



Poole Town v Plymouth Parkway

Pitching In Southern League - Premier South
Saturday 3rd January 2026 - 3pm KO

In front of an expectant and noisy capacity crowd The Dolphins secured the local bragging rights from The Magpies at The Wyatt Homes Stadium on Saturday. The 2-0 win was hard fought but very well deserved in a match that was dominated by the visitors. We move up to 3rd place (P23 W13 D5 L5 44 points) and keep the pressure on the top sides. We are now 5th in the form table P6 W4 D1 L1 and have moved quickly to put the disappointment of the Sholing result behind us.

Next up we welcome Plymouth Parkway to Tatnum on Saturday ko 3pm. The Yellows are sitting just above the relegation zone in 18th place (P21 W5 D6 L10 21 points) and very much in need of points. Their lack of goals seems to be costing them dearly as only Hanwell Town 23 and Tiverton Town on 21 have scored fewer than their 25. They have dropped to 16th in the form table taking just 5 points from their last six matches.

They come into the match on the back of a disappointing defeat in the all Devon clash with bottom club Tiverton Town. After a goalless first half The Yellows went in front on 65 minutes and seemed to be on course for all three points. However, a penalty conceded on 82 minutes and converted by Tor Swan brought the visitors back into the match. It was again Tor Swan who was there to strike home the winner on 92 minutes and break the hearts of the home supporters. In the match prior to that they went down 4-0 at Farnham after having Mikey Williams sent off in the 69th minute when the score was 2-0.

Plymouth have won just once on the road so far this season from their 11 fixtures, Andrew "Rocky" Neale bagged a brace to give them the win at struggling Weymouth on December 20th. We travelled to Bolitho Park on August Bank Holiday Monday and came away with all three points thanks to an 85th minute strike from the now retired Josh Staunton.

Plymouth were very much in the relegation dog fight last season until they found some form towards the end of February and March when they achieved 6 wins. Even though they finished the season with three defeats they finished a credible 13th on 50 points. We beat them 3-1 at home in September but lost vital points to them near the end of the season when we lost 3-1 at Bolitho Park.

The club is managed by Chris McPhee who in two spells played 116 times for Weymouth, scoring 13 times, before his exit in the 2015/2016 season. He replaced Lee Hobbs, who in his superb seven-year tenure took the Bolitho Park club up three divisions to Step 3.

Lee Peacock, the former Manchester City, Sheffield Wednesday and Bristol City striker, is McPhee's assistant.

The striker that we need to watch could well be Andrew Neale who began his football journey at Lee Moor before progressing through a number of clubs including Parkway, Tiverton Town, Bodmin, Truro City, and Taunton Town. After a second spell with Truro, he returned to Parkway, continuing to add experience and quality to the side.

Parkway were promoted to Step 3 after finishing the 2021/2022 Southern League South Division as champions. They started the 2022/2023 season rather slowly but as the season progressed, they managed to turn things around and in a remarkable resurgence they finished their first season at this level in 10th place. This was followed up by an 18th place finish in 2023/2024 and as was said previously 13th in 2024/2025

The forecast is for the temperatures to drop over the next few days so wrap up warm and show your support for the team.



After a two-year spell at AFC Totton where he excelled, the dynamic midfielder spent five years patrolling the midfield for Dorchester Town making 186 appearances for the Magpies across five seasons, scoring 12 goals. Lowes made the decision to join Basley and after an impressive season, Lowes earned himself a move to the Dolphins, and has been one of our standout players since manager Steve Tully arrived at the club. His superb strike against Plymouth Parkway in one of the final games of the 2023/24 season will never be forgotten.

After a spell in America with NSU in the Sunshine State Conference in Florida, Ade decided to return back to the UK and joined Poole on a short term deal where he made five appearances last season, before departing abroad again.

Jamie Whisken
DEFENDER

The 35-year-old centre back is a fan-favourite at Poole Town, he was one several players that moved west to Poole Town from AFC Totton in the summer of 2013. The defender's main position is in central defence, but he can also play along the back four as he is just as comfortable going forward as he is in defence. He has made almost 500 appearances for the Dolphins over a span extending ten years and has captained the side for the majority of that time.

He started his career at AFC Bournemouth, where he only managed to play one game in the league cup against Wigan Athletic. 'Whisk' has also played for Basingstoke Town, Bognor Regis and Farnborough Town took over as captain of the side during the 2013/14 season. During his tenure with Poole, the most memorable moment in his career will likely be captaining the side to the Southern Premier League title in 2016 and finishing in a remarkable 5th place in the National League South the following season.

