



CLUB HISTORY

Founded in 1890, Weymouth FC play their games at the Bob Lucas Stadium, north of the town centre of Weymouth in Dorset. The Bob Lucas Stadium has been the home stadium since 1987, as the club relocated from the Rec.

Originally named the Wessex Stadium, the Bob Lucas Stadium is named after the late Bob Lucas, who was the club's president up until his death in August 2010, aged 85.

Weymouth FC were relegated last season to the National League South following a two-year spell in the National League. Weymouth achieved backto-back promotions to the National League when they became Southern League champions in 2018-19 season and followed up with promotion from the National League South in 2019-20. Weymouth advanced through the playoffs and defeated Dartford on penalties to achieve promotion.

Current Aldershot manager Mark Molesley was part of the double promotion achievement but departed for Southend United at the end of the 2019-20 season. In the 20-21 National League season, Weymouth achieved an 18th placed finish under new manager Brian Stock.

However, last season despite a decent start to the league, Weymouth sacked manager Brian Stock in January 2022 after a run of seven consecutive defeats. The Terras replaced Stock with Oxford City manager David Oldfield, the club's current manager.

KEY PLAYER PROFILES

ZAKI OUALAH

Algerian Goalkeeper arrives with lots of experience for many clubs following a recent spell at AFC Wimbledon, Notably in his career, Oualah spent a season at Hampton & Richmond Borough in 2014-15, he also spent time at Farnborough in 2017 and also a short spell at Aldershot Town in 2018.



TOM BLAIR


Blair arrived at Weymouth from Eastleigh during last season and scored twice in the National League. Blair's qualities are his intricate passing and his pace on the wing. He also spent time on loan at Salisbury during his spell at Eastleigh.

KEELAN O'CONNELL

Arrived from Torquay United this summer, an attacking midfielder with guick feet and a good eye for a pass. O'Connell scored Weymouth's only goal in their 3-1 defeat to Tonbridge Angels. O'Connell is a former AFC Bournemouth academy player, who also spent time on loan at Greenock Morton in 2019.

OA pacy winger, Ahkeem joins the Terras having spent last season with the National League's Dover Athletic. Jamaican born Rose started his

FIVE-STAR REBELS MATCH REPORT HAVANT & WATERLOOVILLE I WORTHING 5 SAT 3/12/22, VANARAMA NATIONAL LEAGUE SOUTH REPORT BY JACK WILLIAMS

Five-star Reds brushed aside Havant & Waterlooville as Callum Kealy netted a hattrick at The Draper Tools Community Stadium.

Worthing travelled to Havant off the back of their first defeat in eight matches last time out against Chelmsford City. The high-flying Hawks, sitting second in the league table, were most recently held to a l-1 draw away at Tonbridge Angels.

Adam Hinshelwood made two changes to the eleven that started against Chelmsford City as Joe Rye and Moe Shubbar returned to the side in place of Luca Cocoracchio and Reece Meekums who dropped to the bench alongside lbby Akanbi who was back in the matchday squad.

It was a cagey opening ten minutes as the Rebels were tasked with weathering the Hawks' early storm. Chances fell to Billy Clifford and Muhammadu Faal in the opening ten minutes but neither effort could really test Harrison Male who gathered both comfortably.

Two of six first half bookings came on the ten-minute mark as Reds captain Aarran Racine and Danny Wright were both given yellows after handbags following a foul by the Worthing skipper.

It took the Reds 19 minutes to muster up their first genuine chance. Striker Kealy was forced wide after being sent in behind the Havant defence, he cut back to Mo Dabre who saw his effort easily saved.

That chance would however be the sign of things to come. Five minutes later, Shubbar was given the ball in the area before going down off a challenge, but the referee waved away the appeals and booked the winger for simulation.

The Rebels got the breakthrough on 27 minutes. A clinical counter-attack saw Shubbar feed through Kealy on the left. The striker cut inside on the edge of the area before unleashing an effort that flew past Brad House at the near post to send the travelling away supporters into raptures.

There was a moment to forget for the two Worthing centre backs in the 35th minute as Rye and Racine both went for the same ball. James Roberts latched onto the loose ball and drove forward before firing his shot wide of the far post. Josh Chambers, who signed a one-month extension to his loan yesterday, was hoping to mirror his heroics of ten days previous as he lined up a free-kick some 25-yards out on 42 minutes. Another sweet dead-ball strike sailed towards the top left corner and forced a brilliant save from House in the Havant net.

On the brink of half time, Lewis White pounced on a loose pass before driving forward and forcing another top save from the Havant keeper to keep the score at I-O at the interval.

The Hawks started the second half much like they did the first as they piled the pressure on, looking for the equaliser. There were a couple of chances for Roberts and one for Wright but nothing that really tested for Male.

