



Poole Town v Basingstoke Town



Pitching In Southern League - Premier South
Saturday 22nd November 2025- 3.00pm KO

The very late winner from Ogo Obi was a bitter blow for the Dolphins at Farnham on Tuesday evening. In a game that produced a lot of attacking football there were many chances at either end, but unfortunately, we only took one of ours and came away with nothing.

We now move on to two home league matches in a row the first one being the clash with Basingstoke on Saturday ko 3pm. We then face Tiverton Town at the BlackGold on Tuesday evening KO 7.45pm.

There is something of a gap opening up at the top of the table. Walton & Hersham have lost just the once this season so far and top the table on 40 points.

Not far behind are Gloucester City on 36 points. Next comes Wimborne Town who are on 28 points having played 15 games. We are still right there in the mix in 5th place (P15 W8 D3 L4 27 points) but we cannot afford to lose too many more matches.

Basingstoke are currently in 11th place (P17 W6 D3 L8 21 points) and need to pick up points in order to challenge to leading pack. They come into the match on the back of a 2-0 home defeat to Gloucester City last Tuesday evening where City striker Kane Simpson added two more to his tally for the season. This was only the second match that Basingstoke have not scored, the only other match that they didn't find the back of the net was the 1-0 away defeat at Dorchester Town. Their best performance of the season was the 4-3 win at Gosport Borough in October, their other away win came at Weymouth, 2-1.

They are managed by Dan Brownlie who was appointed in 2019 succeeding Martin Kuhl who he served as assistant. In fact, he had served the previous three managers as their assistant before being given the top job. He has a great deal of experience in non-league football and managed Hartley Wintney prior to joining Basingstoke. A former Reading youth team player, Brownlie spent nine seasons with Hartley Wintney as a player, coach and joint-manager, enjoying back-to-back promotions from the

Sydenham's Football League (Wessex) Premier to the Southern Premier Division

The club were delighted to be able to retain the experienced striker Liam Ferdinand for the upcoming 2025/2026 season. A player who we have come up against on many occasions in recent seasons. He joined 'Stoke back in October 2023. With Charlie Austen likely to play some part they do boast quite a strike-force.

Keeper Simon Grant has also been earning high praise for his performances between the sticks. He joined Basingstoke from Bracknell Town in January 2024 and has been a very popular figure in the quad since then. He did suffer a knee injury which kept him out for a while last season but he is the regular number one now.

It was great to have Billy Lowes back in the starting line up at Farnham on Tuesday evening along with Charlie Davis who also started, and rewarded his selection with a 9th minute opener and continued to impress throughout the game. Speaking to Connor Hannon after the match Joe Lea said how difficult it was to accept the defeat bearing in mind how well the team had played, especially in the second half. The 17-day break was put to good use with hard training sessions and much focus on tactical awareness. Joe ended his interview by saying that the lads are very keen to get back to the Tatnam and face the always dangerous Basingstoke and show that we can be more clinical in front of goal.

Come along early and take in the great atmosphere that the BlackGold generates.



FOR managers, it's an extra three minutes to deliver the finishing touches to your pre-match team talk.

For fans, it's a chance to grab a quick coffee or spend in the warmth of the clubhouse bar.

Three minutes. One hundred and eighty seconds. It doesn't sound a lot, but it could make all the difference to the National League's 3UP campaign as it continues to ramp up pressure on the EFL to finally put a third promotion spot into League Two on the agenda.

Last Saturday, over 200 clubs from Steps 1 to 4 kicked-off at 3.03pm in 'A Day of Action' to raise awareness on the issue with the Premier League and a large percentage of the EFL away on international duty.

National League chiefs and clubs have been pushing for an extra promotion place for a number of years to align with the rest of the English pyramid.

But while the EFL acknowledge it should be up for debate, the matter is yet to be officially brought to the table despite chairman Rick Parry's promise to "look downwards as well as upwards".

A recent Football Supporters' Association poll revealed 93 per cent of all supporters support the move, while 83 per cent of fans of EFL clubs are so in favour.

But Football League chiefs say any deal would have to form part of any funding agreement with the Premier League so with the two bodies at a stalemate amid the wait for the incoming Independent Football Regulator, National League chiefs have decided to up the stakes amid fears it could be years before EFL clubs vote on any changes.