Whisken put pen to paper to extend his contract at Poole until the conclusion of the 2024/25 season.

Campbell is a technically gifted winger with heaps of experience in the National League South. Born in Croydon, the 30-year-old started his career at nearby Bromley, initially as a goalkeeper before making the switch to defence at 17 years old.

After short spells at Merstham and Dulwich Hamlet, Campbell re-signed for Bromley when the Ravens were in the National League.

For the start of the 2018/19 season, Campbell joined Eastbourne Borough and made 66 appearances at Priory Lane in a two-year span. After short spells at Tonbridge Angels, Bognor Regis and Welling United, Campbell signed for Kent Rivals Dartford.

He played a significant role in the push for the National League South playoffs for the Darts in which they were defeated in the Quarter Final to Chippenham after finishing in 4th place.

Following Dartford, Campbell went on to play for Chatham Town and then Gosport Borough in the Southern Premier Division South before signing for National League South outfit Hampton & Richmond.

In the 2024/25 season, he made 29 appearances for the Beavers and scored on three occasions and secured eight assists and joined Poole in February and went on to have an instant impact becoming a significant part of why we stayed up. To the delight of Poole fans, Campbell will remain with the club until the conclusion of the 2025/26 season.

A dynamic midfielder who was one of many signings made by Steve Tully for the 2024/25 campaign. The 28-year-old joined the Dolphins after an impressive season for Sholing where he racked up three goals and 13 assists. Charlie Davis started his career at AFC Bournemouth before moving to Poole as a talented teenager in 2013 and stayed at Tatnam for two years making 26 appearances.

After spells at Dorchester and Weymouth, Davis re-joined Poole to pursue more game time. In this spell, Davis made nine appearances for the Dolphins, scoring four times including a hattrick in the Dorset Senior Cup against Swanage Town & Herston. Corey Jordan DEFENDER

Last season, he made 36 league appearances for Salisbury in the National League South and helped them remain in the division. Owen Dore has now signed for the Dolphins on loan until January.



Shaquille Gwengwe FORWARD

The 24-year-old centre forward was Joe Lea and Pat Suraci's eighth summer signing and joins us from Dorchester, where he spent the previous three seasons. In the early stages of his footballing career, Gwengwe played for the likes of Worthing, Blackfield & Langley and Andover Town and saw success with sides rising through the non-league pyramid. For the 2021/22 campaign, Gwengwe made the move to AFC Totton and scored 15 goals in 29 appearances in all competitions. Following a strong season with the Stags, the striker signed for Dorchester and within his first season, he secured the club's golden boot after finding the back of the net on 13 occasions. Gwengwe went on to score 17 goals the following season which led to several clubs being interested in his signature for the start of the 2024/25 campaign, but he re-signed on at the Avenue. After scoring on ten occasions last season for Dorchester, Gwengwe has now decided it's time to make the step up and sign for Poole for the 2025/26 campaign.

Selim Saied MIDFIELDER

The tricky winger joins the Dolphins from National League South Farnborough after making 91 appearances and scoring 15 goals in three years at Cherrywood Road.

The 21-year-old started his career at youth level for National League outfit Woking. He progressed through the ranks into the first team and earned a senior deal in September 2020 and made two National League appearances.

Saied joined Farnborough on loan for the start of the 2021/22 campaign, winning the Hampshire Senior Cup and helping his side gain promotion from The Southern League Premier South. After a fantastic season, he made the switch to the Hampshire side permanent in October 2022.

Over the previous two seasons, he made 68 appearances and scored 12 goals before being released at the end of last season. In January, Saied was re-signed by Farnborough and has now signed for Poole Town on loan for the remainder of the campaign and playing a pivotal role in keeping the club in the division. Saied has now signed a two year deal at Tatnam and will be a Poole Town player until 2027.

Midfielder Antonio Diaz signed for the Dolphins from Gosport Borough where he spent the 2023/24 campaign, accumulating 33 appearances and scoring two goals. The midfielder is not the first in his family to play for Poole Town, his dad Tony was a prolific goal-scorer for the Dolphins in the 90's.

The 25-year-old came through AFC Bournemouth's academy and was part of a Cherries' team that won the Youth Alliance Cup in 2017. After spells at Weymouth, Dorchester and Wimborne Town, Diaz joined Salisbury in 2020 and made 77 appearances, scoring nine goals.

