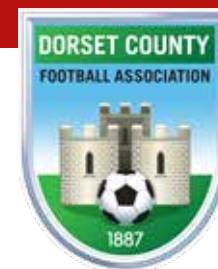

The Dolphins are back home tonight after the 2-1 win at Berkhamsted last Saturday. After going into a 2-0 second half lead things became a little uncomfortable with a late goal from Berkhamsted. We hung on for the points but not without a couple of uneasy moments.

The win takes us back up into 3rd place (P18 W10 D4 L4 34 points) and still in touch with Gloucester who are on 40 points and Walton & Hersham on 47. We have taken 18 points at home from our 9 matches and sit in 10th place in the form table P6 W3 D1 L2 10 points.

Our visitors to The BlackGold on Saturday are table topping Walton & Hersham who look unstoppable at the moment after the 3-0 away win at Basingstoke. They top the form table (P6 W5 D1) and have lost just the one match this season, the 1-0 defeat at Hanwell Town in August. The Swans have two of their frontmen in the Pitching-In leading scorer's table, Johl Powell on 10 and Dawid Rogalski on 7.

Walton & Hersham were disappointed to miss out on promotion last season, losing in the play-off semi-final to Gloucester City 5-3 on penalties after the sides had played out a 2-2 draw. They had finished the season strongly in third place behind Merthyr who were champions and AFC Totton who were runners up and were promoted after winning the play-off final. We drew the corresponding fixture last season 1-1 but lost at The Elmbridge Xcel Sports Hub 2-0 in March.

The club are looking for a new management team as Billy Rowley and Darren Simpson have recently left the club to join Yeovil Town who play in the National League. They made an instant impact by bringing a seven-game winless run to an end on Saturday with the 2-1 home win over Boston. The Swans have put Jakub Pietrazak and Joey Jones in temporary charge whilst the recruitment process takes place. They too made a good start with that 3-0 win over Basingstoke.

Walton F.C. was formed in 1895, and in 1945, following World War II, amalgamated with Hersham F.C. to form Walton & Hersham F.C., the present club. They immediately joined the newly formed Corinthian

League and followed a poor first season with a hat-trick of Championships and a runners-up position. They also won the Surrey Senior Cup for the first time in 1947-48, beating Isthmian League neighbours Kingstonian 2-1 at Crystal Palace. At the end of September 2017 Swans were forced to leave their home of 8 decades, Stompond Lane, when it was sold for development, the club moving to a new home at a purpose-built Sports Hub in Waterside Drive, Walton-On-Thames, Surrey.

When you are doing well you want to judge yourself against the best and Walton & Hersham can rightly say they currently are the best. However, we know that on our day we can beat anyone. Joe Lea and Pat Suraci will have the lads well prepared for this mouthwatering clash. So, come on down to the BlackGold and enjoy non-league football at its very best.

Welcome to our game against table-topping Walton and Hersham, and welcome to our visitors, we wish you a safe journey home.

On the day I'm writing this, I've just got home from a visit to my previous church in Elvetham Heath, Hampshire. There I led

the 'planting' of a new church to serve a new mini-town which was being built, and the first service was exactly 25 years ago today. It has been a very encouraging day, reflecting on the growth and life which have happened there over the years.

... All of which gets me to thinking about how we remember the past, celebrating good things such as wedding anniversaries and mourning sad ones such as deaths in the family. Both kinds of dates stick in the mind.

The ups and downs of life affect all of us, and one of the privileges of being a vicar is sharing in the highs and lows of life with other people, reminding them that God is with them in both. I often find

myself drawn to the Psalms, which express the whole range of human emotion, from joy to despair and everything in between. One of the passages which has increasingly come to mind over the years that I've worn a funny collar is Psalm 121, which includes verse 8: "The Lord will watch over your coming and going, both now and for evermore".