National League vice-chairman and chair of the 3UP steering committee Steve Thompson MBE has been a key part of the push and he wants their message heard.

He told The NLP last week: "The games kicking off at 3.03pm is really going to shine a spotlight on it. We've got MPs from all over the country going to these games. It's not just the 12 National League games. While National League North and South aren't playing league games because it's FA Trophy, the Trident Leagues are also supporting it. That's fantastic. The whole football family at Non-League level sees how important it is."

So important that, in recent months, clubs and the league have been engaging with their local MPs with more than 100 – and members of the London Assembly – pledging their support.

And last week Sir Keir Starmer "commended" 3UP at Prime Minister's Questions with over 60 MP's actively supporting the campaign.

The Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) has formally "recognised" that 3UP's ambitions tie-in with the football regulator's objectives with a Backbench Business Debate planned later this month, as well as two supportive Early Day Motions.

"I was blown away," Thompson said of the political support received. So many MPs are season ticket holders at their local club. They realise how much their clubs do in their community. They realise how much the owners and chairs of those clubs do in the community. The fear is if you have this bottleneck and owners don't think there is a realistic chance of being promoted they will walk away. You need that competitiveness. It creates a healthy eco-system in football and that's what we face losing. The EFL say they've got to look down as well as up. Well, look down a bit more."

History shows there is no competitive imbalance between the National League and League Two. No club has ever been relegated back into Non-League the season after they won promotion while Luton Town went through to the Premier League and others, including Yeovil Town, Doncaster, Burton Albion and Wrexham, have reached the Championship.

"There's over 30 clubs in the EFL that have been in the National League at some stage or another," Thompson added. There's Wrexham now in the Championship. There are 19 League Two clubs that have been in National League. Half of the National League have been in the EFL. There's nothing to fear but there is this bottleneck."

Last Saturday, fans from clubs up and down the country were involved both on the terraces and via social media making their voices heard. For 180 seconds at least the floor was theirs. That's got to be worth raising a glass to.

Match Report v Farnham Town

Late heartbreak for Poole Town as Farnham took all three points on Tuesday evening with a 95th minute winner at The Memorial Ground.

This was the Dolphins' first league match since the 1-0 defeat to Gosport Borough on the 1st November.

Billy Lowes and Henry Spalding returned to the starting eleven, with Ik Hill and Selim Saied dropping to the bench.

The match got underway with both sides off to a flying start and creating numerous early chances in this one.

It was Poole who struck first through Charlie Davis from the edge of the area as he fired into the top left hand corner to give the Dolphins the lead on the 9th minute.

Farnham pressed on in search of an equaliser and should have found the back of the net just two minutes later as Mat Mackenzie fired over from two yards out.

Eventually the hosts did convert as Beaux Booth took his chance and drew the game back to level terms on the 17th minute mark.

Farnham continued to press and had multiple chances throughout the first half, but Adam Parkes' heroics kept the scores level until the break.

Poole came out flying in the second half and almost took the lead through Shaq Gwengwe moments in.



On the 62nd minute, Antonio Diaz was denied from close range by a great stop by Mike Eacott to keep the scores level.

As the game progressed, Farnham grew into it and end to end action meant the next goal really could have fallen to either side.

In the dying moments of the match it was Farnham who took their chance through substitute Ogo Obi in the 95th minute to give the hosts all three points.

A heartbreaking defeat right at the death for the Dolphins who face Basingstoke Town at home next Saturday.

Basingstoke Town FC were formed in 1896 following a merger of Aldworth United and Basingstoke Albion. They joined the Hampshire League North in 1903 and were champions in both the 1911–12 and 1919–20 seasons.

Following the end of the Second World War, Basingstoke Town moved in to its historical home at The Camrose.

After league reorganisation, Basingstoke were placed in Hampshire League Division One where the team finished as runners-up in 1965–66 and 1966–67, before eventually winning the league in 1967–68. After finishing as runners-up again in 1968–69, Basingstoke Town won back-to-back titles in 1969–70 and 1970–71, remaining unbeaten in the latter season.

In what was a successful few years for the club, Basingstoke moved up to Division One South of the Southern League. Their first season in the Southern League saw 'Stoke reach the first round of the FA Cup for the first time, eventually losing 5–1 to Northampton Town.

