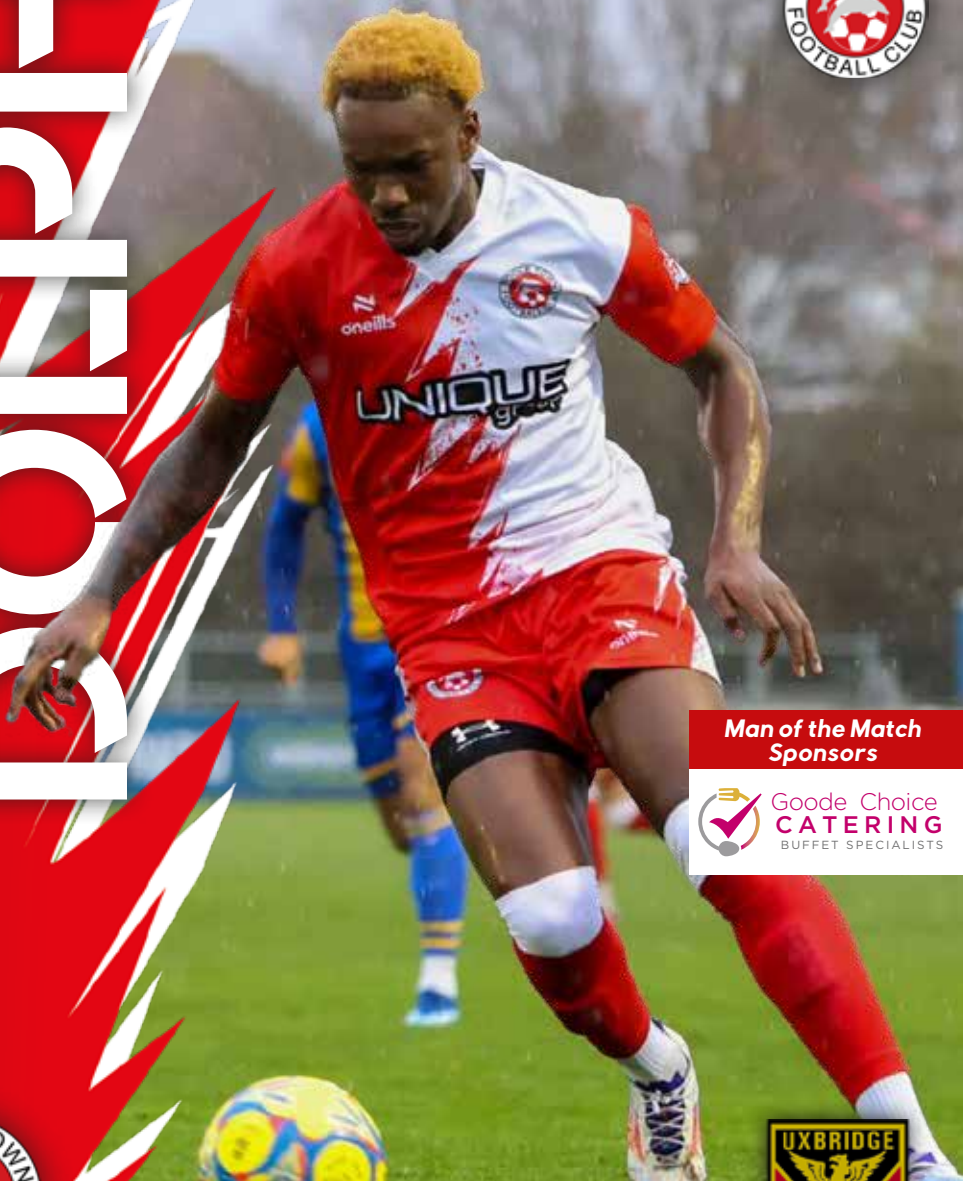

The Chairman



After a rare midweek without a game Pat and Joe will no doubt be reflecting on two vibrant and positive training sessions following on from last weekend's superb three points at Havant and Waterlooville ahead of this afternoon's Southern League Premier South clash with division newcomers Uxbridge. The transformation that our talented joint managers have brought to the playing side of the Club has been quite incredible—we obviously had great confidence in them both as otherwise they would not have been appointed but the wholesale improvement in all aspects, recruitment, coaching, performance, team spirit for example has been just incredible. It is even more impressive when you take into account that they have not even been with us for twelve months yet. In the nicest possible way it seems a lot longer—it is hard now to imagine Poole Town without them!!

