



CLUB HISTORY

Hampton FC were formed in 1921 (changing their name to Hampton & Richmond Borough FC in 1999). The club are the only Senior Football Team in the London Borough of Richmond-upon-Thames, an area dominated by Rugby Clubs. Hampton's early years were spent in Junior Football competing in the Kingston & District and the South West Middlesex Leagues until 1959 (Hampton's main honours during that period were four KDFL Championships between 1929 and 1933). Having secured a lease on Beveree, Hampton made the move into Senior Football, joining the Surrey Senior League.

The Beavers (no one can quite recall how or why the club acquired its nickname!) won the Surrey Senior League Championship in 1964 and were then invited to join the Spartan League (there was no progression though a pyramid in those days). Hampton won three Spartan League and Cup doubles during their stay in the Spartan League. In October 1967 Hampton made their best ever signing when they persuaded Alan Simpson OBE to take the role of Club President (Mr Simpson, in partnership with Ray Galton wrote comedy classics, Hancock Half Hour and Steptoe & Son). Alan Simpson OBE would remain Club President for 50 years until his death in 2017,

his funeral was held on the Beveree pitch.

The Club's first floodlights were installed in 1967 and after a short stay in the Athenian League, joined the Isthmian League in 1973. The Beavers played in various divisions, at one stage sinking down to Division 3 before a surge up the league saw them gain a place in the Premier Division in 1998. At the end of the 2002/03 season the Beavers were relegated but shortly after the signing of Alan Devonshire (ex-England & West Ham United) as Manager saw a resurgence in fortune which saw them gain the Isthmian League Championship in 2007. The Beavers would spend five seasons in the Football Conference South, twice narrowly missing out on promotion to the apex of Non-League, losing two play-off finals in 2008 and 2009.

The Beavers found themselves back in the Isthmian League for the start of the 2012/13 season, a season after Alan Devonshire had moved on. The following two seasons saw disappointing finishes of 13 and 12th, one month into season 2014/15 joint managers Paul Barry and Darren Powell resigned and ex-Kingstonian Manager, Alan Dowson, was appointed.

Under Alan Dowson the club won the Isthmian League Championship once again in 2015-16, seeing promotion to the National League





South. The club also won the Isthmian League Charity Shield in August 2016. Gary McCann took over as Manager in the summer of 2018.

The club have appeared in the FA Cup 1st Round Proper on three occasions [losing 2-1 at Barnet in 2000; 3-0 at home to Dagenham & Redbridge in 2007 and most recently narrowly losing 2-1 at home to Oldham Athletic after leading for most of the game). In the FA Trophy the Beavers reached the last 16 in 2012. In County Cups the Beavers have won the Middlesex Senior Cup in 2006, 2008, 2012, 2014 & 2017. The club have also won the Middlesex Charity Cup in 1970, 1996, 1998 & 1999.

The Club have over the years improved Beveree to a state where it now has a ground capacity of 3,500 (including 750 seats) without losing the 'country' and 'village' feel of the place and has a reputation as a welcoming and friendly club. The club has its own Football Academy as well as a large youth set up. The Club remain fully committed to the local community having been part of life in Hampton Village for a century.

KEY PLAYER PROFILES

JAKE GRAY (Midfielder) Having started his career with Crystal Palace aged sixteen, Aylesbury born Jake signed his first professional contract in 2013, before going out on loan to gain experience with Cheltenham and Hartlepool. Whilst at Palace, Gray made the Premier League bench on four occasions. Moves to Luton, and then Yeovil followed, during which time the versatile midfielder racked up over a hundred EFL appearances. His time at Huish Park included an FA Cup Fourth Round tie against Manchester United, where he went head to head with Juan Mata, coming away with the Spanish midfielder's shirt. Jake moved to Woking in summer 2019, before joining the Beavers on loan where he made 18 appearances, scoring three. In August 2020, Gray signed permanently for Gary McCann's side and was an ever-present in the shortened National League South campaign, registering six goal contributions in 21 matches. A groin injury in 2021/22 had a big impact on Gray's season, but he still weighed in with some crucial goals and assists across the campaign, before agreeing terms in the summer to remain at Beveree for 2022/23.