The club remained in Southern League Division One South until 1979, when league restructuring saw them placed in the Southern Division. Basingstoke won the division in 1984–85, earning promotion to the Premier Division. Two seasons later Basingstoke Town were transferred to the Premier Division of the Isthmian League. Although they were relegated to Division One at the end of the 1987–88 season, they made an immediate return to the Premier Division after ending the following season as runners-up.

The 1989–90 season saw the club reach the first round of the FA Cup again, eventually losing out 3–2 in the Second Round Proper to Torquay United with an attendance of 4091 at The Camrose.

In 1993–94 Basingstoke were relegated to Division One, returning to the Isthmian Premier Division in 1996–97 after finishing as Division One runners-up.

1997 was a monumental year for Basingstoke Town – conquering league opposition for the first time, beating Wycombe Wanderers 5–4 on penalties after a 2–2 draw in a replay; the attendance of 5,085 was a new record for the club. The FA Cup Second Round saw Basingstoke take Northampton Town to a replay, before eventually narrowly losing out, 4–3 on penalties.

Basingstoke again reached the FA Cup First Round in 1998, losing 2–1 to AFC Bournemouth.

As part of league restructuring, Basingstoke Town formed part of the newly-formed Conference South in 2004–05.

In 2006, whilst bottom of the Conference South, Basingstoke Town defeated League One Chesterfield Town at Saltergate 1–0 in the FA Cup First Round, before losing to local neighbours Aldershot Town in a Second Round Replay.



Billy Upton

Club Captain Billy Upton joined Basingstoke Town from Badshot Lea in the summer of 2022. The imposing fan-favourite holds great aerial abilities and is aggressive in the tackle, but also boasts real quality on the ball. He has won Player of the Year in successive seasons. A lovable menace.



Josh Green

An ex-Reading FC academy player joined towards the end of last season and made an instant impact. A high energy, box-to-box midfielder with a great pass and brilliant tackler. Previously of Rayners Lane and Southall.

D'andre Brown

An academy graduate and one in which supporters are very proud of classified as a true 'one of our own'. Dre is a powerful midfielder, with a fierce strike and strong ball carrier.

James Dickson

Signed from Raynes Park Vale midway through last season. A terrific addition to our midfield who has perfected the art of keeping it simple. A great tackler and has brilliant energy in that all important engine room.

Liam Ferdinand

Another player who joined us from Bracknell Town and was our top scorer last season. Ferdi would class himself as a 9.5. A great striker with a wonderful knack for finding the corner, but as capable joining in with deeper positions on the pitch.

Joined from Didcot Town late last year. Came in as a winger but has found a new lease of life in the centre of midfield with brilliant passes.

James Clark



Pitching In Southern League - Premier South

In our second home game in four days, we welcome the players, officials and supporters of Tiverton Town to the BlackGold Stadium. At the time of writing they are sitting at the foot of the table on 7 points. They are on a run of 3 consecutive away fixtures, starting at Farnham on 8th November where they went down 2-0 and then on to Gosport Borough last Saturday, before arriving here at Poole. From their first eight away matches they have just the one win, the 3-1 victory at Dorchester in August.

The Yellows are managed by Asa Hall who signed for the club in June 2024 following his six season stint with Torquay United and would become a vital part of a struggling Tiverton Town side. Following the departure of Leigh Robinson and Ben Gerring, Asa would step up alongside Niall Thompson to briefly become interim manager while the club searched for someone to take the job full time. Hall would briefly return to his role as a player after the club signed Rob Dray however, with ten games left of the season, Dray decided to step away from the club and Hall once again took on the role with a view to see out the season as player manager with Steven Orchard stepping up as his assistant. In April 2024, following a good turnaround of results, Asa was offered the manager role at Tiverton permanently.

It has been great to see Charlie Davis returning to form. He was the man of the match at Farnham and regularly controls the midfield. The 29-year-old joined the Dolphins after an impressive season for Sholing where he racked up three goals and 13 assists. He is a cultured and versatile player who has gained the reputation of being a 'free-kick specialist' who has an eye for goal. Charlie started his career at AFC Bournemouth before moving to Poole as a talented teenager in 2013 and stayed at Tatnam for two years making 26 appearances.

