



Match Preview



Poole Town v Sholing FC

Pitching In Southern League - Premier South
Saturday 20th December 2025 - 3pm KO

We are back at the BlackGold on Saturday to take on Sholing, ko 3pm. The 3-1 win over Uxbridge stretched our unbeaten run to 6 league matches and shows that we are putting some consistency together. That win keeps us in 3rd place (P21 W12 D5 L4 41 points) and 3rd in the form table P6 W4 D2.

Our visitors had an electric start to the new season, beating us in their first home match of the season, 4-1 on a Tuesday evening in August and going on to top the table for a few weeks. However, they have slipped slightly and are now in 6th place (P21 W9 D9 L3 36 points) but still handily placed. They have played 11 matches away from their Mortgage Decisions Stadium on the outskirts of Southampton winning 3 drawing 6 and they have suffered two defeats. They have only failed to score in two away fixtures, at Yate Town and Walton & Hersham.

In our two matches against them last season we played out a goalless draw away but took all three points at the BlackGold in a 2-0 win. Sholing went on to finish in 11th position on 52 points, a few places above us. Leading marksman for the club was Michael Folivi who scored 21 goals in 23 games in the 2nd half of the season. In the close season, a world class 3G pitch was installed in record time and officially opened by Levi Colwill in front of 1,888 spectators as Sholing beat Chelsea U19's, 2-0.

The Boatmen have played two of our local sides in their last two matches. They drew 1-1 with Wimborne at The Wyatt Homes Stadium and then went on to beat Dorchester 2-1 at home last weekend. In that match Sholing took an early lead through Brad Targett but Dorchester quickly equalised. However, a Tommy-Lee Higgs strike for the home side gave them a half-time lead. Will Spetch was shown a straight red card in the second half which made things easier for Sholing who went on to take all three points.

Former Dolphin Jake McCarthy signed for Sholing after leaving Weymouth in September. He has been pretty much ever present for them since then and has scored 7 league goals. Just two behind the clubs top scorer Michel Folivi who is on 9.

Sholing gained promotion to the Southern Premier South for the first time at the end of the 2022/23 season. After finishing the league campaign in

2nd place, the Boatmen firstly defeated Wimborne Town 2-1 in the playoff semi-final, before beating Hamworthy United 2-0 in the Final. After 25 years in charge, Dave Diaper stepped down in October 2023 with Paul Doswell, the ex-Eastleigh and Sutton United boss taking over as manager, and Ross White acting as first team coach. Since Doswell and a new board of directors have arrived, a new 400 capacity stand was built and many improvements have been made, including a large fan zone and 100 space hardstanding car park.

It was announced this week that the very popular and long serving club captain Jamie Whisken will spend a month at Shaftsbury as part of his recovery and to give him the opportunity to regain match fitness. I am sure that we all wish him well and look forward to seeing him back at the heart of our defence.

As we enter the festive period it would be great to keep this successful run going as we prepare to take on local rivals Wimborne Town at the Wyatt Homes Stadium next Saturday. Come along and support your local team and experience non-league football at its best.

Campbell is an attacking left-sided defender with an eye for goal having scored 52 goals over the previous eight seasons.

Midfielder Billy Lowes is one of the most technically gifted players in his position, an energetic box to box midfielder with an eye for goal. Lowes started his semi-professional career with Poole Town FC as a 17-year-old.

After a two-year spell at AFC Totton where he excelled, the dynamic midfielder spent five years patrolling the midfield for Dorchester Town making 186 appearances for the Magpies across five seasons, scoring 12 goals. Lowes made the decision to join Bashley and after an impressive season, Lowes earned himself a move to the Dolphins, and has been one of our standout players since manager Steve Tully arrived at the club. His superb strike against Plymouth Parkway in one of the final games of the 2023/24 season will never be forgotten.

Ade first played for us in the 2022/23 season and became an instant favourite with the fans which led to his return to Tatnams last season over the winter period. The defender started his career with Blackfield & Langley in 2017, he's had spells at Farnborough, Weymouth, AFC Totton and then the Dolphins where made 37 appearances between 2022 and 2023.

