CLUB HISTORY

Concord Rangers began life as a team of boys headed by Steve Lant playing friendly matches during 1966 on a pitch along the Canvey Island seafront close to the Concord Beach (hence the name Concord Rangers and the nickname The Beach Boys). In 1967 Albert Lant, Steve's father and current Club President, became the team manager and took the club into competitive football.

The club initially joined the Thundermite Boys Football League, before moving into the Vange and District League in 1973 where they won several league and cup honours. Saturday football was introduced to the club shortly after when Concord joined the Mid Essex League and played their home games at Waterside Farm on Canvey Island.

Over the following years the club moved to the Essex Intermediate League, the Essex Senior League, and the Isthmian League before promotion to the Conference South in 2013.

The Beachboys lost their 2013/14 first Conference South fixture, however were soon picking up points regularly with determined & professional performances against some of the biggest teams at this level. Although there were a couple of harsh results, there was a level of consistency many didn't expect to see against this opposition, this helped Concord reach what was a spectacular 9th place finish by seasons end. To cap it all off, The Beachboys were able to win the Essex Senior Cup against Braintree as the football season came to a close.

2014/15 was a season of historical moments, but started with 3 losses out of 4 games. Fortunes quickly turned around for the club as eventually a 7th place finish was achieved (a 13 game unbeaten run being a key contributor). The most incredible moment of the season was Concord Rangers reaching the first round of the FA Cup for the first time. Drawn away to Mansfield Town, Concord earned a 1-1 draw before losing 1-0 in the replay in front of 1500 at the Aspect Arena. The second round of the FA Trophy was reached, also for the first time. A penalty shootout filled Essex Senior Cup run saw Concord retain the trophy they'd won a year before, this time beating Billericay in the final. At the seasons end manager Danny Cowley & his assistant manager brother Nicky (who took over from Alzapiedi in September) left the club for pastures new.

2015-16 was a season of rebuilding with Adam Flanagan & Jody Brown in charge of the side which had lost a number of key players, whilst trying to maintain our National League south position. A poor start saw Brown replaced with the returning Alzapiedi as assistant manager, and things looked up. A 12 game unbeaten run at the start of 2016

helped the side reach their 3rd Essex Senior Cup final in as many years, making history in the April when beating Heybridge Swifts to retain the cup. A mid table finish guaranteed another season of National League South football.

2017/18 saw the Beachboys put an impressive 13 game unbeaten run together at one point, however the poor start and shaky end to the season saw the side stave off relegation by just a couple of points, which saw Flan and Glen be relieved of their positions.

Prior to the 2018/19 season, Sammy Moore and Jack Midson were brought in to take charge of the first team, as Concord Rangers looked to make their 6th season at this level a successful one, and a success it was as the club finished in 6th place. However due to ground grading issues, Concord were unable to take part in the playoffs.

Moore & Midson left the club by mutual consent, after which an old favourite returned to take the helm as Danny Scopes was appointed first team manager for the 2019/20 season.

Scopesy enlisted the help of Lee Minshull, James Roach and Adam Drew for his time in sole charge of the Beachboys, and while the league form started well, it was the historic FA Trophy run that really set the tone for the year. Two seasons of prematurely ending league campaigns were the result of the pandemic, but Scopesy's reign was capped off by a historic appearance in the FA Trophy Final at Wembley, losing 1-0 to Harrogate Town.

A new dawn beckoned as in the off season Danny Scopesy resigned his position as 1st team manager and Ant Smith stepped down after 21 successful years as chairman. Jack Smith Jnr and John Smith assumed the interim chairman position off pitch and on the pitch under 18s manager Chris Search was brought in to lead the first team alongside Danny Green and Craig Shipman. After starting the season with a fantastic win over league favourites Dorking, the team were entertaining to watch but lacked consistency. The club went out of both FA competitions at the 1st stage but had a successful Essex Senior Cup campaign, culminating in a 4-3 defeat to Billericay in the semi final. The league campaign picked up towards the end and the management team led us to a final position of 14th and will be looking to build on this next season.

After a poor start to the 2022/23 season, and a winless run throughout September and October, the decision was made between both the club and Chris Search to make a change in management. As November was about to get under way, former Concord player and Bowers manager Rob Small took the reigns at Thames Road, with the aim being to secure the Beachboys place in the National League South for another season.