After spells at Dorchester and Weymouth, Davis re-joined Poole to pursue more game time. In this spell, Davis made nine appearances for the Dolphins, scoring four times including a hattrick in the Dorset Senior Cup against Swanage Town & Herston. However, during the 2018/19 season, Davis left Poole for Gosport Borough and went on to captain the side. The experienced midfielder joined Salisbury in 2020 where he made 57 appearances over a three-year period which led to him signing for AFC Totton and then Sholing before signing across the dotted line for Poole Town.

The Dolphins will be keen to make home advantage count as we have lost only one of our opening seven home league fixtures, the 1-0 defeat to Gosport Borough.

Tiverton Town FC - History

The summer of 1913 saw the birth of what is now Tiverton Town Football Club from the ashes of the recently demised rugby club. Honorary Secretary Sid Skinner proposed the change of code and the newly formed Tiverton Athletic played host to Exeter City at the Athletic Ground at the start of September for the inaugural match. City won 7-0 but the first Tiverton President Mr. Ford was already prepared to make the bold claim that the new team could become champions of the county. Those days were many years off, and the first season had barely been completed when war broke out and Tiverton Athletic was forced to adjourn their journey.

Play resumed following the Great War and after the 1921/22 season, it was decided that a merger between Athletic and Uffculme St. Peters would take place, having been rejected the previous year. The newly formed club, known as Tiverton AFC, moved from the Tiverton & District League to the East Devon League and grabbed their first piece of major silverware by pipping Exminster to the league title. It was a championship they would retain for the following three years and the foundations of a successful local football team were well and truly in place.

A string of championships and near misses followed as the club moved into the Exeter & District League before war once again stopped the majority of competitive sport. By this time there were already a number of names that would go down in Tiverton folklore, not least Frank Butler, a prolific striker who would hold the all-time goalscoring record until almost the turn of the century.

When the action got underway again in 1946 the club, now with the familiar Tiverton Town moniker, relocated from a war-battered Elms Ground to their current home at Ladysmead, although they used a pub ten minutes walk from the ground for changing purposes. The early post-war years didn't give rise to the success of the 1920s and 1930s and by the turn of the decade they were fighting off relegation with some particularly poor seasons; only the ridiculously weak St. Marks and Okehampton finishing below Town in the table in the 1949/50 season.

It took more than ten years to regain some form, with much of the fifties spent languishing in mid-table, but by the time Alf Ramsay was preparing for world domination the likes of Alec Collard and Terry Lee were firing Tiverton back to the top, the club winning consecutive league championships in 1965 and 1966, and the trophy cabinet was filled out with a host of local knock-out victories. But the high road was a short one and it was only a matter of a few years before Tiverton were back in the pack and struggling both on and off the pitch. In the early 1970s, the brave decision to join the Western League was taken, and while the induction was tough the club was able to hang on through the bleak winters. The 1980/81 season was the bleakest of them all with a paltry 23

goals being scored in the league, and relegation to the Western League First Division confirmed a little more than halfway through the season.

Having hit the lowest point possible by finishing bottom of the table in 1984 the only way was up and slowly the fortunes changed, thanks in no small part to the newly appointed John Owen, brought to Tiverton as a coach, but soon to take over the reins as manager. Mark Seatherton and Clive Jones provided the goals as the climb began, and the addition to the squad of Peter Rogers and Hedley Steele culminated in Town clinching promotion back to the Western League Premier Division at the end of the 1988/89 season.

Tiverton was to embark on an unprecedented twenty years of success and never found themselves outside of the top four in the Western League following promotion. Kevin Smith arrived at Ladysmead and started scoring for fun, ably assisted by John Durham and later Phil Everett, and Tivvy finally made Mr. Ford's prediction of 78 years earlier a reality by winning the Devon Cup on penalties against cross-town rivals Elmore. Former Exeter City defender Martyn Rogers, who would go on to earn legendary status at Ladysmead, took over from John Owen in the summer of 1991 and the following season the club were runners-up to an invincible Clevedon Town and reached the FA Vase final at Wembley on the back of some staggering results against higher opposition. Forest Green Rovers were hit for six while Barton Rovers and Buckingham Town both went for four in what was by far Tivvy's best season to date. The day out at Wembley lost a little of its silver lining as Town were defeated 1-0 by Bridlington, but by now everything was in place and the remarkable rise of a club that was in danger of extinction ten years prior was about to be completed.