After a spell in America with NSU in the Sunshine State Conference in Florida, Ade decided to return back to the UK and joined Poole on a short term deal where he made five appearances last season, before departing abroad again.

Ade has once again signed on this season and will be a Poole Town player until the end of January.

**Jamie Whisken**
DEFENDER**Sponsored By:**

The 35-year-old centre back is a fan-favourite at Poole Town, he was one of several players that moved west to Poole Town from AFC Totton in the summer of 2013. The defender's main position is in central defence, but he can also play along the back four as he is just as comfortable going forward as he is in defence. He has made almost 500 appearances for the Dolphins over a span extending ten years and has captained the side for the majority of that time.

He started his career at AFC Bournemouth, where he only managed to play one game in the league cup against Wigan Athletic. 'Whisk' has also played for Basingstoke Town, Bognor Regis and Farnborough Town took over as captain of the side during the 2013/14 season. During his tenure with Poole, the most memorable moment in his career will likely be captaining the side to the Southern Premier League title in 2016 and finishing in a remarkable 5th place in the National League South the following season.

Whisken put pen to paper to extend his contract at Poole until the conclusion of the 2024/25 season.

Campbell is a technically gifted winger with heaps of experience in the National League South. Born in Croydon, the 30-year-old started his career at nearby Bromley, initially as a goalkeeper before making the switch to defence at 17 years old.

After short spells at Merstham and Dulwich Hamlet, Campbell re-signed for Bromley when the Ravens were in the National League.

For the start of the 2018/19 season, Campbell joined Eastbourne Borough and made 66 appearances at Priory Lane in a two-year span. After short spells at Tonbridge Angels, Bognor Regis and Welling United, Campbell signed for Kent Rivals Dartford.

He played a significant role in the push for the National League South playoffs for the Darts in which they were defeated in the Quarter Final to Chippenham after finishing in 4th place.

Following Dartford, Campbell went on to play for Chatham Town and then Gosport Borough in the Southern Premier Division South before signing for National League South outfit Hampton & Richmond.

In the 2024/25 season, he made 29 appearances for the Beavers and scored on three occasions and secured eight assists and joined Poole in February and went on to have an instant impact becoming a significant part of why we stayed up. To the delight of Poole fans, Campbell will remain with the club until the conclusion of the 2025/26 season.

The 28-year-old joined the Dolphins after an impressive season for Sholing where he racked up three goals and 13 assists. He is a cultured and versatile player who has gained the reputation of being a 'free-kick specialist' who has an eye for goal.

Charlie Davis started his career at AFC Bournemouth before moving to Poole as a talented teenager in 2013 and stayed at Tatnams for two years making 26 appearances.

After spells at Dorchester and Weymouth, Davis re-joined Poole to pursue more game time. In this spell, Davis made nine appearances for the Dolphins, scoring four times including a hattrick in the Dorset Senior Cup against Swanage Town & Herston. However, during the 2018/19 season, Davis left Poole for Gosport Borough and went on to captain the side.

The experienced midfielder joined Salisbury in 2020 where he made 57 appearances over a three-year period which led to him signing for AFC Totton and then Sholing before signing across the dotted line for Poole Town.





Harvey Slade MIDFIELDER

Harvey Slade is a 6'4 box to box midfielder who provides aerial threat and has an eye for goal with late runs into the box. He originally joined us on loan from Weymouth during the 2023/24 but agreed a contract with the Dolphins for the 2024/25 campaign.

Slade started his career at Bashley where he scored an impressive six goals in 15 appearances from central midfield emphasising his goal-scoring ability from deep. A player that has impressed Steve Tully during his time at the club and was one of our standout players in the conclusion of the 2023/24 season. Harvey Slade has now continued his stay at Tatnam and will be a Poole Town player until 2026.

Corey Jordan DEFENDER

The 26-year-old is a natural centre half who can also be used as a right sided defender. Jordan started his career at AFC Bournemouth where he made his professional debut in a 3-2 defeat to Preston North End in the EFL Cup, replacing Tyrone Mings as a substitute. Whilst being under contract with the Cherries, Jordan had loan spells in the National League with Weymouth and Eastbourne Borough. Following his release from AFC Bournemouth, he signed for Gloucester City before swiftly moving on to Aldershot in the National League where he made 62 appearances over two campaigns there. For the 2023/24 season, Jordan signed for Gosport Borough and worked under Joe Lea and Pat Suraci in a season where they finished comfortably inside the playoffs in 4th place.