In December 2022, Antonio Diaz made the decision to join Bashley FC before joining Gosport Borough for the 2023/24 season. Diaz has played a vital role during his time at Poole so far, playing multiple different positions and performing admirably whenever featured emphasising his versatility and tireless effort displayed every time he steps foot on the pitch. He also once wore the captains armband against Bournemouth Poppies.



Henry Spalding MIDFIELDER

The 26-year-old midfielder progressed through Bristol City's youth academy before signing for Marine in 2016. After only playing a handful of games, Spalding made the move to Cirencester Town and spent three seasons at the Gloucester-based side.

Spalding then returned back to the Webswood Stadium and remained there for six campaigns, bar a short stint at Salisbury in 2021. For the start of the 2024/25 season, Spalding signed for Hungerford Town before moving to Gosport to work under the management of Joe Lea and Pat Suraci.

After the duo's departure from Privett Park, he then returned to Swindon Supermarine for the remainder of the campaign and has made over 200 appearances across multiple spells for the club.



Ik Hill FORWARD

The 24-year-old winger becomes our fourth summer signing and joins us after an impressive individual season last campaign after recording 31 goal contributions in 45 matches.

Hill started his career in the youth ranks of Winchester's academy before making his first team debut in 2017. After a spell with Westfield in the Isthmian South-Central Division, the winger returned to Winchester in 2022 and became an instant key player for the Citizens.

Last season, Hill found the back of the net on 22 occasions and also recorded nine assists over the course of the campaign in a Winchester side that suffered relegation. Many Poole fans will remember his brace that he scored against us in the 3-2 win at Tatnam last season.

After being heavily sought after, Ik Hill has decided to turn to the red and white of Poole and signs on a two year deal.

The highly anticipated match between the Dolphins and the Magpies was witnessed by a record crowd of 2,500 at The Wyatt Homes Stadium.

Joe Lea and Pat Suraci made one change from the defeat to Sholing with the injured Corey Jordan being replaced by Ade Olumuyiwa who made his first start since returning to the club.

Wimborne manager Tim Sills made three changes coming off the back of the 4-0 defeat to Havant & Waterlooville with Will Fletcher, Max Bustamente and Cam Munn all coming into the team.

The match got underway with both sides holding their shape well in the early stages and neither side able to generate a clear-cut chance. Olumuyiwa was shown an early yellow card after 13 minutes for a late challenge on Bustamente just outside the area, the resulting Wimborne free kick was fired straight into the wall.

Sam Jackson went closest in the first half for the Magpies; his volleyed effort was well dealt with by Adam Parkes in the Poole goal.

The first chance for Joe and Pat's side fell the way of Kris Campbell after great work from Billy Lowes down the left flank, however he was unable to keep his shot on target. The Dolphins went close again on the 25th minute through Gwengwe from close range, but he blazed his effort over the bar as the score remained goalless.

Just a few moments later, Gwengwe was brought down inside the area, and the referee had no option but to point to the spot. It was Poole's number nine who stepped up and as he normally does, converted past Bastian Smith to give the Dolphins a 1-0 lead on the 30th minute mark.

As the half drifted to a close, the Magpies pushed in search of an equaliser, but the referee's whistle brought it to a close with Poole in the commanding position. Joe and Pat were forced into a half time substitution with Ik Hill replacing Selim Saeid and Ayo was substituted just a few minutes after the restart for Charlie Davis.

1980 – 1990

The club was originally formed in 1988 by Stuart Cadmore when a group of players left the youth team Plymouth Kolts and joined the Plymouth & District League in Division 4. In that same year the club secured sponsorship from Exeter Airport, and as part of that deal they changed their name to Ex-Air Flyers. They were the first club in Plymouth to be sponsored from outside the city limits. The club colours of yellow and blue are from the colours of the airport logo and remain the same today.

In their first season the club gained promotion and then moved to the Parkway Sports Club.

1990 – 2000

The club carried on being promoted in successive seasons until it reached Division one and was waiting to join the Premier Division when the Devon League was formed in 1992. The club decided to apply to become members of the Devon League instead as the Parkway Sports Club had sufficient facilities to join the league.

Unfortunately, 1992/93 was their last to be known as EAF Plymouth FC as they finished bottom of the table, but a new era was just around the corner.

During the 1993/94 season, Plymouth Parkway FC underwent a pivotal moment in its history. Not only did the club change its name to Plymouth Parkway FC, but a new management team, led by Keith Pond and Gez Baggott, was persuaded to join. Before this, Pond and Baggott had achieved great success with Falstaff Wanderers in the Plymouth & District league.

