following season, including a memorable 98th minute winner on the last day of the season at Hungerford, which secured a place in the play-offs.

Ieuan Turner

A product of the club's youth system, Ieuan Turner has emerged as a promising central defender. Turner captained both the U18 and U23 teams to league and cup glory, whilst also dual registered with Wessex Premier League side, Bournemouth, where he awarded the player-of-the-season. A physically imposing centre back, he made his senior Dorchester debut in the 2023–24 season, making 23 appearances and scoring his first senior goal in the final away game at Basingstoke Town, before going on to start 21 times the following season.

Harvey Wright

A summer signing from Dorset neighbours Wimborne Town, Harvey is powerful and dynamic centre back, who has won titles and awards where ever he has been. Wright came through the youth ranks at Poole Town before joining Wessex League side Christchurch, where he was a crucial part of the squad that went on a memorable FA Cup run, reaching the third qualifying round where they narrowly lost on penalties to Dulwich Hamlet, live on the BBC. From Christchurch he joined Hamworthy United, helping the Hammers win the Wessex League and reach the Southern League South play-offs the following season. Wright rejoined Poole Town in 2023 where he won the Dolphins' Player of the Year award in his debut season in the Southern Premier League. He joined Wimborne the following season, where he won the Player's Player of the Year award and Chairman's Player of the Year Award.

Midfielders

Matt Buse

Buse joined Dorchester Town in July 2024 from National League South side Truro City. A combative central midfielder, Buse has extensive experience at Step One and Two of the non-league ladder, having previously featured clubs including Yeovil Town, Torquay United and Weymouth, whilst also making over 100 appearances for Taunton Town. In his debut season at The Avenue, Buse was a regular in the Magpies side, showing both his defensive and

attacking versatility with appearances in addition to his usual central midfield role at wing-back and also further forward in attacking midfield, chipping in with an impressive six goals in his debut season at The Avenue.

Wes Fogden

The former AFC Bournemouth, Portsmouth and Yeovil midfielder returned to the Avenue Stadium in the summer of 2024, fifteen years after making his senior footballing debut with the Magpies. Fogden initially signed for the Magpies from Brighton & Hove Albion, playing over forty times for the club in the then Conference South. His battling and creative displays saw him join big spenders Havant & Waterlooville, with whom he won back-to-back promotions with to the National League. His displays for the Portsmouth-based club saw him move into the Football League, firstly with AFC Bournemouth where he featured over 50 times for the Cherries before joining Portsmouth FC for the 2014-15 season. He moved to Yeovil the following season before returning to Havant & Waterlooville in 2016. Fogden joined Dorking Wanderers in 2020, where he helped the club gain promotion from the National League South, and then spent two seasons under Tommy Killick at Poole Town before returning home to the Avenue Stadium to reunite with Killick ahead of the 2024/25. Appointed Player/Coach in Summer 2025.

Corby Moore

Midfielder Moore joined the Magpies from Poole Town in September 2023. A metronomic central midfielder, he began his career with Southampton, where he made his debut in a League Cup tie against Stevenage Borough. He moved to the United States in 2014, joining Indy Eleven, before returning to the UK to sign for then-Conference National side, Forest Green Rovers. In January 2016 he joined National League South side Bishops Stortford, before making the switch to Chelmsford City the following season. Following his release from the National League South side, Moore joined Poole Town where he went on to make 260 appearances for the Dolphins, where he was an integral part of the team that won promotion to the National League South. Corby moved to the Avenue in September 2023 alongside Will Spetch and Jack Dickson, where he was soon to be reunited with Killick once again. He quickly established himself as a vital part

of the Magpies midfield, where his composure and tactical awareness allow him to dictate play from the centre of the pitch.

Cameron Murray

Murray returned to The Avenue Stadium in the summer of 2025, having first featured for the club in 2018. The technically gifted midfielder came through the Academy of Leeds United, before signing for neighbours

Bradford City. He signed for York City in 2013, before going on to feature for club's such as Scarborough United, FC United of Manchester and Stalybridge Celtic in the Northern Premier League. Murray moved to Dorset in 2018, joining the Magpies for his first spell. Murray stood out in a struggling team and his energetic and creative displays soon caught the attention of local rivals Weymouth, Murray made the move over the Ridgeway. where he played a significant part in their back-to-back promotions to the National League. A change of manager saw Murray team up with Tommy Killick at Poole, joining on loan initially in 2022 before making the move permentent the following season. Killick's departure saw Murray move to Southern Premier League side Gosport Borough last season, before re-joining The Magpies the following summer.

Luke Pardoe

Luke Pardoe joined Dorchester Town in February 2024, bringing versatility and experience to the midfield. A cultured winger, who can also fill in at full-back, he began his career with AFC Bournemouth's youth setup. Upon his release from the Cherries, he joined Poole Town, where he made over a 100 appearances before his move to the Magpies. Since joining Dorchester, Pardoe has contributed both in attack and defense, showcasing his tactical nous and adaptability. He scored a memorable sixth minute goal in the 2024/25 play-off semi-final, where his mazy run from the half-way line saw him beat four Totton defenders, before slotting home to put the Magpies ahead.

Kyran Samadi

An exciting and direct winger who can play on either flank, Kyran began his career with Eastleigh, coming through the Hampshire club's academy system. He first teamed up with Tommy Killick in 2023, where he went on to feature thirty times for the Dolphins in his debut season in men's football. He followed Killick across Dorset, joining The Magpies in July 2024.