After a successful season, Jordan signed for Weymouth for his second spell with the club. After suffering relegation from the National League South with Weymouth, Jordan has switched to the red and white of Poole Town to reunite under the helm of Joe and Pat.



Owen Dore DEFENDER

After progressing through the youth ranks of Oxford United and Southampton, the 20-year-old centre back signed for North Leigh in 2022. In January of the 2023, Dore signed for Salisbury and achieved promotion with the Whites from the Southern League Premier South via the playoffs where they beat Gosport Borough in the semi final.

Last season, he made 36 league appearances for Salisbury in the National League South and helped them remain in the division. Owen Dore has now signed for the Dolphins on loan until January.



Shaquille Gwengwe FORWARD

The 24-year-old centre forward was Joe Lea and Pat Suraci's eighth summer signing and joins us from Dorchester, where he spent the previous three seasons. In the early stages of his footballing career, Gwengwe played for the likes of Worthing, Blackfield & Langley and Andover Town and saw success with sides rising through the non-league pyramid. For the 2021/22 campaign, Gwengwe made the move to AFC Totton and scored 15 goals in 29 appearances in all competitions. Following a strong season with the Stags, the striker signed for Dorchester and within his first season, he secured the club's golden boot after finding the back of the net on 13 occasions. Gwengwe went on to score 17 goals the following season which led to several clubs being interested in his signature for the start of the 2024/25 campaign, but he re-signed on at the Avenue. After scoring on ten occasions last season for Dorchester, Gwengwe has now decided it's time to make the step up and sign for Poole for the 2025/26 campaign.



Scott Rowles MIDFIELDER

Scott Rowles joined the club when he was ten years old and made his first team debut in the Emirates FA Cup against Gosport Borough and made his league debut in the dying moments of the 4-1 win against Taunton Town. A versatile player who is certainly a promising aspect for the future.

Selim Saied MIDFIELDER

The tricky winger joins the Dolphins from National League South Farnborough after making 91 appearances and scoring 15 goals in three years at Cherrywood Road.

The 21-year-old started his career at youth level for National League outfit Woking. He progressed through the ranks into the first team and earned a senior deal in September 2020 and made two National League appearances.

Saied joined Farnborough on loan for the start of the 2021/22 campaign, winning the Hampshire Senior Cup and helping his side gain promotion from The Southern League Premier South. After a fantastic season, he made the switch to the Hampshire side permanent in October 2022.

Over the previous two seasons, he made 68 appearances and scored 12 goals before being released at the end of last season. In January, Saied was re-signed by Farnborough and has now signed for Poole Town on loan for the remainder of the campaign and playing a pivotal role in keeping the club in the division. Saied has now signed a two year deal at Tatnam and will be a Poole Town player until 2027.



Antonio Diaz MIDFIELDER

Midfielder Antonio Diaz signed for the Dolphins from Gosport Borough where he spent the 2023/24 campaign, accumulating 33 appearances and scoring two goals. The midfielder is not the first in his family to play for Poole Town, his dad Tony was a prolific goal-scorer for the Dolphins in the 90's.

The 25-year-old came through AFC Bournemouth's academy and was part of a Cherries' team that won the Youth Alliance Cup in 2017. After spells at Weymouth, Dorchester and Wimborne Town, Diaz joined Salisbury in 2020 and made 77 appearances, scoring nine goals.

In December 2022, Antonio Diaz made the decision to join Bashley FC before joining Gosport Borough for the 2023/24 season. Diaz has played a vital role during his time at Poole so far, playing multiple different positions and performing admirably whenever featured emphasising his versatility and tireless effort displayed every time he steps foot on the pitch. He also once wore the captains armband against Bournemouth Poppies.