TOMMY BLOCK (Defender) Right back Tommy, who can also play central defence, initially arrived at Beveree on Ioan in January 2022 until the end of the season, before eventually joining on a permanent basis. Born in Sutton, the 22-year-old started his career with Woking, and arrived back there in September 2020 after time on the south coast and north of the border with Hibs and Queen's Park. After leaving the Woking Academy, Tommy spent a season with Havant & Waterlooville, during which time he enjoyed loans at Pagham and Chichester City, before moving to Bognor Regis Town in 2017. Two seasons with The Rocks followed, in both the National League South and the Isthmian Premier League, and it was whilst playing in Sussex that the defender earnt his move to the Scottish Premiership with Hibernian. Whilst with the Edinburgh side, he spent six months on loan with Queen's Park, before returning to Woking in September 2020. Once he arrived at Beveree, Tommy never looked back, and quickly became a firm favourite with management, teammates and fans alike. When his contract at Woking expired in the summer of 2022, the manager seized the chance to bring the versatile full back on board permanently ahead of the 2022/23 season.

TOMMY WOOD (Forward) Gary McCann moved quickly to snap up Tommy in the summer of 2022, after a fine season in Kent had seen the west London born striker bag 13 goals for Tonbridge Angels, Originally from Hillingdon, Tommy started his youth career with local side Yeading, before experiencing academy football with Wycombe Wanderers, Eventually, Wood wound up at Burnley, signing scholarship forms in 2015, even winning the Youth Player of the Season award for the Lancashire side in 2017, Following his time with the Clarets. the mobile forward moved back home to sign for AFC Wimbledon, where he made his league debut against Fleetwood Town in January 2019. Whilst with the Dons, a series of loan moves followed, including three (with Leatherhead, Burgess Hill Town and Tonbridge Angels) where Tommy averaged a goal a game. Following that final loan to Tonbridge, Wood moved there on a permanent basis, where despite an injury disrupted final he season, he finished the 2021/22 season as the Angels' top scorer.

Weymouth came from behind to defeat Worthing on a bitterly cold night at The Crucial Environmental Stadium.

The Reds came into the fixture fresh off a week's recovery after Saturday's fixture against Dover was postponed just two hours before kick-off. Visitors Weymouth made their second trip to Woodside in just over a fortnight after thumping Tonbridge Angels 5-0 away from home on the weekend, a result which took them off the bottom of the table for the first time since August.

Adam Hinshelwood made three changes to the side that was beaten 6-0 by league leaders Ebbsfleet last week. Luca Cocoracchio and Sammie McLeod returned to the starting eleven while midfielder Alex Parsons featured for the first time this season.

Club captain Aarran Racine missed out along with Mo Dabre, while Reece Meekums dropped to the bench.

The first chance of the night brought the first goal when Ollie Pearce's bouncing ball across the box found its way to Joel Colbran in the fifth minute. The full back struck a sweet volley towards Zaki Oualah who got a hand to it but couldn't stop it from making its way to the back of the net.

Colbran's strike proved to be the only real highlight of the opening half-hour, with both sides creating no more than half chances in a cagey contest.

After the break, it was the Rebels who had the first chance when Joe Rye volleyed over following a corner.

Though it was the away side who swung the momentum in their favour soon after. Keelan O'Connell went close with an effort from distance



before Ahkeem Rose struck the post on 56 minutes.

Two minutes later the Terras did go in front when Dan Matsuzaka prodded home following a goalmouth scramble.

The away side continued building pressure after taking the lead. David Sesay with a brilliant dribble starting inside his own half as he took three players out of the game before forcing a good save from Male who parried for a corner.

On 70 minutes, Hinshelwood turned to his bench as Ibby Akanbi and Javaun Splatt were brought on in place of Parsons and McLeod.

Some five minutes later, Dan Bowry replaced Rye who was forced off with a nasty-looking knee injury.

Ash continued to threaten for the away side. On 81 minutes the tricky winger struck the post after an incredible piece of skill on his first touch, flicking the ball from behind him over his own head, had allowed him to get his shot away.

It was just two minutes after when Rose scored a third for Weymouth as the Terras made it five league games without defeat.

A difficult night for the Reds was brought to an end and they will look to put it behind them as they head to Maidstone United on Saturday in the FA Trophy 3rd round.