KEY PROFILE PROFILES

MITCH BEENEY – Goalkeeper, Signed from Horsham this November, Mitch is a vastly experienced 'keeper who has played between the sticks for a number of both non-league and professional clubs. Coming through the youth system at Chelsea, Mitch has seen playing time at Sligo Rovers, Hartlepool United, Cheshunt and Bowers & Pitsea, where he was under the management of now Concord gaffer Rob Small. Signing for Horsham in the summer, Mitch jumped at the opportunity to once again join up with Smallsy when the gaffer came calling a few months into the season.

ARON POLLOCK – Defender, Signed for the Beachboys less than a week before the 2018/19 season, Aron is a Basildon-born defender who came through the youth system at Leyton Orient, earning a spot in the first team in 2016. Loans at Wingate & Finchley and Wealdstone followed, before he joined Leatherhead on another loan. Following his release from Orient, the Leatherhead move was made permanent, before following that management team to Concord Rangers in 2018. Pollock is a determined and dogged defender who comes up with his fair share of goals, and he's certain to continue that form as he moves into his fifth season with the Beachboys.

TOSAN POPO – Defender, Now in his third run with the Beachboys, Tosan is an experienced defender/midfielder who has spent time on the youth books at West Ham, Chelsea and Charlton before joining Concord Rangers for the first time in 2012. Tosan then moved to the States to play for Rollins College. Following his stint in the college game, Popo played for the Tampa Bay Rowdies and then the Florida Tropics before returning to England. Tosan signed on for his second stint with Concord Rangers for the 2018/19 season, before joining Hemel Hempstead Town a year later. Popo made his welcome return to the side in 2020 and has maintained his role as a key part of the back-line.

JAYDEN RANDELL – Defender, Signing for the Beachboys just before 2020 came to an end, Jayden is an experienced RB/CB who was most recently playing his trade at National League side Wealdstone. Randell has also seen playing time at Maidstone,

and was a key part in the recent Heybridge Swifts playoff win. The defender was also awarded the Young Player of the Year during the 2019/20 season at Heybridge. Currently out injured after suffering a double leg break in preseason.

NANA KYEI – Winger, Joining the Beachboys last February for his second spell with the club following a loan spell a few years ago, Nana had most recently been playing in the National League South with Hungerford Town. Nana started his career at Barnet where he progressed through the youth system from 9 years old, from where he went on loan to Concord Rangers, Hampton & Richmond and Potters Bar Town before signing for Maidstone in 2019. He made an instant impact last season, notching up some key goals in the Beachboys league campaign.

LOUIS RAMSAY – Defender, The 24 year old right back joined Concord Rangers in February this year, having most recently been playing for Rio Grande Valley FC in Texas, who ply their trade in the United Soccer League. Before his trip across the Atlantic, Louis was on the books at Billericay Town, where he made 23 appearances. Louis started his career coming through the youth ranks at Tottenham Hotspur then at Norwich City before moving into the Senior game with the Canaries before being loaned out to Woking.

ALEX HERNANDEZ – Striker, Another product of the youth setup here at Concord Rangers, Alex has been a part of the successful U18s sides before joining up with the first team in recent years. Alex spent a significant chunk of last season on loan at East Thurrock where he gained some valuable first team experience at a very competitive level, and he'll be looking to use that experience to earn a regular place in the Beachboys matchday squad.

RICKY MODESTE – Midfielder, Signed this summer, non-league stalwart Ricky Modeste is an experienced winger who has also earned caps for the Grenada national side. Most recently playing for Tonbridge Angels prior to his move to the Beachboys, Ricky is no stranger to Essex having played for Chelmsford City (92 appearances) and Billericay Town (45 appearances) in the past. Modeste has also seen playing time at Witham Town, Dover Athletic and Dartford.

LEWIS MANOR – Striker, The first new signing for the Beachboys following the appointment of Rob Small as manager, Lewis reunites with Smallsy having played under him at Bowers & Pitsea prior to and during the COVID-hit campaigns. Manor is a prolific striker, having scored 22 goals for Bowers during the 2021/22 season. Lewis left Bowers this past summer to sign for Potters Bar Town, and also counts Rayleigh Town and Billericay Town as previous clubs.

Bruno TAVARES – Midfielder, Signed from Hayes & Yeading United this December, the Portuguese winger has been on dual registration at Southall getting some regular first team football under his belt. Last season Bruno was on the books at Hungerford Town then Royston Town, and has seen playing time at Rayners Lane, Chalfont St Peter and Enfield Borough over the years. The youngster can play on the wing or lead the line up front, and will be keen to prove himself at National League South level.

