

# WITH EMLYN LEWIS





#### P'nawn da a chroeso!

Good afternoon and welcome to the Optima Stadium for what is another huge day in the club's history, the First Round Proper of the FA Cup. A warm welcome to everyone connected with Aldershot Town: players, staff and travelling fans. We hope you enjoy your visit to Weston (but naturally, not the result).

#### The Memories and Magic of the FA Cup

The FA Cup has this ability to blur the lines between tiers, reputations and budgets. It reminds everyone why we play the game. For 90 minutes (and sometimes 90 plus 7 or 120 plus 3), it is eleven versus eleven. It is lads with other jobs and part time schedules going toe to toe with full time professionals. And it is the supporters who make it all the more real, dreaming of that one upset, that one goal, that one replay under the lights.

There is a beauty to the unpredictability of it all. And while we respect Aldershot massively, they are a strong and organised National League outfit, we also know that if we play to our potential, we can give anyone a game.

A mentor and good friend of mine, Professor Robyn Jones, explained the Magic of the FA Cup to me a few years ago when he shared stories of playing right back for Sutton United during their famous win over Coventry City in 1989. Coventry had won the FA Cup at Wembley just 18 months before that tie, and yet here was Robyn and his teammates upsetting the odds. That was the first time I truly understood what this competition means. You can still see the pride in Robyn's face when he talks about it. He has photos from the game up in his office and never fails to mention the set piece goal that gave them the lead. It has got me thinking, maybe I will speak to the Gaffer about drawing something up ourselves.

That sense of joy and belief is something we experienced last year in our trip to Bristol Rovers. That day will stay with me forever, even if I only lasted 20 minutes on the pitch. Hopefully today I can stay on a bit longer and help the team write another chapter in our own FA Cup story.





#### Inside the Changing Room

Since my last blog after the Needham Market game, we have had a few important results. The last-minute winner by Dan Martin, followed by a more comfortable win against Slough, and then a well-earned point away at Tonbridge have all helped build momentum.

As a group, we continue to grow, not always in performances but certainly in mentality. We have got quality, strength and a group of lads who care about each other and the shirt. Whether you are starting or supporting from the bench, the collective spirit is strong and that has really shown in the last few weeks.

Morale is high, even though there are a few grumps and groans from time to time (usually from me), but the belief is there, and we are all looking forward to getting out there today and giving our best for the club and the fans.

#### A Word to the Fans

You might get tired of hearing it, but I will keep saying it. Your support matters. These days are special because of what they mean to the town, the club and the wider community. Seeing you packed into the stands, flags waving and chants ringing out gives us that extra push when the legs are tired and the pressure is high.

I remember vividly the noise you created at Bristol Rovers. I was actually outside the ground in a wheelchair, sat with my Mam, sister and aunty, waiting for the car to take me to A and E. Suddenly, I heard a massive roar. I thought, that is game done. Two nil down. Mountain to climb. Then a steward walked past, shaking his head in disgust. Turns out we had scored. Yes Bastin, we knew it was you. That sound, that moment, it was not the five thousand Rovers fans making the noise, it was you. Our fans. That moment is now part of Weston's history.

Hopefully today, you can help create another one, and maybe, just maybe, spur us on to a place in the Second Round.



Long-serving midfielder Jacob Jagger Cane chatted to Rob Hammett about the start to this season, his midfield partners and his favourite FA Cup memories.

Hi Caney, you're now in your twelfth season with The Seagulls. What have you made of the start to the campaign, both for yourself personally and the team as a whole?

We've had a great start again, very similar to last season, but obviously we fell short of what we wanted to achieve, which was the play-offs. But I think with what we have got now we can hopefully achieve that. And personally I think I've started pretty well, I missed too many games through injury last season, so I want to try my best to stay as fit as possible and contribute as much as I can.

There's been a managerial change with Scott Rogers replacing Scott Bartlett. What were your thoughts on this?

Yeah we achieved a lot with Bartlett and fair enough for his move to the National League, it was well deserved. But with Scotty taking over it's been a real seamless transition. You nearly missed the Doncaster Rovers game in 2014. For those not aware, what happened in the Fourth Qualifying Round at Witham Town to put your place in jeopardy?!

Well we were 1-0 up and Witham were attacking, they were

bound to score but I unlocked my inner Max Harris (aka the octopus) and saved the ball on the line, probably the best save in Weston's history. I was given my marching orders but they then went and missed the penalty and we saw the game out and won.

My suspension was then supposed to fall on the First Round tie vs Doncaster but, luckily for me, it was called off so I was able to play! So yeah a bit of a mad one but a great and funny memory!



Youngsters Jake Hicks and Charlie Cummins have come in and played alongside you in recent weeks, what have you made of their impact?

Hicksy is class. I love him and he's a top top player who has got a big future in my opinion, he just has to believe it himself! Charlie has just come in and is one of the boys already, he's been brilliant in every game so far and it's a great addition having him here on loan from Exeter. They're still young but for me they are two of the top young midfielders in the league, we're very lucky to have them and I'm looking forward to playing alongside them and helping them as much as possible. James Dodd recently made his 200th appearance for the club. As a team-mate and a good friend of his, how proud are you of this achievement for him?