Our visitors today in the shape of the players, officials and supporters of Uxbridge Football Club are most welcome—their first ever visit I believe. Uxbridge have made a really solid start to life at step 3 having won promotion last season. They currently lie in ninth place with 29 points from their 20 games played. As we reluctantly say goodbye to Josh in playing terms at least we are very hopeful of welcoming back another Poole favourite in the form of Adeoye Olumuyiwa. "Addie" plays his football in the States these days but is over in the UK now until the end of January and as he did this time last year has signed forms to be with us during that time. A quality performer and a really nice guy—he will be a brilliant addition to the squad over the next 8/9 weeks or so. Welcome back Addie.

Poole Town v Uxbridge

Pitching In Southern League - Premier South
Saturday 13th December 2025- 3pm KO

Goals from Shaguille Gwengwe, Harvey Slade and Corey Jordan gave us a comfortable victory at Havant & Waterlooville last Saturday. The win keeps us very much in touch with the leading pack, although Walton & Hershaw have opened quite a large gap at the top of the table on 51 points followed by Gloucester City on 43. We are currently in 4th place on 38 points behind Gloucester City who are on 40.

The club have moved quickly to strengthen our defence this week by re-signing the very popular central midfielder Ade Olumuyiwa on a short-term deal until the end of January. On signing the contract, Ade said: "I am delighted to be back home at Poole! There was only one place for me, and that is with the Dolphins"

We are back home this Saturday as we entertain Uxbridge, who will be making their first trip to the BlackGold since their promotion from the Isthmian South-Central League last season.

They have had a good first half of the season sitting in 9th place (P20 W7 D8 L5 29 points) and have lost just the once on the road, the 3-0 defeat at Sholing. They have become draw specialists away from Honeycroft having drawn 6 of their 9 away fixtures to date. They are not on a good run at the moment as they sit in 18th place in the form table with 4 defeats, one draw and one win from their last six matches. They were unlucky not to take anything from their last match at home to Walton & Hershaw, after leading 2-1 at half time they eventually lost 3-2 to a 90th minute strike from Dawid Rogalski.

The Middlesex club is managed by Danny Edwards who started his managerial career at Chalfont St Peter. He has guided the club's promotion to step 4 and an FA Vase semi-final. Danny is in his 5th season at the helm at Uxbridge, having also previously worked at Chelsea FC and Southampton FC and is an UEFA A-Licence coach.

Last season will live long in the memory of all Uxbridge supporters. After a poor start to the season, one point after four games, The Reds steadily climbed the table, finally finishing as runners-up to runaway Champions Farnham Town. A goal down in the Play-off semi-final against Kingstonian they fought back

to lead 2-1, until Eddie Simon equalised ten minutes into stoppage-time to force the tie into extra-time and then penalties. A 100% record saw them triumph 5-4 and a place in the Promotion Final. A record crowd at Honeycroft Horton Road of 1535 witnessed a pulsating final, in which Hanworth Villa took the lead. Once again, the Reds showed great character and resilience to fight-back and George Moore sent a powerful drive into the bottom corner to seal promotion to Step Three of the pyramid.

With a few injuries to contend with Joe Lea and Pat Suraci will be pleased to have had a week's break to get the team back to full fitness. After the win at Havant, they explained how they had to reorganise the defence playing the lads in unfamiliar roles. Hopefully, the signing of Ade Olumuyiwa will go a long way to sorting out some of those problems. The forecast is looking much better for the weekend with only drizzle at worst, so it promises to be a great afternoon for non-league football. Our home crowds are rising steadily, and we are now averaging over 700 at our home fixtures.