In my family, one of the things which has helped us reflect on our experiences has been our extensive archive of family photos: there are lots that make us smile, like our daughter's recent wedding, but also some which bring a lump to the throat, such as the last photo of my sick dad before he died of cancer. And our photos also reveal a few surprises, including how non-league football chaplaincy became an add-on to my life about 20 years ago in Fleet!

Whatever the milestones in your life, I hope that you will know God's presence amid the ups and downs,

Taylor signed for Poole in August of 2024 and earned the number one shirt after the departure of Cam Plain, Taylor has now renewed his contract for the upcoming season.



Adam Parkes
GOALKEEPER

The 25-year-old shot-stopper came through Southampton's academy after joining the Saints at the age of 10 and made appearances on the international stage for England at under 17's level.

Parkes signed for Watford in 2019 and went on to have loan spells in the National League with Barnet and Dover Athletic. Following his time at Watford, Parkes was signed by Plymouth Argyle but never made a first team appearance for the pilgrims.

For the beginning of the 2023/24 campaign, the goalkeeper joined Plymouth Parkway and impressed at Bolitho Park earning him a move to Taunton. Last season, after a spell with Taunton Town, Parkes signed for Gosport Borough under the management of Joe Lea and Pat Suraci and made 30 appearances at Privett Park. The goalkeeper has now made the move to Tatnam and signed for the Dolphins for the upcoming campaign.



Samuel 'Ayo' Faniyan

The 24-year-old winger started his career in the youth ranks with Reading, before making the move to non-league with the likes of Hertford Town and Tooting & Mitcham. After a successful 2023/24 campaign with Hayes & Yeading United, where he found the back of the net on eight occasions, Faniyan linked up with Joe and Pat at Gosport Borough.

Last season, he made 31 appearances for Gosport, but with Joe and Pat's departure from Privett Park, Faniyan also departed the club not long after and finished the campaign with Walton & Hersham.

His journey as a footballer started at Gillingham before moving to Dagenham & Redbridge in the 2016/17 season where they pushed for promotion back into the football league but fell short in the play-off semi-final. The following season, Staunton moved to Woking where he impressed, making 40 appearances and scoring three goals before making the transfer to Halifax where in two seasons he made 60 appearances. In 2020, Staunton moved to the Glovers and was an ever-present in their side, making almost 100 appearances; he captained the side and departed with the status of a club legend. Due to a lack of game time last season, the defender made the decision to move to National League outfit Boreham Wood.

However, after a short time with Boreham Wood, Staunton decided he needed to be closer to home and the opportunity of playing for Poole Town seemed the right move for him as he signed the contract on the 4th February and has started every league game since!

Poole Town fought back to earn a point against bottom-placed Tiverton Town in 'embarrassing' 5-5 draw at Tatnam on Tuesday night.

Josh Staunton and Selim Saied returned to the starting eleven following Saturday's 1-0 win over Basingstoke Town.

The match got underway on a chilly evening, and it was the visitors who started fast and opened the scoring within two minutes as the Dolphins were caught out at the back and Tor Swann calmly gave Tiverton the lead.

Poole immediately responded as Selim Saied was brought down inside the area and Gwengwe stepped up and converted from the spot.

Tiverton re-took the lead in the 7th minute after a mistake from Adam Parkes at the back led to Swann passing it into an empty net for his second of the match.

A frantic start to the night, but it didn't stop there as Tiverton made it three goals to the good as Aiden Horne scored on the 15th minute to make it 3-1.

The drama continued as Poole looked to fight back through Charlie Davis, his lobbed effort caught the keeper unaware and narrowly crept over the line for the fifth goal on the 19th minute.

On the 24th minute, Gwengwe was brought down by the goalkeeper inside the area and once again he converted from the spot to draw it back to level terms.

Certainly wasn't a quiet evening under the lights at Tatnam with six goals within 25 minutes, but the goal show hadn't finished quite yet!

Poole finally took the lead in this one as a Ryan Campbell rocket (pic right) flew into the roof of the net on the 35th minute to make it 4-3 to the Dolphins.

It looked as if Poole were now in a commanding position and looking for more to put the game to bed, however, just before the break it was Tiverton who struck again after a scramble in the box was tapped home by Horne again.