Tom Smith

Joined Dorchester Town in June 2025 from Taunton Town. A cultured, goalscoring midfielder, Smith began his career with Swindon Town, before joining National Leugue South side Bath City. Smith became a Twerton Park icon during a seven-year spell, where he made over 260 appearances and scored over 50 goals for The Romans. He was notably named National League South Player of the 2019–20 Season. He left Bath in the Summer of 2024 to sign for fellow Somerset side, Taunton Town, where he captained the team to a top-half finish. Known for his forward runs, creativity and goal contributions, his arrival is seen as a significant coup for Magpies manager Tom Killick, who had been a long-term admirer.

Charlie Wooding

A young and highly promising midfielder, Wooding joined the Magpies in August 2025 having impressed on trial during the pre-season of 2025/26. An England Schoolboys international, Wooding came through the academy system at Salisbury FC, where he made his

Southern Premier League debut aged just 16. In search of more playing time, Wooding signed for Bashley in 2024, where he impressed hugely in his debut season in the Southern League South Division. In January last season, he made the switch to league rivals Westbury United, where he went on to win a number of man of the match awards and picked up February's Player of the Month award. His calm

and mature displays at such a young age caught the

attention of Tommy Killick, who invited him to trial

with the Magpies this summer.

A Northern Ireland U21 international, Daws is an electric wide-forward who began his career with AFC Bournemouth, coming through the Cherries' academy, where he enjoyed a fruitful loan spell under Tommy Killick at Poole Town. Daws joined Luton Town in 2023, but left the then-Premier League club the following season. He reunited with Killick at Dorchester in January 2024, where he got back to enjoying his football and playing with confidence once again. He joined AFC Totton briefly at the beginning of 2024/25 season but returned to The Avenue in October, where his end of season form was a major factor in The Magpies getting into the Playoffs that season.

Joe Parker

Joe began his career at Gloucester City, where his goalscoring exploits quickly attracted the attention of Newport County. With the arrival of James Rowe Joe opted to leave and was sold to Leamington where he played as a right winger. It was a role that he also occupied at Chippenham Town and one that he was brought back to City to



fill with the aim of him feeding Danny Wright in the middle.he former Newport County forward scored 11 times in 15 games at the end of a 2023-24 campaign that saw Yellows retain their Pitching In Southern League Premier Division South status. It is without argument that Joe's goals were a huge factor in that. Agreeing signing originally on loan from Gloucester City in 2024, Joe went on to score 21 goals for The Yellows in 58 appearances.

Dorchester Town FC - Players

Luke Roberts

Roberts signed for Dorchester Town in January 2024, where the former Poole Town forward arrived following a highly successful spell working with boss Tom Killick, making over 170 appearances for the Dolphins in a 5-year spell during which time he attracted interest from full-time professional clubs. Hailed by Killick as "probably the best I have ever managed", Roberts has overcome terrible luck with injuries following a serious knee ligament injury, and having worked his way back to full fitness became a regular in the side last season, impressing the Magpies faithful with his performances on the wing.

Wayne Robinson

Signed in the summer of 2024 from Salisbury, Robinson arrived at The Avenue having won back-to-back promotions in the previous two seasons, firstly at Sholing before gaining promotion from the Southern League Premier South with the Wiltshire side. Niggling injuries impacted his debut season with the Magpies, but the lively forward still made telling contributions both through the middle and from wider positions. His most memorable moment at The Avenue came in a dramatic 3-2 win against Basingstoke Town last season, with the Magpies scoring twice in injury time and Robinson netting the crucial 90+5th minute winner at the Bypass End to send the crowd wild.

Brett Pitman

A highly experienced and decorated centre forward, the former AFC Bournemouth striker joined the Magpies in March 2025, scoring a memorable 16-minute hatrick on his debut. The Jersey-born forward is a prolific goalscorer with a wealth of experience in the Football League, scoring over 180 goals across the Championship,



League One and League Two for clubs including AFC Bournemouth, Bristol City, Ipswich and Portsmouth. Pitman made the move into non-league football in recent seasons, scoring over 50 goals in consecutive seasons for AFC Portchester and then Shaftesbury, before moving to The Avenue Stadium. A coach with AFC Bournemouth's academy, this season Brett will assist Tommy Killick as Player/Coach.

Coaching Staff:

Tom Killick

Manager Killick returns to the Avenue following a hugely successful 20 year spell as manager at Poole Town, where he took charge of nearly 1,000 games. He guided the Dolphins from the tenth tier to the National League South. The ex-Magpies striker is fondly remembered at the Avenue from his playing days in the 1990s scoring a number of memorable goals in the black & white stripes. Killick returned home in September 2023, to link up with Glenn Howes again, the two having played together at Basingstoke and later spells together at Salisbury and Poole Town.

James Wood

First team Coach Wood joined the club from AFC Totton in October 2021, having worked alongside Howes at both Blackfield & Langley and The Stags. Following his playing career, Wood stepped into management with Wessex League side Bournemouth Poppies, where a successful three year stint almost culminated in leading them to a shock league title. He joined Poole Town as Tommy Killick's assistant and alongside then coach, Howes. He left Poole to join Howes at Blackfield, where they have built up a partnership that has seen success wherever they go.

Brian Churchill

First Team Coach Churchill is an experienced coach and UEFA B licensed coach, who has previously been involved with AFC Bournemouth's academy, as well as spells at Swanage Town & Herston and Hamworthy United. Was head coach of the club's highly successful U23's side before stepping aside at the end of last season.

Steve Dodge

Goalkeeper Coach An experienced goalkeeper who came up through the same Dorchester Town Youth team as former Liverpool player David West, Dodge went on to a career with Dorchester, Weymouth, Bashley and Christchurch amongst others, before moving into coaching with Portland United.