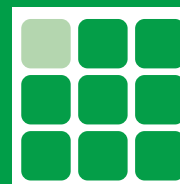

Goalkeeper Ben Taylor signed for Poole Town following trialling with the club during 2024/25 pre-season. An excellent shot-stopper who came through the academies of MK Dons and Cambridge United. He has played for the likes of North Leigh, Gloucester City and Oxford City. He also had a spell playing in the US.

Taylor was part of a Banbury squad that won a league title in the 2021/22 season after making 20 appearances for them. For the 2023/24 campaign, he was at Evesham United and made 28 appearances for the The Robins. Taylor signed for Poole in August of 2024 and earned the number one shirt after the departure of Cam Plain, Taylor has now renewed his contract for the upcoming season.



Adam Parkes
GOALKEEPER

The 25-year-old shot-stopper came through Southampton's academy after joining the Saints at the age of 10 and made appearances on the international stage for England at under 17's level.

Parkes signed for Watford in 2019 and went on to have loan spells in the National League with Barnet and Dover Athletic. Following his time at Watford, Parkes was signed by Plymouth Argyle but never made a first team appearance for the pilgrims.

For the beginning of the 2023/24 campaign, the goalkeeper joined Plymouth Parkway and impressed at Bolitho Park earning him a move to Taunton. Last season, after a spell with Taunton Town, Parkes signed for Gosport Borough under the management of Joe Lea and Pat Suraci and made 30 appearances at Privett Park. The goalkeeper has now made the move to Tatnam and signed for the Dolphins for the upcoming campaign.



Samuel 'Ayo' Faniyan
FORWARD

The 24-year-old winger started his career in the youth ranks with Reading, before making the move to non-league with the likes of Hertford Town and Tooting & Mitcham. After a successful 2023/24 campaign with Hayes & Yeading United, where he found the back of the net on eight occasions, Faniyan linked up with Joe and Pat at Gosport Borough.

Last season, he made 31 appearances for Gosport, but with Joe and Pat's departure from Privett Park, Faniyan also departed the club not long after and finished the campaign with Walton & Hersham.



Josh McCormick
DEFENDER

McCormick started his career at Winchester after coming through the youth ranks. The right-sided defender had spells with Backfield & Langley and lifted the Sussex Senior Cup with Bognor Regis but has spent the majority of his career with the Citizens.

Over the last three seasons, McCormick has been a consistent performer, making 124 appearances and has all the attributes of an attacking full back whilst being defensively resolute. McCormick signed for the Dolphins for the start of the 2025/26 campaign.

The 31-year-old defender becomes our second summer signing and joins us after spending eight years at the Webbwood Stadium and making just under 300 appearances. Campbell started his career through the ranks at national league south side Chippenham and made his debut for them in 2015.

After two seasons with Chippenham, Campbell made the switch to Swindon Supermarine where he became an instant regular starter and was appointed as captain for the start of the 2024/25 campaign. Campbell is an attacking left-sided defender with an eye for goal having scored 52 goals over the previous eight seasons.

Everyone at Poole Town is looking forward to seeing Campbell in red and white for the upcoming campaign.



Billy Lowes

Midfielder Billy Lowes is one of the most technically gifted players in his position, an energetic box to box midfielder with an eye for goal. Lowes started his semi-professional career with Poole Town FC as a 17-year-old.

After a two-year spell at AFC Totton where he excelled, the dynamic midfielder spent five years patrolling the midfield for Dorchester Town making 186 appearances for the Magpies across five seasons, scoring 12 goals. Lowes made the decision to join Bashley and after an impressive season, Lowes earned himself a move to the Dolphins, and has been one of our standout players since manager Steve Tully arrived at the club. His superb strike against Plymouth Parkway in one of the final games of the 2023/24 season will never be forgotten.



Adeoye Olumuyiwa
DEFENDER

Ade first played for us in the 2022/23 season and became an instant favourite with the fans which led to his return to Tatnam last season over the winter period. The defender started his career with Blackfield & Langley in 2017, he's had spells at Farnborough, Weymouth, AFC Totton and then the Dolphins where made 37 appearances between 2022 and 2023.

