

WITH SIMON PANES

We within the Academy Programme were delighted with the board's decision to appoint Scott Rogers as our first-team manager.

With Gary Warren as his Assistant and Adie Britton as Technical Director, this forms a formidable team. Just as importantly for all our Academy players, this announcement shows and will prove that our pathway into the first team becomes even more realistic. Scott has already spoken to me about boys within our programme and this was proved with three lads in the squad for last week's FA Cup tie, plus five Academy lads regularly training with the first team.

ACADEMY BLOG

In my role I am forever being asked and sometimes challenged by parents that we don't have a pathway, or they actually think there are better pathways elsewhere. My reply is always "show me a better pathway in the South West outside the professional game that gives you the facilities, education programme, quality of coaches, games programme and access to a club at the sixth tier of English football?"

We talk a lot about development of players, but we as an Academy always look to development staff as well. If you look at this season for example, we have promoted both Craig Graham and Bridget Bolland into senior roles, plus Gary now taking the Assistant Manager role with the first team. Luke Coulson alongside his coaching role for us coaches at Bristol City, and now Ethan Reed has been given the opportunity to coach at Swindon Town, again while still remaining with us. This will not only enhance their careers, but we will benefit from sharing good practice and possibly give some of our boys the potential to trial for a Football League club.

That point does cause debate though, and all I can say is, if you are good enough you will be found. Other organisations highlight that they will get you trials for League clubs as part of their recruitment process. Please don't fall for that one, be patient and opportunities will come along if you are producing outstanding performances. Parents/guardians please take note!





LAST TIME OUT



Weston face Slough Town in tonight's National League South clash here at the Optima Stadium, and will be looking to repeat last season's achievements where they picked up six points and a league double against the Berkshire side.

Coincidentally, both games were played in Tuesday night fixtures under the lights, as they are this season as well.

The first game between The Seagulls and The Rebels during the 2024/25 campaign came in early September here at the Optima. Weston had won their last four games in a row, but faced a tough test against Scott Davies' side, who had done the double over Weston in the 2023/24 season.

LAST TIME OUT

It was goalless at the interval, but Weston grabbed the first decisive goal of the night when Dylan Kadji played the ball wide to Luke Coulson. From the left touchline, Coulson's dangerous inswinging cross evaded absolutely everyone and ended up in the back of the net.

Weston were looking fairly comfortable but victory was guaranteed in second-half injury-time after Scott Bartlett's side caught Slough on the break, the ball eventually found its way to loan signing Dylan Morgan and he calmly slotted home for his second goal in two games.

The return fixture was played at Arbour Park in January. Weston made the journey along the M4 reeling from the 4-1 home defeat to Welling United three days earlier, but that loss was forgotten about after The Seagulls' 3-1 win in Berkshire after goals from Coulson, Emlyn Lewis and his namesake and compatriot, Morgan Lewis. Slavi Spasov, now with Southend United, had equalised for The Rebels.



Player-manager Scott Davies (left) became first team manager in November 2022 having taken on the role of caretaker manager the previous week, following the departure of Neil Baker and Jon Underwood.
