



# WITH EMLYN LEWIS

Centre-half and captain Emlyn Lewis chatted to Rob Hammett about his first season in BS24, and the first few games of this campaign.

Hi Emlyn. You had a tremendous first year at the club last season, what were the stand-out games for you?

Thanks very much. It was a really enjoyable first season, and a few games definitely stood out. My first away win at Chesham was a big one, it felt like a real turning point for us. That week we also beat Chelmsford at home on the Saturday and Maidstone away on the Monday. A huge three game week that gave us real momentum moving forward.

#### How enjoyable has your time been here at the club?

I've absolutely loved it. It's a tight knit group, and both the coaching staff and players are striving to be as professional as we can. Everyone, from staff to players to fans, made it really easy for me to settle in. It's been refreshing stepping into a new environment and being tested in different ways.

Avo is a proper old school defender, vocal, aggressive, always organising, and does a great job of keeping me calm. They both make my job easier, just in different ways.



Michael Smith, Dan Martin and Callum Wood have come in this summer. How would you rate their performances so far? They've all slotted in brilliantly, good players and good people. Smudge brings loads of experience, quality, and composure. Dan has a serious engine and real energy down the left. Callum's added balance and has really grown since joining. The depth and competition they've brought in has lifted the level again, especially across the back four or five.



Your first game this season was against Chelmsford. How pleased were you with your performance and the Man of the Match award that followed?

Missing the Hornchurch game was frustrating, I felt I could've made a real difference. So I was excited to get back in and contribute with a solid defensive performance. Man of the Match is always a nice bonus, but I was more pleased with the clean sheet and how we performed as a team.

Onto Chippenham and our first win of the season with an assist for yourself. How were you feeling after that game? It was a great feeling, not just getting the win but also contributing to a goal. That's something I want to do more of this season. There's always a bit of relief when that first win comes, and we looked much more of a threat going forward. It felt like real progress.

#### What games are you looking forward to most this season?

The derby games always bring that extra bit of edge and energy, especially with the fans, so I'm definitely looking forward to those. I also enjoy testing ourselves against the so called big teams with big budgets, it's always a good challenge.

They'll be tough, like every other team in this league. Having come down from the National League, they'll be one of the sides fancied to be up there. Like most National League teams, they're physical, well organised, and experienced at this level. We'll need to be sharp in and out of possession, but we're building momentum and I'm confident we can cause them problems.

### HEAD TO HEAD - MAIDENHEAD UNITED



Maidenhead United visit the Optima Stadium today for the first time since October 2023, when Alan Devonshire's side travelled west for an FA Cup Fourth Qualifying Round tie.

With both sides just one round away from the FA Cup First Round Proper, it was the Berkshire side who emerged victorious with a 3-0 win, courtesy of a Tobi Sho-Silva hattrick, to set up a First Round tie at Oxford United.

The first ever game between the two sides came way back in September 2004 in the newly-formed Conference South. In addition, it was only the fourth league game played at the brand-new Woodspring Stadium. Frank Gregan's Seagulls side won by two goals to one after finishes from Dave Gilroy and Marc McGregor, who went on to manage Weston between 2017 and 2019 (pictured at the top of the next page).

# <u>HEAD TO HEAD - MAIDENHEAD UNITED</u>



In between those first and last fixtures, there have been some memorable wins for Weston against Maidenhead. The home victory over Maidenhead in April 2016 was hugely significant as the 2-0 win was enough to guarantee National League South survival with a game to spare. Second-half goals from Scott Wilson and Dayle Grubb ensured there were scenes of both joy and relief around the Woodspring Stadium at the final whistle.

Weston's record victory over Maidenhead was a 3-0 victory at York Road in February 2014, thanks to Grubb's double and one from Alec Fiddes, while Maidenhead's record victory over The Seagulls came just eight months later at the same venue. The Berkshire side won by six goals to two thanks mainly to Dave Tarpey's hat-trick. Jamie Lucas and Ryan Bath scored consolation goals for Weston that day.

# NLS ROUND-UP

Following the midweek action in National League South, there are just two teams with 100% winning records.

Of the two, Ebbsfleet United are top after Tuesday's 1-0 home victory over Chelmsford. The Kent club are top on goal difference above Hornchurch who won 1-0 at Enfield Town after a late winner from their captain, Tom Wraight.

Torquay United, Chesham United and Hemel are the only other teams who remain unbeaten so far.

The Gulls beat Totton 3-1 at Plainmoor as ex Weston Ioanees Dylan Morgan and Matt Jay were on target.

After winning their first two games, Chesham could only draw 0-0 with Horsham at The Meadow, while Hemel fought back from falling behind twice at Maidenhead to earn a 2-2 draw. All four goals came before half-time in an entertaining first-half at York Road.

Since losing their first game of the season following promotion, Dover Athletic have won twice on the road after fantastic wins at Bath City and at Eastbourne Borough, who themselves have had a tough start since reaching last season's play-offs. Dover's George Nikaj scored the only goal in their 1-0 victory at Priory Lane.