In the late 19th century, the game of "football" was growing in popularity, and on the 3rd February 1871 a group of eminent local businessmen held the inaugural meeting of Uxbridge Football Club. A local solicitor, Mr William Gardiner, was elected as the Club's President and the club's colours were chosen as white shirts with a light blue Maltese cross and a light blue velvet cap with silver tassel. Friendly games against local opposition were played in the early years, until the FA Cup was entered in 1873. A First Round Victory over Gitanos set-up a Second-Round tie against eventual finalists Royal Engineers, which the Engineers narrowly won 2-1. It was at this time that Uxbridge could boast amongst its ranks a Full England International. Hubert Heron played for England on two occasions whilst an Uxbridge player before he moved to Wanderers FC where he gained further international honours. His brother Francis, formerly of Uxbridge, also played for England after joining him at Wanderers FC. The club changed its colours to Oxford Blue and Cambridge Blue shirts in 1874 but they were in financial difficulties and folded later that year.

The main problem for Uxbridge was the lack of a permanent home ground (a problem that was to plague them until the middle of the next century), the committee searched the town for a suitable base but were thwarted at every turn and they led a nomadic existence, moving ground every few years. The enthusiasm for a team in Uxbridge was still prevalent and the Club was reformed in 1879. In 1886 Uxbridge FC amalgamated with another local club, Uxbridge Crescents, and played under this name in season 1886/87, before reverting to plain old Uxbridge the following season. It was at this time that the Red Shirts, which are still worn today, were adopted and the nickname "The Reds" was born. Their first trophy was won in 1889 when they lifted the West Middlesex Cup, defeating Colnbrook 1-0 in the Final. The end of the 19th century was a particularly successful period for The Reds as they won the West Middlesex Cup on three further occasions and also won the prestigious Middlesex Senior Cup twice. In 1894 they beat the 3rd Grenadier Guards 2-0 and repeated that success two years later with a 3-2 victory over local rivals Southall in a replay in front of over 5000 spectators. The outstanding achievement however was in reaching the final of the F.A. Amateur Cup in 1898. This was the club's first season in the competition, and they had to win eight ties before meeting Middlesbrough in the final at Crystal Palace. Unfortunately, their Northeast rivals proved too strong for them on the day and ran out 2-0 winners. During this successful period for the club, they became founder members of Division Two of the Southern League in 1894, finishing fourth in their first four seasons. However, in season 1898/99 they finished next to bottom and the dwindling crowds (averaging around 500) meant that financially the club was once again in trouble.

A decision was therefore taken to withdraw from the Southern League and join the local Middlesex League to try and stabilise the club. However, a majority of the more talented players joined other clubs, and they struggled in their new surroundings, finishing bottom with only one point from their 14 games. At the end of the season the club had a deficit of £130 and with few players the club once again folded. For two years much fund raising amongst the local community finally saw the club's debts paid and the reformed Uxbridge FC joined the West Middlesex League for the 1902/03 season. In 1904 the Great Western Suburban League was entered and here they stayed until the outbreak of the First World War. Their best finish during this period was as Runners-up to Brentford Reserves in 1910/11. They also won the Middlesex Charity Cup on two occasions in 1908 and 1913, as they looked to re-establish themselves as a force in the football world. Following the end of hostilities Uxbridge joined the Athenian League and added "Town" to their name. An unsuccessful first Athenian League campaign saw them relegated back to the Great Western Suburban League in 1920. A successful four seasons saw them back in the Athenian League in 1924 where they remained until

1937. The Middlesex Charity Cup was won for the third time in 1935 as Finchley were beaten 4-3. Two poor seasons saw them finish bottom of the Athenian League in 1936 and 1937 and the club failed to be re-elected. They joined the Spartan League for

the 1937/38 season, dropping "Town" from their name at the end of the campaign stood proudly at the summit. Championship celebrations however were cut short when it was discovered that The Reds had played an ineligible player and were deducted six points, placing them in third position behind Champions Marlow.

