

Poole Town v Gosport Borough

Pitching In Southern League - Premier South Saturday 1st November 2025- 3.00pm KO

The Dolphins will not appreciate another week like last week. An away trip to Gloucester City on Saturday followed by the long trip to Taunton on Wednesday and finish the week with another journey south to Plymouth Parkway the following Saturday. We came out of it with 3 league points from Taunton and exited the FA Trophy after losing the penalty shoot-out at Plymouth 7-6.

So, much calmer waters this week with a little more recovery time and the home league fixture against Gosport Borough on Saturday ko3pm.

We have had injury doubts over Billy Lowes, Selim Saied, and Shaquille Gwengwe but Joe Lea has told me this week that all, except Billy Lowes are in contention to play.

We go into the match in 3rd place (P13 W8 D3 L2 27points) and still unbeaten at home in the league. Of course, Pat Suraci and Joe Lea will need no introductions to the visitors who are in the chasing pack and currently in 6th position. In mid-October the Borough board decided to make a change to their management structure which resulted in Glenn Howes taking full control of the first team with his assistant Mark Summerhill. Glenn is well known to us and wore the Dolphins red and white until his playing career was sadly brought to a premature end. Since then, he has been a very successful coach at Blackfield & Langley, Dorchester Town and now Gosport Borough. As a player he represented Eastleigh, Basingstoke, Newport, Gosport, Dorchester and Poole. He has gained a great deal of experience at this level. Gosport themselves are right there at the top end of the table and have already picked up away wins at Chertsey 3-1 and Weymouth 2-0. Only Gloucester City on 31, have scored more goals than Borough who have clocked up 30 so far with Ethan Taylor leading the way on 5. On Saturday they picked up a valuable point in their local derby at Sholing. It came with almost the last kick of the match from Ben Greenwood after something of a goalmouth scramble. The game ended 2-2.





Making a substitute appearance in that match was the Gosport legend Dan Wooden who first joined the club all the way back in 2010 after impressing coach Tony Stares during his time at Moneyfields. Operating as a left winger or striker, Woody helped the Boro to back-to-back promotions from the Southern League Division One South & West to the Conference South - both via the playoffs. The success kept on coming as well, with Dan featuring in the 2014 FA Trophy final at Wembley and in an FA Cup First Round tie against Colchester United. He finally returned to Privett Park this summer, much to the delight of their fans.

Non-League Paper Column

THE week leading up to Halloween proved to be something of a horror show for Non-League bosses everywhere as the managerial merry-go-round clicked into overdrive.

As a result, it caused endless nightmares for us at NLP Towers as the news pages had to be constantly updated and, in the case of John Coleman's Friday afternoon arrival at Aldershot Town, ripped up and rewritten completely. We were perhaps given a sign of what was to come when Kettering Town announced the departure of Simon Hollyhead just minutes after their 4-0 defeat at Redditch United on Saturday with the former assistant at Champions League side Malmö having resigned from his Poppies' post at two days previous.

It's fair to say it wasn't a good week for Isthmian League bosses with a high percentage of departures coming in and around the M25.

Club legend Drew Cooney left East Grinstead Town after four years in charge.

Cooney made over 500 appearances for the Wasps before taking over the hotseat in 2021.

He quit after picking up just one win from his opening 11 games in charge of the Isthmian South East club. League rivals Hastings United also made a change with former Whitehawk boss David Altendorff replacing Lee Carey in the U's hotseat, while former England manager Peter Taylor stood down at Isthmian North side Canvey Island after five months in charge following the Gulls' midweek defeat to Benfleet in the Essex Senior Cup. Tilbury too have new joint-bosses with George Christou and Jack Toghli coming in for Marc Harrison and Liam Wallace, who left the Dockers by mutual consent. It was all change also at Lewes after it was announced that popular former boss Craig Nelson had returned to the Dripping Pan hotseat after six months away, replacing Bradley Pritchard.

Nelson steered the Rooks to their best league start in over a decade last season before being snapped up by Tonbridge Angels.

There's no busier owner in English football right now than Bracknell Town's Kayne Steinborn-Busse. He is looking for his FIFTH manager in the space of just 17 league games after dispensing with former Wealdstone and Notts County assistant Matt Saunders.

Saunders had just one point and an FA Cup win over Tadley Calleva to show for his seven games in charge of the Robins – a tenure which will be remembered for releasing the club's two longest serving players after questioning the commitment of the senior members of the squad.

Perhaps the highest profile departure last week was that of Altrincham chief Phil Parkinson after eight years at Moss Lane.

The 44-year-old led the Robins to two promotions in three seasons, from the NPL Premier to the National League, and then a play-off campaign in 2023–24, where they finished fourth before falling to Bromley in the semi-finals.

However, after losing a plethora of key players in the summer, including the likes of Regan Linney, Justin Amaluzor and Alex Newby, the Robins have struggled to find the same consistency this season and Parkinson leaves after a seven-match unbeaten league run.

Altrincham will now be looking to appoint a new man in charge, much like league rivals Aldershot Town, who brought in John Coleman to replace Tommy Widdrington, who left a fortnight ago, and has since rejoined Eastbourne Borough.

