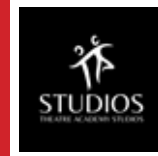
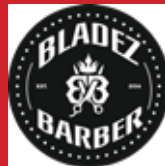

# TODAY'S OPPOSITION

WELCOME TO OUR OPPONENTS FROM  
ST ALBANS CITY FC

## CLUB HISTORY

Serving its 114th year in existence, St Albans City FC currently occupy a spot in the Vanarama National League South, England's Sixth Tier.

Throughout its history, the club has never ventured beyond the non-league system in English football. However, The Saints reached an all-time best during the 2006-07 campaign by reaching England's fifth tier, just one division off the country's professional game.

The 21st century has seen the club feature from the seventh to the fifth tier but after the highs of the 06-7 season, St Albans dropped down to the Southern League Premier Division (Tier Seven) in 2011. A new low for the club after a promising few years before, The Saints dropped out of the Conference scene for the first time in 20 years. However, a return to the National League South was secured through Play-off glory with a 3-1 win over Chesham United.

Every club has at least one name that they all hold dear to their heart, and for St Albans City, that name is Wilfred Minter. Representing the club during the 1920's, Minter scored a remarkable 356 goals in 362 games. His name can also be found in the record books after making FA Cup history in the 1922 Fourth Qualifying Round tie against local rivals Dulwich Hamlet. Whilst staring down the barrel of defeat after

## KEY PROFILE PROFILES

### #1 Michael Johnson - right

Shot-Stopper Michael Johnson, started his footballing journey at lower league Stotfold before earning a move up the non-league pyramid system with his first move to Hitchin Town. Michael had loan spells at Codicote and Biggleswade United before accomplishing himself as Hitchin Town's Number 1. His impressive displays brought the attention of National League Braintree Town, whom he moved to, competing in 22 games and then having a brief spell at Dagenham & Redbridge. Michael joined the Saints at the start of the 2020-2021 season after impressing Ian at his time at Hitchin Town. Michael, known for his heroic penalty saves and commanding organisation of the defence has played a total of 34 times for St Albans, keeping 15 clean sheets during this time. His crucial saves against Concord Rangers and in the penalty shoot-out against Metropolitan Police have been integral for St Albans to reach the Emirates FA Cup 1st



Round. Michael is a commanding presence in the Saints goal, putting in 47 starts last-term and 65 appearances total since joining the Saints during the curtailed 2020/2021 campaign.

### #4 Kyran Wiltshire

Holding midfielder Kyran Wiltshire started his career at Milton Keynes Dons, featuring heavily in pre-season games as a youngster during the 2014-2015



conceding eight goals, Minter provided a glimmer of hope for The Saints by netting seven to become the only player in FA Cup history to score that number of goals whilst remaining on the losing team.

A time in history that provided a staggering record which is still to this day held by Minter, the 1920's were a special period for The Saints. First of all, St Albans lifted the Isthmian League Premier Division title on three separate occasions. Building on from the league success, the club saw its name in the draw for the Amateur Cup Semi Final in three of the years during the decade but a chance at silverware proving to be a step too far on each occasion.

As for the FA Cup, St Albans have reached the Second Round of the world's oldest cup competition on five occasions. This includes the seven-mile journey this year to face Boreham Wood, where the 2nd placed National League side would cruise to a 4-0 victory. On the way to meeting The Wood, St Albans caused a major shock by overcoming a deficit to knock out League Two leaders Forest Green Rovers. A game that will go down in folklore for the people of St Albans with Mitchell Weiss, Zane Banton, and eventual game-winner Shaun Jeffers on hand to complete the turnaround.

Creating the foundations for the club we know today, St Albans now set their sights on a promotion push back to the National League.

as a teammate of Dele Alli. He was released by MK Dons in 2015, where he then joined Maidenhead United and experienced promotion to the National League. At the start of the 2020-2021 season, Kyran joined The Saints. The midfielder has played frequently for the Saints, rarely missing a game through the curtailed 2020-2021 season and the current 2021-2022 season. Kyran last year totalled up an impressive 51 appearances in all competitions during the 2021/2022 campaign, leading to an impressive 71 appearances in all competitions since joining from the Hoops. Kyran brings great fluidity by proving a constant pivot between the Saints defender and midfielder, and was highly important through the Saints' 2021/2022 season.

### #5 Callum Adebisi

6'3 defender Callum Adebisi started his footballing career as a youngster at Barnet FC, Callum was the captain of the Barnet Youth Team during this time. Callum then joined Kings Langley on loan initially before making his move permanent in the 2012-

2013 season. He then played four seasons for Kings Langley, before having an unsuccessful spell at City rivals, Hemel Hempstead, before moving back to Kings Langley. Another unsuccessful spell move away from Kings Langley to Hayes & Yeading, then saw him join Kings Langley for a third spell. Across this time at Kings Langley, Callum made over 250 appearances for the side and was integral to a couple of key promotions. Callum, who is adaptable on left side of defence and in the centre, joined St Albans at the start of the 2020-2021 season.