Upon their appointment, Pond and Baggott made drastic changes to the squad, bringing their entire successful squad from Falstaff Wanderers with them. The decision proved to be astute, as Plymouth Parkway FC finished joint second in their first season. Although they narrowly missed out on securing second place overall, they managed a commendable third place based on goal difference.

Despite their early success, Keith Pond decided to step down from his position at the end of the season due to family reasons, leaving Gez Baggott as the first-team manager. Baggott proved to be an exceptional leader, holding the position for an astonishing 14 consecutive seasons and two more later in the club's history, cementing his legacy in the club's remarkable journey.

After the successful 1993/94 season, Parkway enjoyed stability within the Devon League and were quickly making a name for themselves, which drew attention from the South Western League teams across the Tamar. To prevent players leaving for a higher level of football, the committee and management at that time (1998) decided to join and compete at the same level.

The move proved an extremely wise decision as although playing against teams with higher resources, Parkway more than held their own in the South Western League.



Parkway left the 90's behind them with an 11th placed finish, winning 10 of their 36 fixtures.

2000 – 2010

On the eve of the 2000-01 season the club became homeless with the loss of the Parkway Sports Club due to a disagreement over the terms of the lease and subsequent maintenance costs. As a result, and with special permission from the league, the club spent that season having to play all its games away from home.

During their build up to the 2001/02 season the club announced they would be developing an area of Manadon as their new ground, to be known as Bolitho Park. While work was being completed, with assistance from Plymouth City Council, they used The Brickfields athletics ground in Devonport before they moved to their new and current home in August 2003.

Under the leadership of Chairman Jim Parsons and with the support of early sponsors such as Mortimers (Ian Mortimer), Gary Doel, and Gez Baggott Painters and Decorators, Parkway continued to perform well in the South Western League. However, the most significant progress came in terms of infrastructure at Bolitho.

In the 2006-07 season, the club made its debut in the FA Vase and achieved an impressive feat by reaching the second qualifying round. The following season saw the merger of the South Western Football League and the Devon County Football League, leading to the establishment of the South West Peninsula League, with Parkway as one of the founding members.

As the decade was nearing its conclusion, another vital addition to the club was Garry Turner, who joined as the groundsman, ensuring the playing field was well-maintained. A year later, Genny Turner also joined as the secretary, handling administrative responsibilities for the club. Both Garry and Genny Turner continue to hold these positions today. 2010 – 2020

The football club's identity is rooted in a determination to advance and excel both on and off the field. After spending nearly two decades in the South Western leagues, the club's leadership decided to formulate a plan to climb higher in the football hierarchy.

To achieve this goal, they recognized certain areas where Plymouth Parkway, as a business, needed improvement. This led to a busy summer before the 2016/17 season, culminating in a merger with another ambitious Plymouth-based football club named Bar Sol Ona.

The leadership structure saw changes as well, with Bar Sol Ona's Chairman, Mark Russell, assuming the role of Plymouth Parkway's Chairman. Lee Hobbs was



appointed as the first-team manager, while the former Plymouth Parkway Chairman, Jim Parsons, transitioned into the role of Club President. Gez Baggott, the former General Manager, took on the position of Vice-chairman.

This merger injected renewed energy and ambition into the club, leading to increased financial capabilities. The board, which included long-serving Club Secretary Genny Turner and Treasurer Brian Martin, wasted no time in expressing their intentions by seeking promotion to the Toolstation Western Football League.

In 2015, life vice-president and founder member of Plymouth Parkway Stuart Cadmore, formed the Plymouth Parkway Supporter's Club. The supporter's club has become an essential and vital group within the football club, helping to develop and enhance the reputation, stature, and progress of the yellows on, and off the pitch.

The 2017-18 season was exceptional, with Plymouth Parkway achieving promotion as League Champions of the SWPL, having suffered only one defeat throughout the campaign.

The subsequent season of 2018/2019 proved to be equally impressive for Plymouth Parkway as they

embarked on their first Western League campaign. They secured a runner-up position in the league and the Devon St Luke's Bowl. They also clinched victory in the prestigious Les Phillips League Cup.

2020 – present

The impact of Covid-19 on sports, including non-league football, was indeed significant in 2020. The decision to curtail the 2019-20 season came as a response to the government's lockdown plans to control the spread of the virus.

Parkway, being in second place with a strong position to compete for the top spot, faced disappointment due to the sudden suspension of the season. They were just three points behind the league leaders and had three games in hand, which could have potentially led them to win the league.