Following the debacle of their one and only season in the Spartan League they resigned and joined the London League prior to the Second World War. During the war years they continued to play and joined the newly formed Great Western Combination League before re-joining the London League in 1945, finishing as Runners-up to Edgware Town. Uxbridge were founder members of the Corinthian League in 1946 and remained in this league for the next seventeen years. Finally, in 1948, after over three quarters of a century of searching, a ground of their own was purchased. A piece of land in Cleveland Road, Cowley was bought for £5,800 by then President Mr W.S. Try. The ground was named after a large house that stood on the land and "Honeycroft" was the new home of Uxbridge Football Club. During this period, they won their only Championship to-date when they were crowned Corinthian League Champions at the end of the 1959/60 season. They also won the Middlesex Senior Cup for the third time in 1951 when they defeated Hayes 2-1. This was a successful period in the club's history as they finished in the top five of the Corinthian League on no less than eight occasions and crowds were averaging around the thousand mark. A re-organisation of non-League football saw the end of the Corinthian League in 1963 and club found itself once again in Division One of the Athenian League. This was a lean time for The Reds, they were relegated to Division Two in 1967 and financial problems once again beset them. They gained national publicity in 1976 when England were looking for a side to play as part of their warmup for the forthcoming World Cup campaign. Uxbridge took on a full-strength England at Wembley, losing 8-0. The ground problems that had blighted Uxbridge throughout their history surfaced once again and the club had to find a new home. In 1978 they moved to their current headquarters in Horton Road, Yiewsley. A former works Sports & Social Club they have developed the site to the superb standard you see today.

Over the past 43 years they have added floodlights (opened by the visit of Arsenal in 1981), new stands, fencing and in more recent times a new clubhouse was opened and car park laid. On the playing front the club won the Middlesex Charity Cup for the fourth time in 1982, their first silverware for 31 years, and moved to the Isthmian League in the same year, winning promotion to Division One in 1985. The Final of the AC Delco Cup (League Cup) was reached in 1986, where they met Premier Division Champions Sutton United. The Reds failed to stop Sutton completing "The Double" though, losing 3-1 in the Final in front of over a thousand spectators at Imber Court, the home of Metropolitan Police FC. Uxbridge entered the London Challenge Cup for the first time in the 1992/93 season and hence followed a love affair between the Reds and the magnificent trophy. In the eight seasons they entered the competition they reached five finals, winning on three occasions in 1994, 1997 and 2000. They won the Middlesex Senior Cup for the fourth time in 2001, defeating Harrow Borough 3-0 in the Final held at Honeycroft. In 2004 the club were moved across the pyramid to the Southern League and have reached the Play-Offs on three occasions. In 2004/05 they lost on penalties, after leading Maldon Town in extra-time, in 2007/08 they narrowly lost 0-1 at Oxford City and in 2011/12 they lost 2-1 at Bedworth United in the Semi-Finals.

In 2018 Uxbridge were moved back across the pyramid, re-joining the Isthmian League in the South-Central Division. In 2019 Uxbridge appointed only their sixth manager in over fifty years. Ron Clack was in charge for 18-years from 1970,



followed by Peter Marshall for one season, Michael

Harvey for three, before George Talbot took the reins for fourteen seasons in 1992. In 2006 Tony Choules became the man in charge, being replaced by our current manager Danny Edwards in 2019. Danny is a UEFA A licensed coach who spent 15 years as manager of Chalfont St Peter AFC. He steered Chalfont St Peter to Step 4 of the league system in 2011, as well as reaching the 3rd Qualifying Round of the Football Association Challenge Cup on three occasions. The Middlesex Charity Cup was won for the 8th time in 2022, with a 2-0 victory over Hanwell Town. This feat was repeated in 2023 when North Greenford United were defeated 2-1 in the final at Bedfont Sports.

In recent times the club have mourned the passing of several club stalwarts. President Alan Odell, who had been associated with The Reds for eighty years, in 2016. Long serving Chairman Alan Holloway in 2021, a year later "Mr Uxbridge", David Tucker who had been associated with the club for over 50 years and was a massive influence in the running of Uxbridge Football Club. And just this summer former Secretary and President Roger Stevens was taken from us. Mark Bantock took over as Chairman from his stepfather,

Alan Holloway, and under his stewardship the club has used the legacy left by "Mr Uxbridge" to revitalise the Club. A 3G pitch was installed in 2023, along with new floodlights, pitch surround, dugouts and a 158-seater stand on the far-side of the ground. The Clubhouse has been refurbished to a high standard, providing a space to enjoy for both home and visiting fans.

