

PREVIOUS MEETINGS

Tonight's meeting with Ebbsfleet United is the eleventh time that the two sides have faced each other in National League South.

In the ten games so far, Fleet have won five times, Weston have seen victory in four games and there has been one draw. Tonight's game is the first meeting since 2016/17 when Ebbsfleet finished second and won promotion to the National League, and in that successful season the Kent side completed a league double over The Seagulls.

Weston's last win against Ebbsfleet came on Good Friday in 2016 when a Dayle Grubb brace secured a 2-1 victory here at the Woodspring. Matt Godden, now with Charlton Athletic, scored a late consolation for the Kent side.



PREVIOUS MEETINGS



Of those four wins against Ebbsfleet, only one has come on the road at Stonebridge Road. That solitary victory came in December 2014, when a late Ollie Watkins winner grabbed a 1-0 victory for The Seagulls, as they completed a league double over Fleet.

The remaining two wins have both ended in 3-2 victories for Weston here in BS24. In September 2014, goals from Jamie Lucas and Joe McLennan had Weston two in front, before Charlie Sheringham (son of Teddy) scored twice to level the score. However, The Seagulls scored an 88th minute winner from Jacob Jagger Cane to gain an exciting victory.

In March 2011, the 3-2 success came courtesy of goals from Kane Ingram, Sahr Kabba and Nat Pepperell.

Out of Ebbsfleet's five victories against Weston, their best win was the 6-0 rout here in BS24 in October 2013. After an early Martin Slocombe own goal, Fleet ran riot as Alex Osborn and Anthony Cook each scored a brace.

"I was interested in football from a young age and first played when I was a teenager. I have played for many clubs over the years including Luton Daytel, where I played alongside a couple of players who played in the "unofficial" England team that went to the World Cup in Mexico in 1971. Away from football I've always been an avid hockey player. I have spent many years torn between hockey and football, trying to figure out which one to give priority to.

Hockey was something that I enjoyed playing at school, and that journey continued on and on, and I've been playing ever since. In recent years I've taken up Masters Hockey alongside my Walking Football and have even been selected to play Masters hockey for England. I have been fortunate to play with some highly skilled players which has meant I've won several World Cups, European Tournaments and Home Nations over my years with them. I joined Weston's Ladies Walking Football team a few years ago after my mate asked me along and I've loved every minute of it. As a youngster I used to play midfield in the 11 a side game as my fitness was probably my best asset but I've become more of a defender as the years have gone by and am now in the Walking side. I would definitely say that there are skills that overlap between hockey and football. The need for making movement off the ball, creating space for other people is similar for both sports. I prefer to give and go in football and hockey and in both sports you can turn to protect the ball too.





EBBSFLEET UNITED



Josh Wright made the step up into management at Ebbsfleet in December 2024 following the departure of Harry Watling. Having served one game previously as caretaker manager earlier that season, he stopped his playing career to focus solely on his new management role.

As a player, Wright amassed more than 400 games in the EFL and signed for the Fleet from Billericay Town in summer 2022. Wright is a former Charlton Athletic and England youth international who spent two seasons in the Championship with Scunthorpe United, and he also played for Millwall, Leyton Orient, Gillingham, Southend United, Bradford City and Crawley Town.

He won promotion with the Fleet in his first campaign as a player and took over the captain's armband in 2023/24, making just shy of 100 appearances for the club before his move into the dugout.

Kwesi Appiah (top left):

Seventeen years on from emerging from Fleet's youth academy, Kwesi Appiah returned to re-sign for the club from Boreham Wood in June 2025. He fired 24 league goals last season to help take the Wood back into the National League at the first time of asking, ending 2024/25 in second place in the division's scoring charts.

Appiah left for Peterborough United in 2008 before returning to non-league and enjoying prolific spells with King's Lynn and Margate earned him a big move to Crystal Palace. Appiah later played for AFC Wimbledon and has also played for Ghana at the Africa Cup of Nations.

Maxx Manktelow (top right):

Fleet Academy graduate who earned a few Kent Senior Cup appearances, including starting in the 2024 final, before he made his first-team National League breakthrough in 2024/25. An extremely versatile player, he has featured in defence, midfield and up front and he signed his first professional contract with the Fleet in January 2025, going on to make 34 appearances last season and scoring his first goal in professional football at Hartlepool.

Finlay Barnes (bottom right):

The attacking wide player began his career in Norwich City's youth system before making the move to the city's other side, Norwich United, spending a season in Step 5 with them. A string of excellent performances saw him join Leiston in the Southern League and he helped the Suffolk outfit to the play-offs in 2023, making 116 appearances and scoring 36 goals. He made another jump of two steps up the football pyramid in 2023 by signing for York City and also enjoyed successful loan spells at Darlington and Scarborough Athletic. Last season he reached the National North play-offs with King's Lynn Town before making the move to the Fleet in June 2025.

Dominic Samuel (bottom right):

Experienced striker signed in October 2023 who began his career coming through Reading's youth ranks. He enjoyed loan spells with clubs including Gillingham before a three-year stay with Blackburn Rovers, helping the club to promotion from League One to the Championship.

In 2020 he returned on a permanent basis to Gillingham, staying with the Priestfield club for a season before a move north of the border with Ross County. He spent two years in the SPL before a move back south brought him to the Fleet and he scored on his debut for the club at Hartlepool, having a knack of scoring crucial late goals.

Weston came into this game in great form having won three National League South games in a row, scoring ten goals in the process after a 4-3 win at East Thurrock and a 5-1 home win over Eastbourne Borough.

Marc McGregor's side made it four league wins in a row after their 1-0 win at Cressing Road following Ash Harper's 51st minute winner, an excellent result considering Braintree went on to win the promotion play-offs at the end of that season.