Henry Spalding MIDFIELDER

The 26-year-old midfielder progressed through Bristol City's youth academy before signing for Marine in 2016. After only playing a handful of games, Spalding made the move to Cirencester Town and spent three seasons at the Gloucester-based side.

Spalding then returned back to the Webswood Stadium and remained there for six campaigns, bar a short stint at Salisbury in 2021. For the start of the 2024/25 season, Spalding signed for Hungerford Town before moving to Gosport to work under the management of Joe Lea and Pat Suraci.

After the duo's departure from Privett Park, he then returned to Swindon Supermarine for the remainder of the campaign and has made over 200 appearances across multiple spells for the club.



Ik Hill FORWARD

The 24-year-old winger becomes our fourth summer signing and joins us after an impressive individual season last campaign after recording 31 goal contributions in 45 matches.

Hill started his career in the youth ranks of Winchester's academy before making his first team debut in 2017. After a spell with Westfield in the Isthmian South-Central Division, the winger returned to Winchester in 2022 and became an instant key player for the Citizens.

Last season, Hill found the back of the net on 22 occasions and also recorded nine assists over the course of the campaign in a Winchester side that suffered relegation. Many Poole fans will remember his brace that he scored against us in the 3-2 win at Tatnam last season.

After being heavily sought after, Ik Hill has decided to turn to the red and white of Poole and signs on a two year deal.

The Boatmen, nicknamed after the club's history of shipbuilding, have a long, but fragmented history, running teams from the Woolston Works as early as 1878.

In March 1887 they were finalists in the first Portsmouth Challenge Cup, beaten 1-0 by Portsmouth Association Club. The Club were only beaten twice in 16 games that year (goal tally 72-6) and won the last Hants & Dorset Challenge Cup before those Associations split.

Woolston Works won the first ever Hampshire Senior Cup Final in 1888, beating Winchester 2-0. There was some controversy that year concerning Woolston's professional attitude, which was referred to as "Kesson's Boots". Andover were beaten in an earlier round by Woolston, in which a Glasgow-based player called J. Kesson played a prominent part.

Andover protested that Kesson should be disqualified on the grounds of residency - although he had played for Woolston Works earlier that season, he had since moved back to Glasgow. Woolston's appeal rested on the fact that Kesson had left a number of clothing items at his lodgings in Woolston, and this should be interpreted as his intention to return. The Hampshire FA upheld the appeal and allowed Kesson to play.

Re-forming after World War 1 as Thornycrofts (Woolston), they were admitted into the Hampshire County League from 1919 to 1926. In 1920 Thornycrofts reached the FA Cup First Round proper (pictured below), meeting First Division giants Burnley at Fratton Park, and held them to a 0-0 draw in front of over 10,000 spectators, before losing 5-0 in the replay, three days later. Burnley were Football League runners-up that season before winning the Title the following year.

After World War 2, Thornycrofts Woolston re-formed in 1947 but were only able to keep going until 1952.

The Club were re-formed as VOSPER THORNYCROFT FC in 1960 and joined the Southampton Junior League.

After many successful years in the Southampton Leagues, where the club won 6 Championships overseen by Arthur Fox, Trevor Lewis & Bill Boyle, Vospers were promoted to the Hampshire League Division 3 in 1991. The following season they were promoted to Division 2. 1997/98 saw Vospers as Hampshire Intermediate Cup Winners.

1999/00 Dave Diaper is appointed manager
2001/02 Vospers win the Southampton Senior Cup at St Mary's Stadium.

2002/03 Vospers re-named as VTFC (after the parent company), and were Runners-up in the Southampton Senior Cup.



2003/04 A double winning season as Hampshire Premier League Champions & Southampton Senior Cup Winners and promotion to the Wessex League for the first time.

2005/06 VT again win the Southampton Senior Cup

2006/07 VT finished in third place and won the Southampton Senior Cup yet again. The Club's 4th victory in 6 years.

2007/08 Runners-up in the Wessex Premier League and continued our dominance in the Southampton Senior Cup, winning it for the third consecutive year.