Just when everyone thought the eight first half goals were enough, Tiverton managed to find the back of the net for a fifth with the last kick of the half and went into the break leading the game by five goals to four.

Poole came out for the second half the much livelier and immediately looked like finding an equaliser.

It took until the 66th minute for the Dolphins to find that decisive fifth goal after substitute McCormick found Gwengwe in the centre who tapped it home to make it 5-5.

As the game progressed, despite Poole putting the pressure on in search of a winner, it seemed too little too late as Tiverton remained resolute at the back and held on to a point with the full time whistle being blown and it ending 5-5 at Tatnam.

Joint-manager Joe Lea labelled the result as "embarrassing" in the post match interview with Connor Hannon and said he "expected more" from a select few of his players on the night.

Walton-on-Thames F.C. was formed in 1895, and in 1945, following World War II, amalgamated with Hersham F.C. to form Walton & Hersham F.C., the present club. The united club immediately joined the newly formed Corinthian League and followed a poor first season with a hat-trick of Championships and a runners-up position.

They also won the Surrey Senior Cup for the first time in 1947-48, beating Isthmian League neighbours Kingstonian 2-1 at Crystal Palace.

Election to the Athenian League soon followed and in their first season, 1950-51, Swans finished runners-up and again won the Surrey Senior Cup at Palace, defeating the much vaunted Dulwich Hamlet 2-1.

Great days, big crowds

These were golden days for the Stompond Lane side and the FA Amateur Cup Semi-Final was reached in successive seasons, 1951-52 and 1952-53, only for Swans to go out to Walthamstow Avenue and Harwich & Parkeston respectively.

During this period the club enjoyed a tremendous following, and a record crowd of 10,000 were at the Lane in 1952 when the famous Crook Town were the visitors for an Amateur Cup tie.

Stars of this era included Swans' most famous player, England and Great Britain Olympic defender C.R. 'Jack' Neale, and the prolific Reg Sentance, still the club's all-time top scorer.

Some lean years followed, although the FA Cup First Round was reached for the first time in 1957-58, Southampton winning 6-1 before 6,000 people at Stompond Lane.

Don Stoker's popular sides of the early 1960's brought cup fever back to the Lane and there were fine runs again in the FA Amateur Cup.

Two late goals by the prolific and popular Brian Jenkins beat the star-studded Wimbledon side in the Surrey Senior Cup Final of 1960-61, and the trophy was retained against Sutton United the following season.

After several years of mid-table respectability the appointment of Allen Batsford as manager in 1967 heralded the beginning of the most successful period in the club's history.

At the end of his first season, a superb victory over a powerful Wimbledon side in the two legged Final secured the Premier Midweek Floodlit League title, the first of three, followed a year later by the winning of the Athenian League championship for the first time.

The FA Cup First Round Proper was again reached in

the following two seasons, only for Swans to lose to Barnet 1-0 in 1969-70 and Telford United 5-2 in 1970-71, both games being played at the Lane. The runners-up spot in the League was achieved in both those campaigns and the Surrey Senior Cup came back to Stompond Lane in 1970-71, Woking being defeated 3-0 in the Final.

Election to the Isthmian ranks followed, with third place attained in the first season, 1971-72.

Wembley at last

Then followed the most memorable season in the club's history, 1972-73.

The FA Cup First Round barrier was overcome for the first time with Exeter City being defeated 2-1 amid tremendous excitement at the Lane, only for visitors Margate to win by the only goal in the Second Round. Kingstonian were beaten 2-0 in the Surrey Senior Cup Final and the runners-up spot achieved in the League.

Then on the 14th of April 1973 the ultimate prize was gained at Wembley when 41,000 people saw a last-minute Roger Connell goal against Slough Town bring the FA Amateur Cup to Stompond Lane, the trophy being won without a goal being conceded, a record never to be equalled.