Last season will live long in the memory of all Uxbridge supporters. After a poor start to the season, one point after four games, The Reds steadily climbed the table, finally finishing as runner-up to runaway Champions Farnham Town. A goal down in the Play-off semi-final against Kingstonsian they fought back to lead 2-1, until Eddie Simon equalised ten minutes into stoppage-time to force the tie into extra-time and then penalties. A 100% record saw them triumph 5-4 and a place in the Promotion Final. A record crowd at Honeycroft Horton Road of 1535 witnessed a pulsating final, in which Hanworth Villa took the lead. Once again, the Reds showed great character and resilience to fight-back and George Moore sent a powerful drive into the bottom corner to seal promotion to Step Three of the pyramid. Their first promotion in forty-years!

Uxbridge FC - Players

Rhys Forster (Goalkeeper)

Began his career at Metropolitan Police before moving to Slough Town. Played a pivotal part in Enfield Town's promotion to the National League South in 2024. Joined the Reds in November, making his debut at home to Farnham Town.

Massimo Giamattei (Defender/Midfield)

"Mas" was a regular member of the Chertsey Town side that won the Isthmian League South Central Division title in 2023/24. In his second season at Honeycroft and scored some important goals last season. Former professional at Swindon Town who has also played for Bracknell Town and Basingstoke Town.

Kyle Bailey (Defender)

Another player to join the Reds in the summer of 2025. Vastly experienced defender who has previously played for Hungerford Town (Step Two) and Enfield Town. Began his career at Sheerwater and Westfield before playing professionally in Malta, Norway and Scotland.

CJ Fearn (Defender)

Joined the Reds from Farnborough in September 2024. Commanding defender who has over ten years' experience at Steps 2 & 3 of the football pyramid. Was a massive influence in Uxbridge gaining promotion with his defending and leadership qualities. Supporters and Players Player award winner last season.

Jordan Stepney (Defender)

Strong left sided defender who joined the club in October from Farnham Town. He made over 50

appearances for the Surrey club as they clinched promotion by winning the Isthmian League Division One South Central last season.

Casey Bocarro (Defender)

Made the left-back position his own last season after joining from Virginia Water. Tenacious defender who looks to get forward at every opportunity.

Kai Hobbs (Defender)

Kai joined Uxbridge on a permanent deal last season, after impressing on loan from Basingstoke Town. All action defender who can play anywhere across the back four. Chipped in with some important goals in last season's push for promotion.

Cole Brown (Defender/Midfield)

After making his Reds debut as a 19-year-old in 2017, Cole has rejoined the club from Chertsey Town. Attack minded player who has also represented Hayes & Yeading United, Hampton & Richmond Borough and Hendon. Made 40 appearances, scoring 10 goals in his previous season at Uxbridge.

Bernie Tanner (Defender)

New signing from Enfield Town, where he scored in the 2024 Isthmian League Premier Division play-off final to secure Enfield's place at Step Two. Strong central defender whose experience at Step Three will be invaluable to The Reds

George Moore (Midfield/Forward)

Attacking midfielder who joined us from Harrow Borough in 2023. Last season's top scorer with 21-goals, which saw him pick up the Player of the



year trophy. Was regularly amongst the goals at Step 3 with Harrow Borough and his winning goal in the Promotion final has already made him a club legend.

Frank Keita (Midfield)

Free scoring midfielder who joined the club this season from Farnborough. Scored an impressive 35 goals for Rayners Lane last season, as they finished 11th in the Isthmian League South Central Division One. Previous clubs include Hendon, Potters Bar Town, Wingate & Finchley, Hayes & Yeading United and Boreham Wood.

Andrio Brandao (Midfield)

Skilful, attacking midfielder who joined from Virginia Water in 2023. Always plays with a smile on his face and is improving with every game.

Harry Rush (Midfield)