### #6 Michael Clark - above

Michael was captain of the Leyton Orient youth team that won the South East and West Youth Merit League 2015/2016. In his first season as a professional player, Michael went out on loan to East Thurrock United at the start of the 2016-17 season where he made 35 appearances in all competitions and scored four goals. This included the second goal in the 2-0 win over Colchester United in their Essex Senior Cup quarter-final. Michael was recalled from his loan and drafted into the Leyton Orient first team squad in February 2017. He made his debut as a second-half substitute for Tom Parkes in the 1-0 league defeat at home to Cheltenham Town on 25 February 2017. A second loan spell at East Thurrock was announced on 15 December 2017, initially to run for one month. On 29 June 2018, Clark agreed to join newly-promoted National League side Braintree Town. After spells with Concord Rangers and the Saints, he returned to Braintree Town. However, he signed for his second spell with the Saints in mid-December 2019. Through these two different spells Michael has featured 47 times for St Albans, picking up 2 goals from defence. Michael picked up a stress

fracture to his pelvis during the 2020-2021 season which has seen him yet to feature for the Saints this season. An injury pact 2021-2022 campaign saw Michael return for the second-half of the season in the Saints' defense and made 19 appearances for the Saints resulting in 66 games throughout his Saints career.

### #9 Shaun Jeffers - right

Shaun, a former England Under 19 player, came through the youth ranks of Coventry City and spent time at a number of Football League sides including Peterborough United, Newport County, and Yeovil Town prior to joining Chelmsford City in the summer of 2016. Shaun helped fire the Clarets to the playoffs with 21 goals in 39 games. His goal-scoring exploits helped earn him a transfer to Hertfordshire neighbours Boreham Wood where he made over twenty appearances in the National League during the 2017-18 campaign. The striker went on to enjoy spells at Hampton & Richmond Borough on loan, where he notched 6 in 13, and Brackley Town. Jeffers then joined National League Yeovil Town, playing 25 times. Shaun re-joined Chelmsford City in the summer of 2019 where he once again made his mark, leading the club's scoring charts with fourteen goals in thirty-two games, including an effort against the Saints at Clarence Park in November 2019. Shaun signed for the Saints in the summer of 2020. Shaun has been on goal scoring form since joining the Saints across the last two seasons, this season sees him top of the Vanarama National League South goalscorers. Shaun has become the talisman of The Saints' strike force over the last two seasons since joining from Chelmsford City in 2020. Integral to the side, contributing 45 goals in 70 appearances across all competitions during that spell. Last campaign, Shaun scored an impressive 34 goals in 50 games, with 27 of those coming in the Vanarama National League South, supplying 49% of City's goals in the competition. This impressive tally saw him finish runner-up to Dorking's Alfie Rutherford for the golden boot.

### #11 Zane Banton - right

Zane is an exciting winger who made four first-team appearances for Luton Town during the 2016/2017 season, all in the Checkatrade Trophy with starts against Gillingham and West Brom, then as a substitute against Millwall and Swindon. The



move to Clarence Park in March 2017 was Zane's third loan in non-league football, having spent time at Evo-Stik League Southern Premier side Biggleswade Town and our National League South neighbours Hemel Hempstead Town in the last two seasons. Zane was recalled by Luton prior to the Saints final game of the 2016/2017 season. He was then released by Luton at the end of their season. Zane then signed a permanent deal in June 2017 with the Saints for the 2017/2018 season. Zane agreed to a new deal in April 2021 and re-signed for the 2021/2022 season. Zane this season made his 150th appearance for St Albans away vs Braintree Town. Zane throughout his time at St Albans has made 156 throughout his long spell and shows a vast non-league experience for the 24 year old. He also won Goal of the Season in the 2019/2020 season. Now entering his sixth campaign with City, he has accumulated 186 appearances to date. **Worthing fell to their first defeat of 2023 after Tonbridge Angels came from behind to win 2-1 at Longmead Stadium.**

The Reds came into the fixture in scintillating form having won each of their last five fixtures in all competitions, most recently defeating Dover 3-0 away from home on Tuesday night.

The hosts meanwhile, were in their own spell of good form – undefeated in their last five fixtures, including their victory on penalties against League Two Gillingham in midweek.

Adam Hinshelwood made three changes to the side that beat Dover on Tuesday. With Joe Rye missing with a hamstring injury, his place was vacant for Dan Bowry to return to the starting eleven. Joining him were Danny Barker and Lewis White who replaced Reece Meekums and Callum Kealy.

Tonbridge started the second half the brighter of the two sides with early chances from a free-kick and corner being headed just wide.

The Angels got their reward for their positive start to the second half just before the hour mark. Male came out to punch clear a deep free-kick but the ball fell to Tariq Hinds who hit it on the volley and into the vacant goal.

Hinshelwood responded with a change, replacing Reuben Livesy Austin with James Beresford.

Two big chances for Pearce followed and were both met with important stops by Henly. The first, from a tight angle, was parried over before being sent one-on-one a minute later. Henly stayed big to make the save.

Hinshelwood then made his second change on the 67th minute and final change on 74 minutes. First, bringing on Kealy in place of Rodari before replacing Chambers with Ibby Akanbi.

But, it was Tonbridge who took the lead five minutes later. Lewis Gard pinched back possession on the halfway line and dribbled forward before playing through Joe Turner. He took it in his stride before firing past Male to give the home side the lead.

The Reds struggled to create a good chance to get themselves back in the contest and fell to their first defeat of 2023.

**The Rebels made it four consecutive league wins as they breezed past Dover Athletic at The Crabble.**

Adam Hinshelwood's side made the trip to The Crabble to take on a Dover side sitting 15th in the league table.

Confidence was certainly high in the Worthing camp after their convincing 3-0 win against second-placed Dartford at the weekend.

Meanwhile, the hosts played out a goalless draw away at Hemel Hempstead last time out.

Hinshelwood made two changes to the side that beat the Darts on Saturday as Reece Meekums and Callum Kealy returned to the starting eleven in place of Lewis White and Danny Barker.

The encounter got off to a cagey start with both sides managing to threaten with half chances. Joshua Ajayi was sent in behind the Worthing back line which forced Harrison Male to rush out to clear the danger with a header.