Maidstone beat Hampton 2-0 at the Gallagher as ex-Bristol Rovers striker Deon Moore scored their first.

Farnborough and Worthing are eleventh and tenth respectively in the very early table. They played each other at Cherrywood Road on Wednesday with Farnborough winning by one goal to nil. Mason Bloomfield scored a late winner in a game that will be sadly remembered for the terrible injury to midfielder Aaron Kuhl. We wish Aaron a speedy recovery.

Weston won their first game of the season after their 2-1 success at Chippenham Town. Will Dawes and Louis Britton scored in each half as Chippenham are still searching for their elusive first victory.

Bath City also picked up their first win after Tuesday's 1-0 victory at Salisbury. Will Jenkins-Davies scored the only goal at the Ray Mac as The Whites have now gone 270 minutes without scoring. Their first two games finished 0-0, the only time a National League South side have drawn their opening two games by that scoreline.

Dorking Wanderers also earned their first three points after beating Slough 2-0 at Meadowbank, a welcome result for them after a shock 0-3 home defeat to Hampton last Saturday. It's been a tough start for Scott Davies' Rebels, meanwhile, who are bottom of the table heading into this weekend.

Dagenham & Redbridge remain without a win, although they were looking set for their opening victory as they led Tonbridge Angels 2-0 early on at Victoria Road. But The Angels fought back to earn a 2-2 draw. The Daggers were looking comfortable after goals from Donovan Wilson and Ashley Hemmings, before the Kent side rescued an excellent point after Matty Warren and Alfie Allen found the back of the net.



# OPPOSITION GAFFER - ALAN DEVONSHIRE



If there was only one adjective you could use to describe Maidenhead United manager Alan Devonshire, that word would simply be 'loyalty'.

Devonshire spent an incredible 14 years with West Han United as a player, having joined The Hammers in 1976 for £5,000 from non-league side, Southall. Clearly a bargain, the signing has been described as West Ham's best ever signing.

In 1980, Devonshire scored one of the goals in The Hammers' FA Cup semi-final victory over Everton to set up a final with Arsenal. This was even more remarkable considering West Ham were in the old Second Division at the time. Quite naturally, The Gunners were clear favourites for the Wembley final, but against all odds, Devonshire's delightful cross set up Trevor Brooking for a rare headed goal to help The Hammers to a shock 1-0 win and claim the FA Cup.

The following season, West Ham won promotion from the Second Division with Devonshire and Brooking forming a formidable partnership.

During this time, 'Dev' won the first of eight England caps, playing for both Ron Greenwood, who had signed him for West Ham, and Bobby Robson.

In his later years at Upton Park, Devonshire supplied the ammunition for the prolific Tony Cottee and Frank McAvennie as West Ham finished third in the old First Division in 1986.

When Devonshire eventually evolved into management in men's football, he was the manager of Maidenhead between 1996 and 2003. After a successful first spell at York Road, Devonshire then spent lengthy spells at Hampton & Richmond (2003-2011), Braintree Town (2011-2015), before returning to Maidenhead in 2015.

In the last ten years at York Road, Devonshire led the Berkshire outfit to the 2016/17 National League South title. They then spent the subsequent eight years in the National League before relegation last season.

With so many large clubs in the National League, to spend so long at non-league football's top table is a great achievement, and they are a great example to all similar sized clubs.

We welcome. Alan and his Maidenhead side to the Optima Stadium this weekend in what should be an entertaining fixture.

- 5.ONLY CONSUME ALCOHOL IN THE STADIUM DURING A MATCH THAT HAS BEEN PURCHASED INSIDE THE GROUND. ALCOHOL SALES ARE AS IN LINE WITH THE FULL GROUND REGULATION AS DISPLAYED & LISTED.
- 6.NOT THROW OBJECTS WITHIN THE STADIUM, THIS IS A CRIMINAL OFFENCE AND STRONG ACTION WILL BE TAKEN AGAINST ANYONE COMMITTING SUCH AN OFFENCE.
- 7. FIREWORKS, FLARES, SMOKE CANISTERS, LASER DEVICES, AIR HORNS, KNIVES, BOTTLES, GLASS VESSELS, CANS, POLES, AND ANY ARTICLES THAT MIGHT BE USED AS A WEAPON AND/OR COMPROMISE PUBLIC SAFETY ARE NOT PERMITTED WITHIN THE GROUND. THESE ARE CRIMINAL OFFENCES AND STRONG ACTION WILL BE TAKEN AGAINST ANYONE COMMITTING SUCH AN OFFENCE.
- 8.NO PERSONAL FOOTBALLS, TENNIS BALLS, INFLATABLE BALLS OR ANY OTHER SUCH THROWABLE BALL, HAND-HELD MEGAPHONES OR THE LIKE, SHOULD BE BROUGHT INTO THE GROUND. Anyone found with such will have the item confiscated until the conclusion of the match.