Just before the hour mark, it was Worthing who



doubled their lead as they again hit the Hawks on the counter. White beat his man and crossed from the byline into Dabre who laid it off to Chambers in a better position. The young midfielder saw his effort blocked but straight into the path of Kealy who slotted past House to double his tally in front of a ballistic away end.

Hinshelwood immediately made a couple of changes as he replaced White and Shubbar with Ollie Pearce and Meekums.

It was some 15 minutes after when Kealy made himself a hattrick hero. A move that started with the ball in the hands of Male saw the Reds transition brilliantly from defence to attack with white shirts chasing shadows. Pearce was played in behind before he unselfishly laid it on a plate for Kealy to complete a fine hattrick.

There was an instant reply from the home side and in bizarre fashion as Faal's header floated over Male into the net.

The goal struck a response from the home side who looked to get themselves back into the game with some ten minutes left on the clock.

Chambers was replaced by Sammie McLeod with Hinshelwood's final change on 81 minutes. In the 83rd minute, Jake McCarthy fired an effort from distance that struck the upright of the Worthing goal. Three minutes later, Faal nearly doubled his own tally as he met Paul Rooney's cross with a header that struck the bar.

It was the Reds, though, that capped off a fine performance in style with a quickfire Dabre double. On 88 minutes, Meekums broke from his own half and went through one-on-one with House. His effort was saved but the ball was kept alive and squared to Dabre who couldn't miss from close range.

Just before the whistle, the Rebels were sent into dreamland with Dabre's second. Meekums cut the ball back to the Swindon Town loanee who beat his man, before finishing in style in front of the Worthing faithful.

In what can only be described as an emphatic victory, this is a day that will live long in the memory of Rebels supporters.

BARN STORMERS MATCH REPORT New London Lionesses I Worthing 8 Sun 4/12/22, LSERWEL DIV. I SOUTH REPORT BY GARETH NICHOLAS

For the third time this season, Worthing ran in eight goals as they maintained their title challenge thanks, in part, to a Becs Bell hat-trick and a campaign first for Gemma Worsfold at a decidedly chilly Barn Elms Sports Trust.

Following on from last week's heroic efforts at MK Dons, it was a case of three in, three out.

Charlie Carter, Chloe Winchester and Emily Linscer all returned to the starting fold as Niamh Andersson, Sophie Humphrey and Hayley Bridge all dropped down to the bench. A foot injury picked up in Buckinghamshire ruled out the luckless Katie Cooper, while Keavy Price also commenced proceedings amongst the replacements, in her first appearance since early October's win at Saltdean United.

Worthing arrived at the Parc des Princes, just without the des Princes bit and were soon treated to a fly by courtesy of a gaggle of the local Canada Geese population.

New London Lionesses were spitting feathers after only twenty-five seconds too, when they struggled to clear their lines and Linscer made them pay via a punishing conclusion to a penalty box scramble, to give her side the lead.

Good reactions saw host 'keeper Avril Clark deny Worsfold from close range before Becs Bell got her name on the scoresheet, as she tucked home a perfectlyweighted Katie Young pass through the inside-right channel.

The visitors continued their early domination thanks to Rachel Palmer's left wing cross being met with a cushioned volley onto the crossbar by Worsfold.

A similar method of shooting was adopted by Winchester but bore greater gifts, in the form of a third goal a mere twelve minutes in. Young once again the architect due to a deep right flank delivery that Chloe W. - virtually on the byline - deftly dinked, side footed, first time over a helpless Clark.

After setting a new record for the crossbar challenge, Skipper Worsfold finally broke her duck for 2022-23 by backheading in a Georgia Tibble corner, inside the six yard area, to make it four.

Palmer instigated a move that nearly resulted in number five; picking out Linscer in the eighteen yard box to nod into the path of the incoming Young, who drove her effort into the side netting.

Half-time was about to be declared on a cold winter's day, although not without Bell having the final say of the first period.

Worsfold reached the byline and delivered a ball that Bell, who timed her run perfectly, clipped past Clark, as the Reds went nap.

It didn't take long for the Seasiders to find the back of



the net yet again after the turnaround. Three minutes to be precise. More fine approach work culminated in a reverse pass by Bridge that a box-based Linscer buried in the top corner.

A nice swivel and cross from half-time sub Humphrey was sent over the target by Tibble, before a rare error by Bridge - also introduced at the interval - saw her inexplicably gift possession to Polina Avramova. A scrambling Lauren Dolbear equally relieved to see the final outcome finish narrowly the wrong side of the upright.

Price, along with remaining replacement Andersson, also entered the fray for the second forty-five prior to it's commencement and made an immediate impact. Showing admirable strength to find Bell who eventually shook off the close attentions of Rebecca Neil but Clark did well to keep her out.

On seventy-three minutes, Katie's (Young) cross was controlled and despatched in an instant by Lelliott for a well-deserved strike.