# PREVIOUS MEETINGS

Today's meeting with Aldershot Town is only the third-ever meeting between the two sides, and the first time ever that The Seagulls and The Shots have faced each other in the FA Cup.

The two previous meetings came back in the 2013/14 season, in manager Craig Laird's final season in charge at the Woodspring, with both games coming in the space of three days in the FA Trophy.

The first tie was played at Aldershot's Recreation Ground on the final Saturday of November 2013. As both sides are today, The Shots were in the National League and Weston were in National League South.

In this FA Trophy First Round tie, The Seagulls took a shock lead through Tristan Plummer in the 76th minute, against the side he joined a month later. Just as a surprise result was on the cards, Aldershot's Aidan O'Brien, who would eventually go on to play for the Republic of Ireland, equalised right at the death with a spectacular volley.

Therefore a replay was required three days later on the Tuesday night at Woodspring Stadium. While the first game had been close, Andy Scott's side showed their class in the replay and won by five goals to two. Lewis Young and O'Brien fired the Shots into a two-goal lead, before Ben Kirk pulled one back for Weston.

Young grabbed his second, before The Seagulls halved the deficit again as Plummer got himself onto the scoresheet to make it 3-2. But any hopes of a grandstand finish were dashed as Matthew Paterson and Craig Stanley ensured The Shots went through.

### IN THE SPOTLIGHT

Popular central defender Clayton Fortune had two spells with Weston, and it was during his second spell with the club that the former Bristol City man enjoyed some relative FA Cup success with The Seagulls.

Ahead of our First Round Proper tie with Aldershot Town, Clayton chatted to Rob Hammett about the 2014/15 campaign and the tie with Doncaster Rovers and the lads he played with.

Hi Clayton, you played quite a few games for Weston, what are your favourite memories of your time with The Seagulls?

I would have to say the FA Cup run to the First Round Proper. I used to joke with the lads, saying I didn't know the FA Cup before November! But it was a great achievement getting to the First Round and Mickey Bell did a job getting us there.

You played in the FA Cup First Round for Weston versus Doncaster Rovers, what was the build-up to that like and what was it like to play in?

A bit anti-climactic to be honest. We prepared for a game on the Saturday by training on the seafront (it was freezing!) only for the game to be called off. It was a great day when the game finally went ahead despite the scoreline.

Who were the best players you played with here at Weston, and what made them so special?

I was lucky to play with some really good players and great characters. Caney, Kane Ingram, Marvin and Aaron Brown, Joe McLennan, Tom Jordan, Barnsey (Ollie Barnes), Jake Mawford.

But the front three of Tristan Plummer, Dayle Grubb and Ollie Watkins was something special, up there with MSN at Barca!

### IN THE SPOTLIGHT

You were player/coach at the time we brought in a young Ollie Watkins. What are your recollections of him, both as a player and a person?

As a player he was last pick on a Thursday 5 a-side (in the evening after a long training session at Exeter). But come matchday he was at another level. His work-rate, application and willingness to learn was amazing. Off the pitch, a really likeable person whom we all got on with, no ego about him even though he came from a pro team.

Who were the main characters in the Weston dressing room back in the day?

Again too many to mention. Tom Jordan, Kane Ingram, Luke Purnell and probably myself but Grubby, Joe Mac and Jake Mawford especially were, let's say, "special."



### IN THE SPOTLIGHT

Do you still keep tabs on how Weston are getting on, and if so how well do you think the club are doing?

I still keep tabs on Weston as I have fond memories of the place. I'm glad they're doing well and I wish Scotty Rogers and Adie the best of luck, two of football's good people.

You also had a spell at Aldershot, who we play today. How was your time there?

I had a bit of a funny time at Aldershot. It didn't really help that I used to travel in from Bristol every day, but I met some great people there whom I'm still in touch with.

What do you do these days? Are you still involved in football?

I work for a football agency now called Sport Management International, so it's great to still be involved helping out the next generation.

And finally Clayton, what is your score prediction for Weston v Aldershot?

I'll sit on the fence and just predict a good game of football, hopefully a high scoring one.



#### ALDERSHOT TOWN FC



On Friday 24th October, Aldershot confirmed the appointment of John Coleman as the club's new First-Team Manager. The highly-experienced 63-year-old officially took over the position in the last week, following last Saturday's game at Scunthorpe United, meaning that today's game here at Weston is Coleman's first in charge.

Coleman arrives in Hampshire with over 25 years of managerial experience for the likes of Accrington Stanley, Rochdale, Gillingham and many more. Prior to this, John played as a forward in a playing career spanning nearly 20 years.

Alan Dowson and James Henry were in charge for last Saturday's game against The Iron following the shock departure of Tommy Widdrington to Eastbourne Borough.