Harsh perhaps on Alan Dowson, who took interim charge of team affairs for Saturday's trip to Scunthorpe and told The NLP of his desire to make the most of his opportunity in the Shots hotseat. Dowson, the former Woking, Hampton & Richmond Borough and Kingstonian boss, has now left the EBB Stadium and looking for his next challenge. At Step 5, Richard Brodie left Glossop North End after two years in charge of North West Counties League side and is now back playing with former club Skelmersdale United at the age of 38.

Dan Bailey quit as player/manager and coach of Combined Counties Premier North strugglers Virginia Water, Mark Scott resigned from South West Peninsula Premier East side Axminster Town after a 12th successive defeat and Clay Cross Town's management team of Ian Cotton, his assistant Ian Birtley and player/coach Kieran Coupe joined United Counties Premier North rivals AFC Mansfield.

Welcome to today's game against Gosport, it's good to be back to home action in the league. And welcome to our visitors, we wish you a safe journey home to your part of the south coast.

October was a good month for us, with five wins, but it's still early in the season.

With the arrival of November, and shorter days/darker evenings, it feels as if we've reached the guts of the season with lots of the action on Saturdays as well as Tuesdays being under the lights.

One of the things Jesus is known as is 'Light of the world', and there's a famous painting of that name by William Holman Hunt, the Victorian artist. Unusually, he painted three originals (which hang in London, Oxford and Manchester). The painting is based on Revelation 3.20: "Behold I stand at the door and knock; if anyone hears my voice and opens the door,

I will come in". Three striking features are present in this painting:

- The door has no handle on the outside, symbolising how the occupant on the inside (ie us) is free to decide whether to open their life to Jesus;
- Weeds have grown up around the door, because it has been long-unopened; and
- Jesus is carrying a lantern depicting the light which he himself embodies. I have a lantern very similar to this, sitting in the corner of my study, given to me by friends in my previous parish. It's a reminder that a Christian's role is to shine as a beacon for Jesus in the world. As John 1.5 says, "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it".

For the beginning of the 2023/24 campaign, the goalkeeper joined Plymouth Parkway and impressed at Bolitho Park earning him a move to Taunton. Last season, after a spell with Taunton Town, Parkes signed for Gosport Borough under the management of Joe Lea and Pat Suraci and made 30 appearances at Privett Park. The goalkeeper has now made the move to Tatnam and signed for the Dolphins for the upcoming campaign.



Samuel 'Ayo' Faniyan FORWARD

The 24-year-old winger started his career in the youth ranks with Reading, before making the move to non-league with the likes of Hertford Town and Tooting & Mitcham. After a successful 2023/24 campaign with Hayes & Yeading United, where he found the back of the net on eight occasions, Faniyan linked up with Joe and Pat at Gosport Borough.



Match Report v Plymouth Parkway

Saturday 25th October 2025 The Isuzu FA Trophy 1st Round Proper at Bolitho Park

Poole Town's Isuzu FA Trophy campaign came to an end at the hands of Plymouth Parkway in a penalty shootout at Bolitho Park.

Joe Lea and Pat Suraci made a number of changes for the cup tie with the likes of Shaquille Gwengwe, Billy Lowes and Selim Saied all missing out.

The Dolphins got the game underway in Plymouth, in which was their second trip down to Bolitho Park this season with Poole securing the three points back in August.

Poole started on the front foot and looked the more dangerous of the two sides in the opening stages.

Antonio Diaz broke the deadlock on the 13th minute with a fine finish into the bottom right hand corner after a great ball forward from Henry Spalding.

The first half continued in a similar fashion with Poole on top, but unable to create any clear cut chances.

The home side went close on the 37th minute with two huge chances that somehow stayed out and preserved the Dolphins clean sheet.

The half time whistled arrived with Poole leading by one in this one due to Diaz's opener.

The second half got underway with Poole looking for a second, Kris Campbell's direct free kick







on the 68thminute forced an excellent save from Cherries loanee Mack Allen in the Parkway goal.

Only a few minutes later, it was Parkway who found the back of the net and equalised through James Watts-Barciela at the back post.

Poole pressed in search of a winner, but the game ended level resulting in it going straight to a shootout from 12 yards out.

After seven penalties each, it was level at 6-6 from the spot, Parkway converted their seventh and it was down to Owen Dore to score and keep Poole in it.

He stepped up from the spot and struck it well, but his effort was denied which meant that Poole crashed out of the Trophy and Parkway progressed through to the next round.

Gosport Borough FC - History

Gosport Borough Athletic Club as the club were originally known, were formed just two weeks after D-Day in the summer of 1944.

Despite winning the Hampshire League at their first attempt in 1945/46, dropping "Athletic" in the 1960s, and over the decades being a major force in county football, silverware was rare at Privett Park and the title was not realised again until back-to-back titles in 1976/77 and 1977/78.

The two Hampshire League titles led to a successful application to join Southern League for 1978/79 and a period of 14 seasons in the (then) upper echelons of the non-league game began.