The Western League championship finally arrived at Ladysmead in 1994 and stayed in Tiverton the following year. By this time Tivvy had made three appearances in the first round proper of the FA Cup, playing host to Leyton Orient and having the cheek to take an early lead on the most recent occasion. But it was the FA Vase that was most coveted and having carefully assembled a squad with the belief and talent to succeed, the dream was finally realised when Tow Law Town was defeated by a single Peter Varley goal at Wembley Stadium in May 1998. Not satisfied with just one trip up the 39 steps to lift the cup Tiverton went and did it again the following year, this time getting the better of a very highly-fancied Bedlington Terriers side thanks to Scott Rogers' late, late strike.

The next step was to take on the challenge of the Southern League, and after an impressive initial season, Tiverton won promotion to the Premier Division at only the second attempt. In keeping with



an unwritten Tivvy tradition, the promotion came after finishing as runners-up but little did that matter on a warm and sunny day at Blakenall when the Yellows won 3-0 thanks to goals from Paul Chenoweth, Scott Rogers and Kevin Nancekivell to seal their place in the top tier of the Southern League. The step-up in class did little to temper the Yellows' appetite for success and the next two seasons saw them finish respectably in sixth and then fourth, only being denied a shot at the Conference after failing to win any of the last five games of the 2002/03 campaign.

It is fair to say that the club has since struggled to maintain the air of invincibility that carried them to such great success, and the latter half of the following season saw Tiverton slump from second to fifteenth and miss out on a place in the newly structured regional sections of the Conference. The next five years saw Tivvy back in mid-table, and a particularly frustrating 2006/07 had them fighting at the wrong end of the table for much of the season, often hampered by postponed games, injuries and suspensions. The only high point was winning Southern League Cup with a fine 3-2 aggregate victory over Hemel Hempstead Town, but even that failed to disguise the fact that there needed to be a period of rebuilding if Tiverton were to take the next step up the ladder.

The culmination of half a decade of struggle came in the 2009/10 season when the club finished in the relegation zone. Tivvy were lucky to escape the drop due to off-field matters concerning other clubs across the non-league system, and in May 2010 Martyn Rogers stepped down as manager, bringing to an end a 19-season managerial tenure. Former England Under-21 captain Chris Vinnicombe was appointed in his stead but results were poor and he left the club after just four months at the helm, replaced by former Plymouth Argyle and Gillingham midfielder Mark Saunders. However, the slow start to the 2010/11 season proved decisive and Tiverton finally succumbed to relegation for only the second time in the history of the club.

Tivvy steadied the ship with a comfortable mid-table finish in 2011/12, only fading away from playoff contention in the final month of the season, and after a strong start to the next campaign hopes were high, but a poor run of form saw Saunders leave the club in March 2013. Jamie Ward was appointed as his replacement until the end of the season, and in the summer of 2013 John Clarkson took over as manager and quickly went about assembling a new-look squad. The 2013/14 season was much better on the pitch with appearances in both the Southern League Cup and Devon Cup finals, while a third-place league finish saw Tiverton in the playoffs, but eventually, the club finished empty-handed, losing both finals and falling in the playoffs to eventual promoted Paulton Rovers.

Clarkson himself chose not to stick around in the managerial seat, but remained involved at Director-

level at the club. His departure opened the door for Rogers to return, although he was tasked with assembling a new squad with financial constraints at the fore. It was tough-going initially, and a difficult spell across the turn of the year raised questions on the validity of bringing back a legendary manager. However, the Yellows gathered themselves to finish a respectable eighth position in 2016, before winning the playoffs the following season to reclaim a place in the Southern League's top Division after a six-year absence. Scott Rogers assumed the role of joint-manager alongside Martyn in 2019, and helped transform the team into genuine title contenders before the season was terminated prematurely, and the even more abrupt 2020/21 campaign saw Tivvy off to a flying start, leading the standings from the opening day, but in vain as the season was once again scrapped after just seven matches.