Widdrington left The Shots following their 3-2 win at Dorking Wanderers in the Fourth Qualifying Round of the FA Cup, but less than 48 hours later Widdrington announced his departure. Widdrington was popular with the Aldershot supporters, particularly after guiding them to a fabulous 3-0; victory over Spennymoor Town in the FA Trophy Final at Wembley Stadium last May, undoubtedly a marvellous day in Aldershot's history.

Hady Ghandour (top left): Ghandour signed for the Shots in April 2023. The striker has represented Lebanon at senior international level and was most recently playing for Maidstone United. Ghandour earned a move to Charlton Athletic after impressing with Tooting and Mitcham and made a handful of first-team appearances for the League One side in cup competitions.

Kwame Thomas (top right): Thomas signed for the Shots for the third time in June 2025, having spent the end of last season on loan from Ebbsfleet United and playing his part in Aldershot's FA Trophy win at Wembley Stadium. Thomas made his senior international debut for St Kitts & Nevis during his first spell with the Shots, having made a number of youth appearances for England during his time with Derby County.

Josh Barrett (bottom right): Barrett signed for the Shots in January 2024. Barrett worked with Tommy Widdrington at Kings Lynn, and has also played for Bristol Rovers and Coventry. Barrett has international experience, having made three appearances for the Republic of Ireland Under 21s, and after breaking through the youth ranks at Reading, went on to make ten Championship appearances with the Royals. Scored one of the goals in Aldershot's famous FA Trophy win at Wembley Stadium last May.

James Henry (bottom right): Henry joined the Shots in August 2023. Henry spent the 2023/24 season with Oxford United, who he joined in 2017/18, and made 14 appearances for the now Championship side as they won the League One play-offs last season and made a total of 260 appearances for them. against The Mariners, while Hemel have an attractive tie at Wigan Athletic, who sensationally won the competition in 2013 when they beat Manchester City in the final.

Slough and Chelmsford have tricky home ties against Altrincham and Braintree respectively, while Totton will fancy their chances

and Braintree respectively, while Totton will fancy their chances away at Macclesfield of National League North, particularly after their shock win at Truro City in their Fourth Qualifying Round replay.

As for the league itself, Hornchurch returned to the top of the table after their 2-1 home victory over Hampton & Richmond. Totton moved up to third after their 2-1 home win over Chelmsford, while Hemel are now fourth after Joe White's 99th minute penalty saw them beat Bath City 1-0. Weston and Hemel are now tied on fewest goals conceded this season with only nine goals scored against The Seagulls and The Tudors in the league.

Ryan Jones played for the Weston Academy and broke into the first team in autumn 2019, and the exciting left-sided player scored his first goal for the club in an FA Trophy tie at AFC Totton (pictured).

His form at the start of the 2020/21 season was excellent, the highlight being a fantastic goal against Met Police, and this stunning form was enough for Bristol Rovers to pay a record fee for a Weston sale. He has now been at Aldershot since the summer of 2024 after he left the Memorial Stadium.

**Tristan Plummer** first joined Weston in 2013 and eventually had four spells with The Seagulls and two spells with The Shots, joining Aldershot from Weston and vice versa on two occasions.

Tristan is now extremely well-known for his media work, starring regularly on Channel 4's Gogglebox, and we hope to see him here at the Optima Stadium today.

### PLAYED FOR BOTH

The tough-tackling **Naby Diallo** played with Plummer at both Weston and Aldershot. Naby had two spells with Weston and played 12 times for Aldershot in 2014/15.

Another popular Bristolian to have played for both sides is striker **Marlon Jackson**. Marlon first arrived at Weston in November 2018 and finished as the club's top-scorer despite joining so late in the season.

Marlon left in 2019 but came back in November 2021 and his goals were again crucial as they helped Weston into the 2021/22 Southern League play-offs. He was again top scorer a season later as The Seagulls won the Southern League Premier South. Marlon spent time on loan to Aldershot from Bristol City in 2009 and 2010.

Another player who endeared himself to Weston fans was Clayton Fortune. He first joined in 2009 under Andy Gurney but left for Aldershot at the end of that season. Clayton came back to Weston again in 2014 under Mickey Bell and played for Weston for two years, and was player-coach under both Bell and Ryan Northmore. Clayton left in late 2016, around about the time new manager Scott Bartlett signed Rollin Menayese from Cardiff City. Rollin had an impressive spell here at Weston and his performances caught the eye of several Football League clubs, with the young Welshman joining Bristol Rovers. Rollin subsequently played for Aldershot, as well as an array of Football League clubs

Menayese's defensive partner at Weston was the late **Chris Barker**, who had played for Aldershot beforehand and had also been their caretaker manager for a short time. As well as being a superb defender, Barker was Bartlett's assistant manager here at Weston.

There are a further three ex-Weston and Aldershot players to add to the list. **Scott Wilson**, **Alex Fletcher** and **Dylan Kadji** all spent time here in BS24, with all three also playing brief loan spells with The Shots.