Dave Bassett, Willie Smith and Connell also had the honour of playing for the England Amateur side. The following season Brian Clough brought his Brighton & Hove Albion side to Stompond Lane in the FA Cup First Round, and following a goalless draw, Swans pulled off a sensational result in the replay at The Goldstone Ground, a Clive Foskett hat-trick included in a 4-0 win.

Sadly, when Batsford left for Wimbledon the following season the fine team broke up, the crowds drifted away, and relegation soon followed in 1975.

The FA Cup First Round was surprisingly reached in 1975-76, and a young side put on a battling performance at Selhurst Park against Malcolm Allison's Crystal Palace, only going down 1-0 to a late goal.

Barren years followed, with the club several times being close to extinction.

In the mid 1980's the club was proud to have Sir Stanley Matthews as President, but sides flattered to deceive and only a draw in the final game of the 1986-87 season prevented relegation to Division Two.

Promotion

After 20 years out of the top-flight, a young side under Neil Price at last gained promotion in 1993-94, and the following season the First Round Proper of



the FA Cup was again reached, Swansea City winning 2-0 at the Lane.

However Swans' Centenary celebrations were spoilt by relegation after only two seasons back in the Premier.

Under the management of Laurie Craker the team ensured the stay in Division One was as brief as possible, promotion being gained on the last day of the campaign.

After a creditable first season back in the Premier Division it again proved to be a struggle to remain there, and at the end of the 1999-2000 season Swans finished in bottom spot and relegation again became a reality.

Swans had to wait until the 2004-05 season before more success came to Stompond Lane after long-serving player Alan Dowson took over as manager in October.

After defeat in his first match in charge, Dowson led the team to a record breaking 13 match winning sequence, fine runs in the FA Trophy and League Cup, and promotion as runners-up in the Ryman League Division One.

The Surrey Senior Cup Final was reached for the first time in 31 years, the Swans only losing a thrilling game against AFC Wimbledon 2-1 after extra-time before close to 4,000 people at Woking.

After a creditable first season back in the Premier Division a poor start to 2006-07 led to Dowson's early resignation and eventual relegation yet again.

Since then Swans remained in Division One, facing relegation fights on several occasions, until 2015-16, when a third from bottom finish finally saw them go down, ending a 45 year unbroken stay in the Isthmian League.

At the end of September 2017 Swans were forced to leave their home of 8 decades, Stompond Lane, when it was sold for development, the club moving to a new home at a purpose-built Sports Hub in Waterside Drive.

After two good seasons in the Combined Counties League Premier Division, when they finished in fifth and fourth places, a poor 2018-19 led to a bottom place finish and relegation to Division One.

A new era

At the start of the 2019-20 season Walton & Hersham FC was then taken over by a consortium of seven 19 year-olds, who became the youngest owners of a senior football club.

With a complete club rebranding a resurgence of fortunes soon began, and following two seasons

that remained unfinished due to the Covid-19 virus, Swans' record of finishing in third and second places gained them promotion under a PPG (points per game) system to the newly formed Combined Counties League Premier Division South for 2021-22.

The management team of Scott Harris and Billy Rowley then guided Swans to a second successive promotion and a return to the Isthmian League after six seasons away, a runners-up spot securing them a place in the South-Central Division for 2022-23.

Also, an end of season record breaking 18 match unbeaten run culminated in them winning the Combined Counties League Premier Challenge Cup with a 2-1 win over Southall in the Final.

After a last minute goal in the final match of the season denied them the Championship, a 3-1 home win over Hanworth Villa in the Play-off Final before a ground record crowd of 2,059 secured a third successive promotion, the season ending with a 21 match unbeaten run.

Returning to Step 3 after an absence of 16 seasons for 2023-24, the Club played in the Southern League for the first time, finishing in a creditable 7th place in the Premier Division South.

Following the departure of Scott Harris, Swans played their second season in the Southern League Premier Division South with Billy Rowley in managerial charge, and reached the 2024-25 Play-offs by finishing in 3rd place.