After four seasons at the top end of the Southern League's Southern Division, promotion was won to the Premier Division for 1982/83 - at the time an equivalent level to the later Conference South.

Boro spent seven seasons in the Premier Division before relegation in season 1989/90.

Despite surviving the following season, Gosport finished bottom in 1991/92 and were relegated back to county football (Wessex League).

The club competed for a couple of seasons and did lift the Wessex League Cup in 1993 but with the Club struggling for money, Chairman Ian Hay set up a trustee scheme which kept the club alive through their darkest days, helping to support the club with fans providing regular income.

At the start of the century, things started to turn for the better at The Boro.

Reserve team manager Mick Marsh was put in charge of the 1st XI and with the Club emerging from their financial difficulties, a return to the Southern League was back on the agenda. Marsh chased the dream for five seasons, finishing in the top four on four occasions before he retired in 2005.

Under manager Alex Pike, Boro won the Wessex League title on goal difference in Pike's first season (2006/07). With the club back in the Southern League in 2007/08, it wasn't until season 2011/12 that success came when Boro achieved third spot and a play-off place, winning the Play-Off Final after a Steve Claridge strike sent the game to extra time. Two goals without reply in the additional 30 minutes saw Boro promoted back to the Southern League Premier Division.

In season 2012/13, Pike's men enjoyed FA Cup success as a precursor to an unbeaten run of 23 games which lifted Boro into a play-off place.

Boro saw off second placed Stourbridge in the semi, before beating Hemel Hempstead Town 2-0 in the final only to concede two late goals before winning promotión on penalties.

So the board's planned rise from county football to Conference South was complete and Gosport started 2013/14 again looking to establish themselves at a new

Like the season before. Boro struggled to find their feet at the new level and after flirting with the relegation zone for much of the season, it took another cup run to gain the belief needed to lift the team clear of

An FA Trophy run which started in November, ended with The Boro playing beneath the Wembley Arch in a final against Cambridge United in front of over 18,000. The result saw United run out 4-0 winners, but the belief that flowed through the squad as a result of the Trophy run put Gosport back on track and lifted them into a comfortable mid-table league

The club were able to plough the financial windfall from the FA Trophy run back into the infrastructure at Privett Park. During the summer of 2014, a number of improvements were made including the installation of a new hospitality suite/club office building and a state-of-the-art pitch irrigation system.

A solid start to the 2014/15 league season saw Boro well placed in the league. The confidence gained from the league campaign helped the club finally make the First Round Proper of the FA Cup for the first time.

Boro hosted Colchester United of League One in a tie that attracted over 2,000. Gosport acquitted themselves well in a memorable match, but ultimately lost to the Football League side 6-3. Boro were well placed for a play-off place until a little wobble in March saw them drop just too far off the pace - eventually finishing sixth. But the club did have the consolation of lifting the Hampshire Senior Cup for the first time since 1988 and seeing Justin Bennett pick up the award for the Conference South's leading goal-scorer.

The 2015-16 season got off to a good start, with the club pushing into play-off contention from the off. But as the New Year came, the club were hit with financial problems.

But the campaign did at least end on a high with a 2-1 win against AFC Portchester in the Russell Coates Cup Final, with talismanic striker Justin Bennett recording his 262nd and 263rd goals for Gosport. In 2016-17 Boro were relegated to the Southern League Premier Division and former Portsmouth FC Chairman Iain McInnes took control of the club in the following autumn. After a couple of narrow relegation escapes, the club consolidated under Lee Molyneaux in the 2019-20 season, but the pandemic put an outside hope of a late play-off run to bed and the club parted company with Lee in June 2020.

For the 2021-22 season Shaun Gale is the club's head coach, assisted by Ben Kneller and with the highly experienced Graham Rix as first team coach.

At the end of the 22/23 season Pat Suraci and Joe Lea South side Dorking Wanderers in were appointed head coaches and asked to take the Club forward achieving a play off position at the end of the 23/24 season.

The start of the 25/26 season saw Club legends Danny Hollands and Glen Howes take charge and with them Ben Kneller returned.

Signed from AFC Totton in July 25, Ethan scored the winning goal in last seasons play off final. Despite AFC Totton making two improved contract offers Ethan decided that he would join The Boro. Comes from a family with pedigree in the game. Ethan is also a high level cricketer who is one of the very best with a bat in his hand.

He also had previous spells with National South side Farnborough, Football League side Colchester United along with Hungerford Town, Dartford and Hampton & Richmond Borough and also loan spells at Leatherhead and Salisbury.

TREVOR CABORN (Forward)

Previous Clubs: Winchester City, Westfield, Dorking Wanderers, Woking

Signed in July 25 from Winchester City. The two previous seasons Trevor has been one of the best players in the league. The Boro beat many Clubs for his signature this summer when they paid a fee to Winchester for Trevor.

The success kept on coming with Dan featuring in the 2014 FA Trophy final at Wembley and in an FA Cup First Round tie against Colchester United. After a fruitful spell, he re joined Moneys in 2017 before moving to AFC Portchester, where he reunited with former Boro' boss Mike Catlin. Wooden finally returned home to Privett Park in 2021, much to the delight of fans.