OLA OGUNWAMIDE – Midfielder, Joining the club from Isthmian League Premier Division side Hornchurch at the start of February, Ola is a deceptively fast player with a keen eye for goal. He has seen playing time at Barking, where he made 40 appearances, before joining East Thurrock and then Tilbury prior to signing with the Urchins in December 2021.

MOHAMMED KAMARA – Midfielder, Signed from Potters Bar Town this January, Mo was previously captain of The Scholars and has a reputation for scoring spectacular goals from midfield. Kamara has previously seen playing time for fellow non-league sides Margate, Herne Bay, Moseley and Greenwich Borough.

QUINTEN MONVILLE – Striker, Signed from Potters Bar Town in early March, Quinten has previously played under gaffer Rob Small and alongside Lewis Manor when at Bowers & Pitsea before joining the Scholars in June of last year. Monville has a knack of getting on the end of crosses out of nowhere and is not shy of converting from the penalty spot. His partnership with Manor back at Bowers was highly productive for Smallsy, and he's hoping that reignites here at Concord Rangers.

Three second half goals helped Worthing end their winless run with a 3-2 win against Havant & Waterlooville at The Crucial Environmental Stadium.

The Rebels welcomed the Hawks to Woodside on Non-League Day with both playoff hopefuls looking to end poor runs of form.

The home side were winless in their last five outings, while Havant & Waterlooville's winless run stretched to eight games before today.

Adam Hinshelwood made four changes to his side that lost away to Chelmsford last week, with Joe Rye, Kane Wills and Ibby Akanbi returning to the side along with Ebbsfleet loanee Jack Paxman who made his first start since signing on loan.

It was the visitors who started the strongest and had their first chance inside the first ten minutes after Joel Colbran tripped Muhammad Faal on the edge of the box and received a yellow card. Josh Passley took the free kick but hit it over.

On 13 minutes, the Rebels created their first opportunity when Ollie Pearce fired towards goal, straight into the path of Ibby Akanbi who deflected it, forcing a reflex save from Teddy Sharman-Lowe, diving to his right.

Worthing's best chance of the half came on 24 minutes when Paxman cut back to Mo Dabre. The Swindon Town loanee saw his shot deflected wide off the heels of his teammate, Akanbi.

Up the other end, Charlie Ruff forced a one-handed stop from Harrison Male, tipping over for a Hawks corner.

The corner came in towards Jake McCarthy who missed his header, but James Roberts kept the ball alive by firing towards goal. After a deflection, the ball fell straight to Faal who fired in despite Colbran's best efforts to clear off the line.

Soon after, Danny Wright missed a chance to double the visitors' advantage by firing wide of the upright.

The Hawks began to display their frailties at the back with a succession of loose passes providing chances for the Rebels to advance forward but the home side couldn't create anything clear-cut.

Roberts went close just before half time for the Hawks after cutting onto his left foot, but his shot hit the side netting and the away side had a one-goal advantage at the break.

After picking up a booking for bringing down Ruff on the break, Dabre was replaced by Rodari for the Rebels on 52 minutes.



The substitute made an instant impact by heading home the equaliser just three minutes after coming on. Wills spread play wide to Colbran who delivered a glorious cross to the unmarked Rodari in the area and the forward headed past the desperate dive of Sharman-Lowe.

It was a cagey affair after the equaliser with both sides looking to end their poor form and neither side wanting to lose the contest and as a result, chances were limited.

Hinshelwood opted for the fresh legs of Reece Meekums on 66 minutes, replacing Suk-jae Lee.

The drama unfolded on 80 minutes when Akanbi's shot at goal was blocked by the arm of Hawks defender, Sam Magri, and the referee pointed to the spot. Pearce stepped up and blasted in his 19th goal of the season straight down the middle to give the Rebels the advantage heading into the late stages.

Looking to shut up shop, Hinshelwood replaced the debutant Paxman after an impressive display with Danny Barker in midfield in the 85th minute.

But the next passage of play saw the Reds add a third, and in fine fashion! Wills found himself in space some 25 yards out and decided to try his luck, firing in low into the bottom left corner and there was a sense of relief amongst the home support with the two-goal advantage. However, the Hawks soon got a goal back through McCarthy who beat Male at his near post with a fierce effort to set up a grandstand finish at The Crucial Environmental Stadium.

Four minutes of added time came and went for the visitors as McCarthy's late strike proved to be no more than a consolation and the Rebels secured a well-needed three points to keep them in the playoff places in the National League South.