Unfortunately the Semi-Final at home to Gloucester City was lost 5-3 on penalties following a 2-2 draw after extra-time.

The season finished on a high note however, when the Surrey Senior Cup was won for the first time in 52 years, National League South Dorking Wanderers being beaten 3-1 in the Final on their own ground at Meadowbank.

**Jos Barker (Goalkeeper)**

Jos joined Swans in the summer of 2024 from Combined Counties League club Knaphill, for whom he made his senior debut in 2021 at the age of 17. He became a regular for the Knappers, making well over a century of appearances and playing a key role in their passage to the 2023-24 Play-off Final, also breaking the Club's clean sheet record with 17 shut-outs. In his first season at Step 3, Jos added to fine performances in goal by heading a last-minute equaliser against Dorchester Town. He was also selected for the English Universities' squad. Age: 21. Debut: 10.08.24 v. AFC Totton.

Eoin Bolger (Defender)

After being a young player at Crystal Palace, Eoin joined Swans at the beginning of the 2023-24 season from Tooting Bec FC. After being on dual-registration at Combined Counties League club Cobham he soon established himself as a regular in the Swans' side. Eoin was virtually ever present last season at both left back and central defence. Age: 19. Debut: 09.12.23 v. Salisbury.

Luciano D'Auria-Henry (Defender)

Luciano came through Fulham's development system to play for the U23s. He played three times for Cheltenham Town when on loan in 2023-24, and after being released by Fulham he joined Farnborough last season, making 23 appearances for them. He then joined Swans in October. Age: 22. Debut: 01.11.25 v. Tiverton Town.

Riley Horan (Defender)

A captain of the AFC Wimbledon U18 side, Riley joined Swans at the end of March last season on a work experience loan, scoring on his debut against Basingstoke Town. He rejoined for a second loan spell in August. Age: 19. Debut: 29.03.25 v. Basingstoke Town.

Thabo Kuaho (Defender)

Thabo is a young left-side defender who broke into Swans' 1st Team midway through last season after progressing through the youth side, quickly establishing himself as a regular in the left-back spot. Age: 19. Debut: 14.12.24 v. Dorchester Town.

Ethan Light (Defender)

Ethan joined Leyton Orient from Burnham FC in January 2023. While at the East London club he had loan spells at both Hendon and Banbury United. After leaving Orient he had a short spell at Hemel Hempstead Town at the beginning of last season before re-joining Hendon on a permanent basis. He returned to Hemel Hempstead Town in January, before joining Swans in the summer. Age: 21. Debut: 09.08.25 v. Plymouth Parkway.

Stefan Parkes (Defender)

Stefan first joined Swans on loan from Fulham in February 2024, but his debut was cut short after just 25 minutes when he suffered a recurrence of a hamstring injury, one that he had just returned from following a long period of rehabilitation. After joining Fulham from Brentford as a 14 year-old, Stefan moved through the age ranks to the U21s. After being released by Fulham he re-joined Swans on a permanent basis in the summer. Age: 21. Debut: 17.01.24 v. Tiverton Town.

Aaron Williams Fernandez (Defender)

Aaron signed for Swans in October from Chertsey Town, who he had joined in the summer. He spent his early career in the USA, playing for three different clubs, before moving to Spain in January 2025 from UNH Wildcats to play for Real Sporting de Gijón. Age: 23. Debut: 01.11.25 v. Tiverton Town.

Elliott Bolton (Defender/Midfield)

Elliott joined Swans in the summer of 2024 after playing the latter stages of the previous season at Basingstoke Town. He started at AFC Wimbledon, and while there had a first short spell at Basingstoke on loan, and also played for Corinthian-Casuals on a similar arrangement. He joined Weymouth in 2023-24 before his move to Basingstoke. Age: 23. Debut: 10.08.24 v. AFC Totton.

Joey Jones (Defender/Midfield)

Swans' captain Joey started as a young player at Arsenal and then Leicester City. Although born in England he qualified for Northern Ireland through his father and played for their youth sides to win a cap at U21 level.