However, despite the challenges faced during the season, Parkway experienced a remarkable achievement when they reached the quarter-finals of the FA Vase. Unfortunately, their journey ended with a 2-0 defeat to Hebburn Town in the competition. Despite the loss, this achievement brought national exposure and recognition to the club.

The season's events were captured on film, leading to

the production of a documentary titled "Round Our Way." This documentary gained impressive viewership figures, reaching over 50,000 views, and provided a unique insight into Parkway's journey through the challenging 2019-20 season and their historic FA Vase run.

The yellows had a strong start to the 2020/21 season, leading the league with a 10-point margin after 13 games. However, due to the resurgence of Covid-19, the season was curtailed, and the government had no option but to enforce another lockdown.

The Football Association (FA) had plans to reshape the non-league pyramid before the season began, and following the second curtailment, they implemented the changes. As Parkway had been one of the best-placed points-per-game teams over the previous two curtailed seasons, they were awarded upward movement to the Southern League Division One South Division, which is step four of the non-league pyramid.

The Southern League adventure began with sad news that Charlie Baggott, a founder member of the football club had sadly passed away. Charlie played a crucial role in shaping the face of Bolitho Park and was a much-loved figure by everybody at the football club.

Further news was to follow ahead of the new season as Truro City would become ground-sharing neighbours following their departure from their home ground, Treyew Road. This new agreement would mark the re-development of Bolitho Park.

Bolitho Park had seen a mini redevelopment in previous years with the construction of a multi-purpose club house which provided modern amenities and facilities to the players and supporters alike. This addition not only elevated the infrastructure of the ground but also created a welcoming atmosphere for all.

The improvements extended to the playing surface, where extensive work was carried out. One of the most significant enhancements was the construction of the "Charlie Baggott stand." This 250-seater stand was aptly named after a cherished figure in the club's history, honouring the legacy of an individual who had contributed significantly to Plymouth Parkway's growth.

Further elevating the fan experience, the ground saw the addition of covers to three sides of the stadium. This provided much-needed shelter to supporters, allowing them to cheer on their team regardless of weather conditions. These additions added a new dimension to the Parkway experience, making it a more comfortable and enjoyable destination for fans.

Parkway's promotion to the higher division was met with scepticism and questioning during the start of the 2021-22 season. As the season progressed, their performance in October was particularly dismal, leading to even more doubts and criticism from pundits.

However, Parkway managed to turn things around in the latter part of the season. After the Christmas period, the team seemed to find their rhythm and began performing

at their best. The players came together, and the squad started to gel, resulting in a remarkable resurgence.

This newfound momentum culminated in a historic moment for the club as they secured the league title on their very first attempt in the Southern League. Parkway managed to finish the season three points ahead of their nearest rivals, Frome Town, underlining their dominance in the league.

The historic moment was again captured on film by Parkway Media, who chronicled every thrilling moment of the remarkable season. "Round Our Way Again," immortalised the emotions and celebrations that swept through the fans and players alike. The show's popularity soared, with viewing figures again exceeding 50,000, spreading the story of Parkway's journey to glory far and wide.

Last season, the football club more than held their own in the Southern Premier South Division and after a difficult start, the club finished in the top 10 and established themselves as a step 3 footballing club. What's next? Join us at Bolitho Park and become part of the history!

A proud Liverpool supporter and someone who always looked up to Messi, his favourite footballing moment so far was earning a three-day trial at Brentford. Dylan Jones is the best player he's played with, who is now on the books at Norwich City.

A roast dinner enthusiast, he'd choose flying as his ideal superpower, mainly to make sure he's never late for training.

Jensen Ireland - Centre-Half

Jensen joined Argyle's pre-academy at 7, progressed into the academy by 9, and earned a scholarship before making the move to men's football with Parkway.

A Manchester United fan and someone who always rated Ronaldo, his standout moment in his career so far came in a 1-0 FA Youth Cup win over Everton. He rates Tegan Finn as the best he's played with saying that he is always capable of producing something special.

He can't beat a cheeky Nando's, and he'd pick flying as his superpower, allowing him to sweep up at the back with ease.

Ryan Brett - Centre Midfielder

Ryan began his career climbing the ranks at Plymouth Argyle, before joining many clubs within the South-West, including Salisbury, Truro, Taunton and now, Parkway.

He is a Chelsea fan through and through, and idolises Frank Lampard as his favourite player all-time, and his best moments on the pitch have come through multiple promotions and the celebrations that followed. 