2008/09 Club gained promotion to Step 4 for the first time by finishing as Wessex League Premier runners-up. Also won the Wessex League Cup with a 2-1 victory over Hamworthy United. Club reached the final of the Hampshire Senior Cup, but were defeated 1-0 by Fleet Town.

2009/10 In our first season in the Southern League South & West Division we finished a creditable 4th, reaching the play-offs, but were defeated by Bridgewater Town in the Semi Final. We reached the final of the Red Insure League Cup, but lost on penalties to Cambridge City. The Southampton Senior Cup was won again at St Mary's, defeating Team Solent 2-0.

Club changed name in July 2010 to **SHOLING FC** after the parent company, VT Group, were no longer in existence with the closure of the Woolston shipyard. We decided to reflect the name of the area of Southampton nearest the ground and adopted the Red & White stripes so associated with the City.

2010/11 In our second season in the Southern League South & West, we finished 2nd, but agonisingly missed out on promotion in the play off final, losing 1-0 to Frome.

2011/12 For the third season on the trot we reached the playoffs only to fall at the first hurdle to a 1-0 away defeat by Gosport.

2012/13 We finished 7th in the Southern League South & West, but the club made the difficult decision to voluntarily drop out of the Southern League.

2013/14 Back in the Wessex League Premier Division we weren't defeated until February. Despite having to play 20 games in 30 days due to a bad winter, Sholing won the title with 104 points and a goal difference of +105. We also won the Southampton Senior Cup at St Mary's.

The FA Vase win will be what most people will remember from this season. Back in October as we squeaked past Winchester City in the 1st round, no one was dreaming of Wembley, but as the rounds



were ticked off, we started to get the feeling that our name was on the Cup. So, on the 10th May 2014 at Wembley Stadium, backed by over 3,000 fans, Marv McLean scored the only goal in the 71st minute and Byron Mason & Dave Diaper lifted the Vase. In a whirlwind of activity that followed, the team paraded the FA Vase in front of 30,000 Southampton FC fans at St Mary's, were given an official reception by the Mayor of Southampton and appeared on both local TV stations.

2014/15 We were granted promotion back into the Southern League South & West division, finishing in 17th. Ground grading issues saw Sholing relegated back to the Wessex League.

2015/16 Sholing finished runners up in the Wessex Premier League.

2016/17 Boatmen achieved 2 Cup Wins in the space of 3 days at the end of the season. Firstly winning the Wessex League Cup with a 2-1 win over Baffins Milton Rovers, then defeating Team Solent 3-1 at St Mary's Stadium to lift the Southampton Senior Cup for a record 8th time.

2017/18 Sholing finished 3rd in the Wessex Premier for the 2nd consecutive season, scoring 100 goals in the process.

2018/19 Sholing were crowned Wessex League Champions with 8 games remaining. The Boatmen finished with a record title winning margin of 31 points and also the Wessex record for points per game (2.763). The club also won the Russell Cotes Cup for the first time.

2019/20 Boatmen climbed from the bottom 3 to 10th place and were looking good for a possible late run for the play-offs, before the season was sadly halted by the Coronavirus outbreak. Sholing created club history by reaching the First round proper of the FA Trophy for the first time.

2020/21 After decades of trying, the club finally built a new changing room building. History was made in the FA Cup when the club reached the 4th Qualifying Round for the first time where we were narrowly defeated by Torquay United.

2021/22 Boatmen started the season well and stayed in the top 6 until February, but finished 7th

2022/23 Sholing gained promotion to the Southern Premier South for the first time. After finishing the league campaign in 2nd place, the Boatmen firstly defeated Wimborne Town 2-1 in the play off semi final, before beating Hamworthy United 2-0 in the Final.

2023/24 After 25 years in charge, Dave Diaper stepped down with Paul Doswell taking over. Since "Dos" and a new board of directors have arrived, a

new 400 capacity stand was built and many improvements have been made, including a large fan zone and 100 space hardstanding car park.

2024/25 Boatmen finished 11th, in part due to Michael Folivi scoring 21 goals in 23 games in the 2nd half of the season. In the close season, a world class 3G pitch was installed in record time and officially opened by Levi Colwill in front of 1,888 spectators as Sholing beat Chelsea U19's, 2-0.