Unfortunately the 2021/22 season would not reach the glitz heights of the previous two seasons. A poor start followed by the departure of ever-popular manager, Martyn Rogers, saw Tivvy flirting with relegation come December. However with the return of Martyn Rogers in the festive period the team was reinvigorated and went on an inspired run which included an unbeaten March which saw Tiverton Town pick up the Southern League Club of the Month award. However this season was destined for nothing more than a mid-table finish and a major squad rebuild in the summer.

Tiverton Town Football Club has a history of which to be proud, and particularly in recent times, some players that have graced the Ladymead turf have been etched into Tivvy legend. Kevin Smith broke Frank Butler's goalscoring record and went on to net 302 goals for the club, and Phil Everett eclipsed this total, eventually finishing his Tivvy career with 378 strikes. Smith and Neil Saunders captained the club to victories beneath Wembley's twin towers, while Steve Daly, Kevin Nancekivell and Jason Smith are amongst the best players ever to appear in Tiverton colours. But without their forefathers none of the success of the past twenty-five years would be possible, and Tivvy is proud to remember all those involved with the club over the last 105 years.



4. Toby Stephens (Midfielder)

Former Southampton youth academy graduate Toby joined the Yellows this summer from Hungerford Town. Also, previously with Yeovil Town, Plymouth Parkway & AFC Totton.

12. Gabe Billington (Midfielder)

Gabe made 17 appearances and scored twice on loan from Exeter City during the 2024/25 season. Signed permanently this summer.

14. Zack Williams (Midfielder)

Wideman Zack joined the Yellows this summer, after a successful trial period and is also dual registered with Sidmouth Town.

10. Louis Jagger Cane (Forward)

Re-joined the club this summer from Sidmouth Town, where he was their top scorer last term, having made appearances in the 2019/20 season.

9. Daniel Koita (Forward)

Signed from Okehampton Argyle at the start of 2025. Grew up and played youth football here in Tiverton before spells with Crediton United, Tavistock and Willand Rovers.

7. Tor Swann (Forward)

Another in his second spell with the club, having initially joined the club in the summer of 2024 from Barnstaple before moving to Exmouth at the start of 2025.

17. Aiden Horne (Forward)

Local lad Aiden joined the Yellows this summer from near-neighbours Cullompton Rangers, where he played under Steve Orchard.

11. Jacob Wellington (Forward)

Former Torquay United youth academy graduate Jacob is another to have joined the Yellows from Willand Rovers this summer.

15. Finley Rooke (Forward)

Joined the Yellows from Taunton in September. Spent the previous season with Willand Rovers, where he impressively reached double figures for goals and assists.

16. Ise Aworinde (Forward)

16-year-old forward, who was previously at Torquay United's academy and has represented the Devon FA in their youth teams. Dual registered with Crediton United.

2. Brooklyn Wilkins (Defender)

Right back Brooklyn joined the Yellows this summer having impressed on trial during pre-season. Previously with Plymouth Marjon, Tavistock & Camelford.

18. Sam Gleeson (Defender)

Young left back Sam, who has 11 first team appearances to his name, is dual registered with and currently playing at Sidmouth Town.

6. Toby Down (Defender)

Appointed club captain this summer. Toby is in his second spell with the Yellows, having made 7 appearances for the club during the 2022/23 season.

5. Matthew Wood (Defender)

Commanding centre back Matt joined the Yellows this summer from Frome Town and notched his first goal for the club in the 5-1 pre-season win at Newton Abbot Spurs.

21. Dean Moxey (Defender)

Needs little in the way of an introduction, having spent a sizeable portion of his career in the upper echelons of football with Derby County, Crystal Palace and Bolton Wanderers.

3. Corey Koerner (Defender)

Left sided defender Corey joined the Yellows this summer following his departure from Yeovil and made his debut in the pre-season 2-2 draw at Willand Rovers.

19. Harry Hutchinson (Defender)

Left sided defender Harry joined recently on loan from Dorchester Town and scored on his debut in the 3-2 defeat to Yate Town.

8. Asa Hall (Midfielder)

Player/manager and midfield maestro, who alongside Steve Orchard, masterminded the Yellows 'great escape' at the end of the 2024/25 season. Captained Torquay United to a league championship in 2018.


